# Kingpin Challenge Postponed **Until 2006**

GREENDALE, Wis.-The Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge, an event that promised to pay the first \$1 million first prize in bowling history, has been postponed.

The event, which is certified by the United States Bowling Congress, was scheduled to take place the end of this month at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., but Kingpin Challenge organizers elected to postpone the event due to a slowdown in entries and growing cancellations.

'Obviously USBC is disappointed the event is not going forward but we understand the reasons behind the postpone-ment," USBC Chief Operating Officer Jack Mordini said. "USBC initially became involved in this event to protect the interests of our members, and we have received assurances that complete refunds will be offered to bowlers.3

Kingpin organizers say the event will now be conducted sometime in 2006. Details are still being worked on and an announcement is expected in the next two to four weeks.

We apologize profusely for the inconvenience this is going to cause those bowlers who have already committed," Kingpin spokesman David Woodruff said. "All contestants will be offered a full refund of any and all funds they have paid the Kingpin organizers." Kingpin organizers.'

# **Up Your Average** by Rolf Gauger



Instruction to Help Raise Your Scores

#### FORM, FINISH AND FISICS PART II

In last month's issue we discussed some of the reasons for the importance of form in achieving optimum scores and averages. Then, we worked on some of the techniques for achieving such a form (body position) during the approach and at the line. As was mentioned, all of this has but one purpose...to ultimately achieve a body position at the line which turns that body into a solid launch pad from which you can fire a consistent, accurate and powerful "missile".

We also dealt with the reasons why optimum form may vary somewhat from bowler to bowler and still be appropriate. This is because the only rules about form are that to be effective in helping to score it must somehow allow the bowler to accomplish a leveraged release. The underlying laws of physics demand this. Also, it must be kept simple enough to be easily repeatable. It was pointed out that while some of the leading touring pros may have somewhat similar styles, many vary widely; but that there are always similarities which may not be easily noticeable at first because such similarities are often hidden by the more obvious differences.

The bottom line point was...and is...that once the underlying laws of physics are understood (and most are fairly easy, really), it is worth while to make a few adjustments which allow what we call "form" to become an asset rather than a liability. Since amateur bowlers can't practice as many hours per week as the touring pros, it would behoove them to at least work on achieving a solid bodily form somewhat closer to a more leveraged launch pad, as mentioned above!

#### Down, DOWN, DOWN!

Nothing new here; this is a no-brainer! We all know that a lower, yet more upright torso at the line, the more leverage is available for the release. The problem is, that once the over-bending of the body from the waist at the line has been corrected (see part 1 of this article in last month's issue) many bowlers wind up standing too tall. Then, to correct this, they often try to remember to bend the knees in addition to keeping the torso more vertical and this creates the old "overthink" problem.

So forget about knee bending. Instead, what actually works, is to visualize yourself "dropping" the finishing HIP forward. Since it's impossible to drop a hip without bending the knee, you can forget the knees and merely tell yourself, "DROP YOUR FINISHING HIP FORWARD!" as you get to the line. For right handers, this is the left hip...right hip for left handers. This results in a lower yet slightly more upright torso at the line.

The critial point is this...AT THE RLEASE POINT THE CHEST SHOULD BE NO FARTHER FORWARD THAN THE FRONT KNEE! That body position must be maintained, while posting!

#### FISICS AND THE DOWNSWING

Anyway, as we discussed in last month's article, the real secret of accuracy is the ability to create a non wandering swing plane in alignment with your target, or mark, during the approach and release. As virtually all par bowlers know, such a swing alignment is most easily achieved by initiating it with a target aligned pushaway. This is true regardless of which of the numerous possible styles of push-away you may be using.

The correct pushaway is important. It must have four properties in modern bowling:

1. It must be bigger than the accompanying step;

2. It must be faster...never too slow and deliberate;

It must, preferably starting at or slightly below the waist, go slightly upward at the same time 3. as forward;

It must push the ball toward the intended target board (mark). 4.

Why? Well, a bigger push allows the ball's gravity to take over the swing. This avoids muscling the ball; faster pushaway assists timing; slightly upward keeps the ball from getting ahead of the steps, and toward the mark assists with accuracy.

#### **BICEP, NO!**

Try this test: Hold your ball as if in the stance, about waist high, elbow at your side, but without your other hand. Look down at your bicep; it's contracted, right? You can even feel it all bunched up in an effort to hold that ball. Now, do a push-away with just that one hand. As that hand moves forward, notice two things...your bicep gradually seems to disappear as it flattens out and the ball feels heavier, until at the end of that push it's so heavy that it wants to fall down. This proves that it's the bicep, which ordinarily restricts the backswing. A bigger push-away eliminates the bicep and lets the BALL SWING THE ARM! Remember that...the ball swings the arm!

Why? Well, this creates the all important "free" armswing, so critical for a successful shot. Hall of fame coach of the pros, John Jowdy, the acknowledged "king of swing" (did you think it was Benny Goodman?) teaches this and has helped champions like Pete Weber and others improve their win rate with it.

#### **RUBBER BAND, YES!**

Now that the ball is into a more effortless backswing, there's less tendency to muscle it into the downswing (the second swing alignment problem mentioned above). The bad news is, that quite often the ball gets muscled down anyway, in spite of the nice free backswing just concluded.

Why? Because at the top of the backswing, the ball temporarily loses all its gravity. That's when your muscles scream, "The ball doesn't weigh anything...we better help it down!"

Muscling the ball is the result. While it feels good, trust me when I tell you that as good as that ball muscling may feel during the downswing, a split second later, at the release, ol' Dr. Feel-good suddenly deserts you. Now you're either out of time, your bowling shoulder and downswing have moved out of alignment, or both. As stated above, the arm is attached at only one point...the shoulder. Pull against that ball with one end of the arm and the other end will be affected.

Worse yet, chicken winging often begins with a muscled downswing. So that sense of power one gets from forcing the ball down vanishes into thin air and usually results in an errant shot.

O.K. We all know about muscling being incorrect. Yet I get 200 plus average bowlers who do it anyway, thinking it can't be much of a problem because they seem to be getting away with it. Then, after they've been helped to overcome it and the average jumps several pins, they suddenly get religion.

Just one last little test: Stand with arms hanging naturally; move your bowling arm backward, as if in a backswing, arm straight. Now, notice that as your arm approaches the top of that backswing, the

chest muscle (pectoral) stretches out, sort of like a rubber band. Feel it?

Well, what happens to a stretched rubber band when it is released? It snaps back, right? So when your ball reaches the top of the backswing, all you need to do is let the snapping back of that pectoral rubber band initiate your downswing, with no help from you! This will provide all the swing force needed with no muscling whatever! And so it is with the ball. Presto! No more muscling. So even on the downswing, the ball swings the arm!

This technique greatly assists in the art of "waiting for the ball", a much prized method among professionals. This takes some practice to achieve, but is really the best way to get that sphere into the release position at the bottom of the swing in proper timing and alignment with the target.

This "waiting for the ball", is also taught by Coach Jowdy. It's worth the effort, no matter what your average range!

#### THE GORILLA SYNDROME

None of the above errors would be a problem for a bowling gorilla. Such brute strength could easily overcome the weight of the ball, so swing alignment and accuracy would probably remain intact. No, I'm not trying to be funny; my point is, that the bowling world includes bowlers who get away with short or muscled backswings and forced downswings and still maintain par plus averages, even win tournaments.

This needs to be said because such exceptions exist, even among professionals. Many pros lift weights regularly to increase strength and fitness. Include their constant time on the practice lanes and it all adds up to the ability to win despite seeming to break some of the rules. While this may be true, it is generally wiser for the improvement hungry bowler to avoid trying to overcome the physical laws, which govern our sport. Those laws will break you, long before you get away with breaking them!

In more than one past article I've referred to the outstanding techniques used by many lady professionals. These women are admired for their bowling form by many coaches and instructors, who often wish their men students, with their added strength, would apply such techniques to help themselves attain their goals more quickly and easily!

Can you imagine a gorilla's scores, using the form and technique of a Wendy MacPherson? 'Nuff said!





He started the first all deaf traveling league and the So. California Traveling League. He is also a writer, writing a weekly column in the PACIFIC BOWLER and the BOWL-ING NEWS. He is a member of the Bowling Writers Association of America and the So. California Bowling Writers.

He has been inducted into the National Deaf Bowling Hall of Fame and was the recipient of the Rip Van Winkle award from the Bowling Writers Association of America.

The scope of bowling for the deaf was revealed by the statistics that there are 50,000 serious deaf league bowlers and 100,000 recreational bowlers.

The second part of the Jamboree was an informational and Q & A session conducted by Elaine Hagin, USBC Board of Director. Also in attendance were Lou Gillis, Chairman of the California USBC Transition Board: Gloria Loftis, Field Service; Gina Mora, CSBA Executive Director and Al Hoffmann, former ABC Director.

Elaine outlined the USBC Mission Statement which describes why the USBC exists, what it does, and for whom it does it. The principles or Core Values are:

1. Risk Taking, 2. Inclusiveness, 3. Integrity,

### **KIETZ KOMMENTS** Need League Organizing Tools

LAKE FOREST — USBC Roger Dalkin writes in the Fall issue of the USBowler, "coaching is key". People who understand the sport and become more skilled are more likely to become life-long bowlers.

This writer does not agree. Coaching is not "key". If it was true, the lost millions of keglers would still be bowling filling those recently closed centers.

What we do need is league organizers, organizing tools, association/proprietor co-operation, incentives, friendly/knowledgeable staffs (desk people), simple/friendly computers and teach the kids (and adults) how to keep score and have fun bowling.

To get the right bowlers to fill a team, we need enthused volunteers, paid marketeers, then the organizing tools, a phone list of eligible bowlers, promotions, advertising, off-the-street attractions, so on and on.

Every association has an average book, a list of its members. But only a few use the "book" to organize teams/leagues.

Association office staffs argue they cannot give out the names and phone numbers, costly, privacy, just don't want to do it.

Those average books are the "key" to bringing back bowlers. The proprietors and association wheels must agree to a method to use the average books.

The above ideas are not new. Associations were known to give out names, addresses, phone numbers to organize tournaments, social bowling clubs.

What would be wrong? Each association forms an honor award 200 average club and give out 50% discount award cards to participating centers or each certified center forms their own award, 200, 190, 170 or even 100 average clubs.

A few remember back in the 50's Vic Hodge organized a So-Cal 700 Club with discount membership cards. Vic started with names, addresses and phone numbers from the SEDBA - some of these clubs still exist.

Yes, it's time the associations and proprietors get together and produce league organizing tools.



# National Deaf Bowling News Stogryn Beats Kaczmarczyk In \$3,000 NDMBA Kansas Tourney

OLATHE–This is a great year for Darrell Stogryn who in his debut on the Deaf Team USA in the last January Deaflympics in Australia, rallied to win the silver medal in the Masters and last October 2nd winning a \$3,000 NDMBA title at Olathe Lanes East. The El Camino Village, CA right-hander defeated the much-heralded deaf PBA member Peter Kaczmarczyk 234 to 188 in the one game Championship Finale.

The 4th annual National Deaf Master Bowlers Association tournament started on Saturday morning Oct. 1 with Kaczmarczyk leading the first 6 games block qualifying round with 1430; Then after the afternoon 6 games block, the Sterling Heights, MI right-hander finished with a grand total of 2807 (233+ average for 12 games. He tied his own record of 12 consecutive 200 games.

Chasing Kaczmarczyk was the tournament director and two time Deaf Team USA member Ed Abakumoff, Riverside with a pair of 279s in first block and a total of 2665 (222 ave.). Finishing 3rd was the 1986 ABC Star of Tomorrow and former PBA member Mark Fisser, Buena Park, CA with 2612 (217+ ave.) including a 269/709 in his first 3 games.

Four pins back of Fisser with 2608 was the veteran PBA member Frank Gallo, Jr. of Lanham, MD. Gallo hit a 279 in 7th game as did in 8th game by Deaf Team USA member Robert Ellison, San Diego who finished with 2489. The eventual winner Stogryn placed 5th with 2455.

Others finishing with 2400 were former Deaf Team USA member and coach Don Ketter, Olathe 2422 and Deaf Team USA Joe Ed Thompson, Austin, TX 2410. The 16th qualifier for match plays with 2163 total was Johnny Qualls of host town Olathe who is in his first tournament..

Echoing a national trend, Sunset is the third public bowling alley in San Diego to close in recent years.


Money apparently is not the problem. The family that has owned the business since 1957 is selling to honor the wishes of the late founder, general manager Milt Galik said.


