# **EJ Tackett Overcomes Slow Start to Win PBA Bear Open For Third Career Title**

Late strikes after early open frames secure victory over Sweden's Jesper Svensson

ALLEN PARK, MI -EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., threw critical backto-back strikes in the 10th frame to overcome backto-back open frames early in the title match to defeat Sweden's Jesper Svensson, 212-199, and win the PBA Bear Open, the second event of the PBA Fall Swing at Thunderbowl

The tournament finals aired Wednesday on CBS Sports Network.

Tackett, the 2013 PBA Rookie of the Year, prevented the 21-year-old Swedish left-handed twohander from winning his



fourth title of the year, instead claiming his third career PBA Tour title. In winning his second title of the year, Tackett joined Svensson and Texas teenager Anthony Simonsen, a two-time title winner, as the only three players to win more than once on the PBA Tour in 2016.

Tackett, who qualified Svensson held a four-pin

second for the stepladder final, recovered in the match after leaving a 4-6 split in the second frame and 7-10 split in the third frame. lead in the ninth frame with both bowlers working on a strike.

"I didn't panic but it was do or die at that point," Tackett said after the two splits. "I had to do something so I went with a small adjustment with my hand position and fortunately it worked."

When Svensson bowled a nine count on his first shot in the 10th frame, Tackett extended his string of strikes with a double in the 10th to take the win.

"I knew sitting there I had a good chance because after the fourth frame I continued on page 12

# A Poignant Night for Steve Johnson

MADERA, Calif. – It was one of Steve Johnson's most memorable bowling nights.

The right-handed bowler from Fresno popped games of 222, 300 and 280 last month to finish with his second 800 series of his career – this time finishing with an 802 during league play at Valley Bowl in Madera.

Of Johnson's final 28 shots, 27 went for strikes – the lone non-strike being a ringing 10 pin in the second frame of his third game.

But there was more to this special night for Steve Johnson.

Johnson turned in his stellar performance less than a month after eloping with standout bowler Danielle Davis and marrying her Aug. 27 in Reno, Nev. Two of their four kids and Danielle were there to watch Johnson's theatrics – and he put on a show, flinging his right arm skyward in triumph shortly after delivering his final shot of the night.

"Quite honestly, why it was so special was that Danielle and the kids were there and I was in my typically distracted mode doing puzzles with the kids and socializing," said the 47-year-old Johnson, who also was thrilled about bowling for the first time against Patti Hoban, the bowling center's co-owner.

But there was even more to this special night for Steve Johnson.

Johnson's feat happened to take place on the same pair of lanes that he first met Danielle.

The two had come together three years ago on the day that Valley Bowl presented Johnson with a commemorative 800 series ring.

But there was still more to this special night for Steve

Johnson got into his groove right after making a series of adjustments after the 10th frame of his first game. Johnson estimates that he made approximately six changes on his delivery and approach – incorporating the fine-tuning all at once.

"Somehow I was in tune with the inner voice on what to do," Johnson said.

Johnson, who previously blistered an 858 series, finished with his second perfect game of his career and quite a few memories.

"It was a very emotional night," he said.

# BVL Contributions for 15-16 Season Reach \$924,567

Thanks to the continued support from bowling associations and bowling centers, BVL contributions for the most recent fiscal year rose almost \$16,000 from 2015 to \$924,567 for the season ending July 31, 2016.

"We received contributions from more than 350 state and local associations and leagues last year and almost 40 different bowling center operators," noted BVL Board of Directors Chair John LaSpina. "We cannot thank these wonderful groups enough for their continued generosity – they are the backbone of our organization."

In addition to the donations from leagues, associations, and bowling centers, BVL received contributions from a wide range of other bowling-related fundraising efforts including the auction of a Kegel lane machine resulting in a donation of almost \$14,500. Bowl America President Leslie Goldberg Charity Foundation gifted \$10,000 and friends of International Bowlers Journal Senior Editor, Bob Johnson, and his new wife, Michelle, raised \$5,000 in honor of Michelle's father, Vietnam Vet Fred Garcia, at their recent nuptials.

"What's most exciting for us is the passion our volunteers have for America's military men and women," continued LaSpina. "Moreover, we feel as though that spark is really catching on fire now... We have many bowling centers newly signed up to support BVL, and we believe our numbers will skyrocket for the 16-17 season. We already have close to 200 operators that have agreed to participate in our new "Care. Commit. Contribute." campaign for centers. This could have a profound impact on our programs to support our veterans."

At the same time, BVL leaders are asking all associations to renew their promise to support bowling's own, oldest, and most successful charity. BVL is asking every association to start the season by appointing a BVL committee and drawing up plans for a fundraising event. "We want every association to join with us. Imagine what we could achieve if just 100 more associations agreed to help our hospitalized veterans," noted LaSpina.

The need for backing America's veterans was recently illustrated in a national survey which found that, while the support required by more than 21 million veterans in America is growing, philanthropic support is fragmented and charitable contributions are not keeping pace. The total number of veteran nonprofits peaked in 2011 and has been slowly and continually declining over the last four years. The study notes: If measured only in terms of media coverage and Veterans Affairs funding, there has been an apparent groundswell of support for veterans' causes in the last decade. But that groundswell apparently never translated into philanthropy. Overall funding for veteran nonprofits has remained relatively flat, rising only from \$8.3 billion to \$8.9 billion since 2001 to keep up with inflation. So while demand for services has been spiking, funding outside of the VA does not appear to be keeping up.

LaSpina concludes, "BVL and the sport of bowling made our promise to our nation's veterans in 1942: 'We will not forget your sacrifice.' We have work to do to meet the needs of those that sacrificed for us. Let's join together and make 16-17 the best ever for BVL. # Fort Worth's Kerry Fulford Earns2016 PBA50 Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award

CHICAGO — Bowling in his first season full-time on the PBA50 Tour, 64-year-old Kerry Fulford of Fort Worth, Texas was selected as the winner of the 2016 PBA50 Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award as voted on by his fellow players.

"Tom Carter (last year's Dick Weber Sportsmanship recipient) told me that receiving the award was as good, if not better than winning a title," said Fulford. "I've never won a title but I would have to agree with Tom on that."

Because of a bad back, which was injured while serving in the U.S. Army in the mid-70s, Fulford has his good and bad days on the PBA50 Tour.

"I decided that I felt well enough to go full time this year," said Fulford, who has bowled in PBA50 events since 2003. "The best I can be is 90 percent. It's something I just have to deal with. Just to be able to be out here with all these guys is great. Even though realistically I can't be competitive day-in and day-out, I go into it thinking I can win, otherwise, why show up?"

Despite his back ailment, Fulford did throw a 300 game in the PBA50 National Championship, the final tournament of the season.

"Until I learned I got the (sportsmanship) award the 300 game was probably the highlight of the season and to do it in the last tournament of the season was extra special," said Fulford, who began bowling in PBA competition in 1986.

"I learned early on how important it was to be respectful of everyone in the sport, from the players, to the fans, sponsors and proprietors. Without them we couldn't do it."

Among other top vote-getters for the award were Paul McCordic, John Dudak, Warren Burr and Sam Maccarone.

The Dick Weber Sportsmanship Award is named after the late PBA Hall of Famer who among his many accomplishments in the sport won 30 PBA Tour and six PBA50 Tour titles.

# "Dead Money" Needs New Name in Defense of PBA Team Challenge Title

Underdog team of friends to return to South Point in Las Vegas for second annual PBA team event

LAS VEGAS – A year ago, an underdog team of friends calling themselves "Dead Money," pulled off a stunning upset when they won the inaugural Professional Bowlers Association Team Challenge at South Point Bowling Plaza.

The team, consisting of five players with a combined total of one PBA Tour title, was named after a poker term related to money left in the pot by players who have folded their hands. But after winning the 2015 PBA Team Challenge, teammates Danielle McEwan, Alex Cavagnaro, Matt O'Grady, Matt McNiel and Anthony Pepe (the winner of the 2014 PBA Cheetah Open) will no longer be considered "dead money" when they return to the PBA Fall Classic presented by South Point, Oct. 29-Nov. 2.

The Fall Classic will get underway when Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., opens defense of his PBA Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open title, Oct. 29-30. The PBA Tour title event will include two eight-game qualifying rounds at 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Saturday, followed by two eight-game match play rounds for the top 16 qualifiers on Sunday at 8:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. The top five stepladder finals will follow at approximately 5:30 p.m. All times are Pacific

Team competition begins on Monday, Oct. 31, with team qualifying rounds at 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., followed by a 10-game round of Baker format match play Tuesday at 9 a.m. The top four teams will bowl in the Baker format stepladder finals at approximately 3 p.m. Tuesday.

Both the PBA Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open and the PBA Team Challenge are open to non-members as well as members. The entry fee for the Las Vegas Open is \$300 for members and \$350 for non-members; the entry



fees for the PBA Team Challenge are \$500 for each member and \$600 for each non-member.

In 2015, Dead Money proved chemistry among teammates is vital to success when it upset "4 Majors and 100 at 1," a team representing 46 PBA Tour titles (PBA Tour champions Bill O'Neill, Tommy Jones, Wes Malott, Jason Belmonte and Tom Daugherty), but the underdogs upset the favored "4 Majors," 497-452.

Both teams will return to the PBA Team Challenge as contenders for the projected \$30,000 top prize along with – new this year – PBA Tour titles for each winning team member. Dead Money returns with its lineup intact. "4 Majors" will be the unofficially-named "5 Majors" with Chris Barnes back in the lineup (Daugherty filled in for Barnes who was recovering from surgery in 2015). With Barnes joining Malott, Belmonte, Jones and O'Neill, the "5 Majors" now represent a combined 64 PBA Tour titles including 13 majors.

Also in the 2016 field is a potent team of Brunswick staff members (PBA Hall of Famers Parker Bohn III and Walter Ray Williams Jr. plus Tour champions Ciminelli, Sean Rash and Tom Smallwood); a star-studded international team (England's Dom Barrett and Stuart Williams, Sweden's Martin Larsen and Jesper Svensson, and Finland's Osku Palermaa), and a number of mixed-identity teams hoping to capture Dead Money's magical chemistry.

Both the PBAL draft and preliminary rounds of the U.S. Open also will be video-streamed live on Xtra Frame.





# Wes Malott Leads Field Heading into PBA Badger Open Finals On CBS Sports Network Wednesday at 6 p.m.

ALLEN PARK, Mich. — Ten-time PBA Tour champion Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, makes his first PBA Summer/Fall Swing television appearance as top qualifier in the PBA Badger Open finals Wednesday at 6 p.m. on the CBS Sports Network.

Malott, the 2008-09 Player of the Year, earned top qualifier honors by beating 2011-12 Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., 226-162, in the final position round match at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit.



Also qualifying for the CBS Sports Network telecast were Canadians Graham Fach of Guelph, Ontario, and Quebec City native Francois Lavoie, who now lives in Wichita, Kan. Both are contenders for 2016 PBA Rookie of the Year honors.

Lavoie will meet three-time reigning PBA Player of the Year and 12-time Tour winner Jason Belmonte of Australia in the opening stepladder match. Belmonte, who finished third in the Wolf Open, will be trying for his first win in 2016. Belmonte claimed the fifth spot in the Badger finals when Denmark's Thomas Larsen missed a spare in the 10th frame of his position round match.

The winner of the opening match will meet Fach, who won the Barbasol PBA Players Championship for his first title earlier in the year to become the first Canadian to win a PBA Tour title.


The winner of the second match will meet Rash in the semifinal. Rash will be trying for his 10th PBA Tour win, which would make him eligible for future PBA Hall of Fame consideration

The Badger Open is the third and final animal pattern event, all three of which served as qualifying stages in determining the finalists for the PBA Detroit Open, which is the fourth PBA Tour title event included in the PBA Fall Swing. The Badger Open winner also earns an automatic berth in the King of the Swing finale to the Fall Swing television series.

The PBA Fall Swing is one of the PBA Tour's most challenging events, requiring players to perform at a high level on three distinctly different lane conditioning patterns (the short 32-foot Wolf pattern, flat 40-foot Bear pattern and the long 52-foot Badger pattern). Overall performances on all three lane conditions determined the Detroit Open finalists.

The Fall Swing on CBSSN continues with the Detroit Open on Oct. 12 and concludes with the King of the Swing special event on Oct. 19 at 6 p.m.

made the adjustment I needed to make to get to the pocket," Tackett said. "It was just a matter of did I have enough time to catch him.

"I've been in that position before where you needed a strike to win the match, and those always seem to be more satisfying when you win that way," he continued.

It was Tackett's first win on national television. He won his previous titles in the PBA Xtra Frame Storm Open earlier this season and the 2015 Lubbock Sports Open. Both events were streamed live on PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame.

Svensson, a leading contender for PBA Player of the Year honors after winning the PBA Rookie of the Year in 2015, is the first player to win five PBA Tour titles by age 21. Earlier in the year, he became the youngest player ever to win the FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions followed by wins in the Brunswick Euro Challenge in Munich, Germany and the WBT Thailand in Bangkok. He won his first two titles in 2015.

The stepladder final began with No. 4 qualifier John Szczerbinski of N. Tonawanda, N.Y., defeating No. 5 qualifier and one-time Tour winner Jon Van Hees of Charlestown, R.I., 207-183. In match two, Szczerbinski defeated two-time Tour winner Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz., 232-184, to advance to the semifinal match against Tackett. Tackett then ended Szczerbinski's bid for his first title in the semifinal match, 193-183.

Fall Swing telecasts on CBSSN continue with the Badger Open on Oct. 5, followed by the Detroit Open on Oct. 12 and the King of the Swing special event on Oct. 19. All shows air at 9 p.m. ET. With his victory, Tackett joined Wolf Open titlist Tom Daugherty as the first two players to earn berths in the King of the Swing telecast, which will feature the four PBA Fall Swing title winners plus the player who finishes highest in overall points without winning a title.



organized by fellow PBA Tour competitor Sean Rash. The "strips" pattern involved what PBA Xtra Frame announce Randy Pedersen called "moguls" - alternating three-board peaks of heavy oil next to four-board valleys of very little oil across the lanes. After finding the condition wasn't playing the way he had hoped, Ciminelli moved inside and struck on five of his first six shots to build a big enough lead to hold on. Raymond, a sixth-year PBA member who was trying for his first PBA Tour title, was behind by 43 pins in the fifth frame, but made a ball change and threw five strikes in a row to get back into the match. Needing three strikes in the 10th to tie Ciminelli and force a rolloff, he left the 6-10 on his second try in the final frame.

Raymond advanced to the title match with a comefrom-behind 207-193 win over Kristopher Prather of Milton, Fla., ending Prather's bid for his first PBA Tour title. Prather led into the final frame as Raymond struggled to find the pocket on the PBA "strips" lane condition, which he had selected for the match. But after rolling only one strike in the first seven frames, Raymond put together a late string of four strikes to take the lead and he won the match when Prather, needing a strike, left a solid 7 pin on his first shot in the 10th frame.

Prather spoiled PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr.'s bid for his first PBA Tour title since winning the 2010 USBC Masters, 224-191, in the first match of the four-player stepladder finals. Prather, as the higher qualifier, selected the flat U.S. Open lane condition for the match and threw an early turkey to take a 23-pin lead after five frames that Williams was unable to overcome.

The Xtra Frame PBA Tour Series continues next weekend when Sawgrass Lanes in Tamarac, Fla., hosts the PBA Reality Check Tamarac Open presented by Xtra Frame. The series, which will reward the overall points leader with a \$10,000 bonus, concludes with the PBA Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open Oct. 31-Nov. 1.
