ENTRIES CLOSE October 29, 2014



It has been announced that a special committee has been formed to study the possibility of changing bowling's scoring system, officially in effect since 1895 when the American Bowling Congress was founded in New York City. Louis Stein is the man credited with putting together the details at that historic gathering.

Stein was active in all areas of bowling and for a long time was the proprietor of a six lane center near Times Square.

He often attended tournaments with the late Pat Mc-Donough, who covered the Yankees as a top baseball writer for the World Telegram and was a pioneer bowling columnist, starting in the late1920s.

At one event scorekeepers were needed and Mc-Donough volunteered Stein for the job.

"Does that old man know how to keep score?" he was asked. McDonough was quick to reply.

"Not only does he know how to keep score, he invented how to keep score."

There is no doubt that scoring bowling is not the easiest task and now that automatic computers do the tallying fewer bowlers are on the ball if personal scoring is required.

Stein was not really recognized for creative efforts, was elected to the ABC Hall of Fame in 1997, 102 years after the system was approved.

Also gaining headway are renewed efforts to have bowling accepted as an Olympic medal sport, a dream that has been chased for more than half a century.

The nearest bowling game was in the 1988 Games in Seoul, South Korea when bowling was featured as an exhibition sport. It was a match watered down version of bowling with only 24 participants, male and female.

Bowing has been accepted as a medal sport in numerous international competitions such as Pan American Games, World Games, Tournament of the Americas and others.

The sport also has had a presence at Olympic competition, often a bowling center facility where athletes were welcome to bowl, mingle and enjoy various video games as well as a variety of snacks. Officials were brought up to date on the advantages of bowling as a worldwide sport played in well organized settings by bowling federations in more than 120 nations.

Brunswick has been the major sponsor and the driving force behind the Olympic bids, but the company is now in the process of eliminating its bowling properties so won't be as active in the quest.

Hitting the Ground Running



Frank DeSocio

After a six month search to replace former BPAA Executive Director Steve Johnson, the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America named Proprietor Frank DeSocio its 11th Executive Director. The announcement was made May 11, and DeSocio was on the job July 1 immediately following International Bowl Expo.

DeSocio and his wife Cathy, who is the immediate BPAA Past-President, own a chain of bowling centers in Kansas and Oklahoma. After accepting the new job, DeSocio resigned as President of Strike Ten Entertainment, the marketing arm for bowling that he has been involved with for more than a decade. A search for his replacement at STE is ongoing.

BPAA President Tom Martino had high praise for Executive Committee Chairman David Spiegel and his seven member committee, saying "BPAA is very pleased to name Frank as executive director. His bowling, sales and marketing background, as well as extensive industry contacts will be a great asset."

Indeed, it appears that BPAA was not ready to hire another leader from outside the industry and endure a year or two of the learning curve. Shortly after DeSocio was hired, the United States Bowling Congress, housed in the same building with BPAA, made a similar decision in promoting Chad Murphy to its Executive Director position.

Desocio has been so busy since day one of his new job that it took a couple of months to schedule this interview for the BNN. He was very apologetic that it took so long, but also made it clear that he is working very hard to make BPAA as good as it can be.

Right after Steve Johnson left, we wrote an editorial urging BPAA and USBC to hire from within. When did you first know you were being considered for the job? Were you surprised when they contacted you?

I was more honored than surprised. There was a lot of talk about who would be best qualified to replace Steve, and I was told my name came up with the search committee. When they contacted me, I had to discuss it with my family, and we were able to come to an agreement and arrangement that would work for both parties.

Will you be living in Arlington, or commuting from Wichita?

Normally, I will spend four days a week in Arlington . . . but they are long days. My work ethic is similar to a proprietor . . . lead by example first in and last out to the office. Most weekends I am home with the family.

You have been involved in bowling for many years, I am sure you hit the ground running. Give us a few of your short and long term goals for both BPAA and for the Bowling Industry in general.

One of our top goals will be to restore Bowl Expo to the attendance levels it once had. It has always been profitable, but less in recent years. To do that, we will promote it more; bring in more dynamic speakers like President Bush and more of that stature. Think about it – if you are a small center operator in Iowa, it is a big deal to belong to an organization that makes that type of speakers and education available, not to mention all of the ways you can save money and make money by attending Expo. As for bowling in general, we just want it to grow and get better, and we will do whatever it takes to help that along, especially in areas like youth bowling. We have a lot of work to do. Good things are happening, but it can always be better.

What is your reaction to the bombshell announcement from Brunswick, and specifically, how will it affect BPAA and Bowl Expo?

I don't think it will have anything close to the negative impact that some are predicting. From what I have seen, Tom Shannon is a very smart businessman; and we have already learned that all of those rumors about eliminating leagues from the centers are untrue. It is just going to take some time to see how it all plays out. But I think in the long run, it could be very good for bowling to have an energetic company behind all those centers.

What about the products business?

Again, it depends on who buys it, but if it is the right party, it could mean growth and more profit. It is amazing what can happen when energy and fresh ideas are pumped into any company or organization.

Still, if you were representing Strike Ten, as you did for more than a decade, or the PBA, and you were trying to sell bowling to a potential sponsor, and they ask you why they should invest in bowling when its number one brand is leaving the indus-

A lot of people are saying that the USBC Convention was a pep rally that ignored any problems - given that their membership losses directly affect BPAA center business, do you think they need to develop a better plan for future membership? Any suggestions?

Well, first, your framing of the question is a little negative. I didn't get that impression at all. I thought they did a good job with the convention, and my impression was that most of the delegates and everyone else who attended went home feeling better about USBC than when they arrived.

That is why I threw in the part about their decisions having a direct impact on proprietors ... so you are saying that you have confidence in Chad Murphy and Jason Overstreet and their staff to turn things around and improve USBC and in turn help proprietors and bowling in general? Yes.

Are Traditional centers in big trouble? Is the future one where we see mostly FEC's - or is there a plan to promote Hybrids, where both traditional league and recreation work together? What percentage of proprietors still believe in bowling as a sport? I'm suggesting it has dropped from over 80% to under 50%... I don't know . . . but I can tell you that I believe in the sport and what USBC is doing, and all of the proprietors I spend time with out in the field with seem to believe in the sport side of bowling. There is room in our industry for all types of centers, and whatever their methods and business practices are, we will try to help them be successful and make a profit. That is what BPAA has always done, and what we will continue to do.

You and Cathy, and Cathy's dad before you, have always promoted and supported the PBA. How can BPAA help PBA? We heard recently that there was an attempt to bring the PBA to Arlington before they decided to make their HQ with Luby Publishing in Chicago?

Yes, there was some discussion, but it just did not work out. You should speak to Tom Clark about why they made the decisions they did. Regarding our support for the PBA, it is as strong as it has ever been and we wish them much success. We will always be willing to help as long as it makes sense for both sides and for our membership. BPAA is in support of a strong Professional Bowling Association!

What about the U.S. Opens and the Family Tournaments? We heard that BPAA has eliminated its Tournament Committee?

No, that is not true. We still have a tournament committee, but we have contracted the U.S. Opens and the All American Family Tournament to the USBC. They have some very qualified tournament people and over the years they have done a good job with tournaments. When our board looks at tournaments, they see them usually as something that cost us money instead of a profit item; so we decided to try this new arrangement with USBC to see how it works.

try, what would you tell them?

I would tell them that bowling is such a great opportunity that somebody was just willing to invest \$270 million to buy a group of centers; and that many others are interested in the products side because they know what a good business it is. Don't forget, we hope . . . that whoever buys Brunswick Products will pay rights fees for many years, so the Brunswick brand is going to be a part of bowling for a long, long time.

How is the search going for your replacement at Strike Ten? Why didn't they just promote John Harbuck?

I am not a part of that search committee, so I don't know details, but I understand that the board just wanted to explore options . . . and John is one of the candidates who may get the job.

How will BPAA be involved in the ITRC and the IBMHF, and what more can be done to make those two parts of the IBC successful?

I've been involved in the operation of the Training Center since it was built, and I am proud of all of the things we have accomplished with Team USA, and seminars and clinics, and visits from international teams, and youth bowling. We will continue those programs and add more. Regarding the museum, there are some things in the works that I cannot talk about right now, but we will continue to support the museum as much as possible.

Given the progress being made by World Bowling, shouldn't they also office inside the IBC? Has there been any discussion of that?

That is not a bad idea . . . but there has been no discussion that I am aware of. We would be willing to sit down with Kevin Dornberger to talk about it if he thinks it might work for all of us.







My final thoughts on this subject are: A. Most league bowlers are not going to get rich winning a league. B. I personally refuse to allow any one person or any one event the power to keep me from participating in the sport I have loved and enjoyed for over 50 years.

over half the center! The "A" qualifying squad was off and rolling with 48 entries (more entries than both squads last year!). This was going to be big! Not only big but exciting as the field had not only two past Glover Champions (Eddie VanDaniker and Jeff Frankos) bowling, but an excellent sprinkling of top bowlers from our state and Nevada. Two 300 games were rolled in this squad, one by Steve Smith of San Diego and the other by Robert Piroozshad of Mission Viejo. Those two perfectos guaranteed both their spots in the Top 12 from this squad. Piroozshad came in as the top qualifier with +369 (averaging 252) and Smith came in third with +331. Smith was presented with \$100 cash by Carol Glover for rolling the first 300 of the event.

The "B" squad took place later in the day at 5 p.m. and drew 33 entries (which brought a grand total of 81 entries this year), but one entrant emerged from out of nowhere and bowlers began to take notice. This entrant from Oakland was Dupree Dickey and he worked his way up to the number one spot for the "B" squad with +296 (averaging 242). Another notable bowler making the cut this squad was David Haynes of Las Vegas who is currently the point's leader for the PBA Regionals, West Division. He came in sixth with +216 (averaging 230).

Twenty bowlers returned on Sunday morning to bowl in the Match Play Finals (12 from the "A" squad and 8 from the "B" squad). At this point, Robert Piroozshad was still standing in the number one position with (1769). The excitement started to escalate when Bakersfield's Joe Smith, bowling his seventh game of the day, bowled a 300 against Andrew Graff of Las Vegas but really climaxed when it came to determine the Top 5 for the Step Ladder Final and Zack Newman, from Bakersfield and Justin Ziegler, from Corona, tied with 3400 after the tenth/ position round game! To break the tie the two had to have a one game roll-off to determine who would be the top seed for the Step Ladder Finals. Ziegler defeated Newman in a close game 228-221. Ziegler, who has just been bowling for five years, has quickly made his presence known, as he placed 8th this year in the USBC Nationals in the Singles event in Reno and occasionally bowls in Regional events.

On to the Step Ladder Finals where fifth seed Eric Forkel of Las Vegas took on fourth seed Dupree Dickey where Dickey won 277-238. Dickey then took on third seed David Haynes. This match was close and then Dickey left a 6-7 split in the 8th frame and he calmly proceeded to pick it up and the momentum totally shifted his direction defeating Haynes 217-214. Next up was Bakersfield's Zack Newman who was competing in the Glover Step Ladder Finals for the third time in his career. Dickey started this match full speed ahead with a turkey while Newman had strike, spare, strike. The fourth frame as Dickey started his approach he nearly lost his ball in his release but gathered it back, calmly, and started over again! All this excitement was starting to come to realization for Dickey as he calmly walk off the lane after he bowled to make a post on Facebook while waiting his next turn. His talent was there throughout this match as well as he easily defeated Newman 235-173 and was ready to take on top seed Ziegler. This final match started off with Ziegler leading with a double and Dickey starting with a spare but after that it was a string of eight strikes that made the pace tough for Ziegler to maintain as he missed a ten pin in the sixth frame. Dickey won the final match against Ziegler 255-226 to win the 8th annual Don Glover Masters. Dupree Dickey, 29, has been bowling for 8 years and was just coming off winning the A Mitchell team event in Ohio 3 months ago. He placed fourth in the Bowlers Journal event in Reno last year. Not a Regional bowler, he says he bowls in local tournaments. He would like to thank and recognize Relax, Release, Repeat (shirt company) and American Dream Development (his sponsor). Congratulations, Dupree!! You won an event that this year had over \$13,900 in its prize fund.
