Late/Early Timing by Robert Ellison

There two "timing" in bowling when we swing the ball to the foul line.

One is "early" timing and the second is "late" timing.

Early timing- this is when your armswing is faster than your feet, the ball will get ahead of your sliding foot. This is due to your arm reaching the release point of ball before your feet. This closes your shoulders are you approach the foul line.

Early timing will puts the body in a poor position at delivery. This creates the ball to arrive at the line ahead of the body- causing excessive waist bend rather than knee bend. Shoulders end up too far forward in a position of weak leverage. This will make it difficult to project the ball toward the target and will cause inaccuracy and a weaker release.

Many bowlers develop early timing from standing too far back on the approach. Standing too far back will give the body the feeling that it has to take off, taking steps that are bigger than natural to make up the distance to the foul line. This will cause the ball to drop into the swing too quickly and cause you to run up to the line to cover the distance of the approach. Fast feet are a classic symptom of an early start.

Moving up on the approach may be one solution to a fast approach.

Fixing early timing either by pushing the ball later or pushing the ball up will delay the ball's entry into the swing- and RELAX. You do not need to push the ball into the back swing in a way to rush the swing; by pushing the ball back will only rush it into the swing, creating early timing. Adjustment get the ball into the swing later, or delay the swing, will make the feet feel slower. Keep your mental mind clear, stay calm and let the ball do the work.

Late Timing- this is when your armswing is "slow", or sliding feet arrives first, then ball will go out. Your feet reaches the release point before your arm. This creates opening your shoulders as you approach the foul line.

Missing the target to the left from pulling the ball can be the direct result of late timing. Pulling the down swing to bring the ball back in time at the finish often leads to pulling the ball left of the target. Pulling the ball is the most common reaction to late timing.

If this keeps happening, correcting late timing can restore accuracy.

Loosen up the swing and push the ball out sooner with the right leg to improve the timing of the back swing. Then it no longer will be necessary to pull the ball in the down swing to catch the ball up to the body. Fixing the late start will allow the arm to relax in the down swing and improve

Don't try to control your arm swing because this will create bad timing, muscles tighten which results in getting further off-timing.

An inaccurate arm swing is often caused by pushing the bowling ball to the right or left during the first step. Push the ball out straight and down toward the right foot during the first step and your armswing will get off to a good, straight start. Improper timing can throw your armswing off- thus the "early" or "late" timing of ball arriving at the foul line. It is important to remember your armswing should NEVER vary. Keep a loose, natural armswing - "Pendulum Armswing." This is a major adjustment to regaining your timing

It is very important to be CONSISTENT in your walk and armswing.

Developing consistency in your bowling game is the first requirement to becoming a truly great



INDIO — It is people like Stacy Long that make bowling great. I REPEAT: "It is people like STACY LONG that make bowling great. Stacy is a volunteer who devotes numerous hours to a youth program without pay.

Stacy is a Special Education teacher in the Desert Sands School District. She teaches challenged children in Indio. On Saturdays she is at FANTASY LANES leading the youth program, supervising five coaches and several dozen young bowlers. Stacy got involved ten years ago when her daughters started bowling and has continued giving her time since the girls moved on. About six years ago Stacy became TOP BANANA of the desert's top youth program.

Stacy's program is divided into two groups: Pee Wee and Junior. The Pee Wees are bumper bowlers from age four to whenever they are old enough to discard the rails. Juniors are graduated Pee Wees up to age nineteen.

Stacy is proud of her program for two reasons. First, every youngster earns scholarship money. This is the case no matter how well they bowl.

The least talented youngster can earn education funds through participation and improvement. Second, any youth may participate in the program. Youngsters with physical disabilities and intellectual challenges are welcome. At the time of this writing Fantasy Lanes has one young bowler with cerebal palsy and two who are autistic. They love bowling and enjoy competing with other kids.

WEST COVINA—We returned to West Covina Lanes where we saw 191 entries come out on Saturday and find excitement in the event. The cut scores were +59 for the men and +6 for the women, on a semi-tough shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) were Manny Loria +43, Tom Dahl, Mike Bousquet +31, and Wendy Soo Hoo -7. Super Seniors are men 63 and over. For the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 48 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The High qualifiers were Jerry Chang for the men with a +128. For the women it was Deborah Martin with a +113. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1,170. Jerry would draw the score and he drew a 424. We had one bowler that bowled this score; it was Jack Trongale during the 12 pm squad. Jack says it is the best 424 he has ever bowled well at \$2.76 per pin (I would hope so:-) Therefore, we will estimate the Match Series at \$350 at Foothill Lanes event. Kevin Valmonte was standing for the 3-6-9 roll-off; he got the chance to go for \$900. He was not able to get all five strikes or nine counts so he takes home a consolation of \$50. The pot will be at \$1,000 at Foothill Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Samson Kong and Jerry Chang with a 1422 for \$120. Finishing in second was Jerry Chang and Kenny Kwan with a 1414 for \$100. There was a total of \$1,310 paid out in doubles and 24 paid spots with low to cash of 1349.

After bowling the semi-fi-

nals, finishing in first was Jeff Wu with a +133 and in second was Jerry Chang at a +106. He will sit out the first round of the single elim finals. Jeff had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Jeff drew a 223. After a review of all the scores we had two bowlers who shot that score. They were David Dittlinger and John Armenia. Each will get \$1,750. We still have five full pots and now a sixth pot started, so next week we will go for \$3,500 again.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Wendy Soo Hoo, Kent Maruyama, Allan Basto, Armand Garcia, Manny Loria, Deborah Martin, and Thomas Licauco. Each got \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Natalie Perenishko, Speedy Bryant, Holden Au, and Dominador La Guardia with each getting checks of

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses were paying a low of \$33, Jerry Chang, to a high of \$61, Art Widsor. In one match, it was George Covarrubias the fourteenth seed versus Jerry Change the second seed. This was another of our low scoring matches where Jerry advancing with a 189/239 to 148/188 final. In the other match, it was Art Windsor the third seed versus Jiradej Harnpatanakitpanch the fifteenth seed. This was another one of the low scoring matches as the lanes were tough at this point of the night. Jiradej would finish with a 164/204 to 137/190 to advance. Art and George finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$112.50 each.

Our semi-final match was all set and would pit the secthe semis against each other. In the weekly "horses", we would see Jerry paying \$33 and Jiradej paying \$54 if they would win their match. Jiradej would lead off the match with a spare. Jerry would open in the first three frames, giving Jiradej a lead of 22 pins at that point. 

The field was set and the Match Play Semi-Finals were bowled to determine the Top Five for the Step-Ladder Finals.

Seeded fifth was Tony Knuth of Oceanside against fourth seed Mason Sherman of Woodland Hills. This match was close with both bowlers having a double going into the tenth but Sherman took the match 193-171. Next up for Sherman to face was third seed Jess Stayrook of Bakersfield, the only leftie in the Top 5. Sherman started stringing strikes in the sixth that shut Stayrook out of the match 230-196, even though Stayrook ended with a turkey in the tenth. Sherman progressed on to take on second seed Eddie Van Daniker of Chatsworth. This was again another close match but Sherman had a split in the 9th which cost him and he was defeated 189-202 which lead the way for second seed Van Daniker to bowl top seed Dave Wodka in the final match. Van Daniker started the game hot with a double while Wodka, 41, started out steady but threw a split in the fourth frame and then a missed single pin in the fifth put his game in trouble. Although neither Wodka nor Van Daniker, 26, were stringing strikes, it was a double for Van Daniker in the eighth and ninth that sealed the deal. Van Daniker defeated Wodka 203-174. Eddie Van Daniker, Jr., became the 6th Glover Masters Scratch Champion!

Van Daniker, Jr. has been bowling since the age of 4 and is originally from Maryland, but for his 22 years of bowling, what a resume! He has (1) Regional Title/Southwest Region. He won All-Events for both the 2012 CUSBC Open Championships (where his 800 series helped him accomplish that) as well as the Las Vegas Open (with a 300 game). He is currently on the Storm/ Roto Grip/Masters Staff along with Turbo Grips. He has (95) 300 games and (37) 800 series—his highest 877. Although he's not a leftie, Don Glover would have been so proud to have him win his event! Van Daniker said he "thought this tournament was very well run and would like to thank the Glover Tournament Committee for having this event." He felt the lanes were "very challenging", but "nice scoring pace" although "spares were at a premium!" Be sure to watch as Eddie Van Daniker will be bowling in the upcoming World Series of Bowling in Las Vegas, Nov. 2-11 (he started Tour in 2006). He was at the tournament with wife Nicole, and they are expecting a daughter, Mckenzee, who is due right after the World Series of Bowling event is over!







SOUTH KOREAN CHO TOPS CHRIS BARNES FOR PTT THAILAND TITLE

BANGKOK — South Korean's Cho Young-Seon defeated 13-time PBA Tour champion Chris Barnes, 234-212, at Blu-O-Paragon in Bangkok, Thailand, Monday to win the \$32,258 top prize in the WTBA World Bowling Tour PTT Thailand Open.

In the opening three-player shoot-out match, Thailand's Annop Arromsaranon topped Chris Loschetter and UAE's Naif Oqab, 237-214-209. In the second shoot-out match, South Korea's Jang Dong-Chul eliminated reigning men's World Bowling Tour champion Mika Koivuniemi and Annop, 257-200-184. Jang then advanced to the semifinal match with a 236-210 victory over Ryan Ciminelli. Barnes, the No. 2 qualifier, then eliminated Jang, 245-235, to advance to the title match.

The race for the final three berths in the 2012 Bayer Advanced Aspirin World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals presented by the PBA now moves to Vienna, Austria, for this week's Columbia 300 Vienna Open. The final WBT qualifying event will be the AMF Australian Masters, Oct. 8-27, at Sydney.

In addition to WBT points, the final two events will award a PBA International Tour title in the men's/open division if the winner is a PBA member. Cho, who is not a PBA member, didn't earn a PBA International Tour title for his win in Thailand.

The WBT Finals will be contested as part of the PBA's ESPN World Series of Bowling IV package. Three-player stepladder finals for men and women will be conducted on Saturday, Nov. 10, on lanes specially installed in the South Point Hotel and Casino exhibition area. The men's and women's finals will kick off the PBA Tour season on ESPN, airing on Sunday, Dec. 9 at 1 p.m. ET. The winner in each division will earn \$20,000.

The reigning WBT titlists are Finland's Mika Koivuniemi and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard of Keller, Texas.

Koivuniemi retained the 2012 WBT points lead after Thailand, where he expanded his lead over Mike Fagan of Dallas from 31 to 41 points while Barnes padded his third-place status over reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill. In the women's race, two-time PBA Regional titlist **Missy Parkin of Lake Forest, Calif.**, the top woman finisher in Thailand, overtook Dorin-Ballard, who didn't compete in Thailand. PBA Tour titlist Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., and Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., remained in third and fourth place. Kulick has a four-point lead in the race for the third spot in the WBT women's stepladder finals.

World Bowling Tour points are based on a two-year cumulative total.
