Australian Cara Honeychurch Returns To Winner's Circle

LAS VEGAS—Cara Honeychurch of Melbourne, Australia, proved why she's still one of the best bowlers in the world as she struck on the first shot of her final frame to defeat Colombia's Clara Guerrero 235-225 in the championship match of the USBC Women's Challenge on Monday.

The accomplished left-hander and eight-time Professional Women's Bowling Association titlist hasn't bowled much since the PWBA ceased operations in 2003, but averaged more than 234 in four wins on the way to the title and \$25,000 top prize.

In Monday's semifinal, Honeychurch topped 26-time PWBA titlist Leanne Barrette of Elk Grove, Calif., 232-156 to advance to the championship match. But because she is now a wife and a mother, the Women's Challenge could be the final win of her career.

"I haven't thrown a ball competitively in three years, so no one is more surprised about this win than me," said Honeychurch, who was the PWBA Rookie of the Year in 2000. "I tried not to focus on the outcome and took it one shot at a time. I am satisfied with what I've accomplished in my career and to be able to leave on a good note is fantastic."

In Week 2 of the five-part, made-for-TV event on ESPN2, Honeychurch downed former Team USA member Kassy Golden of Colorado Springs, Colo., and Golden's sister, reigning U.S. Amateur champion Diandra Asbaty of Chicago to earn a spot on Monday's final show.

The unique competition, which was created by Gary Beck of Killer 'B' Promotions and aired on ESPN2 every Monday night since Sept. 11, was filmed over two days in August in a single-lane arena that was specially constructed in the middle of the Fashion Show Mall in Las Vegas.

Guerrero, the 2005 World Ranking Masters champion, has emerged as one of the world's top amateur bowlers and defeated Team USA member Stefanie Nation and former PWBA stars Kim Terrell and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard on the way to the final.

Despite battling an injured finger that required constant attention during Monday's telecast, Guerrero rattled off 10 consecutive strikes in a 280-198 win against Dorin-Ballard, a 20-time PWBA titlist, and added three more strikes to start her match against Honeychurch.

"Even though I didn't win, this is going to make me a lot stronger and motivate me to keep getting better," said Guerrero, a member of the Colombian national team. "We all came here for the sport and the love of the game, and I hope this event brings women's bowling the attention it deserves. Of course I wanted to win, but I am really happy with what I accomplished here."

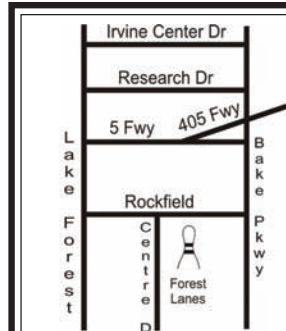
Bowl For The WCST Ebonite Singles This Weekend October 14-15 at La Habra "300"

TENPIN SLANTS

October has been quite a month for pro bowling. First, the Professional Bowlers Assn. kicked off its 2006-07 season with a major tournament, no less, the USBC Masters.

The event marked the long-awaited debut of Kelly Kulick, the popular 29-year-old right-hander who is the first distaff bowler to gain one of the coveted exemptions for the PBA Tour. If the New Jersey native manages to make just one of the TV shows, her season would have to be considered a huge success.

And speaking of something else being long-awaited, October welcomed the debut of Steve Sanders’ Generations Bowling Tour. The GBT, a new competition for senior men and women pros, got off to a flying start with 75 entrants competing in the GBT Bay City (Mich.) Open.

The winner, in case you missed it, was Hall of Famer Mark Roth, who edged Dale Eagle, 237-234, in the championship match. Roth, in recording his 37th national title, collected a rather generous \$13,500 first-place prize.

Eagle, undoubtedly, was delighted with his \$8,800 runner-up check. That’s \$800 more than what the PBA pays its Senior Tour winners.

So kudos to Steve Sanders, who spent a ton of his own money in getting the GBT started. Tenpin Slants still wishes that Sanders, President of Pinnacle Events Inc., had taken over the PWBA (Professional Women Bowlers Assn.) Tour a couple of years ago. But after being rebuffed at every turn, Sanders threw up his hands and concentrated his remarkable promotional abilities on the GBT. A lot of insiders thought Sanders would never get the GBT off the ground. Guess who has the last laugh now.

The GBT, by the way, has 35 scheduled events during its inaugural season. That’s about four times as many tournaments as the PBA stages for its senior membership. The PBA, however, says it is going to add more events to its 2007 Senior Tour. Ain’t competition grand?

Did you watch the USBC Women’s Challenge? The unique promotion, featuring 16 femme stars, was conducted at the Fashion Mall in the heart of the busy Las Vegas Strip. The two-day competition, which was taped and shown over five Monday nights by ESPN2, ended on Oct. 9.

The winner, as previously announced in the Bowlers Journal International magazine, was Australia’s Cara Honeychurch, who received \$25,000. That’s not bad for just two-day’s “work.”

Hats off to the USBC—and co-host Gary Beck’s Killer B Productions—for staging the Women’s Challenge.

They accomplished what they set out to do: To focus the national spotlight on women’s bowling in the hopes that someone (Bill Gates or Donald Trump?) would step forward and revive the dormant women’s pro tour. But don’t hold your breath.

Instead, it seems that the USBC Women’s Challenge has created a minor controversy of sorts by knowledgeable Las Vegas residents.

For example, Mike Monyak, the Executive Director of Coast Bowling for the chain of first-class Casino Resorts bowling centers, says: “It (the USBC Women’s Challenge) wasn’t a bowling contest, it was a beauty contest. Otherwise, how could they not invite Wendy Macpherson, who’s undoubtedly the best woman bowler in the world, as one of the 16 participants?”

“Besides,” added Monyak, a 220-average bowler who’s a member of the Southern Nevada Bowling Hall of Fame, “Wendy lives in Henderson, which is just a stone’s throw away, so to speak.”

Echoing Monyak’s sentiments was Char Hammel, who will be defending her Golden Ladies Classic title on March 5-8 at The Orleans. “There were a lot of other women that were overlooked besides Wendy Macpherson,” Hammel said. “What about Kelly Kulick, Liz Johnson or Michele Feldman? I think the USBC missed the boat.”

The Golden Ladies Classic, by the way, is Jeanette Robinson’s baby, having originated the popular event 17 years ago at the old Showboat Bowling Center.

Jeanette, a USBC Hall of Famer, eventually moved the Golden Ladies Classic to The Orleans, where she is the house pro.

She says entries for Golden Ladies Classic ’07 are now being accepted. The tournament is for those who are 50 or older. For details, call Jeanette at 1-888-365-7111, a toll-free number.

The entry fee is \$150, all of which goes into the prize fund, along with added money. Last March, added monies from The Orleans and co-sponsor Storm Products totaled \$3,070. It’s no wonder that the Golden Ladies Classic is considered one of the best bargains in bowling.

And, men, if your wife is a bowler who qualifies, a paid entry into the tournament would make a great Christmas gift.

Duke Hopes To Continue Success In Milwaukee at USBC Masters

GREENDALE—As far as Norm Duke is concerned, he's got some unfinished business to take care of at the 2006 United States Bowling Congress Masters.

After finishing second at the Masters last year, the Denny's PBA Tour veteran and top-ranked player hopes to build on last season's performance and repeat the magic he found in 1993 when he won the event.

"I bowled great last year, but I fell a little short and I've got some room for improvement," said Duke, who lost to Mike Scroggins by seven pins in the championship match. "The Masters has been and will continue to be one of the greatest events that we bowl, and I love the fact that it starts off the official season because it gives me more time to prepare."

Duke will be joined by approximately 450 of the best professional and amateur bowlers in the world at the Masters, the sport's most prestigious event, from Oct. 24-29 in suburban Milwaukee.

For the third consecutive year, the qualifying and match play rounds will be contested at AMF Bowlero, a bowling center Duke has come to love. In addition to his second place finish in 2005, Duke finished ninth in October 2004. "Past performances do not indicate future performances, but I do know that there are certain venues that people bowl well in," Duke said. "I won three times in Tucson, and every time I walked into Tucson, everyone knew I was the man to beat. If I were to put together four or five years of that type of performances here, I would get that feeling."

Duke said the Masters takes on even more importance this year than it has in years past. As a major on the Denny's PBA Tour, bowlers will be competing for a top prize of \$100,000 and an overall prize fund of \$350,000.

Standard PBA Tour events now pay \$25,000 for first and feature an overall prize fund of \$180,700, a reduction of 20 percent over past seasons.

A USBC Hall of Famer, Duke has established himself as one of the stars on the PBA Tour over his career. He has 23 titles and more than \$2.2 million in career earnings. A resident of Clermont, Fla., he was the PBA Player of the Year in 1994 and 2000.

In addition to competing in the Masters, Duke will once again take part in the second annual USBC Bowlfest, which will take place the evening of Oct. 28 at the Wisconsin Exposition Center, the site of the Masters finals. Duke, who was in Milwaukee recently to help promote the Masters, is scheduled to be joined by fellow pro stars Chris Barnes, Parker Bohn III, Brian Voss and Mike Machuga as the group will perform their famous trick shots.

Bowlfest will also feature a "Legends and Ladies" match with Carmen Salvino, Marshall Holman, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard and Kim Terrell as well as a Team USA exhibition match.

The Masters is open to all USBC members with a 190 or higher average. For entry information, visit bowl.com or contact Tom Boedecker at (800) 514-2695, ext. 3415 or by e-mail at Tom.Boedecker@bowl.com.

The televised finals of the USBC Masters will be held on Oct. 29 at 1 p.m. EST at the Wisconsin Exposition Center, located at State Fair Park in the Milwaukee suburb of West Allis, Wis. To purchase tickets to the finals or to Bowlfest, visit bowl.com or call (800) 514-2695, ext. 3283.


