

\$7,975 In SMART Scholarship Awarded In **Shootout Action At Cal Bowl and Parkway Bowl** Just 8 More Shootout Events To Go With Over \$48K Up For Grabs

LAKEWOOD - The Bowling Centers of Southern California's Summer Shootout held two events over the past two weekends at Cal Bowl in Lakewood and Parkway Bowl in El Cajon. 120 bowlers took the lanes for the chance at part of the \$7,975 awarded in these two events At Cal Bowl, in the A Division, Avery Domaguin took down top-seed Daniel Hong for the title and \$425 scholarship. Other cashers in the A Division were Daniel Hong \$475, Benaiah McElroy \$325, Patrick Sablan \$200 and Ian Garcia \$150. In B Divi-

sion action, Jacob Major took the title with a huge 299 game for \$485 over Matthew Beck who banked \$205. Jai Kankariya \$290, Stephanie Hong \$175 and Ethan Santos \$130 rounded out the cashers. In the C Division, Ezekiel De-Guzman beat top-seed Bailey Villegas for the title and \$350 each for the bowlers. Chason Hou \$205, Cailyn Robey \$150 and Neel Kankariya \$110 also cashed in the C Division. The D Division was taken by Sean McDougald for \$410 with Jeremy Bassett taking home \$290. Nicholas Moore \$150 and Carter Nguyen \$110 rounded

out the scholarship winners. \$5,235 in scholarship was awarded at Cal Bowl.

At Parkway Bowl, the A Division went to Elias O'Hollaren who defeated top-seed Avery Domaguin in the championship match. Both bowlers earned \$375 scholarships for their effort. The

B Division also saw the second-seed Flynn lott defeat top-seed Stephanie Hong for the title. Flynn lott earned a \$325 scholarship and Stephanie Hong \$330 for their bowling. The C Division bowlers finished as they qualified with Ezekiel DeGuzman taking the continued on page 7



The semifinal stepladder game saw Team "VIZION" enter the competition and defeat the Jeff Lewen's trio 647 to 592. Scott Hatmaker's 232 game led Team "VIZION" to victory.

Left-hander Patty Costello... She Was The Earl Anthony Of Women's Professional Bowling

It was 50 years ago this month that professional women's bowling star Patty Costello first signed a lucrative bowling contract with the AMF Staff of Champions. Patty, who is not to be confused with Pat Costello (another Hall of Fame member), was already a star in the PWBA when Woody Woodruff signed her to the AMF Staff of Champions that included female touring stars Cheryl Robinson and Paula Carter, as well as Hall of Fame members Helen Duval and Bev Ortner.

Patty was born in Washington, D.C., in 1947, but never took up the sport until the age of 16 — probably because the only bowling lanes in the nation's capital in those years were inside the White House! Today there are a few smaller bowling clubs within the District of Columbia, including Penn Social, The Eleanor D.C., and Pinstripes.

Once the Costello family moved to the Maryland suburbs, she quickly made a name for herself by winning the Maryland State Junior Girls Championship in 1962. The next year she recorded the highest game posted in the area, a 277. Costello advanced to adult leagues in 1964, and at the age of 17 was averaging 205, with a high game of 299 and series of 791.

Patty turned professional in 1969, and the following year she won 3 titles, at Wilmington, Del., Las Vegas, Nev., and Canton, Ohio. She continued her winning ways with another two titles in 1971, at AMF Strike 'n Spare Lanes in Northbrook, II., and the PWBA National Championship in Flint, Michigan.

In 1972 Costello went on an absolute annihilation of the record books with five more titles (Tucson, Ariz., Sacramento, Calif., El Cajon, Calif., another victory at the PWBA National Championship in Flint, and the Cavalcade of Stars in Wichita). The three tournaments at Sacramento, El Cajon and Flint were in succession, and prompted Mr. Woodruff to make the Costello signing AMF's number one objective.

The next couple of years were quiet for Patty, although AMF kept her busy with exhibitions and grand openings worldwide. She developed a stoic charm, seemingly indifferent to pleasure or sorrow, reminiscent of other famous professionals of the 20th Century... women like Amelia Earhart and Babe Didrikson Zaharias. Then in 1976, she retooled her game and once again broke loose, sharing Bowler of the Year honors with another famous lefty from the men's tour, Earl Anthony.

Patty posted convincing victories in 1976 at Akron, Ohio, Denver (the LPBA Women's Classic), Miami, Fla., Jamestown, N.Y., Wichita, Kan., and Tulsa. The next year she repeated in Miami. Her next victory came in 1979, at AMF All Star Lanes, in Skokie, II., followed by a win in 1980, in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and what appeared to be her final title in Peoria, II., in 1981.

For most, this would be the culmination of a tremendously successful career, with multiple titles in each of the following organizations: the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA), the Ladies Professional Bowlers Association (LPBA), and the Ladies Pro Bowlers Tour (LPBT). Another group, the Women's Professional Bowlers Association (WPBA), a merger of the PWBA and LPBA, reportedly existed for a few years before the start of the LPBT.

One of my favorite stories involving Woody Woodruff (other than the time I got lost with Dick Weber in Michigan), was with my car. When I first moved to New York from California, a major portion of my net worth was in my car — a 1979 Datsun 280ZX. This was not the car to own in the more severe winter snow climate on Long Island, as I soon learned when the side panels and true-spoke wire wheels were virtually destroyed in a couple of years. But Woody, in his own inimitable style, would stop by my office on the way to his own office along the famous carpeted aisle at AMF, and comment: "There's something wrong with this company. I've been here almost forty years and drive a Dodge Omni. You just got here and drive a 280ZX!"

But after a couple of lackluster years, Patty reinvented herself once again and came back with a vengeance in 1985, taking titles in Rockford, II., Fairhaven, Mass., and the LPBT Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas. Just like Dick Weber, another famous member of the AMF Staff of Champions, Patty kept changing her game, as the game changed (hat tip to veteran pro Bud Horn for that wonderful quote about Mr. Weber).

Among the top twenty moments in PWBA history, Patty is featured in more than any other member, including her standout years in 1972, 1976 and 1985. In addition to all of her pro titles, Costello managed to capture two classic team titles at the USBC (then WIBC) Women's Championships, in 1970 and 1972. And when she wasn't competing on the national tour stops, Costello found time to win a record 28 Women's All Star Association (WASA) events, a regional pro organization that was co-founded and managed by the incomparable Pearl Keller.

Patty's career suffered a setback late in 1977, when it was reported that her father had died of a heart attack while watching her provide commentary for a telecast. She never seemed to fully recover from that experience, suffering depression and anxiety attacks for several years, according to an article that appeared in Bowling Digest in 2002. One person that could always put a smile on Patty's face was Woody Woodruff. His fatherly affection for everyone at AMF was contagious.

Thanks to Patty, and Woody, for a lifetime of fond memories. Patty died much too young on April 16, 2009, after a bout with cancer. She was only 61. Mr. Wood-ruff also passed away in 2009, on March 13. He was 90.

There's a bit of confusion regarding the number of titles that Patty Costello won, because of the similarity to Pat Costello's name, and also the three organizations (PWBA, LPBA and LPBT) that existed during their careers. When in doubt, I followed the listing provided by the PWBA under "Past Champions." We welcome any input if individual titles have been omitted or credited to the wrong Costello.

don't know how long.

"I just go up there and spot and throw and sometimes the ball goes where I want and sometimes it doesn't," added Judy with a laugh.

Bowlers often talk about how they were "in a zone" after putting together a 300 game or 800 series. This was a day when Judy was definitely "in a zone."

"I shocked everyone," said Judy, a longtime Canoga Park resident.

Despite her magnificent performance, there was something disappointing for Judy. As luck would have it, she turned in her gem on the first week of the league season. On the initial week or two weeks of leagues, bowlers establish their average. So Judy was burdened by an excessively high 191.7 average right off the bat.

"That's a terrible way to start off," said Judy in her best pout-like voice.

Judy, a delightful presence at her two day leagues at Winnetka Bowl, hasn't sat on her laurels in the intervening years.

She smacked a 199 last year (Note: This was at age 86!) as she has tried to harvest the seeds for another "in the zone" effort.

Her bowling rhythm, unfortunately, got sidetracked about six months ago when she suffered a freak accident to her shoulder, forcing her to drop down to a 9-pound ball upon her return. But she's adjusting.

Since debuting in the Funtimers League last month, she rolled a 151 - well above her average - and is making strides to recapture her form of yesteryear.

Asked about her goals, she didn't talk about reprising her 575 or anything to do with bowling scores.

"I just want to keep moving, to not be sitting in one place all the time and keep reading good books," she said.

When informed that the Funtimers League has two bowlers still making waves at age 98, Judy said: "I hope I can still be doing that at that age. I just want to bowl as long as I can - as long as someone lets me drive. As long as I can hold the ball."

One thing seems certain: Expect Judy Statham to be around much longer on the lanes and don't be surprised if one day she's back "in her zone" of 1975.

PBA REGIONAL RECAP: DOMBROWSKI SETS UP RPI TITLE DEFENSE by Chase Kaufman

Things are heating up on the PBA Regional Tour as qualifiers for the 2023 Regional Players Invitational took place in three regions.

The reigning RPI champion Patrick Dombrowski booked a return ticket to Las Vegas with an RPI-qualifier victory this past weekend, as did Kris Koeltzow and Eugene McCune (PBA50).

PBA STRIKE IT BIG OVIEDO RPI SOUTH OPEN



In order to get to the top-third after qualifying, the bowlers would indeed have to 'Strike It Big.' Zachary Tackett did just that, averaging 250 during qualifying then holding onto the one-seed for the stepladder. Scott Anderson put together some big advancer rounds to climb to the two-seed, while Patrick Dombrowski and Kenny Ryan earned the three and four seeds.

In a tight opening match, Ryan left a single-pin on a double in the 10th frame. Dombrowski marked, which was enough for him to move on. A continuation of Dombrowski's momentum slithered into match two with the front-nine. He ended up with a 279 to Anderson's 231.

Tackett stepped into the fray, where both bowlers got off to a strong start, but splits from Tackett in the eighth, ninth, and 10th frames downed his hopes for the win. Dombrowski, the 2022 Regional Players Invitational champion, picked up his 10th career title. The top three finishers — Dombrowski, Tackett, and Anderson — all clinched a spot in this year's RPI.

PBA OKLAHOMA CITY SOUTHWEST OPEN

The PBA50 Southwest Region held their RPI qualifier last week. Nobody ran out in front during qualifying, but everyone at -29 or better moved into the first advancer round. Kris Koeltzow took the role of the pace car through the advancer rounds and eventually landed in the one-seed. PBA Jr. star Garrett Andrus earned the No. 2 seed, while Ildemaro Ruiz Jr. and François Lavoie took the final spots in the stepladder.

The two Las Vegas High Roller teammates opened the stepladder in a close match, but Ruiz Jr. moved on after a 242-231 win. Next up for Ruiz was Andrus, who led the initial eight games of qualifying. Unfortunately for Andrus, he couldn't revive that qualifying magic, losing in the stepladder, 220-196. But the chalk held in the finals anyways, as Koeltzow delivered a 234 to Ruiz Jr's 202 for his fourth regional title.

Koeltzow, Ruiz Jr., and Dallas Leong earned the spots to the regional final in Las Vegas. (Lavoie was ineligible as a top-50 player on the 2023 Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour points list, while Andrus is a PBA Jr. player.)

Continuing on with folks who get to pack their bags this winter and head to Las Vegas, Poelking Woodman Lanes, just outside of Dayton, Ohio, hosted the Central Region's PBA50 RPI qualifier. Charles Ferrell and Larry Verble topped the charts after eight games of qualifying at +268 and +261, respectively, but Eugene McCune rocketed to the top by 130 pins after a monstrous 1,069 advancer round.

That gap McCune created would keep him steady at the top of the leaderboard during match play. With a 90-pin lead over Ferrell entering the position round, a 220-198 victory for McCune kept him on top for his 29th regional title. No adjustments here when it comes to the qualifiers for the RPI; McCune, Ferrell, and Marsala all got the phone call.

The top seed, Tom Sorce, dropped out in his first match after his double-bye to Tim Foy Jr., but Foy Jr. then lost to Eric Cornog, 237-183. In the bottom half of the bracket, Sam Cooley lost his match to another Cornog, Jason, 207-193. In the Battle of Cornog (which sounds like a real battle from the 1700s), Jason delivered a 263 to Eric's 203 for his third regional title.

Bryan Hahlen led the PBA division in qualifying as names like Cortez Schenck, Darren Tang, and Jake Peters chased him down. Nonetheless, Hahlen maintained his composure and put together a 751 series to claim the one-seed in the stepladder. Schenck obtained the two-seed, while Andrew Guba and Darren Tang would battle in the opening match.

In said match, Guba couldn't get lined up on the pair and Tang advanced with ease, 244-160. In the second match, a battle between two of the West Region's powerhouses, Schenck put together a five-bagger to seal the deal in a 243-200 win. Although Hahlen had been the top dog all day, he didn't find much on the championship pair. Schenck, the region's reigning Rookie of the Year, won the battle 218-180 for his third title and \$2,500.




