Kulick Recognized with Display at The Women's Museum: An Institute for the Future, in Dallas

DALLAS _Kelly Kulick is being recognized for her accomplishments in the sport of bowling with a permanent display at the national museum, The Women's Museum: An Institute for the Future, in Dallas.

"We are excited to add professional bowler, Kelly Kulick, to the permanent exhibits at The Women's Museum," said Lyn Scott, COO, The Women's Museum.

"Kulick is an excellent role model for young athletes. We are pleased to make this addition in celebration of the Museum's 10 year anniversary."

Kulick, of Union, N.J., became the first woman to win a title in the 51-year history of the Lumber Liquidators Professional Bowlers Association Tour when she took home the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions title in January. She is nominated this year for Sportswoman of the Year by the Women's Sports Foundation.

"To be a part of something that ends up in a museum means that you've done some-

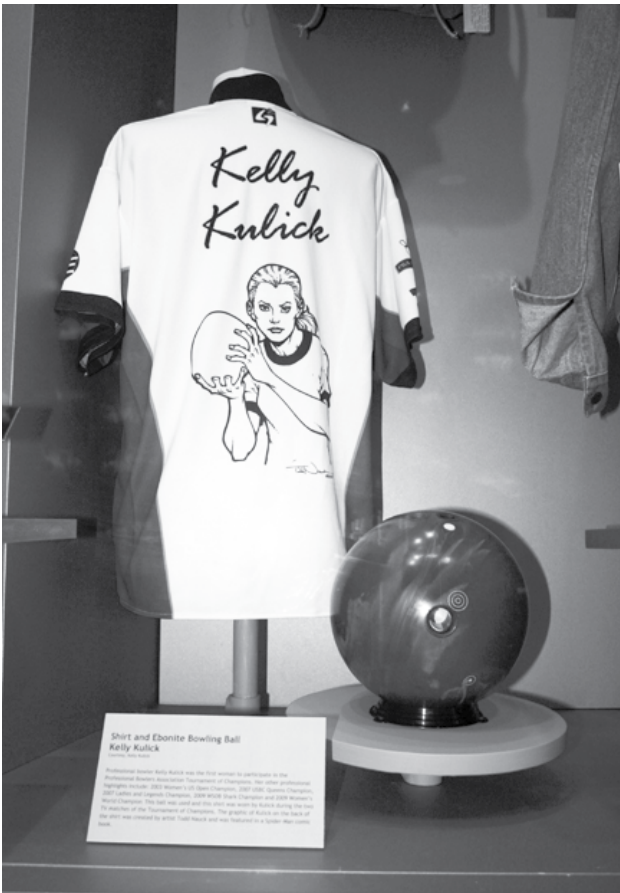
thing significant in history," said Kulick, a member of Team USA. "It's pretty astonishing. I really do feel like I'm walking in the footsteps of some great pioneer women, and it's an honor to be included among them.

"It means a lot that someone thought my accomplishments were significant enough to be included in a museum with such amazing company."

Kulick's victory in the PBA Tournament of Champions was part of an outstanding 2009-10 season.

She also won the 2009 PBA Women's World Championship, PBA Women's Series Shark Championship, the Canon Malaysian International Open, and two major women's titles - the USBC Queens and U.S. Women's Open.

PBA Adopts Rule to Employ Instant Replay as Needed

SEATTLE, Wash. (Oct. 6, 2010) – The Professional Bowlers Association has adopted a formal policy allowing the use of "instant replay" at the tournament director's discretion in nationally-televised competition.

The "instant replay rule," along with a new rule allowing coaching at all levels of PBA competition, are included in the 2010-11 Professional Bowlers Association Rule Book which went into effect on Oct. 1. The rule book can be found on pba.com under the "Resources" tab.

While "instant replay" is rarely needed in PBA competition, issues of foul line infractions and pinfall – where a pinsetter may touch a falling pin have created a handful of disputes over the years. The PBA uses a foul line judge and carefully monitors pinfall, but situations have occurred that made an accurate ruling difficult without closer review.

"Use of instant replay is an issue with all major sports in

this age of technology," said PBA Vice President and Tour Director Kirk von Krueger. "Our concern is simply to be accurate with judgment calls. Until now, we have not had a formal policy on whether instant replay can or should be used. Now we have a rule that governs the issue.

"When the use of instant replay will allow us to make the correct decision, we'll use it. It will be employed at the discretion of the tournament director."

The most memorable use of instant replay in a PBA Tour event occurred in the title match of the 1999 Columbia 300 Open in Austin, Texas, when Parker Bohn III appeared to foul on a spare attempt in the title match against Pete Weber. Ironically, von Krueger was tournament director for that event. During the next commercial break, von Krueger reviewed the instant replay of the shot and determined that Bohn had, indeed, fouled, ne-

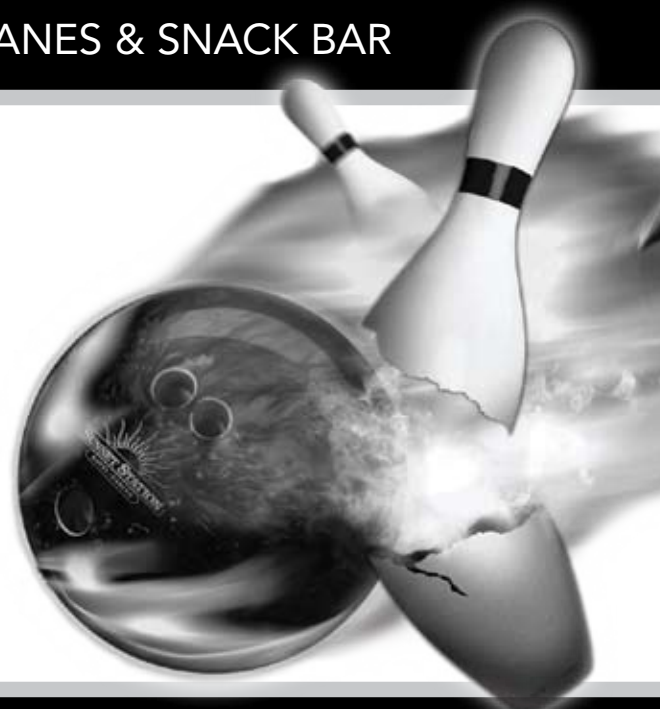

Fred Galvan Stars in First ABTA Win at Westminster

2 Share Match Series of \$278 • Big Pots at West Covina Lanes

West Covina Lanes is our Host for this Weekend

Match Game estimated \$2,100 / Match Series estimated \$250 and 3-6-9 is \$1,600

WESTMINSTER—In our return to Westminster Lanes we had a turnout of 162 bowlers. Cut scores were a +32 for the men and +47 for the women. This week our three Super Seniors added to the board were Jack Trongale (+14), Fidel Usi (+10) for the men and Bobbie McCollum (+23) for the women. That would give us a total of 48 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

During our Qualifying squads our top qualifier for the Men was Michael Garcia with a +124, and for the women it was Chae Kim with a +99. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ABTA event. Michael, being the top seed drew the Match Series worth \$278 and he drew a 557. We had two winners, they were Michael Scimone and Freddie Catamisan, each would get \$139 for that 557. Next week at West Covina, the estimated Match Series will be \$250. For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, Dominador La Guardia was the final person left after the roll-off, to go for the \$1500. He was able to get the first 2 out of 5 but missed on the 3rd shot, he received a \$50 consolation, and we will add another \$100 at West Covina Lanes for total of \$1600.

In the doubles this week we had 60 groups get into the doubles, with 13 spots being paid out. The top prize this week went to Joshua Navarro and Bernie Navarro with a 1350 for \$100. In 2nd place it was Ely Cruz and Vic Garcia with a 1340 for \$80. The low to cash was 1265. We paid out \$600 in doubles.

In the semis this week we saw William Ele lead the field with a +101 to sit out and bowl for the title. Behind William was our birthday girl and fine director Bobbie McCollum at +99. She would sit out the first round. It took a +49 for the men and women com-

bined, as we would take 4 women to make the finals this week.

This week, our top seed William had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$945 and drew 252. After a review of all the scores bowled on Saturday, no one had a 252, so we will estimate the pot next week at West Covina at \$2,100. This week we had 4 new bowlers join us, and no returning member. Let's welcome these new bowlers to the club, William Zarek, Lizz Ramirez, Jeff Pickel and Vickie Maas, with William making the semi-finals in his first time bowling with us.

This would bring us to our Match Play finals now with 16 bowlers taking the floor in our top 16 finals this week. In the 1st round the 7 losers were Javier Avila, John Gaddis, Raul Aldaz, William Zarek, Minh Dang, Hyun ok Park, Anita Smith and they would receive checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Mikko Miller, JoJo Jasmin, Ping Romero, Bobbie McCollum and each would get checks of \$107.50, this would get us to down to the final 4 bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$42 (Sophia Kim) to a high of \$70 (Joshua Navarro) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Som Seng (10th seed) bowling Joshua Navarro (4th seed) on lanes 11 and 12. In this match, Som would get the better of Joshua in this match with a 218 to 192 finish. In the other match we saw Fred Galvan (14th seed) bowling Sophia Kim (13th seed) on lanes 7 and 8. In this close match, Fred would get the better of Sophia with a 218 to 209 final score. Joshua and Sophia would finish in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$115 each. Our semi-final match was set to be bowled on 5 and 6; we had our 10th and 14th seeds into the top 16 bowling each

other. In our horses this week we would see Som paying \$55 and Fred paying \$64 if they win their match. In this match it started out close, and continues that way for a while until Fred pulled away at the end. Fred would go on to win the match 257 to 221. Som would finish in 3rd place for \$200. This week the horse paid out \$64 for all of you that bet on Fred making all the way to the title match.

The title game is set and would be bowled on lanes 3 and 4 this week. William Ele being the top seed elected to have Fred begin the match first. PBA Bowling is Back: 2010-11 ESPN Schedule Begins November 28 Return to ABC Sports

Multi-telecast events highlight Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour's historic campaign

SEATTLE, Wash. (Oct. 11, 2010) – Last season’s thrilling Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour featured unforgettable performances in major championships that represented the best bowling has to offer. The groundbreaking 2010-11 PBA Tour season, which makes its debut on ESPN on Sunday, Nov. 28, promises to build on those major highlights with plenty of compelling innovations.

The PBA’s 52nd season includes 21 original telecasts, beginning with the second annual PBA World Series of Bowling. Several firsts, such as live multi-day coverage for two major championships (PBA World Championship and U.S. Open) and the inaugural PBA Playoffs series to conclude the season, are helping the PBA redefine bowling on television in 2010-11.

The signature event of the upcoming TV season is the PBA’s return to ABC Sports after 14 years on Saturday, Jan. 22, for the live finals of the record-setting \$1 million PBA Tournament of Champions. The Tournament of Champions telecast, which will award the richest prize (\$250,000) in pro bowling history, also will be the first PBA finals aired in high-definition.

“Our TV season is built around capturing and delivering the drama of our major championships which shape the history of our sport,” said PBA CEO and Commissioner Fred Schreyer with a nod towards last season’s most significant events and their notable champions, namely:

“• The storybook finish of laid off autoworker Tom Smallwood capturing the PBA World Championship.

“• The historic first-ever win by a woman registered by Kelly Kulick at the PBA Tournament of Champions.

”• The latest addition to the legendary career of 50-year-old all-time titlist Walter Ray Williams Jr. at the USBC Masters.

“• The glimpse into the future provided by Tour young gun Bill O’Neill at the Lumber Liquidators U.S. Open.

“ESPN and ABC are once again going to be an important part of the PBA’s growing history,” Schreyer said. The PBA previously aired on ABC for 36 straight years until 1997, and has been a staple on ESPN since the network’s inception in 1979. ESPN also has announced a new three-year extension of its PBA coverage through 2013.

Returning as the PBA’s broadcast team will be play-by-play announcer Rob Stone and color analyst Randy Pedersen, a 13-time titlist on the PBA Tour. This season will be Stone’s fourth and Pedersen’s ninth in the broadcast booth. Every finals telecast (except the PBA Playoffs) will employ a stepladder elimination format. Each live event will bring the fans closer to the action with interaction via Facebook, plus “PBA Talk Back” technology which allows glimpses into the players’ minds in the heat of competition.

“PBA players throughout history have consistently delivered compelling storylines and our television formats produce countless pressure-filled shots every show,” said PBA COO and Deputy Commissioner Tom Clark. “This season’s television production will build anticipation for those moments that set bowling apart from any sport by presenting the true personalities of the best players in the world and capturing every nuance of the shots that will define their careers.”

Action on the lanes will begin with a 14-day World Series of Bowling and PBA World Championship at South Point Casino in Las Vegas, Nev., Oct. 25-Nov. 6. The multi-stage World Series and its deep field of 256 PBA members and international stars, will culminate with five separate five-man stepladder finals on Nov. 5 and 6, taped for delayed telecast on ESPN. The Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon, Scorpion and Shark Championships (representing each of the PBA’s primary lane oil patterns) will air on five consecutive Sundays at 1 p.m. Eastern on ESPN, starting Nov. 28. Also, a unique “USA vs. The World” team competition will be the final taped telecast from the WSOB and air Sunday, Jan. 9, also at 1 p.m. Eastern.

The “live” portion of the television season gets underway Jan. 14-16 when the top eight PBA World Championship qualifiers – based upon 60-game totals on the five PBA oil patterns contested during the qualifying rounds of the World Series – return to South Point for three days of live television coverage. The eight finalists will be placed into an eight-player stepladder, with the seventh and eighth seeds meeting in the first match and the winner facing the sixth seed on Friday night’s hour-long show. Saturday’s one-hour telecast will find Friday’s survivor facing the fifth seed, with that winner taking on No. 4. The PBA World Championship will conclude on Sunday, Jan. 16, with a four-player stepladder finale.

Following the PBA World Championship, all PBA regional, senior, Women’s Series and National Tour champions in PBA history are eligible to gather at Red Rock Lanes on the north side

of Las Vegas for the historic \$1 million PBA Tournament of Champions beginning Jan. 16, and culminating with the four-player stepladder finals televised live Saturday, Jan. 22, on ABC at 2:30 p.m. Eastern.

After the TOC, the PBA exempt Tour players head to Northern California for the One A Day Earl Anthony Memorial at Earl Anthony’s Dublin Bowl in Dublin, Calif., beginning Jan. 24 and featuring a five-player stepladder final on Sunday, Jan. 30, on ESPN2.

The season’s third major championship is back in Nevada, as the USBC Masters conducted by the National Governing Body will bring a field of amateurs and professionals together in the spacious National Bowling Stadium beginning Feb. 6. The USBC Masters’ four-player stepladder finals will air live on Sunday, Feb. 13.

In between the live events, the third annual Chris Paul PBA Celebrity Invitational, named after the NBA star and avid bowler and benefitting his CP3 Foundation, will air on “Super Bowl Sunday,” Feb. 6 on ESPN. In addition to Paul, LeBron James, Dwyane Wade, Ludacris and Hines Ward have participated in the event the past two seasons, matched up with PBA Tour stars in a doubles competition.

The PBA next travels across the country for the season’s fourth major championship, the 68th Lumber Liquidators U.S. Open, at Brunswick Zone Carolier in North Brunswick, N.J., Feb. 22-27. The U.S. Open, which features the most demanding lane conditions in bowling, will be the second event featuring three days of live TV coverage leading to the championship on ESPN on Feb. 27. Unlike the PBA World Championship’s extended stepladder presentation however, the U.S. Open will feature coverage of the traditional match play rounds on Friday, Feb. 25, and Saturday, Feb. 26, leading into Sunday’s four-player stepladder final.

“We are particularly excited to bring the match play rounds of the U.S. Open to a national audience,” Clark said. “Never before has the ‘position round’ been seen on TV, and anyone who has witnessed one live knows the TV audience is in for a treat. Something unpredictable will happen that night that fans have never seen before, and will be talking about long after.”

The third edition of the GEICO Mark Roth Plastic Ball Championship follows the U.S. Open, March 1-6, at AMF Thruway Lanes in Cheektowaga, N.Y. This exempt Tour event finds all of the players using identical limited-technology bowling balls, this season emblazoned with the logos of the top national charities under The Bowling Foundation’s umbrella.

The TV season will conclude with another new addition, the Dick Weber PBA Playoffs, March 8-14 at Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis. PBA Playoffs qualifying is already underway in PBA Regional competition and will feature not only the top 72 players who earn seeds through performance on the National Tour, but qualifiers from Regional play that will lead to two televised bracketed regional championship rounds and an eliminator TV round. Those three 90-minute telecasts will be taped on March 14 for delayed airing on ESPN beginning Sunday, March 27, and the live bracketed finals is April 17 on ESPN, also from Woodland Bowl.

Team USA's Dorin-Ballard, Szczerbinski Ready to Tackle World Cup

ARLINGTON—With more than 20 professional titles, nine international medals and dozens of other tournament victories, there isn't much Team USA member Carolyn Dorin-Ballard hasn't accomplished on the bowling lanes.

Starting Monday, the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer will have a chance to pad her resume even more when she competes in the 46th QubicaAMF World Cup in Toulon, France.

The World Cup is the largest international bowling tournament in the world in terms of the number of countries competing, which is expected to total a record 95 this year. The event begins with qualifying on Oct. 18 and concludes Oct. 23. John Szczerbinski of North Tonawanda, N.Y., will represent Team USA in the men's division.

"It's pretty awesome, and I feel pretty honored that our Team USA coaches asked me to bowl," Dorin-Ballard said. "I've never had the opportunity to bowl because for a long time, professional bowlers weren't allowed. This may be my one and only chance, and I'm going to try everything possible to represent the USA to the best of my ability."

"I've really been working on my game, practicing at the International Training and Research Center and working on changing my grip and tilt. It's really starting to come around."

In order to hoist the World Cup at the end of the event, Dorin-Ballard knows it will be a tough battle. She will take on multiple world and zone champions, including Australia's Ann Maree Putney, Sweden's Helen Johnsson, Korea's Gye Min-Young, Canada's Felicia Wong and the Dominican Republic's Aumi Guerra.

"I know I am going to have to bowl really well to have a chance because the international competition has gotten so strong over the years," Dorin-Ballard said. "I know the scores are probably going to be pretty high, so I'm definitely going to have to be on my game. Hopefully, I can make the shots I need to make to win the Cup."

On the men's side, Szczerbinski, a recent graduate of Wichita State University who led the Shockers to three consecutive national championships, also will face a tough field. The two-time Team USA member will take on international stars like Canada's Michael Schmidt, Australia's Paul Trotter, the Philippines Biboy Rivera, Germany's Achim Grabowski, Israel's Or Aviram and Korea's Park Jong-Woo.

"I'm going to go over and try and perform the best I can," Szczerbinski said. "I know I have the support of the 11 other guys on Team USA, my coaches and my family. I'm going to try and play well and bring home the World Cup for the United States."

The World Cup begins with official practice and opening ceremonies Sunday. All participants will bowl 20 games of qualifying over four days starting Monday with the top 24 men and top 24 women advancing to eight more games Oct. 22.

The top eight men and top eight women then advance to the Round of 8 the evening of Oct. 22 when the field will be paired down to the top three men and top three women for the semifinals and finals.

ABT League – Stay Tuned

NORWALK—Ever since September of 1978 the ABT Winter League has started the bowling season on the Friday after Labor Day. From a modest start of 12 teams at Pacific Lanes the league has bowled for the past 32 consecutive seasons. The league has survived the closing of many houses such as Pacific, Champion, Westbrook, Garden Square, Orange, Hacienda, Huntington and Regal. During the years at Regal Lanes (1996-2003) the league ranged from 36-44 teams of 4 bowlers bowling scratch with a 740 team maximum team entering average. During the last 32 years there have been the following honor scores: Women 700 = 13 with Cheryl Carmo High at 771, Women 300 = 3, Men 800 = 6 with Ruben Duran on top at 847, Men 300 = 54, 299 = 26, 298 = 13, 11 in a row = 43. Lang Setthaboupha was the only bowler to have 2-300's in one season. The only bowlers to have a 300 during league championship roll offs were Ross Whitehead and Rich Warner. Of the 11 in a row's Rich Warner was the only one to get the 1st 11 then 0 for a 290. Over the years somewhere over 2,000 bowlers have bowled in this league, all being members of the Amateur Bowlers Tour (ABT). From the original 12 team league at Pacific Lanes only one bowler still remains today, Mr. Jan Fishburn. Next in line would be Troy Sucatre who joined in 1979 and has been the league Secretary since 1981. The founder the ABT was Ken Daleiden who also organized the ABT League. The league has seen a few owners of the OC-ABT over the years; Ken Daleiden, Lew Rudnick, Bill Cauble, John Daleiden, Travis Moore, Donny Wilson, Greg Wilson, Trudi Thompson, Rick Niedermayer.

The sad news is that the ABT league did not get started as usual this season. There were at least 3 meetings held to get the league going but to no avail. Reasons given for not returning were many; The Economy, Time, Day Bowled, Location, Using Handicap, Too high of a team max (800), The Yankee Syndrome (always the same winners), lack of support by key people.....One complaint that was not made is the return on money. That is because that the ABT League has always had a great payback of funds.

I apologize to all ABT League bowlers for letting you down. As your league secretary part of my job is to keep this league thriving and active with everyone being happy. I failed to do that. I was recently advised to "let it go" and after considering that piece of advice I have decided that "let it go" is not an option. There are currently plans being looked at to put this league on the floor this season and I am dedicated to see that happen. Right now all serious suggestions and ideas to accomplish this goal are being taken. gating the spare.

Bohn went on to win the title, 225-211, but the following week, PBA players – who at the time had control over rules policies – voted against any future use of instant replay. Since that time, there has been no published policy on whether or not instant replay can be used to enforce decisions by the tournament director.

In addition to the instant replay rule, all coaching rules and limitations, with a few exceptions, were eliminated to allow coaching across the board at all levels of PBA competition. The new rules define coaching and specific limitations as they apply to televised and non-televised rounds.

The new PBA rules also establish a member policy on appropriate conduct in using social network platforms which have created new levels of world-wide interaction between players and fans, and outline a change back to a voting system for selection of PBA Player of the Year for 2010-11. The new tournament formats which will be employed this year make the Player of the Year points system used the past two seasons impractical.
