PEARL KELLER, A PWBA & USBC HALL OF FAME MEMBER DIES AT AGE 95

ARLINGTON, Texas – Pearl Keller, a Professional Women's Bowling Association and United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame member, passed away Oct. 2 in Brighton, Massachusetts, at age 95.

She was inducted into the PWBA Hall of Fame in 1997 in the Builder category and two years later joined the USBC Hall of Fame for Meritorious Service.

Keller was a trailblazer for women's bowling, teaming with Jean Fish in 1971 to start the Women's All-Star Association to promote tournaments specifically designed for high-average women bowlers. WASA drew the best amateur and professional bowlers from throughout the country to its events.

She served as WASA Executive Director for

more than 30 years. In 2001, WASA had a membership of 325 competitors and awarded more than \$85,000 in 17 tournaments.

Keller also paved the way for women bowling writers. A bowling columnist for 27 years for Gannett Westchester Newspapers, the largest newspaper chain in the country, she was one of the first women writers admitted to the Bowling Writers Association of America.

Controversy Behind Him, Weber Ready For U.S. Open

MOORESVILLE, NC – After last year's U.S. Open, some might expect Pete Weber to have some pointed words entering this year's event. Indeed, Weber has some biting words, but they are directed squarely at himself.

"My competing on the PBA Tour the last couple years has absolutely sucked," said Weber, a five-time U.S. Open champion. "I'm not real happy about that, so I'm trying to get myself into a little better shape."

During last year's U.S. Open, Weber withdrew early in qualifying and had several choice words for the United States Bowling

Congress, specifically citing the practice schedules prior to competition.

Don't expect more of that this year. Weber

brushed off the question about practice, as his only focus is on competing for the title when the event begins Oct. 25 live on Flo-Bowling.

"I can't do anything about the practice schedule," Weber said. "It's just something we have to deal with. I'm going to show up ready to bowl and ready to compete."

The U.S. Open is unsurprisingly of great importance to the most prolific champion in the history of the event. Weber wants to reassert himself as a threat on the PBA Tour in the event for which he's best

known.

"I've always liked the longer format," Weber said of the 56 games required just to make the stepladder finals. "You have to make shots. You can't just throw it anywhere and watch it come back. Spares come into play and I consider myself one of the better spare shooters on Tour."

Just about every player who's ever done well at the U.S. Open shares similar sentiments about the length and difficulty of the tournament. Still, it means a little more to hear it from the man who's had more suc-

Contract Extension Keeps Blanchard With Columbia 300 Until 2021

Three-time PBA champion Josh Blanchard has signed a two-year extension with Columbia 300 that will bring his tenure with Ebonite International to a decade.

Blanchard announced the contract extension on social media Wednesday and said he will stay with the brand until 2021. Along with Jakob Butturff, Osku Palermaa and Kyle Sherman, Blanchard is one of the key players on Columbia 300's staff.

"Happy to announce I have signed an extension with Columbia 300 for 2 more years!" Blanchard wrote on Facebook. "They have been by my side since day 1! This will complete a decade with one brand and I am proud of their continued drive to develop

the best products for us on tour."

A touring pro since 2011, Blanchard last won a PBA Tour title at the PBA Xtra Frame Reality Check Classic in March of 2017.

He won his first title at the Brunswick Euro Challenge in Munich, and then a few weeks later won his second at the PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout.

It's been a bit of an up-and-down season in 2019 for Blanchard with the bright spot being a fourth-place finish at the PBA Tournament of Champions. He lost to EJ Tackett, 264-236, in the second match of the stepladder finals in that event.

Blanchard also finished sixth at the PBA Indianapolis Open and the PBA Cheetah Championship.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: TOM DAUGHERTY WINS 16TH REGIONAL TITLE IN GEORGIA

• Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla., defeated Giorgio Clinaz of Orlando, Fla., 220-190, to win the third annual PBA Albany Strikers South Open presented by MOTIV at Albany Strikers Lanes in Albany, Ga.

In winning his 16th PBA Regional title, Daugherty qualified in the number one position for the four-man stepladder finals with a 17-game total of 3,937. Clinaz advanced to the title match by disposing of PBA Tour titlist Connor Pickford of Charlotte, N.C., in the opening match, 256-220, and easily defeating Trevor Roberts of Crystal River, Fla., 213-184.

In the title match Clinaz needed a double and nine pins in the 10th frame to win but came up short when he left a split that handed the \$2,500 first prize to Daugherty,

• PJ Haggerty of Roseville, Calif., won eight of his 10 matches to post a winning 18-game total of 4,142 pins Sunday in the PBA Battle of Black Oak Casino West Open at Black Oak Lanes in Tuolumne, Calif., picking up his 13th PBA Regional title.

Haggerty, who earned \$2,000, defeated Christopher Tuholski of Troutdale, Ore., by 284 pins for the win. Tuholski had a 5-5 match play record and 3,858 pins.

• Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y. compiled a 7-1 match play record on his way to a 61-pin victory over Brian Boghosian of Springfield, Mass. in the PBA50 Brian LeClair’s Revolutions Pro Shop Eastern Open at Boulevard Bowl in Schenectady, N.Y., Sunday. Shafer qualified second, which gave him a bye into the round robin finals. He went into the final position round match holding a seven-pin lead over Boghosian, meaning the winner of the match would receive 30 bonus pins and win the title. Shafer’s 237-213 victory produced the final 61-pin margin.

The win was Shafer’s 31st overall PBA Regional title, but his first in two years. He earned \$1,500.

• Jeff Campbell of Sioux Falls, S.D., took an early lead and never trailed in defeating 2019 PBA Rookie of the Year Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn., 180-173, to win the PBA Champion Bowl Midwest Open presented by Storm in Ottumwa, Iowa, Sunday for his first PBA Regional title and the \$2,000 first prize.

In the first match of the three-player stepladder finals, Campbell defeated non-PBA member Tim Gruendler of St. Louis, 209-188, to advance to the title match.


• PBA Regional tournaments scheduled for the Oct. 18-20 weekend include the PBA50 Timber Lanes Open in Oxford, Pa.; the PBA50 Waxahachie Southwest Open at Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas; the PBA and PBA50 Northwest/West Opens presented by Dick’s Pro Shop and Boulder Falls Inn at Linn Lanes in Lebanon, Ore.; the Greater Jackson Central Open at Jax’s 60 in Jackson, Mich., and the Bowl-A-Vard Lanes Midwest Open in Madison, Wis.

• Closing out the October PBA Regional calendar will be the South Point West Challenge presented by MOTIV and the South Point Member/Non-Member Doubles presented by Hammer at South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas.

Jones Is A No-Brainer For PBA Hall of Fame

Sometimes you just see a player’s name and you know they are going to be in the PBA Hall of Fame. Tommy Jones is one of those names.

The PBA sent out this year’s ballot Monday night and Jones is the only eligible player. Any bowling fan knows just by hearing the name that this is a no-brainer.

Hall of Fame voters have until Oct. 14 to send in their ballots and then the PBA will make it official shortly thereafter. The PBA Hall of Fame induction ceremony will take place Jan. 18 during the 2020 PBA Hall of Fame Classic at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas. With 19 career PBA Tour titles, including two majors, Jones is tied for 16th on the all-time titles list with Chris Barnes, who is already in the PBA Hall of Fame.

Jones has been eligible for the PBA Hall of Fame based on titles for years but was required to wait until he had been a PBA member for 20 years before he could be considered. That wait is now over.

The Simpsonville, South Carolina, native joined the PBA in 2000 and had his break-out season in 2004-05 when he won the Japan Cup, Denver Open, Cambridge Credit Classic and Banquet Open. The following season he won four more titles, including the U.S. Open, and was named the PBA Player of the Year.

According to the PBA’s Bill Vint, in order to be eligible for the PBA Hall of Fame, players must win a minimum of 10 titles or five titles plus two majors. They must also be a PBA member for 20 years.

No other player met that criteria for this year’s ballot.

DICK RITGER REFLECTS ON PBA’S “MOST MEMORABLE MOMENT”

“When Don Johnson collapsed on the alley after leaving the 10-pin standing to finish with a 299 in the finals of the 1970 Firestone Tournament of Champions, Dick Ritger was there to pick him up.”

That statement by Bob Burrows summarized Burrows’ interview with 80-year-old PBA Hall of Famer Dick Ritger at his northern Wisconsin home, published in the Hudson (Wis.) Star-Observer, in which Ritger addressed his role in the event that was ranked No. 1 in the PBA’s 60 Most Memorable Moments, celebrated during the PBA’s 60th anniversary season in 2018.

Ritger, Johnson’s victim in that famous match, was sitting on the bench watching the historic almost-perfect shot unfold, and he related his recollections about Johnson’s 299 game and his own career in Burrows’ feature story (<https://www.rivertowns.net/sports/4560493-one-ages-ritger-part-pbas-no-1-greatest-moment>).

Included in the interview is Ritger’s personal reflection of a memorable perfect game of his own:

"I bowled a 300 at the Miller Tournament in Milwaukee one year and you know what I got for a prize? Beer for a year," he said. "Fifty-two cases. I didn't drink so we donated the money to the Milwaukee Children's hospital."

She joined the BWAA in 1973, and held many leadership positions before she was elected the first woman president of BWAA in 1992. She also served as president of the National Women Bowling Writers (NWBW) for six years. She won numerous writing awards, including the BWAA's Mort Luby Distinguished Service Award, the NWBW Alberta E. Crowe Award and the Murrey International Bowling Writer of the Year Award.

Keller, who lived in Chappaqua, New York, for nearly 50 years, served bowling on the local, state and national levels. She was on the Women's International Bowling Congress (WIBC) board from 1984-1999, and was a long-time board member of the Westchester Women's Bowling Association and New York State Women's Bowling Association. The WIBC recognized her work as an innovator with Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award in 2002.

Born Dec. 19, 1923, she graduated from Yale University in 1947 with a bachelor's degree in music (piano major) and spent a year teaching piano at the Perkins School for the Blind. She did graduate work toward a Master's degree at Texas Christian University and was a graduate assistant in the school's music history department.

Keller is survived by her four children, Jan Schultz (Howard), David (Mary), Richard, and Lisa Lee (Daniel), six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Services are pending.

cess in the event than anyone in history.

"Having success at the U.S. Open definitely gives me confidence," Weber said. "And yes, every time I go to the U.S. Open, I feel like I can win it. It's about keeping my mental game in focus, trying to keep myself under control and not get too mad at myself. Fill frames."

Weber hopes his renewed focus on fitness will prepare him for the brutality of the format.

"Since March, I've been feeling good about myself," he said. "I'm taking care of myself a little bit more, eating a little healthier, and trying to get into better shape. I'm not trying to bulk up, but I want to tone and get to where I feel like I'm throwing the ball hard. I know I'm throwing it well, but I need more speed behind it."

"I'm working out three or four times a week, like I used to, all the way up until the U.S. Open. I should be a little stronger and able to compete a little bit better."

Weber last won the U.S. Open in 2012 in perhaps the most iconic moment in bowling history. He finished third in 2013 and 2015 (the event was not held in 2014) and missed the cut each of the past three years.

"I feel a lot better going into this U.S. Open than in the last couple years," he said. "I've had the hip and back problems, but I haven't had any of those since March. I've completed every tournament I've bowled in, and I'm feeling better about myself. It's just a matter of it clicking together." While Weber stays committed to his workout regimen, he's been on the lanes as well, competing on the PBA Regional tour, in local tournaments, and in his weekly league. "I bowl league, which is no big deal," he said. "I know the lanes are easy and there's more mistake area, but I feel good about the way I'm throwing the ball. I'm shooting 740 every week, so that's not too bad. Plus, there are local tournaments, and I'm making the top five every time I bowl, so it's a matter of getting myself in shape."

This year's U.S. Open will be held at Victory Lanes in Mooresville, North Carolina, where Weber won the 2016 PBA50 Mooresville Ford Open and where he's come close to winning several other times.

"I like the house, I know that," Weber said. "I've won there, I've finished second, third, fourth. I like Mooresville, I like Victory Lanes and the fans are great."

Shunning all thoughts of last year's controversy and embracing a dedication to fitness and competition, Weber feels poised for his best U.S. Open performance in years.

"I would love to make the show," he said. "I'm not going to guarantee anything. But I'm ready to go. I'm ready to compete, I like the house and I'm ready to do it."

- Mary Lou Teller was named SEDBA "Secretary of the Year." She received her award from new President Bob Allender. Mary Lou is still a great secretary at **Keystone Lanes**. Hail to you Mary Lou!
- Nick Mancini was running his legendary "Hot Pot" at **Vista Lanes**. Entry fee was \$36.04!!!
- Clara Negrete celebrated Xmas early in July. Her 300 game earned her diamonds, pearls and gold awards. Phyl Knoll played Mrs. Claus.
- Mae Shaffer passed away on June 15. Who was Mae? She never won a trophy. She was a worker! On the San Gabriel Board from 1974 to 1992. Plus she was a nightly scorekeeper at **Alhambra Valley Bowl** for 30 years!

- Stacy Rider chalked up her 4th WWPB title at **Palomar Lanes**.
- 22 **Active West** centers declared "Smokeless Free Saturdays" 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. They wanted healthy, fun filled activities for kids and families.
- Billy Myers Jr snatched first place in the Scratch 6 gamer at **Oak Tree Lanes**. That was \$300 plus sidepots.
- **Buena Lanes** bombshell by Emmanuel Manson...300-300-244/844. "Twas a Ventura County Record.
- Dewann Clark, founder of "The Greater L.A. Junior All Stars, owned Specialized I.M.S. His total business was destroyed by fire during the L.A. Riots. The junior bowling world responded instantly. Fundraisers of all sorts popped up. The first was at **Pioneer Bowl**.
- Donna Adamek and Mike McGrath won the Coors Light Doubles Title at **West Lane Bowl** in Stockton. Second was the team of Paula Vidad and Ron Randall.
- Dick Weber/Justin Hromek teamed up to win the PBA Doubles. Dick became the only player in PBA history to capture a title in five different decades.
- **Colima Lanes** toasted Steven Gurrieri for his 278-286-236/800. Fastest ball in the west.
- Junior bowler Russell Dwyer dropped all the pins but one. Big 299 at **Canoga Park Bowl**.
- Subscription to the Bowling News was \$25 for 52 issues.
- Mike Aulby captured his 20th PBA Title in Green Bay. Those guys on tour traveled, bowled, traveled, bowled.
- Dick and Diane Brassch opened their new Pro Shop in Westminster. It was a beaut!
- One of the features at the Hall of Fame Museum in St. Louis was the life and times of San Diego's Joe Norris. Included was photo, uniforms, 1936 Olympic pins, videos and a visit from Joe. He was 84 in 1992.
- Bowlers donated more money to charity than any other group of athletes.
- Bowling was played as early as 5,200 B.C.

Saturday, Sept. 28, started with a tour of Operation Freedom Paws in San Martin. The CBW Board was excited to have been asked by OFP’s Mary Cortani to come take in part of her morning session as well as get a tour of the facility. When we arrived, we saw a session being taught how to give a pill to their service dog to get their dog to swallow it. Her secret way ended with showing the handlers how to give their dog a kiss on the nose and down the pill went! So clever. We were then taken on a tour by Jenna Hernandez and she showed us the inside of this huge building that they use when the weather is bad outside to train as well as they had a few dogs boarded in one area. We then saw the outside fenced exercise areas where the dogs were allowed to play and run while being monitored by a trainer. Jenna noted that they accept donations of sheets, blankets, towels and pillows. We then got to see their outside areas to work their dogs and relax with their dogs. OFP first priority is to help Veterans and a one-year program costs \$17k per dog. We were joined on our tour by Vicki Topaz and found out she is in the process of doing a documentary, “Dog Walk Home” that she hopes to have done by 2021 (www.dogwalkhomefilm.com). She, like several others, are totally engaged with what goes on at Operation Freedom Paws and once you are there taking it in, you too, will be a believer as we soon were! This program is designed to heal a Veteran with a service dog and this process can take eight years. OFP gets sheltered dogs. Many of their Veteran clients come from all over California and are transported to OFP through Angel Flight.

Saturday afternoon the CBW Board conducted their Interim Meeting in the meeting room back at 4th Street Bowl in San Jose.

Sunday morning started bright and early with CBW board members along with Mary Cortani and her staff including Brenda Shiplett (Director of Marketing) and OFP photographer Alan Chan, along with Tournament Director Donna Morales and her volunteers from the Santa Clara County USBC association setting tables up prior to the first squad check-in at 9am. This year’s event not only featured a raffle but added a bake sale. There was also about six items for the Silent Auction displayed. The 2pm squad nearly filled the center and bowlers looked like they were having a great time. Many won raffle gifts as they bowled. The bake sale had more baked goods than buyers and even when the items were reduced to half price at

the end of the second squad, there were still plenty items to choose from. A fun day had by all. Thank you to all that participated and brought this year’s donation check amount to \$3,742.25! This year’s event was \$1,253.25 more than last year’s inaugural tournament that was held at Morgan Hill Bowl.
