John’s big games of 300 and 288 helped him in this victory. John’s victories over Don in Game #2, 300 to 268, and in the Position Round, 268 to 221, was the big difference in winning this tournament. Don bowled 1968 for the 8 games, and won 5 of his 8 matches. Jim Harvey (Burbank), the qualifying leader on Saturday,with 2432 for the 10 games, ended up in 3rd, and he had a big 299 game in the finals. On Saturday in the qualifying, Jim rolled a 300 game. The other 300 game bowled in the qualifying went to Joe Merrill (Boulder City, NV). Scores were very high with plus 306 making the cut for the finals for the 8 games. Two Super Seniors making the finals, Stan Winters (Simi Valley), and Jerry Calvin (1000Oaks). Top 3: 1st, John Whisler, \$1000.00, 2nd Don Moser, \$700.00, and 3rd, Jim Harvey, \$550.00.

50 bowlers entered, (29 regular division, and 21 super seniors), with a good pay-off of \$7,010.00 which included \$500.00 added from Ebonite Bowling Ball Sales. 17 checks were paid out. For this year, 15 Tournaments, the pay-off has been \$127,276.00, and for 244 Tournaments a grand total of \$1,730,534.00 has been paid out. A tight race now for the top WCST Money Leader this year between Vaughn Doody, \$4,940.00, Kevin Gannon, \$4,912.00 and John Whisler, \$4,885.00. There are only 2 tournaments left this year. Our thanks to La Habra “300” Bowl and our host Mr. Bob Shan, and a very cooperative working crew. The lanes were in excellent condition, and the automatic pinsetters ran very well all week-end. La Habra “300” Bowl, always a great place to hold a tournament. Our thanks also to Ebonite International, our great sponsor of all of our tournaments in 2006. Vaughn Doody (Las Vegas), won his 21st WCST, Title, which now puts him in a tie for 2nd place with Kevin Gannon for the most WCST Championships, behind WCST Championship Title Leader Ross

Packard, who has 24 Titles. Vaughn, qualified 4th. Starting out 93 pins behind Qualifying Leader, Dave Frame (Temple City) and caught and passed him after the 1st game of the 6 game finals. Dave regained the lead after Game #2, and then it was a see-saw battle between, Dave and Everett Nishikawa (Corona), for 1st place, while Vaughn was sitting in 3rd place, until after Game #5, with Vaughn now in 1st place by only 9 pins over Everett. Then it was no contest as Vaughn bowled his biggest game of the tournament with a 290 game, against Everett’s 180 game, and a 148 pin victory. Bowling Center Has New Owner

FORT MOJAVE — The bowling lanes at 4575 S. Highway 95 has changed owners and changed names.

Thunder Lanes is now known as Desert Lanes and is upgrading its facility. The bowling center been around for 12 years, but has never replaced its bowling shoes until Christina Cushere took the business over exactly three months ago today. She owns the center with her parents, Mario and Eleanor Cushere.

She sees her ownership as a mission to bring the community together.

"I believe a bowling center is a community place. It's no different than a church." She wants to use it for community activities, like holding garage sales in the parking lot and putting on charity events."

"I wouldn't have a problem giving back 25 percent of any proceeds to an organization that can help somebody else," Cushere said.

Besides replacing the shoes, Cushere installed new pins and bought a new oil machine. "We spent \$77,000 our first month in business and we brought in \$37,000, she said.

It costs about \$35,000 a month to operate the center, with utilities alone costing \$7,000, according to Cushere.

She's also working to make improvements to the bar, snack bar and restrooms.

Cushere wants to get day leagues to use her facility and will target snowbirds when they return this fall.

She's also working to get school kids to use Desert Lanes during the afternoon hours and will talk with schools to try to

get them to offer bowling credits for students physical education classes.

In other cities, "They have ... high school leagues that compete after school," said Ron Ogo, who mans the front desk at Desert Lanes, "and they get credit towards their physical education programs". Cushere has a "Good Grades" program for children 5-18, in which they get a free game for every "A" they earn on their report card.

She said she wants all the children to know she put the arcade back in. It had been removed by a previous owner who didn't want young people in his establishment, Cushere said.

Ogo was held over from previous ownership, who he said had plans for making improvements to the center but never followed through. He's impressed with what the Cusheres have done.

"You couldn't ask for more in a bowling alley that what they

have done already. In the short time they have owned this house, it has been 100 percent improved."

Cushere said it's important that the community supports the center. This is not the highest and best use of this property at all. I could turn this into a hundred different things that would make me a lot of money."

She said she could lease the property out to a shopping center for a 15-year term "and sit back and collect \$25,000 a month." But Cushere would rather keep the center open. "We'd like to continue, with the support of the community."

This is where Cushere's idealism kicks in. She talks of bringing kids and senior citizens together. "Maybe we could actually be a community...and learn something about ourselves. If I can change the mentality of people that are so cold, bitter and hard then I've done something positive for the world."

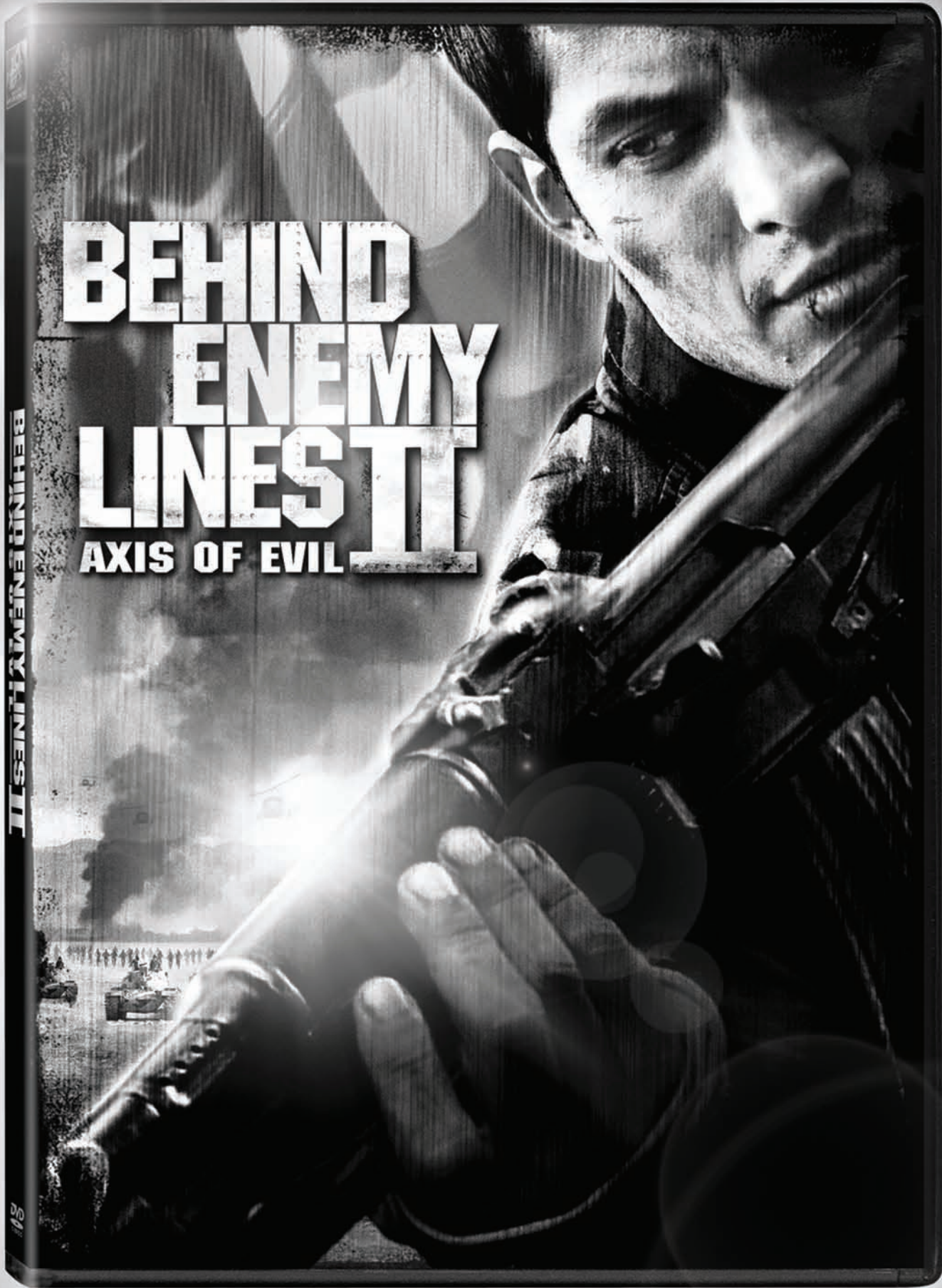

Deaf Senior Bowlers of America Results

John Miller Jr. Wins \$1,300 Deaf Senior Singles

LAS VEGAS—The Deaf Senior Bowlers of America celebrated its 10th anniversary on October 18-12 at the Orleans Hotel Bowling Center with \$5,000 addition to its prize fund. The tournament drew 130 men and 50 women aged 55 years and over participating in their separate singles, mixed doubles and separate prestigious deaf eliminations events, Each with its respective record first place prizes.

The largest individual prize of \$1,300 in the Tuesday’s men’s singles was won by John Miller, Jr of Phoenix, AZ with his 693 total with handicap. Miller, Jr. with 156 average rolled 204-198 168 for 570 plus 123 handicap. Close behind by 5 pins in 2nd place was Robert Smith from Washington with 247-181-173/601 plus 87 handicap 688 total for \$700. Third place \$400 went to Michigan’s Harold Wood 675 total. Tory Graham, Tx had the event’s high series 626 and finished with 671 for 4th \$300. Walter Nielsluchowski, Ill had the event’s high game of 264 but finished in 19th place. The last place score in the money was 40th 610.

JOANNE GALBO GRABS WOMEN’S SINGLES \$500

In the women’s Singles Michigan’s Joanne Galbo with 145 average, scored 190-149-181 for 520 plus 156 handicap for 676 to grab the first place prize \$500. Dorothy Ross, CA took 2nd place \$300 with her 658 total and 3rd place \$200 went to Marilyn Okabe, Ill’s 649. Sharon Duran, CA had the event’s high game 201 and high series 524, finishing in 5th place with 641 for \$150. The last place score in the money was 18th 595.

BOWERS-PARKER DUO’S 1332 WINS MIXED DOUBLES \$1,800 PRIZE

Prior to the Tuesday’s Mixed Doubles event Fred Schmidt, CO was injured and requested a replacement to bowl with his partner Janis Bowers, also from Colorado. A local Las Vegas bowler Tom Parker was found and turned out to be the great one as he scored tournament high 267 game and series 704. Parker’s other games were 246-191 and Bowers who was the 2002 women’s singles champion, added 153-157-136 for 445 to their total of 1149 plus their 183 handicap for 1332 to take the \$1,800 prize. Californian Dorothy Ross took another 2nd place prize as she paired with Chris Groves, CA for a 1311 total for the \$1000 prize. Ross had 458 and Groves 520 along with their 233 handicap. Third place \$700 went to Lyndene Higginbotham AZ (226-496) and Lynn Ohm, CO (215-568) plus 237 handicap 1301. The husband-wife duo of Sharon and William Kalk from Canada placed 4th with 1298 for \$500. For the first time, the first 4 places went to mixed (female and male) pairs, also 7 out of 10 places. The women’s pair of Marilyn Okabe, ILL and Jeanette Daviton, CA took 5th place and men’s pairs, Clarence Jenkins, NY / Robert Dixon, WA and John Miller, Jr/ Larry Berke, AZ took 6th and 7th places respectively. The event’s low score in the money was 28th place 1206

ROBERT SMITH WINS SENIORS DEAF ELIMINATIONS AT ORLEANS

The men’s Eliminations with \$1,100 as the first place prize started on Wednesday with Edward Abakumoff, CA leading the 4 games qualifying round for the 2nd time in 3 years. He rolled games of 211-200-265-247 for 923 plus 24 handicap for 947. Canadian William Kalk who was the event’s runner-up in 2003 qualified in 2nd with 163-210-208-235/818 plus 124 handicap 940. Robert Taylor, CA places 3rd with 222-227-180-192/821 plus 112 handicap 933. Robert Jones, CA turned in good scores of 228-184-203-256/871 but with 4 handicap qualified 8th with 875. Gorman Low made the cut off of 32 qualifiers for the match plays with 811 total. In the Thursday’s top 32 one game double eliminations match play, the eventual winner, Robert Smith, Houston, TX who qualified in 28th place with 815, went through 4 rounds winning all his matches as did Abakumoff who also won all his 4 matches. Both Smith and Abakumoff who are old friends when they worked in Post Offices in California before Smith transferred to Texas, faced each other in the 5th round. Smith with 33 handicap beat Abakumoff who had 6 handicap, 214 168, putting Abakumoff in the loser’s bracket’s 8th round which is the semi-finals.

With this win, Smith was seeded into the championship finals waiting for the one to come out for the 9th round to face him. In the 7th round David Thordsen, FL narrowly beat Lee Moore, Jr CA 200+26/226 to 172+48/220 to move up to semi-finals against Abakumoff. Well-rested Abakumoff beat the tired Thordsen 224+6/230 to 152+26/178,

In the championship match, Abakumoff struggled with 3 opens including a washout in tenth which he picked one pin for 177 and Smith had a split in 10th and picked one pin for 151. Score with handicap was Smith as the champion by one pin, 184 to 183. Smith gets \$1, 100 and Abakumoff as the runner up 4700. Thordsen gets \$400 for 3rd and Moore, Jr. receives \$250. The prize list pays to 32 places.

BERMAN BEATS TAYLOR FOR THE WOMEN’S CHAMPIONSHIP

Only 30 women entered in the Senior women’s Eliminations and in the Wednesday’s 4 games qualifying round, Penelope Hendee, IL led with a record 790 from games of 180-186-215-209 and with her handicap of 176/966. Younisi Donegan placed 2nd with 211/688+208/896 and Kathleen Seymour CA 3rd with 671+224/895. Former (1999) champion Agree Taylor, CA the eventual runner-up placed 4th with 2003/676+216/892 and the eventual winner Doris Berman, FL 5th with 210/671+176/847.

For the top 16 cutoff one game match play on Thursday the low score was 776. Top three qualifier Hendee, Donegan and Seymour were eliminated in the 2nd round. Berman won all her matches and beat Janis Bowers, CO in the 4th round to be seeded to the Championship finals. Taylor lost in the first round and fought hard to win her matches through 5 rounds and faced Bowers in the semi-finals. Taylor beat Bowers 169+54 223-155+52/207 to get in the finals against well rested Berman.

In the Championship finals Taylor trying to win her 2nd title, lost to the new Champion Berman 155+54/209 to 169+44/213. Berman as DSBA’s 10th different Champion gets \$300, Taylor as runner-up gets \$2003 and Bowers in 3rd place gets \$125 and the prize list runs down to 16th place. In the Tuesday evening meeting, Carol Moers, Denver CO was reelected DSBA Secretary-Treasurer for another term. James White, AL was re-elected to 3 years term as DSBA Director. Next year’s tournament will be at the same place on October 9th, 10th & 11th.



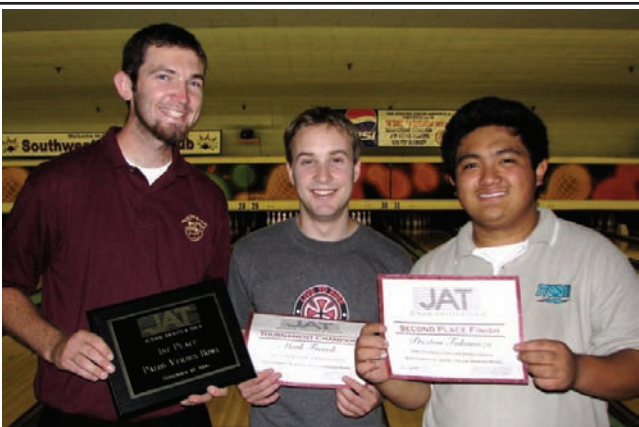
