FATHER, SON RECORD 300's, 800's SAME NIGHT AT WINNETKA BOWL

WINNETKA — Establishing probable Southern California records, a father and son each rolled perfect games and 800 series on separate teams in the River Maniacs league at Winnetka Bowl.

John Englehart, an outside salesman, brought his skills inside as he rolled games of 300, 257 and 268 for an 805 series, while 22-year-old son

Scott bowled 245, 257 and 300 for 802. John fired 12 perfect strikes, but Scott needed a Brooklyn hit on his final ball for the 300, according to Mike Willis, General Manager of the recently remodeled 32-lane center.

John had perfect games before, while it was the first perfect for Scott.

"ACTION" JACKSON TO TAKE ON CHRIS BARNES IN WINNER-TAKE-ALL DUEL AT WSOB VI

LAS VEGAS — JT "Action" Jackson, who earned his nickname by bowling "action" with his comedian friends in Los Angeles, has challenged 17-time PBA Tour champion Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, to a one-game, All-In Showdown match that will be webcast live on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling channel on Friday, Oct. 24, from South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

Jackson, a 37-year-old left-hander, has won one PBA Regional title and has cashed only once in 34 PBA Tour events, but he has no fear of taking on one of the PBA's most accomplished players in a one-game match on the challenging PBA World Championship lane condition. Each player will put up \$5,000 and they will bowl for a \$10,000 winner-take-all prize at 5:15 p.m. ET (2:15 p.m. local time) on Oct. 24.

"I called (PBA Commissioner Tom Clark) and asked



him if the PBA was going to do an 'all-in showdown' like they did a couple of years ago. No one had mentioned anything," Jackson said, "but he asked if I wanted to do something like that, so he called Barnes, and it's going to be me against him."

It was a last-minute suggestion but Barnes, who did his share of megabucks, high-

stakes action bowling before he even began his PBA career, quickly accepted the challenge. He's the only PBA player who has agreed to participate in every winner-take-all contest since the concept was introduced as a special event at the inaugural PBA World Series of Bowling in Allen Park, Mich., in 2009.

Jackson, who has culti-

vated a successful career as a comedian and actor, including featured roles in Kingsford Charcoal, CDW computer and Hulu television ads, said he got his start in "action bowling" in 2003.

"Around that time, I was doing a lot of standup comedy in Los Angeles," he said. "Me and a bunch of my comedian continued on page 9

PBA Legend Marshall Holman Joins Xtra Frame Broadcast Booth for GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VI

LAS VEGAS – PBA legend Marshall Holman will return to the broadcast booth when he joins the Xtra Frame coverage team for the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VI as color commentator, PBA Vice President of Media Dave Schroeder announced today.

The PBA Hall of Famer and 22-time PBA Tour titlist will join Xtra Frame and ESPN play-by-play announcer Mike Jakubowski in the Xtra Frame broadcast booth for live coverage of the Round of 24 blocks of the four animal pattern championships (Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon and Scorpion) that will be conducted Oct. 25-28 at the South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas and the final two rounds of PBA World Championship match play October 29-30.

Holman, a four-time major title winner and 1987 PBA Player of the Year, has extensive experience as a color commentator having previously worked on PBA telecasts for ESPN, ESPN2 and CBS. “The concept of the World Series has always intrigued me,” said Holman. “What I hope to accomplish is provide a historical perspective to the sport that has been so good to me while at the same time provide some entertaining commentary for PBA’s growing audience of Xtra Frame subscribers.”

You can't be more amazed than when you spend some time with today's younger generations.

Whether it is them displaying their flying fingers on computers, their flying feet in gymnastics or their rolling the ball and making parents and grandparents take a good second look at their talent, mentally and physically.

All sports and all fields have their child prodigies. There have been teenagers in every major sport, and many in their early teens, particularly in swimming and tennis.

Many of them have been great or gone on to greatness, at great sacrifice, being forced to grow up too quickly, being forced to choose between fame and fortune early, or after a suitable stretch of education.

In the dream world it would be wonderful if every young athlete in every sport was forced to obtain a high school education at a minimum, and college or other advanced training as a recommended path.

But the real world doesn't work out so neatly.

Some really young baseball, basketball, tennis and hockey phenoms can and do make millions of dollars before they can legally drink or vote. How and when do you tell them they are too young or too unprepared? At 17 they can be accepted into the Armed Services and put their lives on line.

So how can you realistically ask any youngster talented way beyond their years to put a hold on opportunities and riches that may not be there later.

In many cases it is boys against men, and girls against women. But boys grow up fast these days and women aren't nearly as mere as they used to be.

Bowlers are amazingly adept at early ages. You can visit any junior program and see obvious talent. But, at 15 many bowlers been bowling for a decade, and bowling at pro class calibre for years. By the time they are ready for college, many are ready for a shot at the pro tours or the big money tournaments. Look at the Mark Roths, Johnny Petraglias and Pete Webers and a list of thousands and you could see super stars in the making at ages of 17 and younger.

Junior bowlers can't be reminded too often that a 200 game is fine, but an "A" in any subject is better. A tournament win is terrific, but the Honor Roll is more terrific. A 300 game or even a 900 series is great, but a diploma is the greatest.

In bowling there is no reason why both areas cannot be encouraged. A high school or college student can utilize his time, so much can be spent on bowling and much can be spent on study. And students can map out a schedule that covers both sides, and gives them the best of both worlds.

Parents, bowling coaches and bowling officials have a duty to counsel young bowlers and not to put too much pressure on them in either way, except to use common sense.

Education should always come first, but bowling is an education too, if used wisely, whether you're a shooting star or a struggler. But always hit the books as hard as you hit the pins.

seventh 800 and tenth perfect game.

Andy used his new Storm Optimus to bowl his record score. His favorite bowling line is Storm because Storm balls always work for him. Storm balls are predictable. They react on the lanes predictably and predictability is a big part of Andy's game.

Mr. Toro has been bowling for 52 of his 57 years. He has loved every minute of his time on the lanes. Since he started bowl-ing there has always been something irresistible about knocking down pins. Like so many of us he has always looked forward to his next bowling date. It is bowling's version of "THE CALL OF THE WILD."

While his 822 is quite an accomplishment, Andy's high is 878! A bowler only bowls 878 if he is talented, dedicated and focused. Andy possesses all three of these attributes. His 235 average and many 700s demonstrate a talent for bowling. His bowling seven days a week demonstrate his dedication to our sport. His preparation and pre-game routine demonstrate his su-perior mental game, his focus.

I have watched Andy bowl in league and am impressed by his approach to the game. ANDY TAKES BOWLING SERIOUSLY. He always arrives early, always gets right down to business pre-paring himself and his equipment. He is ready to compete before most other bowlers have arrived. Then he prepares mentally.

Before other bowlers have arrived I have observed Andy sit-ting on a seat behind the approach seemingly staring down the pins sixty plus feet down lanes. It appears to me he is preparing himself mentally for the competition ahead. I haven't seen an-other league bowler as intense as Andy. He is focused.

For someone who loves bowling, like myself, it is refreshing to see a bowler so dedicated to his craft. Most of us show up the last minute and approach bowling like a game of horseshoes be-hind the barn. We show up the last minute without preparation or practice. Why do you think bowling has such a bad reputation? Why do non-bowlers consider bowling to be a fun activity that an uncoordinated hayseed can master? Why do many believe that a pitcher of beer will lead to higher scores? It is because there aren't enough of us who bowl like ANDY TORO SR. There aren't enough of us who are dedicated, prepared or focused.

By the way, Andy's favorite professional bowler is EARLAN-THONY. How appropriate it is for a bowler like Andy Torro to admire and emulate the professional who was arguably the most prepared and relentless competitor our sport has ever known.

When you have bowled for fifty-two years there are many people who have contributed to your success. Andy is grateful for the support and encouragement he has received from family, friends, coaches and equipment providers.

Specifically, he is thankful for his parents getting him started, his wife CLARISSA and kids for supporting his efforts and BILL GABLE (ABT) and BOB SMITH (ABTA). Special thanks to CLARENCE ROBERTS MARCUS SR., JOEL RICKETTS and NEIL LAU. Mr. "Bobby" Marcus was Andy's first coach while Joel and Neil of Pins and Needles Pro Shop are responsible for drilling Andy's equipment.

Congratulations Andy. We need more bowlers like you. While most of us may not possess your natural talent all of us can learn from your dedication, preparation and mental approach.

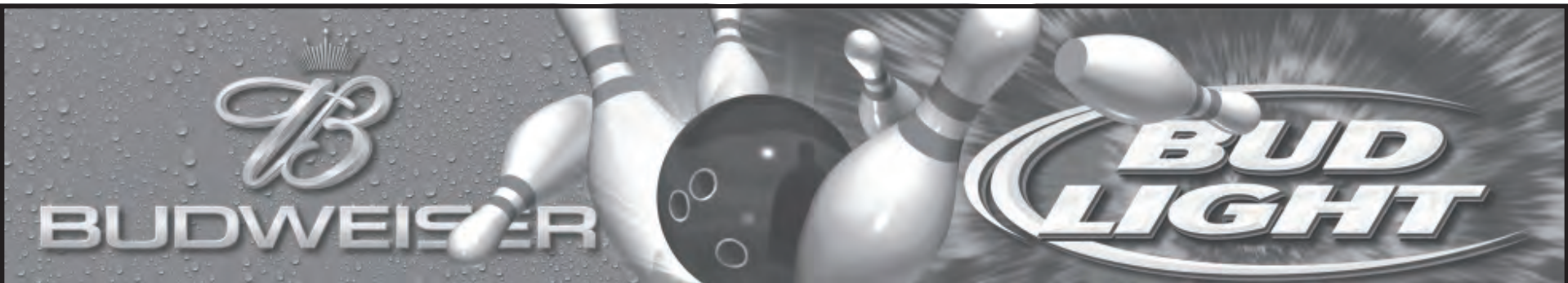

Andrew Rietta 267/750 & Dave Kovach 729 struck just enough for BOWLIUM to take down American Harvest Vodka 4-1 who were led by Dave Bartlett 269/722 & Kevin Too Tall Jones 268/716. Greg Neuer once again was high man with 706 to lead Blizz Yogurt to a 4-1 win over CASAMIGO'S Tequila, and their anchorman Vernon Adams 705. Linder Insurance used a big 3rd game win to come back and win 3-2 over J.A.T. Kevin Valmonte 705 & Anthony Santos 697 led Linders, as Barry Couch Jr. was tops on the pair for J.A.T. with 276/734.

Tifco Industries managed to squeeze out 4 wins over GJC Services, led by Kevin Gagnon's 679, but all the boys got beat by a girl, as Tianna Tipton continued her hot bowling for GJC, finishing with 682. In the only other sweep on the night, it was Herzog Insurance cancelling on Alhambra Gold Company as Justin JZ Ziegler blasted his way to 266/720 while T.J. Abahazy led the Gold with 685.

And finally, again, on our last pair, it was Buddy "I need some help" Lucas breaking the 800 mark for the second week in a row, 289/290/805 to lead his Los Altos Trophies team to its lone win, and also lock up High Average Honors for the first round. Congrats Buddy on another huge week, and another Honor Series.

Sidepot winners were Game 1 Eddie VanDaniker 289 Game 2 Mason Sherman 266 and 3rd Game Super Pot to Arnold Cheesman with 278 (Thanks Leonard & Spanky!). The Financial Advisor's 2nd game pot went to Buddy Blind Bowler Lucas with his 290 (\$240) & Mason Sherman 2nd with 266, good for another \$100.
