"ACTION" JACKSON TO TAKE ON CHRIS BARNES IN WINNER-TAKE-ALL DUEL AT WSOB VI

LAS VEGAS - JT "Action" Jackson, who earned his nickname by bowling "action" with his comedian friends in Los Angeles, has challenged 17-time PBA Tour champion Chris Barnes of Double Oak. Texas, to a one-game, All-In Showdown match that will be webcast live on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling channel on Friday, Oct. 24, from South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas

Jackson, a 37-year-old lefthander, has won one PBA Regional title and has cashed only once in 34 PBA Tour events, but he has no fear of taking on one of the PBA's most accomplished players in a one-game match on the challenging PBA World Championship lane condition. Each player will put up \$5,000 and they will bowl for a \$10,000 winner-take-all prize at 5:15 p.m. ET (2:15 p.m. local time) on Oct. 24.

"I called (PBA Commissioner Tom Clark) and asked



him if the PBA was going to do an 'all-in showdown' like they did a couple of years ago. No one had mentioned anything," Jackson said, "but he asked if I wanted to do something like that, so he called Barnes, and it's going to be me against him.'

It was a last-minute suggestion but Barnes, who did his share of megabucks, highstakes action bowling before he even began his PBA career, quickly accepted the challenge. He's the only PBA player who has agreed to participate in every winner-take-all contest since the concept was introduced as a special event at the inaugural PBA World Series of Bowling in Allen Park, Mich., in 2009.

Jackson, who has culti-

vated a successful career as a comedian and actor, including featured roles in Kingsford Charcoal, CDW computer and Hulu television ads, said he got his start in "action bowling" in 2003.

"Around that time, I was doing a lot of standup comedy in Los Angeles," he said. "Me and a bunch of my comedian continued on page 9

Best team names in bowling? Here are a few by Fred Eisenhammer





Bob Glass, Chris Peters, Barb Wilt Elected to PBA Hall of Fame

2015 induction ceremonies planned for February 10 in Indianapolis

CHICAGO – Bob Glass, a dominant player during a 10-year career on the PBA50 Tour; former Microsoft executive Chris Peters, who played a key role as a new owner in reviving the Professional Bowlers Association, and Barb Wilt, the longest-tenured employee in PBA history, have been elected to the PBA Hall of Fame.

Induction ceremonies will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 10, at the Marriott Indianapolis North in conjunction with the 50th anniversary Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions. The Hall of Fame Dinner will be open to the public; ticket information will be announced later.

Glass was elected in the PBA50 Performance category. Peters and Wilt will be recognized in the Meritorious Service category for their extraordinary efforts behind the scenes to advance the PBA.

Glass, one of the first true power players on the PBA50 Tour, competed as a senior between 1997 and 2007 when he won nine titles and finished in the top five 38 times in 78 tournaments, earning just shy of a half-million dollars (\$487,215). He won a pair of majors – the 2000 Brunswick PBA Senior Championship and 2001 United States Bowling Congress Seniors Masters – and earned PBA50 Player of the Year honors in 2000, 2001 and 2004.

Glass, who holds a PhD in economics and has a law degree, lives in Lawrence, Kansas, and currently is Chief of Economics and Rates with the Kansas Corporation Commission in nearby Topeka. Glass will celebrate his 67th birthday on Friday, Oct. 24.

"I was really surprised," Glass said of his election. "I bowled some on the regular tour, and I really only bowled full-time 5 1/2 years on the senior tour. I just feel real lucky. It's kind of shocking.

"I used to tell people that my game degenerated slower than other people's because as a senior, I was able to beat guys who used to beat me regularly," he added.

With an imposing 6-foot-2, 230-pound frame, Glass said, "I was still pretty strong when I came out (on the PBA50 Tour). Actually, Steve Wunderlich (a three-time PBA Tour titlist), who was with Track at the time, probably saved my career when he convinced me to drop from 16-pound equipment for 15 pounds because the heavier ball was too powerful."

Peters, an early employee of Microsoft who later became an executive with the company, led the effort to purchase the PBA with partners and fellow Microsoft executives Mike Slade and Rob Glaser in 2000. Peters and his partners provided an infusion of capital to ensure a solid foundation for the organization while at the same time providing vision and innovative ideas to enhance the fan experience especially in the areas of event presentation and online coverage. The introduction of a professionally-designed "arena" style set for TV finals, including professional presentation of signage and an overall enhanced image, helped the PBA generate more new non-bowling corporate sponsorships than the PBA had seen in several years.

During Peters' tenure as an owner and Chairman of the PBA Board of Directors, the PBA:

- Hired former Nike executives to enhance the organization's position as a major sports organization;
- Re-launched a more comprehensive and fan-friendly PBA.com;
- Developed live online broadcasting of PBA competition through Strike Pass subscription service (now Xtra-Frame). Strike Pass was one of the first online ventures in the sports world to provide fans with live video-streaming coverage;
- Successfully negotiated long-term contracts with ESPN to establish a consistent time slot for PBA Tour telecasts;
- Introduced the PBA Exempt Tour for the 2004-05 season, creating an "elite" tour to better showcase PBA Tour players and provide the Tour's most successful players with guaranteed opportunities to make a living by including record prize money for standard events. Each major featured a minimum \$100,000 first prize, with the PBA World Championship offering a then-record \$120,000 first prize.

"I was very excited when (PBA Commissioner) Tom Clark called," Peters said. "It's great. I'm a bit overwhelmed, but obviously this is shared with (co-owners) Rob (Glaser) and Mike (Slade). They were responsible, not just financially, but with their enthusiasm and ideas and everything else. I never could have done this without them.

"It's been 15 years since I first talked with (former PBA Commissioner) Mark Gerberich," Peters continued. "Way back then, Rob and Mike and I thought there might be a way to showcase bowling on the Internet. The idea was crazy at the time, but now the world is catching up, and that's great to see.

"The nicest thing about my involvement is the people I met in the bowling industry," he added. "They are the nicest people I've met in the world, bar none, and that's what makes this so special. The PBA didn't have to do this. It's a huge honor. It's kind of a sad note, but my father was a big bowling fan, and he died during the past 15 years. He was the first one I wanted to call, so that kind

Wilt, who joined the PBA staff in 1970, retired to North Carolina in 2014 after 44 years of service to the organization. Her duties ranged from processing all PBA Tour entries to managing all of the PBA's statistical records, and virtually every other hands-on office chore over her extensive career.

When the PBA was sold in 2000, the new owners asked Wilt to assist with the transition to the new headquarters in Seattle, so she moved to Seattle and continued to work to make improvements in membership, entries and statistical processes.

She was the face of the PBA among most of its thousands of members over four-plus decades, providing a familiar and friendly voice to help them with their needs, and she was conduit between PBA's national and regional tournament directors in bridging the gap between the "office and the road." She also became the organization's unofficial historian and served as a guardian of old records, photographs and historical information.

"I'm overwhelmed. I never believed this would happen," Wilt said. "It's pretty overwhelming and I'm very, very honored.

"I did a job I loved to do, and worked with great people and terrific athletes, and I got the better end of the deal. It's pretty cool."

There were no candidates elected in the PBA Performance category.

Eligibility for the PBA Hall of Fame in the performance category requires a minimum of 20 years of PBA membership plus a minimum of 10 standard PBA Tour titles, or five titles plus two majors. Eligibility for the PBA50 performance category, which is intended to recognize players who excelled after reaching the age of 50, requires a minimum of 10 years of PBA50 competition plus a minimum of eight PBA50 Tour titles, or five standard PBA50 titles plus two majors. Candidates must receive a two-thirds majority of ballots cast in order to be elected.

friends started bowling. I had never bowled like that, but a bunch of guys – including Kevin Hart – started bowling every Monday. We'd bowl for \$1 a pin, whatever, and I discovered I could throw the ball pretty good. I lost a lot at first, but I started practicing six, seven hours a day for seven, eight months non-stop. I really took it serious, and that's how I got better."

But put his record against Barnes' and there's no doubt who will be the favorite. "Oh, my goodness, you don't need to tell me that," Jackson laughed. "But in one game, anything could happen. In a marathon, I'm pretty sure he'd prevail. But one game? I know who he is; I respect him as a great bowler, but for me, personally, nobody out there shakes me up. I'm not afraid of anybody."

Jackson also said he's got the confidence of Kevin Hart, a PBA League owner (Philadelphia Hitmen), and one of the hottest acting properties in Hollywood. Hart is actually putting up Jackson's \$5,000 stake in the contest.


For Barnes, the winner-take-all action matches take him back to his pre-PBA days.

seventh 800 and tenth perfect game.

Andy used his new Storm Optimus to bowl his record score. His favorite bowling line is Storm because Storm balls always work for him. Storm balls are predictable. They react on the lanes predictably and predictability is a big part of Andy's game.

Mr. Toro has been bowling for 52 of his 57 years. He has loved every minute of his time on the lanes. Since he started bowling there has always been something irresistible about knocking down pins. Like so many of us he has always looked forward to his next bowling date. It is bowling's version of "THE CALL OF THE WILD."

While his 822 is quite an accomplishment, Andy's high is 878! A bowler only bowls 878 if he is talented, dedicated and focused. Andy possesses all three of these attributes. His 235 average and many 700s demonstrate a talent for bowling. His bowling seven days a week demonstrate his dedication to our sport. His preparation and pre-game routine demonstrate his superior mental game, his focus.

I have watched Andy bowl in league and am impressed by his approach to the game. ANDY TAKES BOWLING SERIOUSLY. He always arrives early, always gets right down to business preparing himself and his equipment. He is ready to compete before most other bowlers have arrived. Then he prepares mentally.

Before other bowlers have arrived I have observed Andy sitting on a seat behind the approach seemingly starring down the pins sixty plus feet down lanes. It appears to me he is preparing himself mentally for the competition ahead. I haven't seen another league bowler as intense as Andy. He is focused.

For someone who loves bowling, like myself, it is refreshing to see a bowler so dedicated to his craft. Most of us show up the last minute and approach bowling like a game of horseshoes behind the barn. We show up the last minute without preparation or practice. Why do you think bowling has such a bad reputation? Why do non-bowlers consider bowling to be a fun activity that an uncoordinated hayseed can master? Why do many believe that a pitcher of beer will lead to higher scores? It is because there aren't enough of us who bowl like ANDY TORO SR. There aren't enough of us who are dedicated, prepared or focused.

By the way, Andy's favorite professional bowler is EARLAN-THONY. How appropriate it is for a bowler like Andy Torro to admire and emulate the professional who was arguably the most prepared and relentless competitor our sport has ever known.

When you have bowled for fifty-two years there are many people who have contributed to your success. Andy is grateful for the support and encouragement he has received from family, friends, coaches and equipment providers.

Specifically, he is thankful for his parents getting him started, his wife CLARISSA and kids for supporting his efforts and BILL GABLE (ABT) and BOB SMITH (ABTA). Special thanks to CLARENCE ROBERTS MARCUS SR., JOEL RICKETTS and NEIL LAU. Mr. "Bobby" Marcus was Andy's first coach while Joel and Neil of Pins and Needles Pro Shop are responsible for drilling Andy's equipment.

Congratulations Andy. We need more bowlers like you. While most of us may not possess your natural talent all of us can learn from your dedication, preparation and mental approach.
