## Jimmy Schmitzer Wins South Point PBA Challenge

LAS VEGAS — Former Citrus Belt star Jimmy Schmitzer has won the South Point PBA Challenge League and a free entry into a PBA Western Region tournament.

With an overall average of 207 bowled on the Earl Anthony, Mark Roth and Cheetah oil patterns, Jimmy was able to accumulate a league best 80 points. Second place went to Vegas legend JOHN DEBENEDETTA.

John's 205 average was third best in the league behind Schmitzer's 207 and WARREN EALES' 210.

The season highs were a 290 by Debenedetta and a 982 (four games) by JOE LIMPIN. Schmitzer's highs were 266 and 887. His strong point was his consistency, never too high and never too low. Jimmy used his Storm Nano and Storm Frantic bowling balls.

Great bowling Jimmy, I can't wait to see how you do in your PBA debut.

## Rash Tops Koivuniemi to Win World Bowling Tour Thailand Title

*Reigning PBA Player of the Year claims seventh career PBA title, second international title of 2012-13*

BANGKOK, Thailand — Reigning Professional Bowlers Association Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., defeated top qualifier Mika Koivuniemi, a Finnish native now living in Hartland, Mich., 235-225, 245-228, to win the World Bowling Tour Thailand

title Monday at Blu-O Paragon Bowling Center.

With the win, Rash claimed his seventh career PBA Tour title, his second World Ten-pin Bowling Association/PBA International Tour title during the 2012-13 season, and a first

# NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

## FISSER 247-888, JONES 255-838 TOPS DEAF TRAVEL AT BRUNSWICK COVINA

COVINA — Southern California Deaf Traveling League had an exciting time in its stop at Brunswick Covina Lanes with the top two lefthanders dueling each other. South California’s endowed Mark Fisser who is the first and only deaf 1986 ABC Star of Tomorrow and has currently the league’s top average 220, matched against Bob Jones who presently leads his Wednesday night scratch league at Harley’s Simi Bowl with 236.

In the first game Fisser doubled in tenth to win with 216 against Jones’ 210. Jones, with 6 strikes in row, took the second game 255 to Fisser’s 211. Fisser’s 3rd game started with 5 in row, two tapped 9 pins and finished with 247 against Jones’ 203. The 4th game was Fisser’s 214 as Jones ran out of gas with a 170. The total pins was Fisser’s 888 to Jones’ 838.

Fisser’s 888 and Jones’ 838 were the only two 800s of the day in the league’s day honor roll of 6 bowlers. The league President Ed Abakumoff had a 211 in his 744, Leroy MacMonagle hit a 736, Dan Flores had a 201 in his 728 and busy secretary Treasurer Bob Taylor a 707.

Sharon Caldwell took over the ladies season high series from Celia Salcedo by 3 pins with her 654 from stepped up games of 137-146-178-193. Sharon’s 193 was one short of tying Anita Lorenzo’s season high game 194. Anita also had a 191 on this day.

Albeit Fisser’s 888 got his Anaheim team 4 of his team total of 7 points against Jones and Taylor’s Eagle Rock’s 13 points, Anaheim fell from first to third place. Eagle Rock moved up from third to 2nd place. The league has a new leader as Mid City with Andy Lorenzo’s 5 of the team’s 14 points helped move up from 2nd to first place against Flores’ S. F. Valley’s 6 points.

Although Caldwell and Abakumoff’s Riverside had the day’s best with 15 points against MacMopnagle’s Orange County’s 5 points, Riverside remained in 4th place 4.5 points behind Fisser’s Anaheim.

The 54 years old all deaf traveling league thanks the Brunswick Covina Lanes management and staff for hosting and will return for the 2nd round in March. The next travel stop will be at Glendale’s Jewel City Bowl on Sunday Nov. 3 at Noon.

prize worth US\$32,140. Rash’s previous 2012-13 title was in the Kuwait Open, where he also defeated Koivuniemi for the title, but this time, because Koivuniemi entered the eight-player step-ladder finals as the top qualifier, Rash had to beat him twice.

Koivuniemi was trying for his fourth WTBA/PBA International Tour title of the year. Earlier in October, he captured his 11th PBA Tour title in the Columbia 300 Vienna Open in Austria.

Rash and Koivuniemi may meet again in the World Bowling Tour Men’s Finals, presented by the PBA, which will be conducted Nov. 3 as part of the PBA’s ESPN television finals at South Point in Las Vegas. Rash will enter the WBT Men’s Finals as top qualifier and will meet the winner of the preliminary match between No. 2 Koivuniemi and No. 3 Mike Fagan of Fort Worth, Texas. The WBT Women’s Finals field will include No. 1 Kelly Kulick, Union, N.J.; No. 2 Liz Johnson, Cheektowaga, N.Y., and defending women’s champion *Missy Parkin, Laguna Hills, Calif.*

In the first three-player, shootout match in Bangkok, Thailand’s Phoemphun Yakasem rolled a 256 game to advance over Korea’s Kim Young Kwan (211) and Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y. (193).

In the second three-player match, Hong Kong’s Michael Mak (238) eliminated Mike Fagan of Fort Worth, Texas (182) and Yakasem (169). Mak then eliminated the only woman to finish in the top eight, Singapore’s Daphne Tan, 258-211, but Mak’s title hopes ended when he lost to Rash in the semifinal match, 242-219.

The WBT Thailand event was the final tournament prior to PBA World Series of Bowling V, which gets underway with the PBA Cheetah Championship Saturday at South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas. All preliminary qualifying and match play rounds during WSOB V will be webcast live, exclusively on PBA’s online bowling channel, Xtra Frame. titles won (three).

Rash, also regarded as one of the PBA Tour's top power players, is right behind Belmonte in ESPN appearances (12), but has not yet won a WSOB title. He is the all-time WSOB average leader, scoring at a 223.19 pace for 475 games bowled, and in total pinfall (106,013 pins for 475 World Series games bowled). But he ranks "only" fourth in WSOB earnings (\$135,140) due, in part, to the absence of any first-place prize money.

Despite their overall dominance, neither Belmonte nor Rash leads in any of the traditional animal pattern championships which are hallmarks of the World Series. The animal pattern competitions are bowled on unique lane conditions named after animals – and the combined qualifying scores for those animal pattern events has been used as the qualifier for players to advance into the PBA World Championship match play final rounds. Rash is the World Championship's top qualifier over the past four years, averaging 232.21 for 192 games – just over four pins higher than Belmonte (228.01) for the same number of games.

In animal pattern events, several other players have had significant success, including O'Neill, who ranks third in TV appearances (8) and shares the titles lead with Belmonte (3). Finland's two-handed star, Osku Palermaa; 37-time time PBA Tour champion Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., and Scott Norton of Mission Viejo, Calif., have each won two WSOB titles. Palermaa, Mike Fagan of Fort Worth, Texas, and Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, have made six TV finals.

There is also "international vs. United States" drama during the World Series. In 2011, international players won all seven singles titles contest; last year, U.S. players swept all five individual titles.

In animal pattern championships, the top two players in qualifying averages for each event, based upon a minimum of 40 games, are:

- Chameleon: Scott Norton 230.49; Jason Belmonte 225.38.
- Cheetah: Norm Duke 243.58, Eugene McCune 241.52.
- Scorpion: Dom Barrett 228.70, Jason Belmonte 222.87.
- Viper: Brad Angelo 222.60, Bill O'Neill 222.39.

The Cheetah Championship will lead off the WSOB V schedule on Saturday, Oct. 26, with seven qualifying games and an additional seven-game semifinal round for the top 24 qualifiers. The same format will apply for the Viper Championship on Oct. 27, the Chameleon Championship on Oct. 28 and the Scorpion Championship on Oct. 29.

The top 24 players based upon 28 combined animal pattern qualifying games will advance to the PBA World Championship round robin match play on Oct. 30-31. For each animal pattern event, the top four after 14 games advance to ESPN finals on Nov. 2 and for the World Championship, the top five after 52 qualifying and match play games advance to the ESPN finals on Nov. 3 – all in South Point's Exhibition Hall B.

**IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS**

... That next year you're always talking about? Don't look, but it's here.

... Golf can be an aggravating sport, but most pro bowlers play golf to relax from bowling, which also can be an aggravating game.

... Do Bahrain, Brunei, Cypress, Jersey, Kuwait, Malta, Mauritius, Myanmar, Yemen and Wales ring a bell? They are among the more than 120 country bowling federations that regularly bowl in FIQ and other international bowling competitions.

... Never thought I'd see the day when bowling balls came in more different colors than Easter eggs.

... The charter members of the ABC Hall of Fame were Joe Bodis, Adolph Carlson, Charley Daw, Peter Howley, John Koster, Herb Lange, Mort Lindsey, Hank Marino, Jimmy Smith, Harry Steers and Gil Zunker.

... Missing from the bowling scene in regular league play is the once large number of artistic and zany bowling shirts. These days many leagues have more teams without bowling shirts than with, and sadly, some leagues have more bowlers wearing hats than wearing bowling shirts.

... In too many cases the instructor is the person who had bowled once or twice before.

... We should always heed the long ago words of former American Junior Bowling Congress manager Chuck Hall, who said, "We need to renew our enthusiasm for introducing youngsters to bowling and project the attitude that bowling is the greatest game in the world." Amen.
