FULLERTON—Sunday morning in Fullerton welcomes back the JAT Farm Club after a few weeks off. AMF Carter Lanes played host to our most recent tournament that brought out thirty bowlers to see if the conditions met the high expectations from previous events.

In the qualifying round Eddie Sayles led the way behind games of 231-262-245 and was plus 106 after the first five games. Other high scores in qualifying came in from Justin Foster 224-248, Jon Hogan 242, Kevin Jones 236, Steven Sensabaugh 236, Jonathan Greenhalgh 235, Michael May 229, James Bael 228, Joey Marino 226-224, Mark Curtis 224, and Thomas Hogan 224. The cut line for match play was minus 73.

Many of the bowlers didn't wake up until they found themselves in match play. However, early riser Sayles still marched on with the tournament high game of 268 and a 220 game. Charlie Hair made the papers with a 266 game, followed by Albert Fernandez 257-236, J. Hogan 242, A.J. Garcia 236, Jones 223-224, Justin Foster 223, Deanna Carrillo 222, Curtis 221, and Allie Ijams 221.

A lot of position movement during match play while two of the top five had to jump five positions to get there and surprises among the other three. However, Fernandez made the

most of match play with a 10 (really 11) position jump. Fernandez, who was originally the alternate after qualifying, got in to match play in the 16th spot. He ended match play in the 6th spot. Yes alternate position to alternate position in five games.

To start off the finals, we had 5th seed Curtis (+63) taking on 4th seed Jon Hogan (+99) as Hogan took the game AND the mind of Curtis 223-220. So Curtis exits talking to himself as Hogan advances to meet 3rd seed Carrillo (+128). Now being a gentlemen, Hogan did not let this match be so close as he posted a 212-192 victory to say good-bye to Carrillo. However, now against the veteran Sayles (+134) the tables were turned. Sayles advanced into the final pairing with a 232-197 win. So here against top seed Jones (+198) Sayles took the first match 236-227. Then it was Jones' turn with a 214-212 win. And then with both bowlers tired, Jones took the last match, the tournament and his first title 176-157. Congratulations Kevin.

COVINA — Every Tuesday and Friday a determined group of bowlers take to the lanes at Brunswick Covina Bowl. These 2 unique leagues are made up of stroke victims, cancer survivors, friends and relatives.

In 1994, Anne Clifford, member of the San Gabriel Valley W.B.A., made a trip to the national W.I.B.C. tournament and convention. On her return, Anne decided to share her experience with the patients at the Covina Stroke Center.

Some of the patients were former bowlers and had a desire to give it a try again.

Anne obtained a ramp, some lane time, transportation, light weight balls and a couple of coaches. Namely Paula Harris and Marie Fisher.

Most stroke victims loose the use of at least one arm, legs and speech. Imagine getting dressed, groomed, into the wheelchair, out of wheelchair and into the car.

Once you reach the bowling center — out of the car, into the wheelchair and into the bowl. Now, get down to the lanes, find a ball, or drag your ball along.

Is bowling really worth that kind of effort? For these bowlers it is! Most must learn to use their left arm, a new way to speak, and get over the fear of going out in public.

Bowling does it for these warriors. They do battle in city and state tournaments. Have appeared on Channel 4 T.V. What a thrill!

Their mascot is the Bumble Bee. The bee, aerodynamically is unable to fly. (Body too big, wings too small.) But HE doesn't know it, so he flies!

Stroke Motto, "You Are Never Fully Dressed Until You Put On Your Smile".

Many of these bowlers have received awards for 200 games and average in the 140's. The national average for women is only 138, so maybe we should practice more.

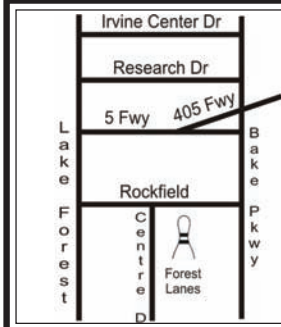

USBC Refocus On System Of Bowling

Part II by John Jowdy

In a recent column, I commented on the first two of four key components of the System of Bowling...bowling balls and bowling pins.

Before commenting on the other two, Lane Conditioning and Lane Surfaces, I came across a bowling column I wrote in April 1988, 18 years ago that is as true today as it was then. Following is the editorial I wrote that appeared in several bowling publications around the country:

Long oil, short oil...the greatest controversy in bowling history is easing its evil shadow throughout the industry. The results of the past year clearly indicate the failure of limited dressing procedures. It has done little or nothing to stem the tide of fictitious high scores and inflated averages. This is not to say that the prime purpose for such procedures were aimed in that direction, but the plan in mind was a means of impeding the fraudulent practice of lane doctoring.

The spirit of cooperation between the Bowling Proprietors Association of America and the American Bowling Congress decays with ached rejected high score. The entire bowling industry is adversely affected by this state of affairs. It is truly an enigma.

On one hand, there is the proprietor, an investor whose livelihood is dependent on satisfied customers. In many cases, proprietors have invested life saving in their businesses. The average 32- lane center will exceed an investment of well over a million dollars.

On the other hand, there is the American Bowling Congress, the governing body of elected officials representing millions of bowlers. The ABC is responsible for the preservation of rules, regulations, integrity and respect. It is the moral duty of the Congress to maintain dignity and fairness in all phases of the game, particularly in the high score category.

The insatiable desire for high scores by many thousands of egomaniacs has been the source of the problem. Unfortunately, pride in performance is sorely lacking in those whose egos surpass the significance of true achievement. This is the type bowler that places constant pressure on the proprietor for easier scoring that, in effect, evoke and summon ABC officials to take corrective steps for the maintenance of purity and morality for the sport.

Bowling is a great family sport. The industry itself is one big happy family, steadfastly cooperating to promote the sport. This is the silver

lining in seemingly dark clouds. The BPAA is concerned, the ABC and WIBC are concerned, and all manufacturers are concerned with this problem.

High scores have always been of major concern with doctored lanes. However, the emergence of urethane finishes has substantially expanded the perplexing matter. Urethane was born out of necessity of financial risks; the results of insurance rates governing lacquer and shellac materials. Hard urethane finishes, unlike lacquer and shellac, do not absorb oil dressings applied to lane surfaces. It is extremely difficult to hook a ball on oil dressing extended to 40 or 45 feet because oil dressings lay on top of urethane and carries down toward the pin deck with each delivered shot. The ball entry to the pocket will suffer repercussions, depending on the type of hook thrown. This is the contrast to short oil.

Short oil, the current system agreed upon by the BPAA and ABC is an oil pattern not exceeding 24 feet, and applied in any manner desired. Results of this method of oil application have been a minor disaster. This procedure, with a completely dry area of over 30 feet, has made gorillas out of monkeys. With no lane oil resistance to the roll of the ball, it has lulled the bowler into a false impression of a powerfully thrown weapon.

Consequently, the outgrowth is the lack of talent required for swinging the ball out to the channel and relying on the dry surface to pull the ball back into the pocket.

Ill-fated as it may seem, it is entirely legal by all standards and regulations set forth by Congress. And so goes the story!

Webster's dictionary defines dilemma as any situation requiring a choice between two unpleasant alternatives. Dilemma is also listed as a perplexity, a quandary, a difficulty and a predicament.

The BPAA and the ABC is a combination of all the above.

Folks, this was written 18 years ago. Need I say more? Have we really progressed in harnessing outlandish fictitious scores? The answer is an emphatic NO! Since then, the USDBC has recognized almost a dozen 900 series.

The latest two, by Robert Mushtare, were somewhat tainted, but nevertheless, approved. The most recent press release from USBC announced the following: Six all-time team standards were broken and one tied during the 2005-06 season.

Record-breaking scores have become an annual pattern. Three million bowlers today are breaking records faster than 9 million bowlers did 20 years ago. There seems to be no end in sight.

The third and fourth components of the USBC Refocus on the System of Bowling Research, will be addressed in my next column.

Part III

The Third And Fourth Component Of The USBC Refocus On The System Of Bowling.

LANE CONDITIONING...According to the USBC press release, "Testing continues in several areas regarding the measurement and application of lane conditioner (commonly referred to as oil) which is the liquid applied to wood and synthetic lanes. Lane oil has two purposes: to protect the bowling surface and affect the difficulty level of the game, depending on how it is applied". Currently, the amount and application of oil on a lane is measured with tape that absorbs the oil, which is read by a computer analyzer. USBC is also considering changing the description of oil application from units to ratios. Currently, USBC rules require at least three units of oil be applied on each board of a bowling lane to constitute certification. The amount of oil on a lane typically is expressed as a ratio compared how much oil is applied to the inside boards (between the second arrows on each side of the lane) to the amount of oil laid down on the outside boards (the channel to around board number 10 on each side of the lane) For example, a lane with a 10:1 ratio means there is ten times as much oil in the middle of the lane than on the outside. The way in which oil is applied changes the difficulty level in bowling and is typically called an "oil pattern".

Nevertheless, there is no absolute definitive rule governing a proprietor's method of oil application. Consequently, lane maintenance men can actually set up a legal blocked condition; yet remain within USBC specifications.

I am in complete sympathy with all members of the USBC research and testing group. They face a thankless, almost impossible task of maintaining integrity in the game, and, at the same time, not offend the bowling proprietor.

The USBC has created Sport Leagues that put the game in proper perspective. Unfortunately, a very small percentage of bowlers have attempted to pit their skills on legitimate conditions. They prefer to boost their egos on soft, blocked conditions. Consequently, lane conditioning has become the main culprit in the ever-increasing high-scoring madness. Proprietors, who have the choice to condition their lanes as they see fit, cannot be governed as long as they play within the USBC rules. As previously stated, present USBC lane maintenance regulations are too inexact. Ingenious lane maintenance men can skirt the edges and set up easy scoring conditions. For example, standard USBC league often have lane conditions with as much as a 20:1 oil ratio which can result in high scoring pace as the extreme differences in friction on the lane act to artificially steer balls to the pocket. This is the dilemma that is, as has existed in bowling for the past 25 years.

USDBC Sport Bowling events, which include most of today's premier bowling tournaments, including all four Professional Bowling Association majors, are, at most, a 3:1 ratio. This can result in a more challenging scoring environment.

Regarding lane conditions in a general sense, USBC endorses the concept of multiple levels of play;

- 1.As a Sport
- 2.Standard... on lane conditions in USBC-certified competition that allow for high and low scoring events
3. Bumper bowling

Bowling can begin to right itself in two distinctly different manners:

First, Award scores should be recognized in Sport leagues ONLY. This will compel egomaniacs to join sport leagues to prove their worthiness.

Second: Adopt the Roger Dalkin theory of multiple levels of bowling: Sport, standard, and bumper bowling. This can be easier accomplished by raising the voids in pins for all league play except those of seniors, beginning youngsters, and handicapped bowlers.

LANE SURFACES...USBC's fourth component of the System of Bowling. Future research plans include:

- 1.Revising Sport Bowling lane dressing ratio specifications
- 2.Testing on how pin deck tilt affect scoring
- 3.Studying potential changes in flat gutter specifications
- 4.Conducting tests on lane surface coefficient of friction and hardness.

Bowling lane construction has evolved from original wood materials to synthetic surfaces. Additionally, lane maintenance machines have become increasingly sophisticated, thus making lane maintenance a faster and simpler task. Synthetic materials and contemporary lane machines has been a boom for proprietors in several ways. It has decreased insurance rates and greatly decreased labor costs for lane maintenance procedures. These machines have greatly contributed to the simplicity of lane blocking. Unfortunately, they are here to stay. Fortunately, they can be computed to deal with all multiple levels of bowling.

Last, but not least, (in my opinion), the simplest method for restoring integrity to bowling is attacking the second component of the USBC System of Bowling, one that has been bypassed far too long. RAISE THE VOID IN BOWLING PINS!

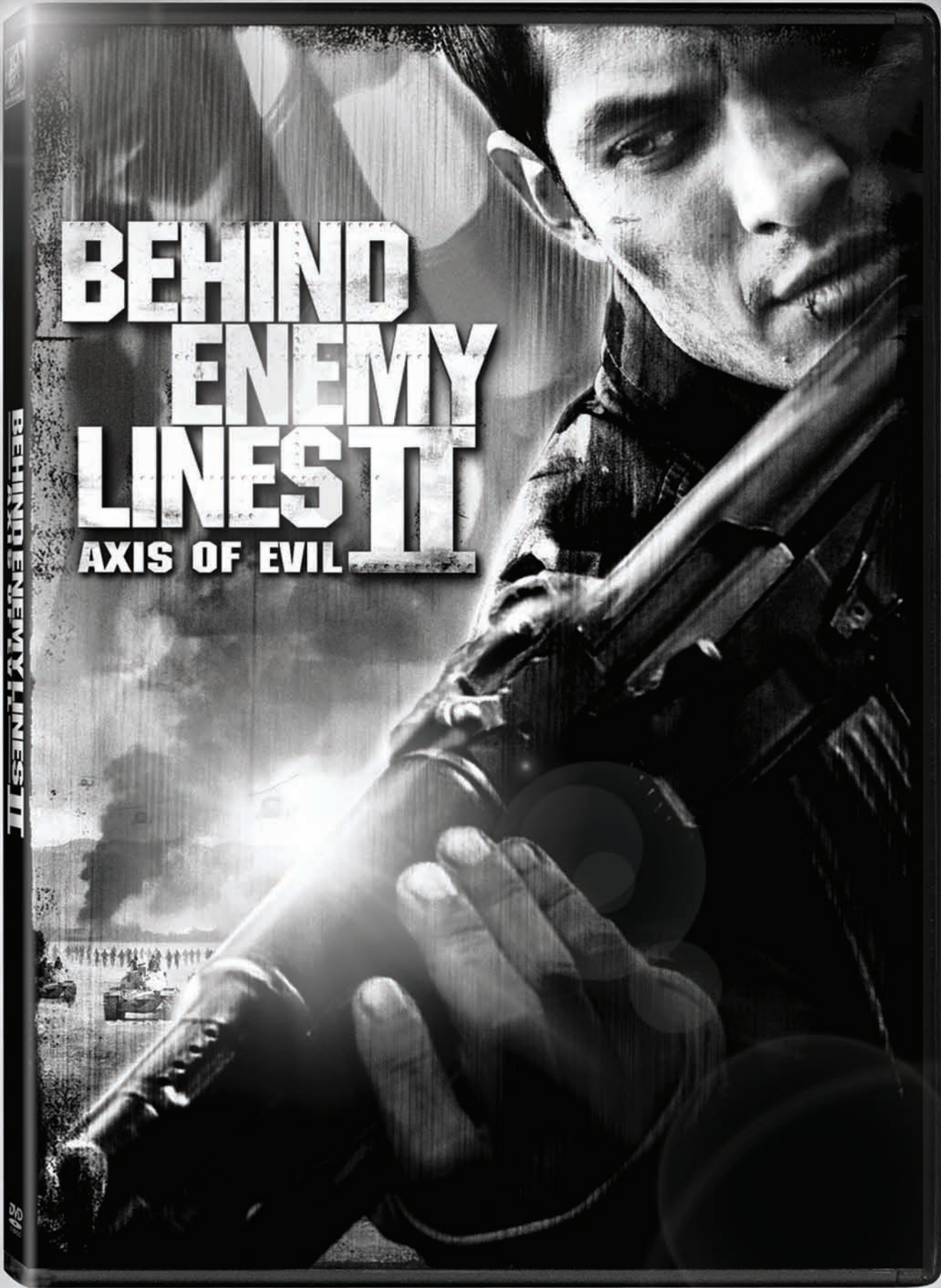

"When I won the Masters, it was like a big burden off my shoulders, not only because of the money but also because of the exemption," said Scroggins, whose victory last year earned him a guaranteed spot on the Denny's Professional Bowlers Association Tour for two years as well as \$100,000. "After the Masters, I just felt like there was no pressure anymore just go out there and bowl."

The result was a breakout year for Scroggins. He made six TV finals, earned \$205,270 and had his highest average in a single season (223.82).

Now, he's hoping to parlay his success into another successful run in the 2006-07 season. He'll get a head start at the Masters, where as defending champion he gets to bypass qualifying and will automatically be seeded in match play.

"It's always nice being seeded but to me it can be sort of a disadvantage," Scroggins said. "When you are bowling in qualifying, you get a feeling for how the lanes are breaking down and how people are playing them. It's one of the things that you have to live with. If they gave me a chance to be seeded or not seeded, I'd be seeded every time."

Scroggins, who has three career PBA titles, defeated Norm Duke 245-238 in the championship match of the Masters last year. The victory came a year after Scroggins failed to make the first cut at the Masters in October 2004 and finished in 175th place.

"In 2004 I just played the lanes wrong," Scroggins said. "I was trying to watch (fellow professional bowler) Patrick Allen bowl because he was bowling fairly decent. I should have never done that. It just got me all messed up. Last year, I decided to just to go out there and bowl the way I like to bowl and see what happens. It turned out all right."

If Scroggins can find a way to survive the demanding double-elimination match play bracket again this year, he will become just the third person to win back-to-back Masters titles, joining USBC Hall of Famers Dick Hoover (1956 and '57) and Billy Welu (1964 and '65).

Standing in Scroggins' way will be more than 450 of the world's top amateur and professional bowlers, including 12 past Masters champions. The field also features 10 women, among them Kelly Kulick, who made history recently by becoming the first woman to earn a full-time spot on the PBA Tour.

All participants will bowl two five-game blocks of qualifying on Oct. 24 and 25 before the first cut is made to the top 25 percent. After another five games the morning of Oct. 26, the top 63 bowlers will join Scroggins in match play, which continues until the top four bowlers are determined Oct. 27 for the TV finals.

The finals of the Masters will be held on Oct. 29 at 1 p.m. EST at the Wisconsin Exposition Center, located at State Fair Park in the Milwaukee suburb of West Allis, Wis., and televised live on ESPN.

A major on the Denny's PBA Tour, bowlers will be competing for a top prize of \$100,000 and an overall prize fund of \$350,000.

USBC HONORS MORE THAN ONE MILLION MEMBERS IN 2005-06 SEASON

Bowlers earn recognition for high score and special achievements

GREENDALE, Wis.—The United States Bowling Congress issued 141,618 high score and 1,206,850 special achievement awards to its more than 2.7 million members during the 2005-06 season. USBC also issued an additional 53 high score awards to its more than 12,000 Sport Bowling members.

In its first full season after becoming an organization in 2005, USBC issued 56,212 awards for 300 games, 23,027 for 299 games, 9,526 for 298 games, 17,612 for 800 series and 35,241 for 11 strikes in a row. The numbers are for adults and youth members combined during the period from Aug. 1, 2005 through July 31, 2006.

USBC Sport Bowling members earned 27 awards for 300 games, nine for 299 games, two for 298 games, two for 800 series and 13 for 11 strikes in a row.

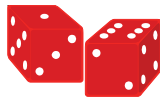
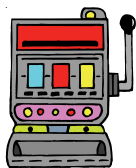

Patterson, Asbaty Prepare For Back to Back Major Events

U.S. Amateur champions will compete in USBC Masters and World Cup

GREENDALE, Wis. - The timing couldn’t have worked out any better for reigning U.S. Amateur champions Dan Patterson of Buffalo, N.Y., and Diandra Asbaty of Chicago.

With one of the premier events on the international calendar - the QubicaAMF World Cup - on the horizon, both players will get a chance to sharpen their skills against world-class competition at the 2006 United States Bowling Congress Masters next week.

“There’s no better way to prepare for the World Cup than to compete in the Masters, which is such a great event where you can bowl right next to the best professional bowlers in the world,” Asbaty said. “No matter how I do at the Masters, I will come away knowing more, and I’ll use it to prepare for the World Cup.”

The 42nd World Cup, which will be held Nov. 4-10 in Caracas, Venezuela, will feature amateur bowlers from nearly 100 countries. The Masters, meanwhile, will be held Oct. 24-29 in suburban Milwaukee and features a mix of the top professionals and amateurs in the world.

“I expect the pressure at the World Cup to be very similar to what I’ll see at the Masters,” Patterson said. “Both tournaments are very different, though. The World Cup will be more of a friendly environment where people are there enjoying the experience. The Masters is more of a quiet, solitary event.”

While Patterson will be making his first trip to the World Cup, Asbaty will compete for the second time. She finished ninth at the 2000 event in Lisbon, Portugal.

“I definitely could have done better in 2000, but I learned what I needed to do to get stronger,” Asbaty said. “I know more about equipment, and I’m a more developed player. My development mentally might be even more important than my physical game. I’ve competed in some really big tournaments since then that have prepared me mentally for this year’s World Cup.”

The United States has dominated the women’s side of the World Cup in recent years, bringing home three of the last four titles. Lynda Barnes won in 2005 while Shannon Pluhowsky won in 2002 and 2004. Pluhowsky also finished second in 2003.

For the men, the last time a U.S. player won the World Cup was in 1995 when Patrick Healey Jr. won in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

“The United States has had great success with Lynda winning last year and Shannon winning twice, so I hope to do as well as they have,” Asbaty said. “I will represent the United States the best I can.

National Deaf Bowling News

Amati Wins Handicap, Parker Scratch in Las Vegas Deaf Classic at South Coast

LAS VEGAS—Las Vegas Deaf Bowling Association annually held its handicap singles classic on the Saturday after the Deaf Senior Bowlers of America tournament which conceded on Thursday. That was planned for some senior bowlers who stayed over the week-end. In the past some did stay and benefited by cashing in this Classic.

But that one held last Saturday Oct. 14 at the new South Coast Hotel Casino and Bowling Center, only one deaf senior from out of town Bob Taylor from Los Angeles, participated.

There were a disappointing 21 entries which left the LVDBA officials pondering its worth for the future on that Saturday.

The tournament went on with 9 Las Vegas bowlers on the first squad at 1:00 PM which Dave Amati led with 193-190-237-245/865 plus 24 handicap/889 total. Tom Parker who on the previous Tuesday as a substitute doubles partner with Janis Bower from Colorado won the Deaf Seniors Doubles event \$1,800 prize, placed 2nd with 227-193-184-234/838 plus 24 handicap/862. Louis Quilles placed third with (218) 746 plus 56 handicap/802.

On the 3 PM squad there were 12 entries including re-entries from Las Vegas bowlers Parker, Quilles, Ron Loader, tournament director Barrett Lee and Van Tomita.

Parker tried to overtake Amati but failed with a 174 finish after 214-206-234 for 828 plus 24 handicap /852 total to led this squad. James Kelly placed 2nd with (205-204) 782 plus 16/798 and Barry Cossman 3rd with 735 plus 0/735.

As in the past few years, the host LVDBA came up with different versions of prize money payoff, this one was an unique separate handicap and scratch prize list which the bowler cashed only once on his best score position. Also LVDBA was generous in giving more place money which 14 out of 21 entrants cashed at least \$50.00.

As the Handicap Champion Amati with 889 won \$450.00, Parker with the 2nd high scratch 838 on the 1 PM squad took the Scratch Championship \$350 prize. With limit of one prize, Parker’s other scores not counting, Quilles’ 802 places him 2nd in Handicap prize list for \$225.00 followed by Kelly’s 798 for 3rd \$175.00. Cossman took the Scratch 2nd place \$175.00 because his scratch 735 was higher than Lee’s 733, Taylor’s 730 and Loader’s 729.

However Loader with higher handicap score of 785 took Handicap 4th place \$100 while Lee and Taylor received \$125 and \$100 for their scratch scores respectively. Both divisions prize went down to 7 places. Special \$25.00 prizes for high scratch game and high game with handicap went to Amati’s 245 and Parker’s 234 +6/240.

DEGROFF ROLLS 298-761 IN MISSION HILLS MAJORS

MISSION HILLS—It was matter of time when I get the news of Ken DeGroff’s hitting a honor score bowling at Mission Hills Bowl. DeGroff managed to get two deaf bowlers, Bob Jones and Dan Flores and another man for a team to bowl in the Mission Hills Majors which has lots of big name star bowlers in it.

With exception of last season, which he did not bowl in any league, Degroff managed to register two or three honor scores each season. Like he did at Mission Hills Bowl which took him most of the season to finally conquer its lanes as last March 2005 he rolled 222-300-268 for 790. The right-hander followed that in April with 299-248-230 for 777. That 300 was his 21st career score and claimed the 299 as his 23rd lifetime.

The news finally came last Thursday in the tough Mission Hills Majors, DeGroff for the first time in his life for 16 years rolled a 298 game. He started with 11 strikes in row and hooked his 12th ball high in the pocket leaving a 4-10 split. Then he finished with 224 and 239 for a 761 series.

That raised his average up to 222 for 21 games.

His name is in USBC record book as one of few bowlers with two back to back 300 games.


