Hall of Famer Carmen Salvino To Compete In USBC Masters

GREENDALE—When Carmen Salvino watched the United States Bowling Congress Masters last year it was like stepping into the past.

A lot has changed in the bowling industry since Salvino, a USBC and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer, last competed in the Masters in 1981. But last year's event gave him a hint of nostalgia.

"I watched the tournament, and I saw that the lane conditions were very tough," Salvino said. "That encouraged me a lot because when the lanes are real opened up it's not really a contest of one's skill. I thought a lot of the bowlers got a real education on how to play the game."

It was enough encouragement that Salvino wants to be a part of the Masters again. So for the first time in two dozen years, the 71-year-old has decided to enter the event.

The Masters will be conducted Nov. 15-20 in Milwaukee and will feature a field of approximately 500 of the world's best professional and amateur bowlers, who will compete for the sport's most prestigious title.

Among those hundreds of competitors only a handful have a bowling resume that matches or exceeds what Salvino has accomplished. He won 19 professional titles in his career - the last coming in the Senior/Touring Pro doubles with Randy Pedersen in 1988.

Should Salvino happen to win the Masters, he would become the oldest champion in the event's history. That record now belongs to Ernie Schlegel, who won in 1996 at age 53.

"I'll bet (baseball hall of famer) Reggie Jackson would like to put on a uniform, sit in the dugout and get one more swing at his age," Salvino said. "Well I'm getting that opportunity at the Masters."

Salvino is still very much in touch with the bowlers of today and what it takes to succeed at the highest level.

He's worked as a consultant for a number of years for the PBA, traveling to many events each season. As a result, he

hasn't bowled a considerable amount.

Salvino started practicing for the Masters recently to get back into "bowling shape" before he heads to Milwaukee.

"I've been practicing a little bit to get into some sort of decent shape to bowl on a condition that I feel is challenging," Salvino said. "Really, I'm bowling for my own personal fun. It's something I want to do for me. Rubbing shoulders with the greatest bowlers of today for at least a week will make me feel like I'm 25 again."

Salvino has bowled in the Masters many times in the past and in his most recent appearance in 1981 he finished 30th. His best finish in the Masters was in the event's third year in 1953 when he finished in the top 10.

That's another reason he's decided to take another shot at the Masters - to try and better his past performances in the sport's greatest championship.

"The Masters tournament has been difficult for me because there is some luck of the draw with match play," he said. "I've had a lot stronger record in other tournaments, and I'd like to come back in a tournament I've never been super great at.

"You can't just bowl where you think you are going to easily knock down pins. You have to be challenged. At 71, I still have the fire, and I'm looking for challenges."

2005-06 PBA Tour Season Gets Under Way In Tusla

SEATTLE—After an exciting 2004-05 season which featured breakout performances, record chases and end-of-the-season drama for final exemptions, the 2005-06 Denny's PBA Tour season has all the makings of another thrilling campaign.

This season will be the PBA Tour's first ever with a title sponsor. In October of 2005, Denny's and the PBA signed a three-year deal making Denny's the official sponsor of the PBA Tour.

History in the Making
The first season of the Denny's Tour could be historical in more ways than one. After winning his 40th title in 2004-05, Walter Ray Williams Jr. heads into 2005-06 looking to tie and break bowling's most storied record: the all-time Tour titles record.

After winning the season's third event last year, the 2004 Uniroyal Tire Classic, Williams (Ocala, Fla.) had four chances on television to tie Earl Anthony's record of 41 titles. Williams, however, went 0-4 in those four appearances and was unable to tie the record. The season wasn't a wash for Williams, who not only won a title for the 12th consecutive season, but also won the George Young High Average Award for the sixth time in his career. Williams will continue to try and shake off the hype and put the title chase – and Anthony – behind him.

"I've been trying to tie the record for a little while but I don't feel like it's bothering me," said Williams. "I had some opportunities last season but it just didn't happen. If it does happen at some point, it's going to be awesome wherever it is."

Williams, however, isn't the only bowler chasing a storied record this season.

Tommy Jones, who won a Tour-high four titles in 2004-05, is building a reputation as one of the best TV bowlers of all-time.

The 26-year-old won his first career title in the Dydo Drinco Japan Cup 2004, then reeled off three more wins in all three championship rounds he appeared in, running his winning streak on TV to eight games.

Jones (Mauldin, S.C.) picked up where he left off in this season's Dydo Japan Cup 2005. This time, Jones had to win five matches to earn his fifth career



Will this be the year Walter Ray Williams Jr. breaks Earl Anthony's all-time titles record?

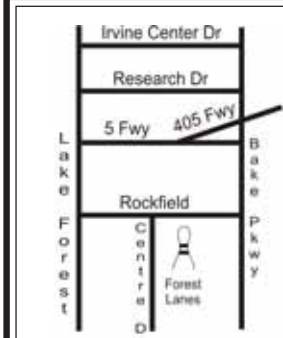
title, defeating fellow exempt bowlers Brad Angelo, Patrick Allen, Patrick Healey Jr. and Norm Duke along the way. Jones has now won 13 consecutive matches on television, 2nd all-time and just three wins shy of Jim Pencak's all-time Tour record.

Despite his four wins last season, Jones finished 2nd in the 2005 PBA Player of the Year race. Patrick Allen topped Jones by finishing in the top five in all four majors, the first bowler to accomplish that feat on the Denny's PBA Tour. Allen captured his first career major title by winning the 2005 Denny's World Championship, and also finished as the runner-up in two majors: the 2004 Miller High Life Masters presented by the American Bowling Congress and the 62nd U.S. Open presented by Odor-Eaters.

Allen picked up two more titles in 2004-05, as well as the Harry Smith Point Leader Award. His \$350,740 in earnings was the second-highest single-season mark of all-time. The question will be whether Allen

It took a +48 to make the sweet 16 single elims and that included four women.

The bowlers took to the lanes. In the first round single elims, and losing were Tommy Newman, Tom Licauco, Joyce Westbrook, Tracy Cueto, Josh Koch, Marvin Crowder Jr. and Paul Danforth. They got checks of \$100 in 10-16th places.

In round two, being eliminated were Leo Tartamella, Mark Wong, Bob Alvarado, and Roger Wrase. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$107.50 each.

Round three had John Daily

finish strongly to down Mrs. Ditch. Krishna Howard laid the wood to Rico Cayton. Janine and Rico were 4th, and 5th with fine bowling, and \$115 each with John Daily and Krischna Howard to meet for the chance to bowl Vic Garcia for the title.

Daily brought his A game and downed a very game Ms. Howard 249-222 and would advance to the title game. Krischna finishing third at Del Rio and she could have been a winner, as she bowled very well.

The title game was on and Garcia elected to lead off. He did, with a strike, and Daily spared, struck. Vic then doubled and Daily lost his shot with bad counts, and opens in frames 3-4. After 6 frames Vic led convincingly by 33 pins and an open. John then sparing and an open. John tried with a big double in frames 7-8 but a “big four” did him in. Vic marking out, won his first ABTA title in fine style with a 203/232-162/184 win and a nice prize of \$2,500. Great bowling by a greater guy!! Vic is one of the classiest and nicest persons that I have ever met on or off the lanes. It is just great to see him win his first title. Vic bought us all food as a gift and we are appreciative to say the least. Great Bowling Vic!!

Ron Schmidt rolled a huge 732 set, but was not able to keep his team from losing late.

can repeat that success after earning a four-year exemption from his World Championship win.

“I wasn’t looking to have the season I had last season, I was just looking to keep my job,” the Tarrytown, N.Y. native said. “Now I’m just looking to keep my focus instead of keeping my job so the mindset is a little different. I think it affects some guys differently to have a year where you don’t have to worry about your job. Some have bowled well, some haven’t. I’m just going to try and work as hard as I always have and not take anything for granted even though I’m in a lot different position than a lot of other guys.”

Young Guns Williams, Jones and Allen will have competition from a bevy of young stars in 2005-06. The Tour welcomes 15 newcomers, as well as one veteran who returns after a one-year absence from wrist surgery.

Of the 15 new exempt bowlers, 10 are between the ages of 24 and 34. This group of “young guns” is looking to take over the Tour from veteran superstars like Williams, Duke, Brian Voss, Parker Bohn III and Amleto Monacelli – all of whom won titles in 2004-05 and proved they’re not ready to turn the Tour over to the young hotshots.

One of the “young guns” looking to establish himself as one of the stars of the game is Chris Loschetter (Olmsted Falls, Ohio). The 25-year-old took the bowling world by surprise last March, coming out of nowhere to finish 2nd in the 2005 Denny’s World Championship to Allen. Loschetter had bowled in just 15 Tour events prior to the World Championship, and he proved it was no fluke, leading qualifying through the second and third rounds, then defeating exempt stars Mike Machuga, Danny Wiseman and Voss before falling to Allen in the title match.

Loschetter then smoked the field in the 2005 Denny’s PBA Tour Trials to earn his first career exemption. He’ll be one of 24 exempt bowlers in 2005-06 looking for their first career title.

Though Ritchie Allen (Columbia, S.C.) already owns one Tour title, his story is compelling. Allen, 27, went through two years of heartbreak and close calls before finally earning an exemption. He finished four spots short of an exemption via the 2003-04 PBA World Point Rankings, then missed by just eight pins in the 2004 Denny’s PBA Tour Trials. Allen then missed an exemption by one spot in the 2004-05 PBA South Region points race.

Just when it seemed like Allen couldn’t possibly take any more drama, he was 11th heading into the 45th and final game at the 2005 Denny’s PBA Tour Trials, one spot out of the cut. Allen wasn’t going to be denied this time, as he shot a 245 in the final game to leap to 9th and earn his first exemption.

The youngest bowler on Tour, Bill O’Neill (Levittown, Pa.), showed flashes of his potential in 2004-05 just like Loschetter. The 24-year-old finished 6th in the 62nd U.S. Open presented by Odor-Eaters as an amateur, just missing a spot in the televised championship round. O’Neill then became a PBA member and finished 10th in the 2005 Denny’s PBA Tour Trials to earn the last of the 58 Tour exemptions.

The 2004 PBA Rookie of the Year Chris Johnson (Garland, Texas) also will look to win his first career title. At 28, Johnson is one of the game’s top young stars. He’s showed an ability to

step up to the toughest competition, defeating PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber all three times he’s faced him in match play.

Return to Form Speaking of Weber, he’ll be one of the focal points in 2005-06 as he looks to bounce back from one of the most difficult seasons in his 26-year career.

Weber (St. Ann, Mo.) was unlucky to start the season, bowling well but not getting the breaks he needed in matches to get an opportunity to bowl on television. Then in February, his world was turned upside-down.

Weber’s father Dick, the legendary bowler and ambassador of the PBA, passed away on February 14, just as bowling’s showcase event – the U.S. Open – was about to begin. The loss had a huge impact on Pete, as his father was loved by all whose lives he touched.

Weber took the next two weeks off to be with family, then found upon his return that he’d injured his right shoulder. After struggling through two events, Weber took the last two weeks of the season off. His season results were not typical Weber: 42nd in the 2004-05 PBA World Point Rankings, just \$43,350 in earnings and no television appearances for the first time since 1995.

After making a full recovery this off-season, Weber has shown he’s returning to form. He recently won a PBA Regional Tour event with many exempt bowlers in the field. He’s ready to honor his father in returning to the level of play the family is accustomed to.

“My heart is into the Tour this season because I know Dad will be there with me,” said Weber.

Another bowler looking to regain his form is Tommy Delutz Jr. The Tour veteran took the 2004-05 season off and deferred his exemption due to right wrist surgery in the summer of 2004.

Delutz (Flushing, N.Y.), who owns two career Tour titles, was bowling well in 2003-04 when the pain in his right wrist became unbearable. Though he continued to bowl to secure an exemption for 2004-05, he paid the price. Surgery put him on the shelf, but he’s taken the long road back and is now proving on the PBA Regional Tour that he’ll be a force on Tour in 2005-06. Delutz has posted five top-five finishes in PBA East Region events and is feeling good going into 2005-06.

“I’m bowling well. There are still a few things I haven’t been able to dial in on, not because of the injury but because when you take 8-10 months off it’s a slow process to get back to all the stuff you did before,” said Delutz. “I can’t wait to do something big out on the lanes so the subject matter switches from talk of my injury.”

Raking in the Riches He didn’t win the Player of the Year, didn’t lead the Tour in points or earnings, but Chris Barnes had another stellar season in 2004-05.

One of the Tour’s most talented bowlers, Barnes (Flower Mound, Texas) got a monkey off his back in 2004-05. The six-time Tour titlist finally won his first career major by defeating Allen, 213-212, in a thrilling title match that came down to the last frame.

It was a Phil Mickleson-type victory for Barnes, who was known as the best player on Tour without a major. He’d had plenty of opportunities, but Barnes struggled when he got those chances, going 0-7 in championship rounds of a major coming into the U.S. Open. On top of that, Barnes had lost his last eight matches on television overall, putting enormous pressure on him.

10th frame to defeat Allen and earn a three-season exemption proved to all his doubters that Barnes could come through when he needed it most. Now, some feel Barnes maybe over his problems of bowling on television and a beast might have been unleashed.

Barnes, who once went 0-12 on television over an entire season, has already proven since his U.S. Open win that he’s not afraid of the pressure. In a season-ending special event – the PBA Motel 6 Roll to Riches presented by GEICO – Barnes struck six consecutive times to defeat Tommy Jones in the Race to Six Strikes to win a PBA record \$200,000 top-prize.

“I was so calm in that moment,” Barnes said of his \$200,000 clinching shot. “Striking to win in the U.S. Open was the coolest moment of my career. To throw the sixth strike, though, that’s the payoff of all the time spent working on this goal, and there was an incredible amount of satisfaction.”

Starting Off These story lines will converge next week in Tulsa, Okla., as the new-look Denny’s PBA Tour season kicks off with the 2005 Tulsa Championship.

The first week is just the beginning of a long season toward earning one of 58 exemptions. Each week is valuable for bowlers as they look to position themselves comfortably in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings. Winning a title secures a job for a year, while winning a major can promise job

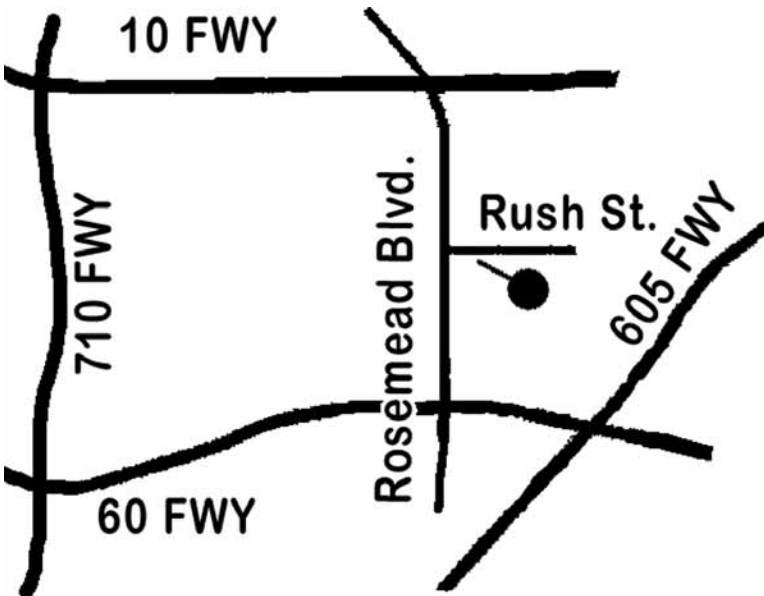


