Hall of Famer Carmen Salvino To Compete In USBC Masters

GREENDALE-When United States Bowling Congress Masters les Bowling Congress stepping into the past.
A lot has changed in the bowling industry since Salvino, Bow Famer, last competed in th Masters in 1981. But last year's event gave him a hint of nostalgia. "I
I watched the tournament nd I saw that the lane condiions ""The very tough, Salvino said. "That encouraged me a lot because when the lanes are real opened up it's not really a con-
test of one's skill. I thought a lo test of one's skill. I thought a lot of the bowlers got a real education on how to play the game.
It was enough encourageIt was enough encouragement that Salvino wants to be a part of the Masters again. So for the first time in two dozen years, the 71-year-old has decided to enter the event.
The Masters will be conducted Nov. 15-20 in Milwaukee and will feature a field of approximately 500 of the amateur bowlers, who will compete for the sport's most prestigious title.
Among those hundreds of competitors only a handful have a bowling resume that matches accomplished. He won 19 professional titles in his career - the last coming in the Senior/Touring Pro doubles with Randy Pedersen in 1988.
Should Salvino happen to win the Masters, he would become the oldest champion in the event's history. That record now belongs to Ernie Schlegel, who won in 1996 at age 53
"I'll bet (baseball hall of famer) Reggie Jackson would like to put on a uniform, sit in the dugout and get one more swing at his age," Salvino said "Well I'm getting that opportunity at the Masters.

Salvino is still very much in ouch with the bowlers of today and what it takes to succeed at he highest level
He's worked as a consultant for a number of years for the PBA, traveling to many events

Yes, we got spoiled. We had to establish averages/handicaps, insure our prize funds, let women and kids bowl, show-off our skills, promote city, state and national tournaments, get into the Olympics, even international contests - to keep tally, cost time and oney.
Here in Southern California the men took the reins and formed the Southeast District Bowling Association. A group of alleys situated North of the Mexican border to Oregon.
Dues were 85 cents. J. D. Anderson was the secretary/treasurer. He collected them (dues) as he said "My hip pocket was the of fice "The first season SEDBA got dues from about 800 white men. Joe Anderson and his staff had a "ball" running the association. It seemed everybody wanted to bowl. Local businesses were generous, sponsored teams, leagues and parties. Even a 200 game was worth 10 gallons of gasoline, a bag of groceries, or a case of beer. Yup, from 1935's 800 members to the 80 's, 60,000 dues paying members bowling in 52 centers - big centers. The four, six, eight laners were gone. The governments; city, county, state, IRS, Franchise Tax Board and corporate responsibility, got into the act.
The dues went up from 85 cents to $\$ 16$. Lineage 15 cents in the daytime to 20 cents at night and now, $\$ 5$ per game isn't strange. Anyway, Glenn Hizer, current leader says, "We have 11 centers with 6,000 members counting women and kids. Really, we don't know the exact number. We are involved in a merger plus jurisdictional negotiations.
Hizer added, "And it's not fun and games, although I bowl in hree leagues, that's fun.
How can we get back to those fun and game days?
Find generous businesses that will sponsor teams, leagues, tournaments, host banquets and parties. Well, we do have parties, birth days, corporate, fraternal but they don't bowl leagues or pay dues. How about bringing the dues down to 85 cents? What services owe want to do away with??
The bonding progam, rules, regulations, field services, sport bowlng, awards, subsidies for women, youth, collegiate, special events PBA, international competition, Olympics, scholarships, coaching programs, automatic scoring, pinsetting, paid officers or directors? There must be a few more useless items.
Getting back to basics, 85 cents dues, impossible. Maybe a frugal leader like Joe Anderson could do it. Fun leagues and business sponsored crazy/amusing events monitored by volunteers -Ten gallons of gas for a 200 game!
