ALLEN PARK, MI — PBA Fall Swing Bear Open winner EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., earned the title of King of the Swing by winning the PBA Fall Swing finale which aired on the CBS Sports Net-

Tackett, the winner of the Fall Swing's Bear Open for his second title of the season and third of his career, defeated Badger and Detroit Open winner Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., 192-189, in the title match at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit.

The King of the Swing, a special showcase event, did not award a PBA Tour title, but it provided a unique challenge and a \$10,000 bonus to the winner. The Rash held the edge until the

## 1963 – Part 2

- CAL BOWL was preparing to host the C.W.B.A. tourney starting Saturday reported Homer Chestnut, when a fire broke out as the result of sanding the lanes. Sprinklers went off! Fire department was called along with a crew from A.M.F.; lanes 32 and 33 were repaired and the tournament went off as planned.
- Remember how dangerous refinishing the lanes used to be? The fire department had to be standing by. Lots of lanes were lost to lacquer coatings. ALHAMBRA REC? MAPLE LANES?
- LEE JOUGLARD set up some four pound wood for a shoot-out. 35 woodchoppers signed up. 444 was the high 3-game series.
- Another great lady joined the management team of AIRPORT BOWL. BETTY MIVELAZ. Great bowler, friend, mother, leader. We will hear more about her as we go along.
- DON RUSSELL was a "teen star, a champion, the best in the west" according to San Diego scribes. 900 youths rolled at **UNIVERSITY LANES** in San Diego in 1963 Championships.
- TOURNAMENT BOWL in Oxnard had an "Obon Festival" Singles running every summer. The word "Obon" in Japanese could mean many things; celebration of life or remembering the past, are just 2 examples.
- **VERMONT BOWL** came up with "Clock-O-Matic". Which means rates by the hour. \$1.50 per hour weekdays. \$2.00 per hour week-ends and holidays. Now, you can't rent a pair of shoes for under \$4.00.
- ROSE LANES in Gardena urged entries for their tournament to be sent P.D.Q. If not by mail send it by carrier pigeon! Is that an "early bird" entry?
- A.J.B.C. membership count was 450,000 nationwide. Some states had their own youth organization. California had the biggest, the Y.B.A., sponsored by the Proprietors. Trophies only no money.
- New York had more certified bowling "Alleys" than any other state; 1179 centers holding 18,831 lanes.
- BRUNSWICK'S Learn to Bowl program for kids reached nearly 5 MILLION students for 1963-64. (Another great way for recruiting league bowlers! Another great program lost, along with ANY kind of instruction in 2016.) I-POD instruction just doesn't cut it! No sound of a strike, no smell of the rental shoes, no greasy fingers from the french fries, no name on the monitor, no strings of X's, no hi-fives for a spare. "Damn let's go bowling"!!!

- According to the A.B.C., over 12,000 tournaments were run with prize funds running about \$22 million.(Sanctioned) "Sandbaggers" appeared and had to be controlled. The ReRate rule, use of current high averages, declaring earnings of \$300.00 or more and the right to suspend bowlers who broke the rules slowed sandbagging down but never stopped it. Seemed every center had at least one that can come up with a way to cheat. Why not just learn to bowl better?
- The A.B.C. average for male bowlers was 153.968. W.I.B.C. average was 134.72.
- When DOUG JOHNSON won a \$200.00 top prize at **COMET LANES**. The press called him a medium average kegler. He got tough and stayed tough! Just ask him.
- CHECK THIS ONE! Pictured was TIM ALBIN and DI-ANA HAYES —Both at the foul line rolling twin balls and sharing a pre-marriage kiss. The wedding was a few days later. Tim still has the bug.
- SKY KING made a great appearance for "Youth Day" at **SHERMAN SQUARE BOWL.** What was his dog's name?
- BOULEVARD BOWL ran a going out of business sale and closed October 1, 1963.
- Local MERLE MATTHEWS was elected President of the P.W.B.A. She was W.I.B.C. champ in 1962 and 1963. DONNA ZIMMERMAN was 1st Vice President.
- FRANK BARRACO put pen to ink for a weekly column called, "COVINA CLIPS". Bet he shook more hands than any manager in town. Greeted every bowler every day!! Sorry to hear **COVINA BOWL** will be closing soon.
- ANDY MARZICH, So. Calif. Bowler of the Year, was leading money winner on the P.B.A. Tour, and named to the Bowling Journal All American team. Lots of awards but very little money.
- RONNIE GAUDERN was named West Coast Sales Rep. for Columbia Industries, maker of the Columbia "300" ball. A short time later, COLUMBIA BOWL rose brick by brick. Columbia balls that dripped oil worse than a Harley Davidson were gobbled up and most are probably sitting in some- ones garage.
- JAY ROBINSON was averaging 210 at **RESEDA BOWL**. Wasn't JAY the manager at **ALHAMBRA BOWL** when it burned down? My son was riding by on his bicycle and called me from a phone booth to tell me the bowl was on fire. I said "Are the the fire trucks there? Call the fire department!" No one was hurt.
- The favorite league in '63 was the Hawaii League. Most bowling centers had this league. Everyone got airfare, rooms and a lei. Sometimes even a luau. The planes were prop jobs and it was a six hour ride.
- Joel's Bowling Apparel had a big retail store on Firestone in South Gate. 45,000 items in stock. Complete flocking and embroidery. You could LOOK good even if you didn't bowl good!
- ART GODDARD won his own scratch singles when he was manager at BAHAMA LANES. Third was KENNY BAYER, the great mechanic at SANTA ANITA LANES. His machines ran so good he could go to Santa Anita racetrack for the afternoon — and no one knew he was gone! (That's what I hear!)
- Every entry in the "DESERT MARATHON" at **PALM SPRINGS LANES** got a free ride on the new Aerial Tramway
- This is good advertising?? "Harry Glascock Invites You To Bowl Where Everything Is Planned For Your Convenience." **SOUTH GATE BOWL**. That was it! Took up 2 whole inches of space.
- The National All-American Team included: DON CART-ER, DICK WEBER, BILLY WELU, RAY BLUTH and HAR-RY SMITH. Remember that crazy leap to the right by Harry after he rolled the ball?
- BOB KNIPPLE averaged 235 at **MARINA LANES**. Bobbie was always a threat when he walked in, signed up and set foot on the lanes.
- Let's talk about FRED RICILLI, the newly appointed manager at LA MIRADA. He was a Peterson Classic winner, Pro bowler on the Stroh's Beer team and a bowl manager since 1958; including a few years at LA HABRA 300 and CHAMPION LANES.
- 4,700 prize fund checks were sent out to winners in the 1963 Men's State Tournament, for a total of \$146,047.15. Each had 2 signatures!
- Pro Joe Joseph was the guest pro at ARCADIA BOWL.
   He pitched 50 no-hitters (softball).
- DAVE PRECHTLE was the star at **SAN GABRIEL LANES** with a 716. (This one's for you Dave!)
- JANET HARMAN rolled the highest series EVER! Her 792 popped up in Norwalk. One mark away from 800.
- RESEDA BOWL gave a Honda Motorcycle for a 300.
- BOBBE NORTH bowled the first 300 game in the San Gabriel Valley at LA PUENTE LANES.
- $\bullet~$  BERT STRAIN was top qualifier in S.G.V. Elims at LA PUENTE LANES.
- BILLY MYERS was Mr. LA PUENTE LANES!! The "good ole days" were the best! Right!

their first ball in the 10th, Tackett earned the win when Rash was unable to double.

"It's a unique challenge that you don't see all year," Tackett said about bowling on two very different lane conditions. "You know coming in the biggest challenge is getting the ball to do the right thing and whoever is the first to get into a good rhythm is going to have the edge."

Tackett, who was the No. 2 qualifier for the stepladder finals, anticipated that using a different ball on each lane to match up with the contrasting conditions was the first step in putting together an effective strategy.

"Nothing seemed definitive as far as an advantage on either lane," Tackett said. "On the long pattern (Badger), I used a ball with more surface and played an outside lane which seemed to work pretty well."

In the semifinal, Tackett employed a similar strategy in defeating Belmonte, the three-time reigning PBA Player of the Year, 226-194.

"I had the feeling that if I had to bowl one more match I was going to have to do something totally different," Tackett added. "I was just trying to get into some type of rhythm where I didn't have to give the pocket away."

In the opening match, Belmonte who had three top-five PBA Fall Swing finishes, beat Malott who had two Fall Swing top-five finishes, 199-185. Belmonte then defeated Daugherty, 219-208, to advance to the semifinal against Tackett





## PBA World Championship Kicks Off ESPN's 37th Year of PBA Coverage

New 19-telecast schedule includes nine live shows, four major championships

CHICAGO — The Professional Bowlers Association returns to ESPN for the 37th consecutive year, beginning on Sunday, Dec. 11, with live coverage of the PBA World Championship from the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev. – the first of nine live telecasts and the first of four major championships on the new schedule.

The ESPN schedule includes a total of 19 telecasts – two more than aired on last year's schedule – and the most live shows to air since the 2008-09 season.

"We're proud of our nearly 40-year relationship with the PBA," said ESPN Senior Vice President-Programming and Global X Scott Guglielmino. "With premier championships and unique events like the annual Chris Paul PBA Invitational, bowling fans can look forward to another season of compelling and action-packed competition on the lanes."

The new ESPN schedule begins with six telecasts from the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VIII at Reno's National Bowling Stadium. The live PBA World Championship at 1 p.m. Eastern (10 a.m. Pacific) on Sunday, Dec. 11, will be followed by the finals of the PBA Cheetah (Dec. 18) and the Chameleon, Scorpion and Shark Championships (on Christmas Eve day and Christmas day), a re-air of the World Championship on New Year's Day, and a special "USA vs. The World" team showdown on Jan. 8 featuring the top five American players vs. the top five international players based on WSOB qualifying. The Shark Championship will be the concluding event of the PBA's 2016 season.

PBA's "Big February" returns to ESPN with three consecutive majors: the Barbasol PBA Players Championship on Feb. 12, the FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions on Feb. 19 and the USBC Masters on Feb. 26. The USBC Masters will be part of a live doubleheader on Feb. 26. The Masters will be immediately followed by the World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals, presented by the PBA, marking the first time in PBA history that two separate events will air back-to-back as live telecasts.

Other highlights of the new ESPN schedule include:

- The annual Chris Paul Family Foundation PBA Celebrity Invitational is set to air in a new prime-time time slot on Friday, Feb. 17, at 9 p.m. Eastern.
- The Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship finals will air live from Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, on April 16, leading into four consecutive Sundays of PBA League telecasts that will follow.
- New to ESPN will be the PBA Main Event, a live special telecast on Super Bowl Sunday (Feb. 5) from Katy, Texas, just outside Houston (the site of Super Bowl 51), and live telecasts of the semifinal and final rounds of the Grand Casino Hotel & Resort PBA Oklahoma Open on Saturday and Sunday, July 1 and 2. Details on both of these events will be announced soon.

In addition to PBA's coverage on ESPN, qualifying and match play rounds of all PBA Tour events will be covered live, exclusively on PBA's online bowling channel, Xtra Frame. Xtra Frame coverage also will include start-to-finish coverage of January's DHC PBA Japan Invitational from Osaka, Japan, and a schedule of to-be-announced PBA Xtra Frame Tour events.


