SAN BERNARDINO-Who is the top bowler at DEL ROSA LANES? For three years now Bobby Campagnale and Dave Wodka have battled it out at the Highland Avenue site for my unofficial title of "King of The Hill." Both have racked up numerous 300s and 800s there.

Both have bowled head to head on even terms. Both have averaged close to or above 240 in league play, just 500 feet from Del Rosa Avenue. So who is the best on Highland Avenue?

After seven weeks of bowling this season DAVE WOD-KA leads all Del Rosa scratch bowlers with a 246.857 average, approximately half a pin higher than Bobby "CAMPY" Campagnale's 246.285. While trailing this year, "CAMPY" has led the league the past two years with averages of 243 and 239. Mister Wodka was second.

PBA regional star RAY COBB is currently right behind Dave and Campy with a 234 average. RAY TORRES is also at 234, but has just joined the league.

Another recent addition to Del Rosa's top scratch league is Citrus Belt Hall of Famer MIKE RICK. He recently rolled a solid 702 set with a 279.

The Del Rosa ladies are led by NICOLE ELLISON averaging 201. Her best set during the first seven weeks was a 727 which included a 267 game.

Randy Pedersen, Dale Eagle and Len Nicholson Elected to PBA Hall of Fame Class of 2011

SEATTLE, Wash. (Oct. 20, 2010) - The Professional Bowlers Association has announced that 13-time PBA Tour titlist Randy Pedersen, Senior Tour standout Dale Eagle and former PBA lane maintenance director Len Nicholson have been elected to the PBA Hall of Fame Class of 2011.

All three will be inducted during ceremonies Saturday, Jan. 22 at Red Rock Resort in Las Vegas following the ABC Sports telecast of the PBA Tournament of Champions.

Pedersen, 48, is currently the color analyst for Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour telecasts on ESPN but he earned entry into the Hall based on his accomplishments on the The Clermont, Fla., lanes. resident won the 1987 PBA National Championship for his lone major title and was ranked 35th on the PBA's list of 50 greatest bowlers as part of the organization's 50th anniversary celebration in 2009. He had 34 top-five finishes in 561 Tour tournaments bowled during his career, finishing in the top 20 in earnings six times and the top 20 in average eight times.

"When Fred (PBA Commissioner and CEO Fred Schreyer) called me with the news, I had to put the phone down and give a great big yell," Pedersen said. "It's very humbling and gratifying. When I first started out on tour in 1981, I never imagined something like this could happen. "During the journey, my

first thought was winning titles and making money. I never started thinking about the Hall of Fame until I was on the downside of my career. Maybe it's always in the back of your mind, but when I was in my heyday, the focus was always on winning.'

Eagle, 64, is the second player elected into the Senior section of the PBA Hall of Fame, following John Handegard, who was inducted in 2009. The Frisco, Texas, resident has 11 career Senior Tour titles which ranks tied for third all-time. Among his titles are four Senior Tour majors -Reno PBA Senior World Invitational (1997); The Villages Senior World Championship (1999); PBA Senior National Championship (2001), and USBC Senior Masters (2003). He was the PBA Senior

Rookie of the Year in 1996 and Senior Player of the Year in 1999. In 171 PBA Senior Tour tournaments he has finished in the top five 40 times. He also won 10 Senior Regional titles and three PBA Tour titles.

"It's something I've been waiting for for 47 years," said Eagle, who is still active on the Senior Tour. "When I was a teenager I dreamed of being a great bowler. Bowling and the PBA have been my life and to be recognized as a great player has made my dream a reality."

Inducted into the meritorious service category, Nicholson's career was devoted to the science of bowling lane maintenance and for more than 20 years the Tucson, Ariz., resident was the PBA Tour's lane maintenance director. Nicholson, 70, has gained worldwide industry recognition as one of the foremost experts on the subject of lane maintenance.

Nicholson was instrumental in developing the PBA Lane Maintenance Program in 1971 which is still referred

to today. He was a founding member of the Bowling Foundation which was created to finding solutions to scoring issues in bowling. An instructor, author of several bowling publications and host of the popular Phantom Internet radio bowling program, he also has served on the technical committee of the World Tenpin Bowling Association. He was a recipient of the bowling industry's Flowers for the Living Award and the John Davis Award in recognition for his contributions to the sport.

"This is the highlight of a career that has been devoted to such an important part of the sport," Nicholson said.

Inductees are elected to the PBA Hall of Fame by a group of veteran bowling writers, industry leaders and current Hall of Famers.

California State Queens & Masters Events Come to an End by Lynn Matsubara

NORWALK—Evervone has witnessed the decline of bowling nationwide, with every association, league and tournament being affected, some more than others. California USBC Association events have been a victim to this decline in all of the events we host. The events hit the hardest were the singles scratch events; the Queens, Masters and Youth State Scratch. Because these events are targeted to higher average bowlers, we are already limiting the potential entrants. The Masters event began in 1961 and the Queens event started in 1966. In September 2009, in a last ditch effort to keep the events alive, the

currently are not self sufficient California USBC Association (CUSBC) board voted to back the two events and guarantee funds totaling \$47,000

enough to stand on their own. The current participation field does not offer enough of a prize fund for many to be interested. The Board decided to put these two events on hold

in the central part of the state. We will roll this new tournament out next fall, September 10-11, 2011 for Oualifying and September 17-18, 2011 for the Finals. You will have four opportunities to qualify in six game blocks and we are hoping to have enough participation to award \$40,000 in prize money to all 48 places that qualify to the finals. The Fantastic Plastic Ball

It's Time To Correct Misconceptions About The Nature of The Equipment We Roll Down The Lanes

EL CAJON-How often have you heard bowlers, professionals and amateurs alike, refer to their equipment as "plastic" or "resin"?

In point of fact, these are misrepresented and distorted words used to describe bowling balls. The use of the words to describe bowling balls is mistakenly applied not only by uninformed bowlers but, also, by ball reps on the PBA tour, manufacturers sales reps, pro shop operators who place orders for these balls, and WORST of all, by TV analysts who are supposedly "in the know"

Manufacturers classify bowling balls as polyester or urethane. Somewhere, somehow, outside the manufacturing industry, "resin" and "plastic" surfaced as the latest lingo.

Interestingly, the usage of "plastic" is not only misused by bowlers, but is never corrected by those who should know better, including me. "Plastic" has been bandied about by professional bowlers, pro shop operators, bowling writers, sales representatives, and ball reps on the professional tours. It is improperly employed by analysts on television shows who unabashedly refer to a bowler shooting at a 10-pin with a plastic ball.

The word plastic, rather than polyester, has crept into a number of manufacturers' vernaculars. This is, perhaps, due to the continuous and prolonged use of the word "plastic" among bowling participants.

Before proceeding any further, let's examine the origin and source of this misinformation. Webster's New World Dictionary defines resin as " a synthetic, usually resinous substance, which, when subjected to heat and pressure, can be cast, pressed, extruded, or molded into various shapes. Again, referring to Mr. Webster, synthetic is defined as "compounds produced by chemical reaction in a laboratory as opposed to those of natural origin".

Furthermore, dictionaries define the plastic as "any of various nonmetallic compounds, synthetically produced, which can be molded or hardened for commercial use.

Suffice to say, the term "plastic" renders ALL bowling balls as synthetic products. Consequently, "plastic" not only covers polyester balls, but also include urethane. EVERY ball manufactured and marketed in the past 50 or 60 years has been formulated from a synthetic substance, including many of the so-called rubber balls dating back to the 40's and 50's. As a matter of fact, during World War II, when the demand for pure rubber products exceeded the natural output, rubber balls, as well as automobile tires, were created with plastic materials. Hence, the word "synthetic" is the most appropriate characterization of any and all bowling balls today. We can say that while all bowling balls are synthetic, some are polyester resin and some are urethane resin.

During the late 50's, Brunswick and Columbia produced the original synthetic balls in various colors. They were familiarly referred to as "plastic" balls and, although plastic covered a multitude of man-made materials, the synthetic substance used by Brunswick and Columbia at that time was, and continues to be polyester resin.

In the late 70's, AMF revolutionized the bowling ball market with the introduction of the Angle, a ball produced from urethane, one of he most intricate and sophisticated resins on the market. Urethane, a rapid curing resin, is an extremely rigid material, yet possesses unbelievable traction on the lanes. The angle dominated the pro tour; that is, until all other manufactures jumped on the urethane bandwagon.

In the late 80's, Steve Cooper, a former professional bowler from Southern California, produced the Excalibur, a urethane ball concocted with various additives that created an even greater "tacky feel that helped the ball to increase its grabbing effect on the lanes. The incredible hooking action and explosiveness of Cooper's missile sent manufacturers scurrying throughout the country, seeking advice from chemical manufacturers for similar resulting materials. Cooper's ball, displaying extraordinary movement and entry to the pocket, earned the nickname of "cheater ball" from professional bowlers. The combined various materials in these type balls have been categorized as 'reactive" resins, thus providing bowlers with more sophisticate weapons.

As the years went by, urethane balls have been customized with glass particles and various other adhesive concoctions. Such foreign substances, heretofore banned by USBC, (formerly ABC/ WIBC) regulations, have somehow managed to skirt the rules and infiltrate the manufacture of urethane balls. The new ingredients serve to put more "teeth" into the balls as they make contact with the lanes.

At any rate, the terms "resin" and plastic" balls have been technically misleading. Consequently, after so many years of erroneous expression, it seems reasonable to set the record straight by defining a ball as polyester or urethane.

The proliferation of sophisticated weapons has been bewildering, not only for competent professional bowlers, ball reps, and drillers, but more importantly, for amateurs who attempt to emulate PBA players.

While new materials in ball surfaces and sophisticated core placements continue to aid higheraverage players, beginners and recreational bowlers can be better served with less potent equipment. This is particularly advantageous for female bowlers who are afforded the opportunity to choose from a large assortment of brilliant colors and weights manufactured from polyester resins.

Most astute pro shop operators prefer to cultivate long-term relationships with their clientele by recommending bowling balls best suited for beginners and less proficient bowlers. Unfortunately, a few uncaring drillers attempt to sell this segment of the bowling population pricier, unmanageable

equipment in order to net a few extra bucks

Fortunately, the greatest majority of IBPSIA (International Bowling Pro Shop Instructors Association) operators take great pride in their craft and, rather than seek higher profits, they make the customer's satisfaction uppermost in the long run. Consequently, I advise bowlers, serious or recreational, to seek out pro shops displaying the IBPSIA logo. IBPSIA is an organization dedicated to its profession and skillfully trained to meet bowler's needs.

Perhaps the only thing most agree on is the employment of a polyester bowling ball (referred to as plastic) when addressing 10-pins or 7- pins. While I am in accord with this philosophy, I further recommend polyester balls for any and ALL single pin conversions.

I further encourage delivering straight shots at all two-pin spares other than 2-8's, 3-9's or spares that presents "sleepers". These are two-pin spares where one pin is directly behind another. These spares can be more easily converted with a slight hook into the front pin.

Despite the advantages of modern supercharged balls, bowlers noted for their high-revving shots have abandoned urethane in favor of polyester balls when lanes dry out and present uncontrollable conditions. However, this is more the exception than the rule.

When should less proficient bowlers consider urethane equipment? These are two requisites that bowlers must abide by:

1. They must be able to approach the foul line in proper balance.

2. They must develop a swing that enables them to deliver the ball freely with proper direction.

These are the initial steps for bowlers to advance their skills. If they cam master these two factors, they will be prepared to progress to the more sophisticated tools of the trade.

Additionally, they and all participants in our great game should be able to distinguish the two most underused words in bowling vernacular, POLYESTER and URETHANE from the misused words, plastic and resin.

BOB JONES 253-816, YOMA HIGH GAME 279 IN DEAF TRAVEL AT AMF CERRITOS LANES

CERRITOS—Bob G. Jones closed with a big 253 after games of 169-192-202 for 816 to lead the 8 men honor roll in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League's stop at AMF Cerritos Bowl. Pablo Yoma after games of 153-206, stole the show in third game when he ran 7 strikes in row, spared a tapped 8 pin and struck out for a mighty 279 to take the season high game lead but swooned down to a 143 to end up with 781. League average leader Gorman Low also nearly made the day's 2nd 800 when he closed with a 179 after games of 186-195-225 for 785 to finish 2nd to Jones.

Other bowlers on the roll list were League secretary-treasurer Bob Taylor with a pair of 201s in his 676, followed by president Ed Abakumoff with (204-200) 766, Gardy Rodgers' 732, Robert Audette's 701 and Emad Aranki's 201.

Jones' 816 along with Aranki's 201 and 5 points and Bob Bergan's 5 points gave their league leading S. F. Valley a near sweep 18-2 victory over Abakumoff's Riverside with Abakumoff himself accounting for Riverside's two points. Low's 785 and Taylor's 767 along with Glenn Cissna's 699 tallied new season high team series 2251 to give their LA City a 16 to 4 win over Rodgers' Mid City and boost up their LA City to 32 points for 2nd place to S. F. Valley's 46 pts. Former 2nd place Mid City fell to third with 28 points.

LA City's new high 2251 replaces S.F. Valley's 2230 made in the league's opener at Keystone Bowl and Yoma's 279 replaces Low's high game 257 also made at Keystone.

The league thanks AMF Cerritos Lanes management and staff for hosting the league and moves on to AMF Bowling Square on Sunday October 31. ROBERT ELLISON SHOT 300 IN WEST COAST SENIORS TOURNEY


So this writer read the front page WCST news in this BOWLING NEWS which said former touring pro Eric Forkel, Henderson, NV won the WCST Ebonite Singles Regular Div. \$700 prize and senior tour pro Barry Gurney, W. Hills, CA won WCST Super Seniors Div. \$700 prize too. Fisser, Aliso Veijo and Ellison, Alpine were among the 20 entrants, placed 4th \$360 and 6th \$330 respectively. Ellison was one of two bowlers rolling a 300 game in this high scoring tournament 10 games qualifying round.

This writer regretted not having more information on how Fisser and Ellison qualified and did in the match plays afterwards. But he does knew that Fisser had entered in WCST several times since it lowered the entry age limit to 40 and over and Fisser had placed 2nd in earlier WCST a couple months ago.

This is the first time this writer knew about Ellison's entry in WCST and congratulates Robert, a two-time member of Deaf Team USA for being the first of our kind to do it in WCST. This is Ellison's 4th career 300 as previously in May 2008 he rolled his first 800, a big 878 with 289-300-289 at Parkway Bowl in San Diego. Ellison's 878 is Deaf Bowlng's 2nd highest to Tony Passarilli's 888 rolled in Colorado State Tournament.

"BPAA Fully Prevails in Glow Bowling / Borden Patent Matter -All Glow Bowling Patents Are Invalid"

Dear Valued BPAA Members:

During the past few years, several BPAA members were accused of violating patents concerning "Glow or Starlite Bowling." Those patents sought to control the use of ultraviolet light and phosphorescent paint in bowling centers, and the patent owner demanded fees for use of these concepts. To protect our members from claims asserting patent infringement and seeking damages by the patent owner, Fred Borden, BPAA undertook the legal defense on behalf of our members.

Your BPAA is pleased to report that as a result of formal action taken by our legal counsel, the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) has cancelled (invalidated) all patent claims regarding Glow Bowling. That decision is final and not subject to further review.

BPAA members are free to employ "Glow Bowling" apparatus in their bowling centers without payment of any fees or fear of violating Mr. Borden's alleged patent claims.

A story in the October 2010 issue of International Bowling Industry (IBI) Magazine, authored by Fred Groh, may have created some confusion. That story implied that, due to a backlog at the re-examination office of the USPTO, "it could be a while coming" before the USPTO invalidated all of the Borden patents concerning "Glow Bowling." That is not the case.

Thor Lundgren, General Counsel for BPAA, stated: "We have informed IBI of the facts. The International Bowling Industry story is not completely accurate. The Glow Bowling claims of Mr. Borden are unenforceable and all the patents are cancelled. All BPAA members are free to employ "Glow Bowling" (glow in the dark) apparatus without paying any fee or fear of a lawsuit."

This is great news for the entire BPAA membership. One of the core values we identified in our new strategic plan states "serve as the voice of the bowling industry and as an advocate for our member centers." On your behalf, we have secured a final judgment to benefit all centers. Thank you very much for placing your trust in the BPAA.

All Eyes on Las Vegas as PBA World Series of Bowling Gets Ready to Roll "PBA World Championship Week" launches 14-day extravaganza at South Point Bowling Center

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (Oct. 22, 2010) – Starting Monday, the eyes of the bowling world will be focused on South Point Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center on the south side of Las Vegas when the 2010 edition of the Professional Bowlers Association World Series of Bowling gets underway, kicking off the 2010-11 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour season.

The 14-day extravaganza will begin with "PBA World Championship Week," a five-day, 60game test of skill and endurance that will serve as the foundation for the first major championship of the 2010-11 season. Week two of the World Series will focus on a series of "animal pattern" championships, culminating on Nov. 5-6 with two days of television finals.

For PBA fans who are unable to attend in person, the entire World Series will be covered live, 12 hours a day, on PBA's Xtra Frame video streaming service (www.xtraframe.tv).

During the first week of competition, the sold-out field of 256 players (men and women from 14 different countries) will bowl 12 games each day on five different Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour "animal patterns." The PBA's challenging lane conditions were given names and introduced to the sport during the 2007-08 season as a way of illustrating the varying types of lane conditioning challenges PBA Tour players face – similar to a tennis player competing on clay, grass or hard courts on different days. Each lane conditioning pattern employs different characteristics based upon the length oil is applied to the lane, as well as how much oil is applied across the lane. Each pattern provides a different test a player's strengths and versatility. A detailed description of each PBA oiling pattern can be found on pba.com under the "Resources" tab.

On Monday, the field will bowl on the Cheetah pattern. On Tuesday, it's Viper pattern day. The Chameleon, Scorpion and Shark rounds will follow on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, respectively.

Similar to the former "PBA Marathon Open," which featured a different lane condition for each round, total pinfall for 60 games on all five patterns will serve as the final standings for the PBA World Championship. One in four will cash based upon 60 games, and the top eight will return to South Point Jan. 14-16 to battle for a \$50,000 top prize in the live PBA World Championship stepladder finals which will launch the "live" portion of the Tour's 2010-11 television schedule. The top qualifier will have the advantage of selecting the lane conditioning pattern for the televised finals.


While accumulating pins toward the World Championship is a high priority, all players also will start fresh with a new challenge each day. Regardless of a player's overall standings, the daily events will be similar to stages in the Tour de France. The top 16 players for 12 games each day will remain in contention for week two of the World Series, which will be devoted to determining the Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon, Scorpion and Shark Championships.

In week two, the top 16 on each pattern will bowl nine games of round-robin match play to determine the top five for stepladder finals. The Cheetah and Viper match play rounds will be contested on Monday, Nov. 1. The Chameleon and Scorpion rounds will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 2. The Shark match play round will be bowled on Wednesday, Nov. 3. The top five after 21 games in each case will advance to the respective stepladder finals, and all 16 in each event will earn "bonus cash" in addition to whatever they may earn based upon their PBA World Championship standings. Each champion will win \$15,000 and a PBA Tour title.

An added special event will be a new "USA vs. The World" team competition, which will be taped on Nov. 6. The top six United States bowlers after 60 qualifying games will meet the top six international players in a five-player team showdown. One point will be awarded for each head-to-head match, and three points will be awarded for the team total.

Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., is defending PBA World Champion. Also hoping to defend their 2009 titles in Las Vegas will be Cheetah champion Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla.; Viper champion Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla.; Chameleon champion Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa.; Scorpion champion Mike DeVaney of San Diego, and Shark champion Jack Jurek of Lackawanna, N.Y.

Bowling fans around the world will be able to follow all of the action on Xtra Frame, the PBA's exclusive video-streaming service which now features improved video quality and a number of other newly-added features. 
be a few schools that would like her to bowl for them when the time comes.

Now on October 19, 2010 while bowling with the Strikers youth league at Brunswick Vista Bowl in Palmdale during the first game of the series, it finally all came together for the perfect game.....a 300! She had done it, all 12 shots solid pocket hits with 10 in the pit. Not too many girls in the history of the sport age 13 or younger have ever managed this accomplishment!


