Norm Duke Makes PBA History

Last week, the 50th Anniversary of the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour kicked off in style. Many memorable events, a widely diverse field, new faces and an historic ending summed up the entire week. I was personally on-hand to witness Norm Duke in his historic quest to capture three consecutive Majors, becoming the only person in PBA history to accomplish this feat.

After interviewing him several times throughout the week, I got an inside perspective on the thinkings and mental game of one of the greatest players in our sport. You see, Duke never once was thinking about making history. He wasn't thinking about defending his title. He was thinking about winning and winning on bowling's biggest platform – a PBA Major.

"I've made history a few times as a by-product of not thinking about it (making history). When you get ahead of yourself, that's when you lose your focus," said Duke.

I was also intrigued to find out Duke's culmination of what makes a great player.

"Great players don't just win titles. I have the mindset that you define your career with Major titles," Duke said. "Great players will go down in history as players who have the ability to win Majors."

In talking to Duke, you find out that he is a very humble individual. We reminisced about his early career when he won a title at the young age of 18, beating the great Earl Anthony in his first match on TV, in route to the title.

"Everyone wanted to beat Earl (Anthony). He was just that good, that he became a target," said Duke. "So I told my mom that I was going out on tour and that I was going to beat Earl. Then when I ended up beating Earl on TV, with

my mom sitting in the front row, it's a memory that I'll never forget," added Duke.

So I slyly asked Duke, "You do know that you are now that target? People now say I want to go out on tour and beat Norm Duke!"

"I don't see myself that way. I don't regard myself as being in the same category as Earl. I know that people get excited to see me and bowl with me, which happened just this week in the pro-am. But in reality I'm just a person who gets to do what I love for a living - bowl," added Duke.

Last week's accomplishment brings Duke's total number of PBA titles to 30 with six Major wins, ranking him tied for fifth with bowling legend Don Carter on the all-time Majors list.

If you followed the results all week, you saw that Duke didn't get off to a great start in qualifying. With a lower-scoring second block and just out of the projected cut to 53, Duke needed a big final set on the third day of qualifying to advance to the casher's qualifying round (block four). From that point on, he got serious shooting +174 in block three, advancing to block four of qualifying in 23rd position.

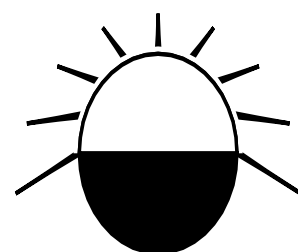

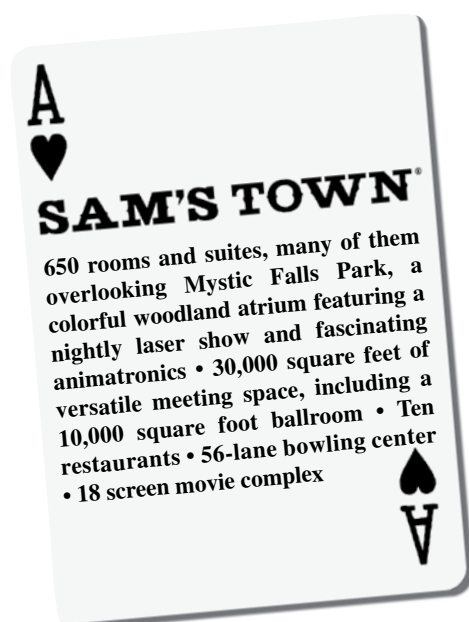
A \$75 deposit will be due anytime now through December 1. Vegas dates will be Sunday through Tuesday, April 5-6-7.

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

DEAF SENIOR BOWLERS OF AMERICA RESULTS AT THE ORLEANS (Continued) CELIA SALCEDO WINS DEAF SENIOR QUEENS

LAS VEGAS...The Deaf Senior Bowlers of America’s prestigious 12th annual Deaf Seniors Queens drew 25 women over age of 55 last October 14 at the same time with DSBA men’s Senior Classic Eliminations.

Canadian 144 average Margaret Pody led the 4 games qualifying round with steady games of 174-170-171-173 for 688 plus 208 handicap 896 total. Two pins behind in 2nd was Joan McCowin, TX with 670 plus 224 hdcp 894 and in 3rd was Theresa Gutierrez, C A with (201) 707 plus 176 hdcp 883.

The eventual winner, Celica Salcedo. CA was 4th with 149-201-182-176 for tournament high 710 plus 164 hdcp 874. Former (1998) Winner Earnestine Coleman, MD has the tournament high game 211 but qualified in 10th with 822. The low cut-off score for 16th place was 787.

In the Oct. 15th double elimination all one game with handicap match play top qualifier Pody from Alberta lost her 1st round match game to 9th qualifier Jackie McBroom, IN 198-217 with handicap. McBroom continue to win her 2nd match and lost in 3rd round 188 - 191to 4th qualifier Salcedo who also won both her first two matches. Salcedo went on to win her 4th round match 235 to 188 against 8th qualifier Penelope Hendee, IL who also had won all her 3 matches.

Salcedo without a loss was seeded into Championship finals while Hendee with her first loss, was placed in quarterfinals where she met and lost to McBroom 196-216.

Meanwhile all the above was going on, Pody in the losers bracket, went on a tear winning all her four rounds matches to face her nemesis McBroom in the semi-finals. Pody got her revenge by beating McBroom 239 to 163 and move on to the title finals against the rested Salcedo.

In the 1st match of Championship finals Pody gave Salcedo her first loss 234 to 164 but in the second match Salcedo bounced back to win a close one 211 to Pody’s 203.

For winning Salcedo got a trophy and \$250.00 while Pody in her runner-up finish, takes back \$130.00 to Canada. McBroom receives \$90.00 for 3rd and Hendee \$60.00 for 4th. The payoff will go down to \$25.00 from 8th to 16th places.

M. MURRAY WINS MEN’S \$1,000 SINGLES, BOWERS BAGS WOMEN’S \$360 SINGLES

The 12th Annual DSBA tournament began on the Oct. 14th with two squads of Men’s and women’s Singles and Mixed Doubles events. Marvin Murray, CA topped the men’s 102 entries singles with 168-211-211 for 590 plus 105 handicap 695 to get the \$1,000 first place prize. Joseph Weiss, CA placed 2nd for \$500 with his (193-196-202) 591 +96/687 and 3rd place went to Joe Ed Thompson, TX for his 251-212-191/654 +30/684.

Fourth place Ralph Moers, CO had one of the three 255 games in the event in his 683 total. The other two were made by 5th place Ed Abakumoff, CA who had his in (180-255-246) event’s high 681 series with zero handicap and first time entrant Daniel Curtis, IL in his 671 9th place total. But the event’s high game 256 was made by David Campbell OR who finished 56th out of money with 621 as the last place score to cash was 642 in 26th.

The senior women’s singles drew 36 entries and Janis Bowers, CO bagged the event’s \$360.00 prize with her 175-171-225 (high women’s game) and high women’s series 571 plus 132 handicap for 703 total. Joan McCowin, TX placed 2nd for \$180.00 with her 508+168=676 total and Nancy Sams, MI got 3rd place \$130.00 for her 622 total. The money ran down to 9th place with 643 score.

W. BERKE/BURGESS DUO WINS DEAF SENIORS MIXED DOUBLES

The Mixed Doubles event of 12th annual DSBA tournament drew 96 entries and the Arizona duo of Wayne Berke and Gary Burgess took first place prize of \$1,400 with their 1413 total score. Berke had 221-264-190 / 675 (high series) and Burgess, 186-217-222 / 624 for event’s high scratch total of 1299 plus combined handicap of 114 in their 1413 total. Their 2nd game total of 481 is the top doubles scratch game.

For 2nd place \$700 was 1386 by Kansas pair of Harold Leiker and Marvin Randall with Leiker’s (233) 607 and Randall’s (221-212-226) 659 plus 120 handicap. Third place \$400 went to 1364 of California combo, Theresa Gutierrez 525 and Lonnie Jones, Jr (213-267) 647 plus 192 handicap.

Jones’ 267 is one of three high games of this event. The other two was made by Daniel Garcia placing 5th with William Booth with 1359 total and Tom Parker placing 9th with 1333. The prize money ran to 18th place with 1285 score.

In the evening meeting it was voted to change the average limit of 150 and 80% of 200 to no limit of average and 10% handicap. This will spread more handicaps and hopefully draw more deaf senior bowlers with lower averages. Next year’s tournament will be on Oct. 13-14-15, 2009 at the same place.



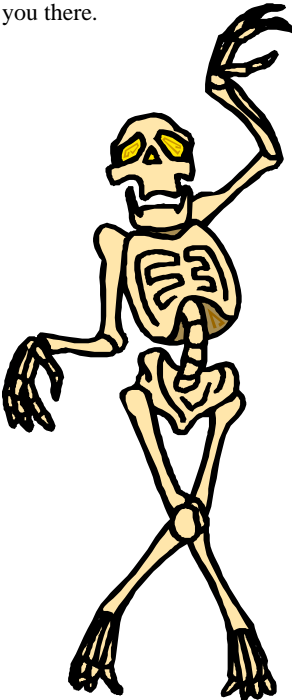
