A packed house filled South Point Bowling Center all day, but it was Johnsons unprecedented move from 24th to fourth that captivate the crowd.



Is the corporate approach having a negative effect on bowling?

With the increased effort to get bowling in the Olympics, which seems to have a more positive look these days, what do we have in common with our global counterparts? According to World Tenpin Bowling Federation President Kevin Dornberger: "USBC is one of our 108 members and while they are an active one they do not have the influence they could have, largely do to their recent lack of interest in the sport (although that does seem to be changing some). In most federations the communication occurs between the federation and competitive/tournament members.'

When asked about the similarity of our local and state association system Dornberger said: "Very few have the equivalent of local associations, of course none are as large as USBC. There are some in Europe that have club structure, I guess similar to leagues but more about competition and meeting social needs. Some federations have regional groups. In general I think the national federation has more control over them than USBC. The smaller federations are autonomous."

More and more professional bowlers are making the trek overseas to pro tournaments that have more lucrative prize funds and, more and more bowlers from other countries are taking part in U.S.

Travel is expensive and it's not like two or three Pros and even families can get into a motorhome and drive around the U.S.A. Are we able to fit into the global mold? How many moms like Candy Cook (Steve Cook's wife) will travel and home school their kids on the way to help their husbands/wives fulfill their dream.

Quite a scenario it will be interesting to see how it all plays out.

One person's view about bowling in the U.S.:

It's sad to see what is going on with bowling. Our local board has vacancies and we try to bring new people on but no one wants to be that committed so then we operate at half capacity. With our parent organization taking awards away, it will been interesting seeing what we will do to be able to provide awards. We couldn't go with the usual award source as their minimum order was way more than we needed, so we went with our State award source but the cost to our association will be a consideration. I would imagine all other associations are currently going thru the same thing. And, most importantly, our association did not raise our local fees this season and kept USBC cards the same price. This will be killer for sure. Is USBC reaching out to aid us? No. Makes me wonder if our state is reaching out to local associations since they have volume purchase on their side? I

Thankfully, I have been able to communicate with another association in CA to send me an awards program we could use for a sample. Not all the other associations will seek out like I did. And what if associations do nothing? Bowlers are going to get discouraged and not want to sanction leagues and away goes leagues as we knew them.

And then there is the rating USBC is doing on local associations. First, if you serve on your board you had to go online and take their test. Most of our board members did but not all so that hurt our rating. Next, depending on the size of your association, you have to put on clinics for new bowlers. We are at 2,000-plus so are required to put on 3. Then, we need to report the number of entrants in our various City tournaments and if we don't get enough to participate, that hurts our rating too. It's crazy. Is this how USBC is involved anymore? Where's the help?"

New Scoring System for Competitive Bowling to beUnveiled During World Bowling Tour Finals at WSOB VI

International task force develops fast-paced, easy-to-understand format for match play competition

ARLINGTON, TX – Athletes and bowling fans around the world will be introduced to a proposed new scoring system for competitive bowling during the World Bowling Tour (WBT) Men's and Women's Finals in Las Vegas on November 2.

The new scoring system for competitive bowling is the result of the work done by an all-star panel of international bowling experts, including World Bowling leaders, athletes, coaches, news media and commercial bowling industry executives. The international task force, with the additional input of Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) leadership, developed the new system in order to make the sport more attractive and easier to understand for casual bowling fans, the news media and the competitors.

The new system, which impacts how the sport is scored as well as the format for competition, will be unveiled during the WBT Finals. The singles match play competition will be conducted as follows:

- 1) A match will involve 12 frames.
- 2) In each frame, each player will throw one shot.
- 3) If Player A gets a higher pin count than Player B, he/she will win the frame.
- 4) If both players strike, the frame will be tied.
- 5) If neither player strikes, but each has the same pin count, each player will try to convert the spare. If both successfully convert their spares, the frame will be a tie. If one player has a higher pin count than the other after two shots, that player will win the frame.
- 6) Scoring for the match will reflect who has won the most frames (example, 1 up, 2 up, etc. All-square means the match is tied).
- 7) At the point one player has won more frames than frames remain (example: 3 up after 10 frames), he/she will be declared the winner.
- 8) If a match is "all-square" after 12 frames, the tie will be broken using the single-frame format described above until the tie is broken.

The new system emphasizes winning the frame, much like golf's Ryder Cup places emphasis on winning a hole. This new system is expected to dramatically reduce the length of time and complexity of scoring required to complete a two-player match.

World Bowling President and CEO Kevin Dornberger noted "We believe we have found the right balance between modernizing our sport while retaining credibility and tradition our athletes and fans value. All of us involved with this project are looking forward to its introduction in Las Vegas"

The World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals will be contested in the new South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas on Sunday, Nov. 2, and will air on ESPN on Sunday, Jan. 25.

About the World Bowling Tour Finals: The top-ranked bowlers in the world will be featured in the season-ending World Bowling Tour (WBT) Finals in November in the grand finale to the WBT season. The top three men and top three women in the WBT rankings were finalized over the weekend as the final stop on the 2014 schedule was held in Bangkok, Thailand. The finalists were determined based on the WBT points standings and will compete for a \$70,000 prize pool on Nov. 1 or 2 in Las Vegas.

About World Bowling: World Bowling is the official trade name for former FIQ, recognized by the International Olympic Committee as the world governing body for the sport of Bowling. World Bowling is autonomous in administering the sport and is responsible to promote the development of bowling throughout the world, promote the Olympic movement, contribute to the achievement of the goals set forth in the Olympic Charter, establish rules for the uniform practice of bowling throughout the world, and ensure that official bowling activities meet the requirements of the Olympic Charter. 

Dean of Bowling Writers, PBA & USBC Hall of Fame

Bowling instructors have been around as long as bowling, at least in one form or another.

In the early days the coach was the bowler who started the day before or the desk man or woman who was on duty when a casual bowler was looking for all the help they could get.

For too many years bowling advertised itself as the game to play because everyone could do it. So bowling lost many possible lifetime keglers because when they started to bowl they were not very successful.

Over the many years of the books I have written, instruction was the subject starting with Guide To Better Bowling, featuring tips from bowling's best pros. I then penned or co-wrote tomes involving coaching of men, women and children. Every magazine in bowling made coaching a constant feature because the demand was always there.

I have witnessed most of the great bowling coaches in action with individuals, with teams, at tournaments, so I will mention only a few names.

One was a gentleman named Angelo Vicari. He specialized in beginners, and he would bring a look of satisfaction to a student even when the learner tossed the ball into the gutter, channel if you prefer.

'See that, before you were rolling the ball into the gutter only a few feet from the foul line. Now you are keeping the ball on the lane more than half way down the lane before it goes out of play".

The late John Jowdy was an icon in coaching the pros, including many of the world's greatest. After a pro tournament session ended, usually after 11 p.m. there would be a line to receive a coachng look see from Jowdy.

One of my coaching favorites with a unique approach was Chief Halftown, a native American who hosted his own TV show, and also a top bowler, but was a marvel in coaching youngsters. Dressed in his full color regalia, beautiful feathered head dress, he would then relate some interesting Indian lore before and throughout his lessons to the

Coaches not only must know bowling, today an in depth know how in lane conditioning and equipment are essential. Bowling balls are weapons in the battle of scoring but only a good coach can bring out the best.

And what about those dots and arrows and different colored lane markings and how best they can be utilized. A coach can see a lot of the little things, including such as bowling accessory items.

Some bowling centers don't have the space for bowling pro shops, but should have a coach their bowlers could reach if requested — and they need not be top bowlers themselves.

With the rise in international bowling and no finger styles in vogue and the general rise in high scores coaches be-

come more and more important in the sport. All groups in bowling see the value good coaching can have in creating and keeping bowlers.

Every golf course has playing and teaching pros. Every bowling center may some day have an association with a





pearances and results to name a few. The PWBA and LPBT did the same as well as many amateur organizations such as the ABC, WIBC and USBC. For aficionados like myself statistics add to the appeal of sports, especially bowling.

At the local level we don't keep the detailed statistics the professional associations do, but we do keep some. The most prominent of these is book average. The book average of every bowler who has ever bowled in the CITRUS BELT is recorded in our annual yearbooks. Yearbooks compiled and maintained by PAM MEEKER. I love perusing the pages of these books of

our "bible."

These books tell me that the highest average ever re-corded here is 253 by VINCI WOOD during the 2012-13 season. It was probably the best season ever recorded in the Citrus Belt. Vinci rolled over twenty 800s that year, which may be the second most ever in the national history of the ABC/USBC.

Will any Citrus Belt bowler ever top 253? Maybe. Right now, after eight weeks, Zach Jellsey is averaging 254! Can he keep it up? Can he go the distance? YES HE CAN. Yes he can if he wants to. Yes he can if he goes for it. Yes he can if he works to get it.

I know that Zach has the talent to average 254 on a house shot but I wonder if he wants to. I wonder if he has the desire to average 254. In the past I know that Zach has not emphasized league bowling. He is a competitor and handicap league play doesn't present much of a challenge to a PBA Regional Champion like himself. He usually bowls in just one certified league each year to establish a book average. So, only Zach knows if he wants 254, if he wants to go for it, if he wants to work

One thing for sure, like Willie Mays, Zach can do it all. He has a power game, he has a finesse game. He can roll it, he can spin it. He can use one hand, he can use two hands. He can play inside, he can play outside

He can read lanes, he can make every necessary adjustment. Zach Jellsey is a threat to break the record.

I love records. I loved 1998 and Mark McGuire's quest for 61 and beyond. I loved 2001 even better when Barry Bonds broke McGuire's record. Zach is on a record pace and I plan to follow his progress throughout the season. His quest will not be a physical one. He has all the physical tools necessary to prevail. His battle is a mental one. A metaphysical challenge only won by someone with mystical mental abilities.

I say his battle is a meta-physical one because his biggest challenges will be responding favorably to adversity. He will have to bowl well when hurt. He will have to bowl well when feeling blue and he will have to bowl well when the world around him may be crashing. bowling season is long and it takes mental toughness to get through it. More so when history is on the line.

I believe Zach will maximize his opportunities and minimize his mistakes. I believe he will get metaphysical and seize the moment. I believe he will set a new record. I look forward to enjoying the quest. By the way, Zach just rolled another 300 and 836 in EMPIRE BOWL'S Odd's N

End's League.
