

CHICAGO - PBA Pro players are depicted in ac Bowling, the first officially licensed video game designed for gaming consoles and PCs in more than 30 years, makes its official debut today, the Professional Bowlers Association and FarSight Studios have announced.

The new PBA Pro Bowling game for Xbox One, Nintendo Switch, PS4 and Steam owners allows gamers to interactively "bowl" against more than 15 PBA stars, including Jason Belmonte, Jakob Butturff, EJ Tackett, Norm Duke and others, with commentary provided by PBA announcers Rob Stone and Randy Pedersen.
"It's been our dream to create an official PBA video game with the real pros since a lot of us watched the PBA Tour growing up," FarSight Studios Vice President Bobby King said. "We're proud of the game that we've created and can't wait for people to check out just how easy and fun it is to play, while still being difficult to master."

WAXAHACHIE, Texas - Defending champion Chris Warren, a native Texan now living in Grants Pass, Ore., built a 238 -pin lead after the 13 games of qualifying and then coasted in the eight-game round robin finals to win a record 55th PBA Regional title by repeating as the PBA50 Waxahachie Southwest Open titlist at Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas, Sunday.
Warren defeated runnerup Pete Thomas from Oklahoma City, Okla., 227-201 in the final position round match for a 4,896-4,695 victory, including match play bonus pins. Thomas held off third-place finisher Paul Fleming of Ft. Worth, Texas, who finished with 4,649 total pins, to stay in second place.

Along with his eighth PBA50 Regional title to go along with his 47 standard PBA Regional wins, Warren earned the $\$ 2,000$ winner's check. Warren improved his lead in the overall PBA Regional titles race to three over Dale Traber, Pete Weber and Walter Ray Williams Jr. who have
each won 52 PBA Regional titles. Warren and Weber share the standard PBA Regional titles lead with 47 each while Harry Sullins of Chesterfield Township, Mich., is the PBA50 Regional titles leader with 24 wins. The current PBA Regional titles leaders include the following:

## PbARELIONALUPDATE: <br> CHRISGEIBBOISS WIINS IIRSTPPARECIONALIIN29YEARS

- Chris Gibbons of Madison, Wis. threw three strikes in his final frame Sunday to defeat non-PBA member Jason French of Levittown, N.Y., 236-234, to win the PBA Bowl-A-Vard Midwest Open at Bowl-A-Vard Lanes in his hometown for his first PBA Regional title in 29 years. Gibbons, who had not won a PBA Regional title since winning his only previous regional title in Belleville, Ill. in 1990, earned a first-place check for $\$ 2,500$. In the first match of the threeplayer stepladder finals, French defeated Jerry Marrs of Lake in the Hills, Ill., 235-187, to advance to the title match.
- Darryl Bower of Middletown, Pa. compiled an 8-0 match play record and a 16 -game total of 3,417 pins to win the PBA50 Timber Lanes Open at Timber Lanes in Oxford, Pa., Sunday for his 16th career PBA Regional title. Bower entered the position round match trailing Sammy Ventura of Norwich, N.Y. by 10 pins. Bower doubled in the 10th frame to force Ventura to throw the first strike to win the game and earn the 30 bonus pins. Ventura failed to strike, giving Bower a $215-199$ win and the title by a final margin of 36 pins, $3,417-3,381$. The win was Bower's fifth in PBA50 Regional competition to go along with 11 standard regional titles. He also received $\$ 1,500$ for the win.
- Joe Cannon of Puyallup, Wash., posted a 6-1-1 match play record and knocked down 4,140 pins Sunday to win the PBA50 Dick's Pro Shop Northwest/West Open at Linn Lanes in Lebanon, Ore., for his first PBA50 Regional title. Cannon, who earned $\$ 1,500$, defeated non-PBA member Mal Acosta of Lebanon, Ore., by 301 pins for a convincing win. Acosta had a $4-4$ match play record and 3,839 total pins for his 16 games including match play bonus pins. In the companion PBA60 Open for bowlers age 60 and older, Hugh Miller of Mercer Island, Wash., went 6-2 and knocked down 4,042 total pins for 16 games to top John Gould of Yuba City, Calif., by 114 pins and earn $\$ 1,500$. Gould had a $5-3$ match play record and a total of 3,928 pins. This was Miller's eighth win as a "senior" player, and his first in the 60 -and-older category.
- Kyle Mayberry of Mechanicsburg, Ohio defeated Justin Knowles of Okemos, Mich., 269-209, to win the PBA Greater Jackson Central Open at Dave Small's JAX 60 in Jackson, Mich., Sunday for his third career regional title and the $\$ 2,000$ first prize. Mayberry topped Chandler Stevens of Archbold, Ohio, 203-169 and Knowles downed Patrick Dombrowski of Parma, Ohio, 276-192 to set up the championship match.

Wayne Central-Midwest Open at Pro Bowl West in Ft. Wayne, Ind
- The Nov. 8-10 calendar of PBA Regional activity includes the La-Z-Boy Central Challenge for non-title winners at Monroe Sports Center in Monroe, Mich.; the Plaza Bowl Midwest Open presented by Roto Grip in Clinton, Iowa, and the Gastonia South Open presented by Brunswick at George Pappas' Liberty Lanes in Gastonia, N.C.
- On the Nov. 15-17 PBA Regional weekend schedule are the PBA50 Bryan's Bowling Center Eastern Open presented by 900 Global in Laurel, Del.; the PBA50 PLYGEM Windows Rocky Mount South Open at Rocky Mount Bowling Center in Rocky Mount, Va., and the Japan Region's High Sports Cup Chameleon Open at Kashima Bowl in Kashima, Japan.

## Bowling From 8 Miles High <br> by Dave Williams

I always enjoy reading J.R. Schmidt's segment in Bowlers Journal International that brings back memories from former decades about bowling and the incredible history of our great sport. The latest, in the October 2019 issue, "Wene Got Her Wings With Sky-High Win Over Weber," did not disappoint.

As one who spent more weekends with Dick Weber in the early to middle 1980's, with the possible exception of his wife Juan-


Dick Weber Bowling... In a Cargo Jet! (Photo Compliments of USBC Communications) ita, I can safely say that this was Mr. Weber's favorite recollection. Whenever someone would ask him about his favorite memory in bowling, I knew that it was time for the "Bowling in a 707 Cargo Jet" story.
Weber loved to tell that flashback from January 6, 1964, and I never got tired of hearing about the promotion that was labeled "Operation Astro Bowl" by the marketing geniuses at AMF. Some of Dick's preferred embellishments were that the pilot was a friend of Sylvia Wene, or my most beloved, that whenever he got up to bowl, the pilot would tilt the nose of the plane up just slightly.

In spite of the pilot's perceived best efforts to sway the outcome of the match, Mr. Weber did establish yet another record, when he was the very first bowler to record a strike while bowling from 8 miles high. Although the match was very close, Weber lost by 2 pins, 146-144. This score brought back memories for me from the 1980 's, when I witnessed Dick winning or losing matches quite often by just a couple of pins.

While I always considered myself a pretty fair country bowler, my blood pressure was always elevated whenever I bowled in an exhibition match with Weber. I can see him just like it was yesterday, when he would say to me, "Dave, just relax!" Unfortunately, I could never take his advice and approached every shot as though it was the most important of my life. I carried this same attitude into the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour, where I was affectionately known as "Gabby," for my lack of conversation.

On at least three occasions that I can remember, Dick and I tied with identical scores for three games. After the third time I began to wonder if he was doing this intentionally. Like the 2 pin loss to Sylvia Wene, he seemed to know the right time to win, lose or tie. Yes, in case you are not familiar with Dick Weber, he was that good.

A perfect example of this took place at the Grand Opening of AMF Southland Bowl in London, Ontario. We tried to get Jo Jo Capon, a ten year old phenom that had defeated Mr. Weber by a score of 205-185 at the Grand Opening of AMF O’Connor Bowl West in Toronto, Ontario. When we couldn't get Jo Jo, I filled in for him and was fortunate to defeat Dick in a three game match, 658-647.

However, the night wasn't over for Weber. The Master of Ceremonies, Rob McNaughton, announced prior to a match with a local bowling star, "Dick, you took it easy on Dave. Now we want you to go all out in your next match." Weber gave McNaughton a wave of the hand and proceeded to roll 279,279 , and 244 , for an 802 series. Yes, he was that good... even from 8 miles High!

- The latest Roll'n Donkee carrier held 12 balls! $\$ 125$. Includes a crane to get it in your trunk.
- The "Chicken Feed" cans at the Women's State Tournaments was started in 1981. The $\$ 38,776$ collected to date (1992) was donated to the National Hall of Fame and Museum.
- Eight year old David Monson rolled a clean game at Mission Hills Bowl. Robin Romeo doubled in the 10th for a 162. Yvette Boyer got 6 crazy strikes in her 134 game. The Mission Hills column writer gets credit for all info!

(Spoiler alert: None mentioned bowling!)
One attendant replied: "I'm new here." Another said: "I don't remember anything in the manual about that." And another: "I'm not much for church, myself." After Malloy visited a multitude of Standard Oil service stations, the company's customer relations department took action.

Standard Oil contacted Malloy and asked him to spell out exactly what he wanted to know.
Malloy said he simply wanted to know the meaning of life. One week later, Malloy got his answer from Standard Oil. It came in the form of a letter. Excited about the mailing, Malloy tore open the envelope. But inside, there was no note, no message.

On our Fab 5 team, Amy Lew bowled first and her dad was fourth. It was so cool to see the closeness of that duo throughout the tournament. And likewise, if was neat to see how Amy beamed when her boyfriend Derek Dimaggio stroked one of his never-ending string of strikes.

There were smiles, fist bumps and high-fives all around our team on strikes, spares, near misses and awful misses. And this scenario played out with the other five teams, including the pressure-resistant Mark Alvarino team that won the qualifying event.

I was touched by the warmth among our team's bowlers - at least during the times I wasn't looking over my shoulder and wondering: Was it the mischievous Amy or was it the mischievous Justin Pluchino who kept preying on my vulnerable self and tapping me and then disappearing?

So, what's the meaning of life? Let's just say bowling (and other pursuits) often fills that role - sometimes in a minor capacity and sometimes in a major way. Some people all the time think and dream and talk about bowling and getting better and winning league titles and individual awards.

That's why fights sometimes break out when some players get angry with the notion that others may be sandbagging to boost their teams' prospects - and potentially sink their own.

A couple of years ago, Adam Lew from the bowling-rich Lew family, made a pointed joke (perhaps with a shred of truth) after rolling his first 300 and receiving a commemorative perfect-game ring.

Said Adam: "Some people ask me why I wear it on my wedding finger and I'll say, 'It's because I got married to the game."
That's true passion
Instead of bugging Standard Oil, perhaps Bill Malloy should have asked Gail Marlis or Theo Sojourn or Adam Lew about the meaning of life.

Yes, it's bowling.
