

After the semi-finals, finishing in first was Jeff Wu with a +171. In second was Scott Johnson at a +120. So he sat out the first round of the top 16 single elims. Our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Jeff drew a 201. After a review of all the scores bowled, unbelievably we had no bowlers match that score. 




