This Makes 2 World Series in 2 Years for Mookie

LOS ANGELES - So why was Tom Clark posting on Facebook about the World Series last week?

Clark, after all, is the commissioner of the Professional Bowling Assn. - not Major League Base-

The reason? He found an angle about one of the participants that escaped much of the mainstream.

Mookie Betts, the allstar outfielder of the Boston Red Sox, is one of the featured performers in the World Series and the likely American League's most valuable player. He also is a talented bowler who's been known to excel in the World Series – at least in the World Series of Bowling!

Clark wished Mookie good luck in his Facebook post and pointed out that the last time Mookie was

in a World Series, he was highly prolific.

He bowled a 300.

Yes, indeed. In November 2017, Mookie rolled a 300 in the qualifying round of the World Series of Bowling at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., and that's a PBA

Mookie didn't make the cut, but he was competing in the World Series of Bowling for the second time in three years. He averaged slightly higher than 200 in the tournament, and that was a notable improvement on his debut in 2015 when he averaged 190.

The World Series broadcasters have mentioned Mookie's bowling skill.

The Red Sox defeated the Dodgers in five games and Mookie contributed a home run in Game 5 in Los Angeles.







Belmonte Looks To Join Bowling Royalty At U.S. Open

In just 10 years on the PBA Tour, Australian two-hander Jason Belmonte has already had a significant impact on bowling's biggest stage. He has the opportunity starting Friday at the U.S. Open to take it up even one more notch, however.

Belmonte currently sits at nine major title wins and is just one behind Earl Anthony and Pete Weber, who top the all-time list with 10 majors. A win at the U.S. Open, which will be broadcast LIVE on FloBowling, would cement Belmonte among bowling's royalty, and it's come at a staggering pace.

While Belmonte could win his 10th major in his 10th season, it took Weber 34 seasons on tour before he got to that number. As for Anthony, it took 15 seasons.

"It's the only major that I haven't won yet, and I really want to win it," said Belmonte, who has 18 career PBA Tour titles. "But I think if I go into the U.S. Open really wanting to win, I think it does more damage than good. I'm going to try to put that at the back of my mind, play with what's in front of me and make my spares. That's what I intend to do."

Belmonte has won the United States Bowling Congress Masters four times, the Players Championship twice, the Tournament of Champions twice and the World Championship once.

A win at the U.S. Open would give him the PBA Triple Crown (U.S. Open, TOC and PBA World Championship), the Grand Slam (Triple Crown plus Masters) and the Super Slam (Grand Slam plus Players Championship).

And although he hasn't won the U.S. Open yet, his track record in the event over the past decade has been pretty solid. His best finish came in 2013 when he lost to Wes Malott, 214-156, in the title match.

In 2012, Belmonte finished third when he lost to Weber, 225-213, in the semifinals of the infamous "Who do you think you are? I am!" championship round of the U.S. Open.

In more recent years, Belmonte finished 32nd in 2015, 12th in 2016 and 17th at last year's U.S. Open.

So, what exactly is it about major championships that tend to bring out the best in Belmonte?

"I feel like major championships typically have longer formats and I just never give up," Belmonte said. "I always believe I am capable of making a run at some point. If I have enough games behind me, I feel like it kind of falls into my sweet spot of a format where I feel like I can build into the tournament."

Even though Belmonte knows the pressure is building for him to win his first U.S. Open title, he's quick to point out that at age 35, he still has a number of opportunities left


"I think you could probably say it was a missing piece if I retired today, but I know this isn't my last chance," Belmonte said. "Yes, it is the one major that I am missing, but I'm trying not to look at it like I need to attain it immediately. I have the rest of my life to win it. If I do everything right in the five steps toward the line, one of these tournaments, it will be mine."

PBA OFFERS \$1 MILLION BONUS FOR TITLE MATCH 300 GAME IN FOUR 2019 EVENTS

OWASSO – At the members' gathering in Owasso, PBA CEO-Commissioner Tom Clark announced that PBA players will have four opportunities to bowl for a \$1 million bonus if any of them can roll a 300 game in the title match of four PBA tournaments in 2019.

The 300 game bonus will be at stake during FOX Sports' live telecasts of the PBA Tournament of Champions on FOX on Sunday, Feb. 10, at 5 p.m. EDT from AMF Riviera Lanes in Akron, Ohio; the PBA Players Championship on FS1 on Sunday, Feb. 17, at 1 p.m. from Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl in Columbus, Ohio; the Go Bowling! Indianapolis Open on FS1 on Sunday, Feb. 24, at 1 p.m. from Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis, and the PBA World Championship on FS1 on Thursday, March 21, at 8 p.m. from Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich.

There have been 26 perfect games bowled on national television throughout the PBA's history, but only two in title matches: the first by Bob Benoit in defeating PBA legend Mark Roth, 300-255, in the title match of the Quaker State Open in Grand Prairie, Texas, in 1988, and the second by PBA Hall of Famer Mike Aulby in the highest scoring title match in PBA history, topping David Ozio, 300-279, in the finals of the 1993 Wichita (Kan.) Open.

Life Is Good for Hall-of-Famer Connie Wannomae

WINNETKA - She's 82 and still going strong.

That's Connie Wannomae, formerly Connie Pick, who has been one of the brightest lights in Southern California bowling history.

Connie has been enshrined in three Southland halls of fame and has won more tournaments – many of them major ones – than this reporter could ever recount.

"I never practiced because I worked all the time. I was just too tired," says Connie, who was employed as a meat wrapper at Safeway for 30 years. "I was very lucky to bowl as well as I did. Back then, I bowled a 16-pounder and weighed 100 pounds. It was a good life."

Connie presently bowls in two leagues after taking last year off because of a rotator cuff injury to her right arm.

She's not too enamored of her current depressed average because she was flying high in the high 180s just a couple of years ago.

"She always gets strikes," says Barb Desaro, who bowled on the same league team with Connie two years ago. "When she doesn't, it's like, 'What happened?'"

Connie, a right-hander who lives in Canoga Park, has made it a goal to return to her lofty bowling average of a couple of years ago, adding with a laugh, "if I don't die first."

Connie started bowling in 1960 and bowled for nearly two decades before taking 10 years off after marrying Ed Wannomae in 1987.

"I was tired with all my driving and I had a hard labor job," Connie says. "And I got married and I didn't think it was fair to him."

Before her 10-year respite, Connie was making a big name for herself as Connie Pick. She won one national Scratch tournament in the 1960s in the team event in addition to placing second in the individual competition. She says the "tournament was ridiculous. It went on for three months. It was big. I averaged 210."

The tournament finals, Connie says, "started at 7 at night and finished at 7 in the morning. Twenty games. People came from all over the United States."

That title earned her a \$1,000 paycheck, she remembers.

Later, she earned the title of the prestigious Ladies West Coast Eliminations tournament in 1973. Connie won both the Northern California and Southern California segments, pocketing \$500.

Connie, in fact, has enjoyed many memorable moments: two perfect games, a 780 series, 10 L.A. city titles and several state titles. She also has shoehorned some pro bowling into her career with the Western Women Professional Bowling Assn.

"I had five seconds and cashed a lot [in the pro league]. I never won one and that was crappy," she says, laughing.

Connie says she loves bowling. The reason? "Probably the challenge and the people," says Connie, who uses Winnetka Bowl as her home bowling center.


Life is good for Connie, who has set her sights on improving her average. "I want to be back to where I was," she says. "It's hard when you're 82, but I think I'll do it. I think I'll get better."

She also revels in the fact that she has a bowling husband, who worked as Connie's boss at Safeway.

"He was my meat manager," she says. "I got him into bowling and he's doing pretty well."

Ed Wannomae has a book average of 183 at Winnetka Bowl. Connie doesn't bowl in that league, but she goes to the bowling center to root for her hubby.

And she's always there with a smile on her face. Yes, life is good for Connie Wannomae.

TERRY CHITTENDEN Receives High Average Award

REDLANDS - Terry Chittenden has averaged 200 or higher for decades. For the past ten years she has a composite average of 207 for over 800 games. Her high was 215 for the 2015-16 season.

Last season, while not her highest, was special. She had other seasons with more honor scores, with more high games and with higher averages. She is probably one of a very few senior bowlers in CALIFORNIA, male or female, to lead their Association in average.

Monacelli: 'I Thought I Paid My Dues'

When the United States Bowling Congress elected to make the U.S. Open a limited-field event, it did so to increase the prestige of one of bowling's biggest events.

However, there have been side effects to that decision – including forcing one of the best bowlers in the history of the sport into bowling Wednesday's PTQ (Pro Tour Qualifier) to advance into the event this year.

PBA and USBC Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli, who has won 20 career titles, posted on social media Tuesday about it and is clearly disappointed in having to bowl a qualifier to make the field at the U.S. Open, which will be broadcast LIVE on FloBowling.

"I am flying to Wichita to get ready for the PTQ tomorrow," Monacelli posted on Facebook. "My last PTQ was February 1985 and I have to say it is a strange feeling. I thought I paid my dues."

Without question, Monacelli is the biggest name competing in the PTQ alongside a field of mostly journeymen bowlers and young players.

To be fair, Monacelli does not fit into any of the categories for an invitation set by the USBC, he simply falls into an unfortunate situation where he isn't eligible.

However, should a player of Monacelli's stature be forced into bowling a qualifier? No. Next year, perhaps USBC should consider adjusting the rules to invite hall of famers into the field who are still active.

In the meantime, let's hope Monacelli is one of the 28 players who advance from the qualifier and into the main event, a place where he certainly deserves to be.



Bill Olson, 100 and Going Strong!

VALENCIA – At Valencia Lanes, I had the great pleasure of meeting a remarkable man, Bill Olson. Bill was there with all his bowling buddies to celebrate his 100th birthday! As his teammates and friends began to set out a feast for a king, Bill and I talked about his life and bowling career.

In 1951, Bill married the love of his life, Luella and they had one son, Glen. Glen gave them 2 grandsons, Jonathan and David.

When I asked Bill when he started bowling, Glen stepped up.

Bill: Glen, do you remember what year it was when I started bowling?

Glen: When you actually started, or when you started lying about it?

This definitely called for an explanation and Glen obliged me.

Glen: When I was a youngster, Dad and Mom would leave in the evening and tell me they were going bowling. Years later, Dad was now 80 and Mom had passed, I had a bowling party and asked Dad to join us thinking as a bowler he would enjoy it. When he got there he admitted he had no clue how to bowl. I asked him what he and Mom had been doing all those years "going bowling". His answer was priceless, "Oh we were just sitting in the bar drinking beer." After that, Dad was hooked and started bowling leagues. With limited records, I was able to determine Bill had bowled in the Golden Foursomes since 2000, adding the Friday Seniors a few years later.

The first center Bill threw a ball was Matador in Northridge. He reeled off the address of the center as if he lived there!

Bill bowled many Pro Am Tournaments over the years but never participated in the local or national championships. Those Pro Ams were good times for him.

I asked Bill what his highest score was and he smiled a million dollar smile saying a 270? A 300? Then he laughed. Nice try, Bill! His average in 2000 was 127. Very nice for an 82 year old! Bill's favorite things about bowling are: interesting game, exercise and the people. Yep, those are my favs too.

Bill was born in Minot, North Dakota on October 19, 1918. Bill provided for his family as a machinist, doing metal plating and metal polishing "for anything that went on an automobile".

I fell in love that day. This was the most cheerful man with a dynamite smile that I had visited with for a long time! Bill was overwhelmed with gratitude when his giant cake was presented to him. "Oh my! Oh my! How won-

derful!" I'm pretty sure there was a tear or two and I think they were mine!

I am blessed to have shared this momentous occasion with Bill Olson and I can only hope to enjoy a long life with the optimism Bill radiated. Happy 100, Bill! You sir, are a joy!

CHRIS WARREN IMPROVES HIS RECORD TO 53 OVERALL PBA REGIONAL TITLES

Native Texan Chris Warren of Grants Pass, Ore., survived a final game challenge from former PBA member Steve Shaffer of Georgetown, Texas, in the eight-game round robin finals, to win a record 53rd PBA Regional title in the PBA50 Waxahachie Southwest Open Sunday at Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas.

Warren, who held a 103-pin lead going into the final game position round match, lost to Shaffer, 247-224, but maintained the overall pinfall lead, including bonus pins, 5,075-5,025. Along with his title he earned the \$2,200 winner's check. The win was Warren's sixth in PBA50 Regional competition in addition to the PBA-record 47 titles he has won in standard PBA Regional events.

After building a 132-pin lead following the 13-game qualifying portion of the event, Warren continued to increase his lead, winning his first three matches with games of 251, 237, and 246. Shaffer, however, momentarily took the lead by rolling 256 and 300 in games four and five while Warren struggled before regaining the lead with his own 300 game. He followed that with a 246 prior to position round. Shaffer earned \$1,400 for second place.

Graham Fach of Canada defeated Aaron Lorincz of Center Line, Mich., 230-222, to win the PBA Jackson Central/Midwest Open at Dave Small's JAX 60 in Jackson, Mich., Sunday for his fifth career regional title and the \$2,000 first prize.

Fach topped Patrick Dombrowski of Parma, Ohio, 234-201 and Lorincz downed Kyle Cook of Centerville, Ohio, 230-222 to set up the championship match.

Jim Russell A Remarkable 300

Jim Russell's love affair with bowling began at four years old in the Peanut League when mom, who was a coach, signed him up to keep him from running all over the bowl. It worked in more ways than one. She knew where he was and peace of mind.

He joined the air force where he spent 22 years and he married his wife Lori. He didn't have a lot of opportunities to bowl, one of the better ones being six years in Alaska. In 2004, while stationed in England he began having seizures and headaches and after numerous MRI's it was determined he had a brain tumor which turned out to be cancerous. After more MRI's and watching "it" the medical staff decided it needed to be removed and they did a craniotomy on September 4, 2005 – better known to the lay people as cutting one's head open! They removed the tumor which left Jim with a balance problem. The 150 staples came out and he healed and was eventually able to go back to bowling. He received an honorable discharge from the air force and officially retired in 2005 and he took a year off of bowling.

Now bowling again Jim had established himself as an elite bowler and currently carries a 213 average. But 13 years later, to his chagrin, he began having headaches again and as many as 100 seizures a day. Again he had the continuous MRI's. The tumor turned out to be golf ball size and surgery was imminent – after summer league he said! After his first surgery he had a lengthy recovery, lost his driver's license and dealt with the balance problem so he hoped he might escape those problems this time. He had another craniotomy on Sept 4, 2018, just 13 years after the first one.

He said this surgery went better this time and of course, his first question was, "When can I bowl?" They said – five to six weeks – a lifetime. They had told him the odds for survival were slim but soon the 42 staples were removed, he healed and after the prescribed wait he actually practiced three games. The 100 seizures a day were going away and he was feeling pretty good. He was grateful for the Medicare and Tri-care insurance coverage he had from the military because the cost was considerable. Chemo or radiation is being considered. Finally, he could bowl.

His first game back was as a sub in the Storm Challenge league at Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights. He was concerned about his balance but started with five strikes and he felt pretty good. And then there were seven. He had a 300 a year ago on Lane 9-10 and here he was, once again on lane 9-10. He had also had his share of 299's – that illusive final strike had haunted him. He thought, "Can I go sheet?" He was not to be denied and Jim Russell shot 300 his very first game back, one month after his ominous surgery!

You have heard the comment, "It's not brain surgery!" Maybe it is.
