# **VAUGHN DOODY - The "DOMINATOR"**

I have known Vaughn Doody for close to twenty years now. I met him and his wife Veronica ("Ronnie") while I competed on the Super Senior Tour (SST) when Vaughn was dominating that tour. My moniker for him at the time was "The Dominator". It seemed like he won every tournament I competed in. By the time Len Miles and the SST left the scene Vaughn was probably the All Time Tour winner, both in titles and prize money.

It was no different on the West Coast Senior Tour (WCST). When Vaughn left Dick Sander's Tour, he had won a record 33 Titles and over \$100,000 in prize money. While his titles record was later eclipsed nothing can detract from Vaughn's accomplishments on WCST. His dominance on each senior tour eventually led to his being universally recognized as "The

Because of Vaughn's demeanor and mental approach to the game of bowling he not only dominated, he intimidated his opposition. That is why he sometimes was known as "The Intimidator".

or Intimidator, Vaughn Doody was a presence on the lanes and a winner.

Speaking of demeanor and stature, Vaughn stood erect and imposing on the approach. His stare was laser focused. Either way, Dominator It would freeze a coyote in place. His back arched. his breath deep, his entire body was wound tight and ready to spring and strike like a cobra. Opponents knew Vaughn was all business. His approach to the foul line was direct with no wasted motion. While his approach was firm everything was effortless. It was an approach that lent itself to accuracy and consistency. Nothing fancy, nothing showy, just machine like precision. That was Vaughn Doody. In one word: **Precision**.

Like I said, Vaughn's stare could freeze a coyote in place, discombobulate and distract an opponent. Make an opponent feel uncomfortable, disorient, and distract. These tactics made Vaughn appear to be cold, aloof, and impersonal. He was just that to opponents. And that's just the way he wanted it. He wanted to dominate, to intimidate. It was his game plan and it continued on page 5

# Did Everyone Catch This Year's Speed Bowling Derby?

The end of the 2023 PBA Tour season means that it's time for this year's version of the Strike Derby. But did everyone catch the event? I received an email the night before reminding us about the Strike Derby, but rather than listing a particular time and station, the memo said to check your local listings for the station and time in your area.

Between the baseball playoffs, the start of the NBA basketball season, and all the hubbub about the NFL games, I never did find the listing for the PBA Strike Derby, or "Speed Bowling" as we affectionately call it in the eastern time zone. The eventual winner of this year's Strike Derby was Chris Via from Springfield, Ohio.

Via crushed E.J. Tackett of Huntington, Ind., in the finals of the strike fest with a total of 15 strikes in two minutes. Tackett, who set a record with 16 strikes against Matt Ogle of Louisville, Ky., in the semi-final match, could muster only 7 against Via. For his efforts, Via received the 1st place prize of \$20,000, while Tackett received \$12,000 for second place. Both Ogle, and Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., received \$7,000 for third and fourth place positions.

I sometimes wonder why the PBA, and especially Bowlero Bowling Centers, continue to promote this competition. A local desk attendant in New Jersey has dubbed it "The Speed Bowling Derby." The consequences of the activity are numerous, but perhaps most notable is the effect that it has had on open play customers renting lanes by the hour. Their objective, as my desk attendant friend so appropriately puts it, is to see how many rolls of the ball they can achieve in an hour — Damn The Bowling Machines! Full Speed Ahead!

There's no redeeming value to the PBA Strike Derby. While encouraging the aforementioned speed bowling and damage to machinery, it also lessens the professional image of the bowler. While watching the event, which I was finally able to locate Wednesday on a video posted by Fox Sports on YouTube, I noticed on the graph to the right of the screen how the bowlers were placing the ball in an area at the arrows from seven to 15 boards in width. What makes that even more appalling are the comments by the announcers as to the accuracy of the players.

What?

If the bowler pulls the ball 5 boards to the left, as some of them did, it should miss the head pin to the left. And if the bowler misses more than 5 boards

to the right, as many of them did, it should miss the head pin to the right. I guess another way to phrase it is by stating the obvious: the lanes are blocked with an area of close to ten boards (five on either side of the target). This is simply not a form of bowling that should be condoned unless different variables are put in place.

Last year's winner, Matt Ogle, took a deliberate approach in 2022, taking his time, wiping the ball after every shot, and checking the position of his feet before rolling the ball. As I mentioned last year ("Another Year, Another Flop?"), Ogle's plan was reminiscent of Kris Prather, winner of the inaugural event in 2020, who also credited a conscious effort to roll quality shots. The next year it was veteran Norm Duke that took his time and looked down at the approach to set his feet in a particular spot, rather than just taking off and hoping for natural instinct to take

The exception this year was Jason Belmonte, rolling in his first Strike Derby. It's no wonder that Belmonte took four years before deciding to compete in the strike fest. Belmonte is perhaps the most deliberate and methodical of all the top notch professionals on tour today. Belmo's thought processes are in overdrive whenever he's competing. He will use anything to gain an advantage (remember the water bottle?). But alas, Belmonte may have met his Waterloo with the Speed Bowling Derby. There's just no time for Jason to conjure up a strategy to beat his opponent, or the lanes.

After four years of watching the Strike Derby, I offer the same suggestions that I have for the past two years:

- Maximum of 12 shots in 2 minutes (consider on one lane, rather than two)
- 6 or more strikes in a row = an additional 1 minute (maximum of 6 shots)
- Round begins when the ball is released from the bowler's hand on the first shot
- Ball wiping caddies to remove the excess oil from the bowling balls after each shot

By the way, whatever happened to the different colors of lane oil that outlined the "blocked" lane condition?

WE GET EMAILS: Rich LaChance asks if PBA veteran Butch Soper is still bowling?

The last time I remember Butch bowling was in 2019, when he got together with former touring professionals Jack Andolina, Tom Laskow, Fred Conner (all friends of mine over the years), and Boysie Huber to compete in the USBC National Championship. They had won the team title at the 1979 edition of the ABC Championship.

Butch is a few years older than me, so at roughly 75 years of age, I'm guessing that he's probably not bowling because it would not be up to his standards. There's a Facebook post at 'Stump The Rob' that states: "Soper is bartending at the bowl in Lake Havasu." Not positive, but I think that's where he is now living.

If anyone has information on Mr. Soper, let us hear from you and we will write an update in a future column.



worked. However, I should mention, Vaughn was a nice guy to friends and teammates.

Guess what? Vaughn had another gear when it came to opponents who irritated him. Besides his patented stare and stoic demeanor, he could initiate his silent treatment if necessary. That meant an opponent who got under his skin would be completely ignored. No words, no eye contact, no smiles, no high fives, and no recognition whatsoever. Vaughn would act as if an opponent wasn't there. Like JIM CROCE once sang "Don't pull on Superman's cape", don't spit into the wind"! Bowlers knew that you didn't pull on Vaughn Doody's cape. You didn't irritate the "Dominator".

So, when and where did Vaughn Doody come from? What made him into a championship bowler? Vaughn is a product of Windsor Locks, Connecticut, and Bradley Bowl. He laced up his first pair of bowling shoes in 1961 when he was already 27 years of age. He was a late comer to the sport of Bowling and a late bloomer. He was a good league bowler in those early days but didn't do anything that would be considered noteworthy. He just kept bowling and kept improving. He was laying the foundation for his later tournament successes.

After receiving an **Honorable Discharge** from the United States Army Vaughn moved to California to pursue a career as an electrician. Once out west he steadily improved as a bowler and then started competing in tournaments. His success through the years, described above, has led to his becoming a **"Bowling Legend"**.

Vaughn's latest accomplishment was rolling in 816 series in the Senior Trio League at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas. He was 88 years of age at the time. I believe that Vaughn May have set a Nevada State record with this series, being the oldest bowler (88 years of age) to roll an 800 series.

Vaughn's career numbers are startling. He has rolled about 40 perfect 300 games and eight 800 series, with a high series of 832. As mentioned above he has at least 50 Senior Tour Titles and a **PBA Regional Title** to his credit. His most lucrative tournament win came a couple of decades ago when he won a sports car at the **Showboat Casino Lanes** in Las Vegas. The value of the sports car at the time was about \$15,000. In today's dollars that translates to \$35,000.

Vaughn's tournament successes and subsequent growing reputation as a bowling Legend have resulted in many rumors and stories about him. Like the legends surrounding **PAUL BUNYAN** there are many tall tails surrounding the accomplishments and successes of Vaughn Doody. Let me put some of these to rest. I like to think of this discussion as "**Fact or Fiction**".

Fact or Fiction. Vaughn competed against and defeated such **PBA stars** as **Ernie Schlegel** and **Mark Roth** in late night "**Action Bowling**" matches in New York City and New Jersey back when he was living in Connecticut. Remember Windsor Locks is only 30 miles from the **Big Apple**. FICTION. There is no evidence of Vaughn Doody being an **Action Bowler** when residing on the East Coast.

Fact or Fiction. Vaughn studied for a Degree in Sports Psychology with the purpose of learning ways of exploiting an opponent's mental weaknesses. FICTION. There is no evidence of Vaughn Doody studying for a Degree in Sports Psychology.

Fact or Fiction. Vaughn was a friend of **NASCAR** race car champion **DALE EARNHARDT** and modeled his intimidating behavior after Dale Earnhardt's intimidating actions as a driver. FICTION. There is no evidence that Vaughn Doody was a friend or imitator of Dale Earnhardt.

Fact or Fiction. Vaughn was involved in the production of the 1950s hit television series "The Howdy Doody Show". That show was NBC's most successful children's show of the 1950s and one of the most popular of all time. I believe this rumor spread because of the common surname (Doody). FICTION. There is no evidence that Vaughn Doody was involved in the production of "The Howdy Doody Show". There you have it. Vaughn Doody the man, the bowler, and the champion. "The DOMINATOR".






