Tommy Jones Wins 4th Title In Last 7 PBA Tour Events

TULSA, Okla.—If there was any doubt Tommy Jones was the hottest bowler on the Denny’s Professional Bowlers Association Tour, all doubts have been laid to rest.

Jones defeated Wes Malott in the title match of the 2005 Tulsa Championship, 289-248, striking on his first 10 shots to capture his sixth career Tour title, the \$40,000 top prize and an exemption for the 2006-07 season.

“It was an unbelievable day. I had mixed emotions - not because of the 300 game - but because Wes is one of my best friends out here and he’s looking for his first title,” said Jones, whose bid for the 17th nationally televised perfect game in Denny’s PBA Tour history was foiled by a 7-pin on his 11th shot. “I caught the breaks and he didn’t.”

The victory gives Jones four titles in the last seven Tour events, as well as back-to-back wins for the first time in his career. The 26-year-old won the Dydo Japan Cup in September and now has 15 consecutive wins on television, one shy of the Tour record set by Jim Pencak from 1989-91.



Jones (Simpsonville, S.C.) advanced to the title match by defeating six-time Tour winner Chris Barnes (Flower Mound, Texas), 236-213. Jones converted the 3-4-6-7 spare in the 5th frame and struck in four of his final five frames en route to his eighth career title match appearance.

In the other semifinal, Malott advanced to the title match by defeating Mike Wolfe (New Albany, Ind.) in their semifinal, 236-209. Malott struck seven times and marked in every frame while Wolfe failed to convert the “Big Four” (4-6-7-10) and the 7-10 splits in the 4th and 6th frames, respectively.

Malott (Austin, Texas) earned \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Barnes and Wolfe earned \$10,000 apiece for 3rd and 4th, respectively. The Denny’s PBA Tour moves to Lakewood, Colo. for the 2005 Mile High Classic at Brunswick Zone Lakewood Nov. 2-6. The nationally televised ESPN finals take place Sun, Nov. 6 at 10am.

With Devastation Comes Opportunity For Renewal

TEXAS—Not since the early 90’s when Hurricane Andrew destroyed Don and Paula Carter’s bowling center in Homestead, Florida has there been a storm that was devastating to the bowling business. Dozens of centers were destroyed as extensively damaged by Hurricane Katrina.

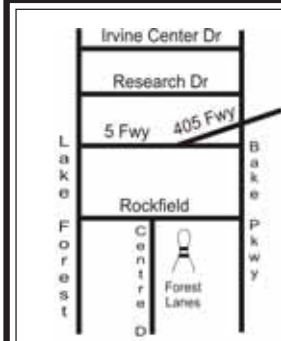
When Hurricane Rita made a direct hit on Port Arthur, Texas in late September, it blew right over Paul Kreins Park Central Recreation Center. This very nice 40-lane facility held up pretty well considering the power of the storm, but with more than \$1 million in damage, will be out of business for a few weeks.

Here is Paul’s description of the damage and his plan for rebuilding. — JG

October 1 we made a trip to Port Arthur to get our first look at the effects of Hurricane Rita on our center and our town. It was not a pretty picture.

As we got closer to Port Arthur, the devastation became greater and more widespread. Our first look at our center was breathtaking. A week earlier this beautiful center was the hub of activity in the community. Now, it was strewn with debris – sheet metal, signage from nearby businesses, insulation, flashing from the face of the building, light fix-

Scratching The Surface

NORWALK—Hello to all and thanks to California Bowling News for allowing me to contribute some technical advice to this publication. I am Steve Kloempken, the Technical Director of Storm Products, Inc. My position at Storm keeps me heavily involved with the Research and Development Department as well as the PBA Tour. This allows me to stay closely involved with both the best players in the world and cutting-edge bowling ball technology.

At Storm we consider the cover, or shell, to be a significant part of a bowling ball. Not to lessen the importance of new weight block technology, such as the RAD design in our X Factor™ and Paradigm™ series, but it is the surface of the ball that contacts the lane and determines friction levels. For this reason, coverstock selection and surface preparation is thus the most controlling and meaningful factor in ball reaction. C.A.T.S. testing has proven this time and time again.

Let's first discuss what the term 'surface' means. Many people define it as the finishing texture, i.e. dull or shiny. They are only partially right. It is important to realize that surface selection relates to BOTH the texture of the shell material as well as the actual material itself. Now, how do you select the proper surface for you? When do you choose a more aggressive cover versus a weaker cover? How about a dull, coarse finish versus a smooth and shiny finish? We should first classify what categories we have for different coverstocks and finishing textures.

Is it really this simple? Absolutely! We can describe all surfaces using this simple guide. Make sure you understand this as well. I promise it will take away a lot of confusion for everyone! But, now

that we understand the variables, how do we relate which combination is right for you?

To determine how much surface we need, we need to look at your ball speed. An initial ball speed of 20 mph would require a lot of friction between the ball and the lane to produce a desirable ball reaction. Maximum velocity requires maximum friction. We get maximum friction with a dull texture on a particle coverstock. On the converse, a player who throws the ball less than 16mph would require very little friction. This type of player would only be able to use a reactive coverstock when it is highly polished. While it is true that different lane conditions will favor different types of players, both types can enjoy success with the correct match-up.

In closing, it should be noted that it is also important to identify weaknesses in your physical game. If your velocity is on either end of the spectrum, you may be best served by first learning how to adjust your ball speed. The next step would then be in understanding the proper surface selection for each of your different velocities.

Particle =	Highest Friction
Reactive=	Aggressive
Urethane=	Mild
Polyester=	Lowest Friction

We can categorize Finishing Texture like this:

Dull=	below 600 grit
Medium =	600-1500 grit
Shiny =	above 1500 grit

LAKE FOREST — “Frank, do you remember your first sponsor, the guy who bought you a shirt with your name over the left pocket and a company name on the back?”

Yes, Eddie’s Sporting Goods, 1936, Lynwood Bowling Academy. I bought my first hard rubber ball from Eddie. I bowled with Pete Rogers, Bill Moon, Ralph Lerch and anchorman Jim Moore. We didn’t win but had lots of fun.

I followed Eddie’s shirt with the beers, Acme, Eastside, Regal, Golden Creme, 102. In fact, every team in Lynwood Academy had a sponsor. Almost all the stores on Long Beach Blvd. sponsored teams in the Commercial League.

Even gas stations, Shorty Long’s Gilmore Blue-Green Gasoline. Shorty’s was the best. He gave 10 gallons (little over a \$1) for any guy that could bowl a scratch 200 game.

From the “Commercial” league giveaways, publicity stunts, the embroidered shirt became known world-wide — individual bowlers were identified as the cigar-chumping, beer-drinking, pot-bellied working stiff, enjoyed themselves. Breweries sold a lot of beer.

It was a cheap way to promote a product.

The shirt/blouse craze flourished, adding matching pants, shoes, bowling bags to the growing fashion.

Bowling had a lock on community support, but talk show hosts, comedians, editors, writers, cartoonists all mocked the rolly-polly squares.

For some reason, centers, bowling associations and their “customers” failed to take advantage of the freebees.

Perhaps it was the freebees. Bowlers, entire industry, avoided mirrors they couldn’t see. They were getting big, fat, and comfortable.

The industry just didn’t support their sponsors. The coupe de grace: when the winner of the Burger King PBA Open, on ABC-TV, answered the question: “What are you going to do with your prize money?” His answer: “I’m not going to buy a Burger King Whopper!”

The new Professional Bowling Association’s 2005-06 season started this past week on ESPN-TV with Denny’s Restaurant it’s major sponsor. This writer hopes the PBA, USBC, YABA and proprietors urge their customers (members) to try Denny’s breakfast special and ask them to sponsor a bowling team.

Better still, all bowling entities develop community relations committees; look for Shorty’s station. It would be great if Shorty donated another 10 gallons.

Steve Miller, former Nike executive, said bowling lost touch with their communities.

Every center should join their local chamber of commerce, let them know you have a “Commercial” league, and corporate, church, junior, fraternal, civic and club events — come in, look us over, we have been around for ages, have fun.

In fact, we support your business.

tures and unidentified trash. The power throughout the area was still out, so our first look at the inside of the center was limited to what we could see with flashlights and the sunlight streaming in through the shattered glass of the entry doors. The first thing we noticed was the damp carpet where the powerful wind had blown rain into the building. Mold and mildew was growing everywhere fueled by the damp, humid conditions, lack of ventilation and Southeast Texas’ triple-digit heat.

The restaurant and lounge were relatively intact with the exception of ceiling tiles that had crashed to the floor, soaked with rain that had poured in from above. Every ventilation and air conditioning hatch had blown away, leaving large openings for the storm to pour into the building. “Minor” cracks and tears in the roof became evident as “day-light” peeked through the gaping spaces created by missing ceiling tiles.

As we approached the control counter, we gasped, “Oh my God!” Everything above the counter – ceiling tiles, beams, trusses, metal framework, mirrors and the entire canopy that had once encircled the desk – were piled onto the counter and floor around the desk. It looked as if a bomb had exploded above it.

Directly in front of the desk, the walkway leading to the front entrance was strewn with broken glass, flyers, posters, ceiling tiles and insulation. Ironically, a poster promoting our “Star Wars” league had been torn off the wall and laid among the

debris on the floor. Its message: “MAY THE FORCE BE WITH YOU.” The front of our building faces north. This was apparently the place where Rita came into the building with her full FORCE.

Almost everything from the front of the building to the settee area was damaged. The game room, meeting room, arcade and offices all took a hit. Oddly however, it appeared that very little was affected beyond the concourse. The bowler’s area, the approaches, the lanes and the pinsetters all seemed to be spared Rita’s wrath. Strangely, not a single pin among 40 lanes had fallen over.

I went up on the roof to survey the damage. It was extensive, especially to the air conditioners. Virtually all the protective sheet metal panels covering the units had been ripped away leaving the electronics and mechanics completely exposed.

Some of the debris scattered on the roof seemed to have come from other buildings.

Examining the center during this first visit was a bit surreal. It felt like an out-of-body experience – as if I was dreaming it all or viewing it on a television screen.

Whatever happens, the important thing is that we all came through this safely. And, despite how bad it is and how severely we (and our employees) have been affected by it, we still came out WAY better than thousands of people in Lake Charles, Cameron and other coastal Louisiana and Mississippi communities. Our prayers go out to them during this truly tragic time.

AMF ALL-STAR LANES IN KENNER: Water and roof damage and repairs are labeled extensive. The center hopes to be up and running by year’s end.

BOWLING USA SLIDELL: The back wall destroyed, extensive water damage, including under the lanes. Repairs are to begin soon to hopefully get the house up and running January or February.

CIRCLE BOWL BATON ROUGE: Lost power for five days with extensive damage to the air-conditioning unit. The loss of power was the most extensive for any local bowling venue.

COLONIAL LANES: The center is up and running after losing power for three weeks. The restaurant continues to serve as a site to feed troops, police and the Red Cross.

EXPRESSWAY LANES IN GRETNA: The roof collapsed over some of the lanes. The plans are to repair in hopes for an early 2006 opening.

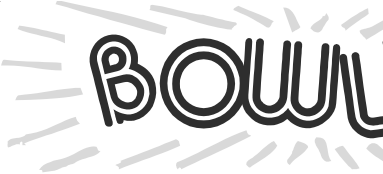

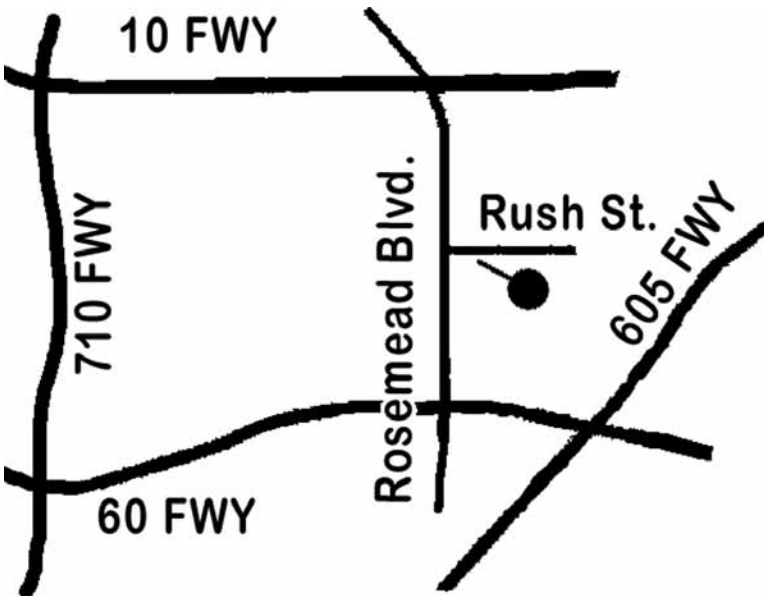

Also with Flores’ 244 along with Pennington’s 204 and Caldwell’s 154, Hollywood scored the season high team game, 602.

The qualifying will be 10 straight games, and then on Sunday, will cut to the two divisional ages for the finals on Sunday, November 13th, at 9:00AM.
