Arizona's Jakob Butturff Wins PBA Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open

Tommy Jones wins \$10,000 honus as season-long Xtra Frame Tour points leader

LAS VEGAS (Oct. 30, 2016) - Jakob Butturff of Chandler, Ariz., won his second career Professional Bowlers Association Tour title Sunday in the PBA Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open at South Point Bowling Plaza in a championship round that featured three of the PBA's rising stars.

Butturff, who won his only other title earlier in the year in the PBA Xtra Frame Lubbock Sports Open in Texas, struck on 10 of his first 11 shots to defeat 19-year-old Anthony Simonson of Princeton, Texas, 277-211.

Butturff, a 22-year-old left-hander, led the field after 32 games of qualifying and match play by 448 pins, winning 14 of his 16

matches Sunday without an open frame. Except for his 218 game to start the tournament, the second-year PBA member led all the way to the final match.

"Everyone performed great," Butturff said. "I just had to make as many good shots as they did.

"My mom was diag-

nosed with cancer recently, so I really wanted to win this one for her. One thing I've learned is that when someone has cancer, you have to keep their spirits up and I know she likes it when I bowl well. My title was basically for her.

"I've just been successful bowling here in Vegas; The battle of contenders

it was more of a comfort feeling than anything," he Simonsen, who won

both of his PBA Tour titles earlier in the year, won the semifinal match in a strike-fest against 21-yearold Swedish two-hander Jesper Svensson, 267-258.

for 2016 PBA Player of the Year honors began with Simonsen throwing seven strikes to start the match while Svensson, the Tour's only three-time winner in 2016, converted three single-pin spares before rolling eight strikes in a row to finish his game.

In the first match, Simonsen struck on four of his first five shots before leaving the 4-6-7-10 split. but O'Neill had trouble gaining ground, leaving 10 pins on five of his first seven shots. He finally got on track with a late string of four strikes, but Simonsen recovered from his big split with a string of six strikes for a 242-224 victory.

Another Reminder About Bowling Etiquette

When will bowlers learn?

One can never remind players enough about bowling etiquette. This may be an appropriate time for that reminder because many new bowlers are in the middle of their fall seasons – and they still haven't gotten the message.

As for those veteran bowlers who should know better . . . well, it doesn't hurt to hear this lecture again.

Remember, you're not bowling in a vacuum. There are bowlers all around you. If you forget everything else, just remember this: Be considerate.

OK, so do you have a pet peeve about etiquette and courtesy when you bowl? I have one.

When I release the ball at the foul line, oftentimes a bowler on an adjoining lane will thunder to my side and rifle his or her ball while I'm still tracking my shot and anticipating my upcoming pin action (or lack thereof).

It's easy to get startled by such an ill-mannered bowler . . . and annoyed. Why can't that bowler just wait a few seconds and allow me to watch my electrifying shot (thinking positively) before I triumphantly return to my seat?

The fact is that rudeness often prevails in a bowling house. It's rarely intentional, but it can produce a heart-stopping – and irritating – moment or two.

On the same topic, perfectbowling.com, a nifty website that provides bowling tips, advice and other interesting data, came up with its list of nine bowling rules for etiquette and courtesy.

So here goes – the etiquette rules from perfectbowling.com.

- 1 The first rule in bowling is to never bother another bowler while they are in the process of bowling.
- 2 Bowlers on the right-hand lane have the right-of-way to bowl first.
- 3 Never pick up your ball from the return rack while another bowler is preparing to bowl and is in his/her starting position.

Fred Eisenhammer: In other words, don't be so eager to take your shot. The pins will still be standing there!

- 4 Refrain from using obscenities or vulgar language.
- 5 After your shot, let others bowl.

Fred Eisenhammer: In other words, don't linger on the lane after your shot.

- **6** Wear proper shoes.
- 7 Keep food and other refreshments off the approach.
- **8** Remember, there are others waiting to bowl.

Fred Eisenhammer: In other words, don't wander off aimlessly... or socialize too long when your turn is about to arrive.

9 – Above all else, have fun.

I'll add Rule No. 10 to the list:

10 – Let the bowler next to you complete his or her turn and walk back to his or her seat before you start your approach.

Of course, it's inevitable that some bowlers will slip up from time to time, so it's important not to get flustered if someone violates one of these rules.

No slamming your bowling ball on the lane in disgust. Distractions happen – even when pros are bowling. Remember, it's just a game.



This tournament featured dual patterns, using the 47' Statue of Liberty pattern on each left lane, and the 32' PBA Wolf pattern on each right lane. The scoring pace was low, as only five bowlers were able to finish plus. Piroozshad stumbled out of the gate with a 151, flagging three singlepin spares, but he used his prior experience of winning to claw his way back.

Rob steadied the ship in games 2 through 6 with scores of 205-204-210-180-214 and saved his absolute best for last. Trailing by over 100 pins with just three games to go, Rob fashioned a huge block with games of 234, 236, and 235 to finish at +69. Like his last victory, he was the clubhouse leader and had to wait it out since one other bowler still had a chance to win.

That bowler was Jonathan Huff. Huff had vaulted into the lead with his huge 276 in game 7 and had the lead with one game to go. Needing a strike for the win, a Greek Church put an end to that and dropped him all the way to 4th. It was a costly \$1000 shot for Huff, as he earned \$150

Bobby Campagnale added to his legendary list of second-place finishes, just as he did in the last Forest 9-gamer. He has now officially surpassed the one million mark in second-place finishes. Bobby also got off to a slow start with two of his first four games in the 160s, one of which included a double gutter, but he was able to grind it out his last five games on scores of 223-211-234-230-202 to finish at +45.

For Bobby, this one wasn't as painful as the others. With second place also a guaranteed payout of \$800, a sidepot win in game 5, and a second place in block three, Bobby still took home \$880.

Kurtis Lee was leading for most of the tournament, opening up with a 269 game. He won the first block with 636 and still held a 70-pin lead on second after game 6. However, a couple of sub-180 games in games 7 and 8 for Kurtis allowed the field to make a move on him.

He finished out with 222, but it wasn't enough, and he finished 3rd for \$200. Rounding out the top 5 was Steve Smith, who is always a threat to win. Incredibly, Steve is returning from a torn right Achilles tendon, which he suffered early in August.

Most mere mortals take six to nine months to heal, but this Superman made it back in less than three. I jokingly made a comment that his first shot back was probably a strike, and he confirmed that his first ball post-surgery was ten straight back. Steve wound up at +13 and shot 225 in the final game to go around a couple of others to sneak out the last cash for \$130.

With the holidays right around the corner and several other local and state tournaments already scheduled through the end of the year, the next Forest tournament will not take place until early 2017. Stay tuned to the Bowling News for updates.

against Jones in the second match, but Jones, after converting spares in his first three frames, threw three strikes to catch up. A 4-6-10 split in Jones' seventh frame, however, gave Simonsen an opening and he jumped on it, throwing another string of five strikes to knock Jones out of the finals, 248-191.

With his fourth-place finish, Jones earned 17 points in the final PBA Xtra Frame Tour event of the year and captured the \$10,000 winner-take-all bonus with a season-ending total of 87 points to overtake E.J. Tackett, who finished with 84 points, and Ryan Ciminelli, who had 83.

of his three titles. He is a former Team USA member and earned collegiate All-American honors while helping the University of Kansas win the 2004 men's intercollegiate championship. Page and O'Neill are also members of the United States Bowling Congress board of directors as athlete representatives.

"There was a considerable time gap between the last time the PBA had an active players' group and now," Page said of his role in the new group. "My heart has always been wanting to help bowling, and I saw this as a great opportunity to serve the Tour. When Mike Fagan and Scott Norton stepped aside - they were the guys who really got the committee up and running again - I kind of stepped in. "The group we have now represents all regions of the country," he continued. "Our goal is to improve the lines of communications between the players and the PBA leadership. Our thinking is in the best interests of not only the players, but our fans and our corporate partners. I think we've been making a lot of great strides in that direction. "One of our biggest goals was to create a structure for the players' committee and to develop a strategic plan covering what we hope to accomplish, so we can let all of the other players see what the big picture is," Page concluded. "Our next step is to improve those communications and let the other players know their opinions are important in what we're trying to build for the future."

- The Bowling News printed a Northern California edition.
- First place in the Cal Classic? A 1964 Chevrolet Corvair. Second place? A trip for two to Hawaii. Qualify in any or all 22 houses running the event.
- A.B.C. Rule 24 prohibited any and all owners or employees of a center to cash in their own tournaments. (I assume they meant "sanctioned tournaments.") A center could make their own rules otherwise. Or even re-rate.
- The "Chinese Lo Ball" tourney had an entry fee of \$130.00 Formosan dollars! Or \$3.25 U.S. money. Low score won. Many strange rules. A scorekeepers night mare.
- T.V. bowling show host DICK STOEFFLER was on 208 times on Channel 11. BOB RAMIREZ won most titles.
- Does the name DON DROOKER sound familiar? He managed centers for many years. In 1964 he was writing a column for **CANOGA PARK BOWL**.
- BILLY MYERS Sr. at LA PUENTE LANES invited everyone to "BOWL 'N' BREAKFAST". 3 games and breakfast only \$2.00. I used to leave ALHAMBRA VALLEY BOWL (I was manager) and go to Billy's for breakfast!
- HERB "JUDGE" ROTH was a real character Bowl manager, writer, L.A.B.A. officer and a friend to every bowler he met. A "leprechaun" in disguise.
- Somebody came up with a gimmick called "Chinese Lo Ball". 10 centers were running the same format. The \$500 winner in February was Barry Asher. Other "house" cashers included Bob Kannicutt, Doug Johnson, Tom Long for \$20.00 each. Entry fee? \$3.25.
- WESTERN COLUMBIA opened a large Pro Shop that specialized in drilling balls according to the "Bill Taylor Method". His formula was "perfection" for a few years, then everyone (including A.B.C.) called him a kook. At the end of his life the bowling world admitted he WAS right!
- The first 100% live plastic ball, made with polyelastic resins, hit the market. It was called American Mark, made in the east.
- DICK BRAASCH —you devil you shot 716 in the All Star League to lead your team to victory at **DUTCH VILLAGE**.
- The subject of hundreds of letters to the Editor of the Bowling News was Bill Taylor. They either agreed with him or not. His study of actual bowling pins was a first. He wanted to know how they flew and how they changed by constant pounding. Chemists, engineers and manufacturers had nothing on Taylor's study.
- League co-ordinator JACKIE HENNY (now a secretary at ACTION LANES) tooted the horn for some BOWLING SQUARE shooters, namely FLOYD BEEDY, HOSS CLAPP and LEW (LOW BALL) ALIEN
- WILLIE MOSCONI, 13 time Pocket Billiard Champion, was in town for lessons, exhibitions and autographs. He was adviser on the movie, "The Hustler" with Paul Newman. He once ran 526 balls.
- CHARTER OAK LANES on Arrow Highway opened on March 28th another David Boran bowl. Gee it was the only bowl to be built (in the area) in two years. What a shame. Thery were being built so fast they hardly made head lines in the NEWS.
- SHATTO 39 blasted their arrival with a full page in color. SHATTO is still in business! \$5.00 per game. \$3.00 for rental shoes. How many of you knew SHATTO is alive and open for business?
- For Sale in 29 Palms, **THE BOWLADIUM**, coffee shop, liquor license, cocktail lounge, dining room, building and property. Only \$20,000 down. Any takers?
- Top P.B.A., Champion BILLY HARDWICK won \$33,000.00 in one game. No sponsors and had topay his own expenses.
- An open letter from a team sponsor explained why companies stopped buying shirts and paying fees. They never got a thank you, only a call to ask them to do it again. Take heed bowlers, If you are lucky enough to have a sponsor. THANK HIM! Send them a league sheet. Invite them to an awards ceremony. Take a picture! DO SOMETHING!
- CAL BOWL staff was thinking big even in 1964. Latest off their noodles was a singles handicap event with a \$90,000 pay-off. All they needed was 3,000 entries. It was a 3 month tourney. Top gun to receive \$2,500.

Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify score if submitted average is lower than correct average thereby resulting in more handicap. Prize winning will be based on the submitted average if it is higher than the correct average.
- 12. Any PBA or PWBA member, past or present that does not meet the average requirements of rule #10, must enter at 220.
- 13. USBC rules 319a2 (10 pin increase in average), 319d (reporting of prize winnings) and 319e (15 pin increase in accumulated tournament average) will be waived.
- 14. Replacements for original entrants may be made providing the replacement meets eligibility and average requirements per Rule 11. A replacement must bowl under their own name at the time the event is scheduled.
- 15. All prize money will be returned 100%. Prize ratio is at least 1:6 per division. In the event of first place ties, co-champions will be declared and prize money will be combined and divided equally. Designated prize funds will be paid accordingly to each division within 30 days upon completion of the tournament, except when USBC nationals has authorized delay in payment, pending settlement of any claim or protest which effects position standings. A symbolic award will be furnished for the champion in each age class.
- 16. Winners in each age classification are eligible to participate in the 2018 USBC Senior National Championships.

 Participation fees will be paid by CUSBC. In the event of a tie for first place in any division, since only one is eligible to participate in the National Seniors Tournament, the tie will be broken by using the highest 3 game series with handicap (i.e., first 3 game set or second 3 game set). If a tie still exists, the tie will be broken by using highest game with handicap. Arrangements will be made with each athlete within stated guidelines and parameters from the CUSBC for attending the National Finals. Eligible advancers must agree to bowl in the National Finals or, failing to do so, agree to waive all rights. In the event a winner of any division is unable or declines to attend the national tournament, the second, third or fourth place finisher from that division (in order of finish) will be eligible to compete.
- 17. Bowlers arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count beginning with the frame then being bowled. Missed frames shall be credited with a zero. Frames may not be made-up. Bowlers not present to bowl when it's their turn will be credited with a zero for that frame. In the event a bowler cannot finish their series, zero points will be scored the remaining frames.
- 18. This tournament will be certified by USBC. The tournament director shall be the authority to interpret USBC and tournament rules, policies and procedures in deciding disputes. If deemed necessary, the tournament director shall consult with the board of directors of the CUSBC.
- 19. An appeal or protest of a decision involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed in writing with the tournament director and the USBC before tournament prizes are paid. The decision of USBC is final and binding on all involved parties. Any violation of tournament rules is cause for disqualification, loss of entry fee, forfeit of all prize monies and possible suspension from USBC membership.
- 20. Fees are refundable ONLY when the Tournament Director is notified, in writing, within 15 days of the schedule notice mailing, that the date and time assigned are not acceptable, or in the case of an emergency, at the discretion of Tournament Director.




