Williams Wins PBA Motor City Open for Record 46th Career Title

ALLEN PARK—Walter Ray Williams Jr. has already ventured into territory no bowler in history has seen, but when he rallied to defeat Chris Barnes, 238-230, and win the Professional Bowlers Association's Motor City Open at Thunderbowl Lanes, he broke new ground even for himself.

Williams, who turned 50 on Oct. 6, won a record 46th title in a PBA Tour career that began in 1983, and he extended his PBA record for winning at least one title to 17 consecutive seasons. The Ocala, Fla., resident, who is now eligible to bowl on the PBA Senior Tour as well as the so-called "Junior Tour," threw seven strikes and converted four single-pin spares in the Motor City Open

finals that aired Sunday on ESPN. But his nearly flawless performance almost wasn't enough.

Barnes, with strikes on seven of his first eight shots, left

the 3-6-9-10 in the ninth frame and failed to convert the spare, giving Williams the lead for the first time in the title match. Then, needing a double and eight pins in the 10th frame to overtake Williams, Barnes left a 7 pin on his first shot.

"I left a lot of nine counts," Williams said. "In the first frame, I threw a great shot and left a ringing 10 pin. The one I left in the third frame (a 6 pin), I pinched the shot a little left,

but I'll throw the ball the same way every time after leaving ringing 10s. Sometimes you'll strike, sometimes not. Fortunately today I didn't get too many taps."

The title match was a strike-fest compared to the earlier matches, when conditions were challenging. Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., needed a late strike surge to escape Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., 201-169, in the opening match.

O'Neill then got lined up and blew past Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 257-224. But as the lane conditions changed, the transition caught up to O'Neill in the semifinal match, when Barnes outlasted him, 183-169, to set up a title match between the top two qualifiers in the event.

Barnes made a critical adjustment to find the pocket in the championship contest, but Williams had an even better answer.

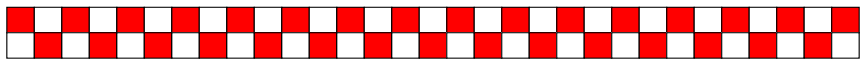

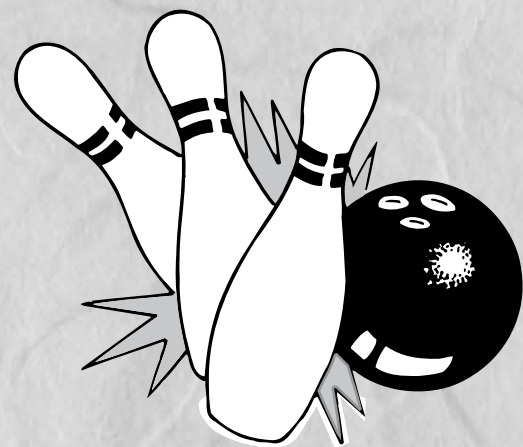
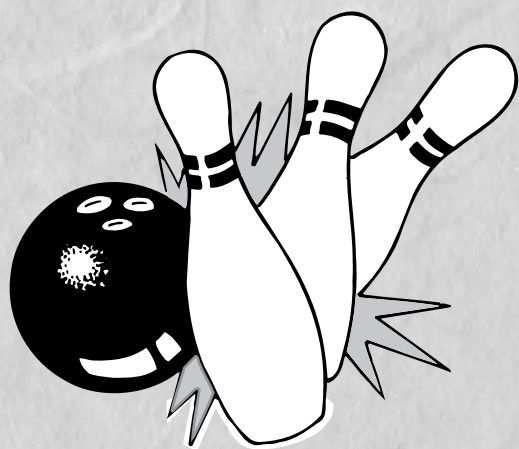

National Deaf Bowling News

2009 Taipei Deaflympics Bowling Results

TAIWAN — With thanks to Ed Abakumoff, coach of Deaf Team USA for the complete bowling results which I can put in this story.

The 2009 Deaflympics held in Taipei, Taiwan last September 5-15 drew a record 85 countries with a total of 2673 athletes and 1569 officials participating in 17 different sports. Bowling as one of 17 sports drew 39 countires with 147 male and 66 female bowlers competing in their respective 5 events. Only 19 countries were able to send a full team while just 8 countries sent full women teams.

All bowling were done in a two story Xinqiaofu Bowling Center in Zhonghe City, a suburb of Taipei. The results of each event with Gold, Silver and Bronze medal winners and how Deaf Team USA flared.

United States started out with its only gold medal as Randall Perry rolled USA’s only 1200 series in winning the singles event with 1228.

USA had two bowlers in each but not one of them moved up fast as Stogryn did when he won the Masters Silver 4 years ago.

"At one time in my career, I was 0-9 on TV," Williams said, "but things turned around. For a long time, I couldn't do anything right. Since things turned around, TV has been going good for me."

Even as he approaches his debut on the PBA Senior Tour at the end of the 2009-10 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour season, Williams isn't showing any signs of slowing down.

"As long as I feel good and stay competitive, I'll keep on bowling," he said. "I don't want to be out here if I'm not competitive; I'd be too frustrated. When I can't compete, when it's isn't fun, I'll retire. I have no issue with that. But I feel like I'm still doing pretty well."

He also has set no goals or aspirations for whatever happens before he retires his bowling shoes.

"I keep saying one more (title), and now it's 46," he laughed. "Winning a tournament is the best thing in the world, but you never know when it's going to be the last one."

Brandon Kraye Takes Senior Event and \$310

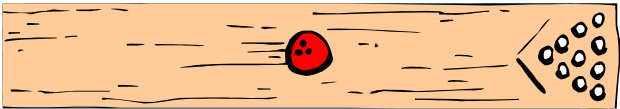

Women’s Championship: Over 3,600 women bowlers participated in team at Yorba Linda Bowl, Yorba Linda and D/S at Forest Lanes in Lake Forest. Orange County USBC was our hosting association. Checks to winners amounted to \$98,000.00. Presentation of the Trophies to the 1st Place Winners will be handled by assigned board members. The newly designed Participation Award was well received. The USBC 200 Pin was given to 980 bowlers as well as, USBC emblems and pins to those earning them. Recognition Award Certificates were presented to all ladies who organized six or more teams. The Oroville and Yuba City associations will be our hosts for **2010**.

Senior Women’s Championship: Double-Decker Lanes in Rohnert Park played host to this annual tournament August 28-30 and 449 bowlers were entered. The high game was 269 by A. Rose Williams, of Orange County USBC. One All-Spare Game was bowled. The “Granny In” participation gift was a big hit as usual. Ten women received “Ten Year” Keychain Awards. The Prize Fund payout was \$5,837. The date for the **2010** event **TBA**.

Youth Championship: The 2009 Youth State Scratch Tournament Committee was still receiving entries until 8:00 AM, October 17, 2009 and was ready for the scheduled event on October 17-18 at AMF Visalia Lanes, Visalia, with estimated \$10,000 in Scholarships based on 100 entries. The committee will provide results report at the next board meeting. The board **Approved** the bids from North San Diego County to host the **2010** events. Surf Bowl will hold the (Team) and Vista Entertainment Center the (D/S). The bids from Oroville/Yuba Sutter for **2011** will be considered at the next board meeting.

Queens Championship: Forty-five women competed at Yorba Linda Bowl in this year’s event for a payout of \$4,190. High qualifier from the Women’s Qualifiers was Paula Vidad. In the Last Chance squad, Andrea Snyder bowled two 290 games and was the high qualifier. Andrea continued to prevail, winning the championship and was crowned our 2009 Queen. Christie Asher was the runner-up. This tournament for **2010** is scheduled for August 15-15 at Tyme to Bowl Lanes in Oroville.

Masters Championship: This year’s event held at Pacific Avenue Bowl drew 117 bowlers (81 Open, 36 Last Chance) and paid out \$13,125. (f) For **2010** Adult championships the prize ratio will be 1 in 8 for Team, Doubles, and Singles and 1 in 10 for All-Events. (g) In the case of **Youth**; any Norcal Youth bowler who wishes to bowl our events, they must be a **certified** bowler. Non-certified **will not** be allowed to participate in State Championships, Pepsi or State Scratch. (h) The committee continues to work toward finalizing all updates to the Tournament Manual and Tournament Host Manual for use in **2010**.

The BVL Committee reported receiving **\$137,451.87** donations in 2008-09. All V.A. facilities requests for funds to be reviewed in November. Smaller associations to receive better recognition as to their per member donations. **BVL 2010** Tournament to be held on April 10 at Yorba Linda Bowl. New designed pin to all participants.

The board **Approved** six changes to the **Policy & Procedure Manual**. **Legislation Committee** presented four Proposed Amendments. The board **Approved** two and **Rejected** two. The board **Approved** the changes in our rules for the “20 Pins Over Award”.

Star of Tomorrow \$1,000 Scholarship funds are being sent directly to SMART at USBC as soon as the name of the winner is announced and the recipient(s) notified accordingly. The committee is working on updating the Award Jacket, with details at the next board meeting.

Distinguished Service Award Committee revealed changes in the **2010** Nomination Form. (a) CAUSBC Hall of Fame Members, or Current Board Members of CAUSBC will not be eligible for this award; (b) the deadline date will be **January 15, 2010**.

Hall of Fame Committee had received four nominations for Meritorious Service and one for Superior Performance. This deadline is **January 15, 2010**.

The **Product Fair** for the 2010 Convention in Fremont, CA will be in the foyer of the Marriot-Fremont Hotel. Table prices to vendors has been reduced.

Convention Committee is reviewing ideas on how to inject some “fun” into the proceedings of our convention weekend to make it more entertaining to the delegates and guests. They will report to the next board meeting.

The board **Approved** President Hoffmann’s appointment of the **2010 Nominating Committee:** Jack Waters (Central California); Bette Addington,(Golden Empire); Joan Feinblum (Redwood Empire); Donna Dillard (North Los Angeles County); Larry Worrall (Southern L.A.County).
