
# **VanDaniker Wins Second Straight PWB Title**

Journal's Bob Johnson on Oct. 24 at Bowlium Lanes in Montclair, Calif. It was an unusual event to make the surprise announcement, but it was done that way to surround Joan with family and friends from the bowling world.

Said Robin about hear-

ing the announcement that day: "I burst into tears and so did she. I know how hard she's worked in bowling - ever since I was a junior [bowler] . . . To see her recognized for her love and contributions to bowling is just unbelievable. I still can't believe it.

"It's a thrill for me. I can't wait to see her inducted."

Joan admitted to being in "total shock" when she heard the news. "When they told me a long time ago that they were thinking of nominating me, I said, 'don't.' I didn't think there would be any way I'd be elected."

In its press release, the USBC listed some of Joan's bowling positions: president (2012-2015) and vice president (2010-2012) of the International Bowling Media Assn.; president of the California Bowling Writers; an executive coordinator role for World Bowling; and trustee to the IBM/Hall of Fame."

Additionally, Joan has earned such awards as the California Women's Bowling Assn. Distinguished Services Award; Columcontinued on page 7

# LOW'S 268-795, MID CITY 2066 LEAD SO-CAL DEAF TRAVEL AT JEWEL CITY BOWL

GLENDALE — At Jewel City Bowl Southern California Deaf Traveling League continued to struggle as Robert Audette's Mid City team made a complete 180 degrees turnabout from last week's low of 1667 team series at Cal Bowl to the day's only top team 2000 series. Mid City's 2066 (513-499-512-528) at Jewel City Bowl turned out as the season high team series replacing S. F. Valley's 2062.

For the first time this season not a single 800 (4 games) was rolled as Gorman Low missed by 5 pins with his 795 and Robert Audette's 791 also missed by 9 pins. Low's 795 consists of 268 (spare, 9 strikes, 8, spare)-192-162-173. Audette in his thrilling match duel against Darrell Stogryn, had 211+180-209-191 while Stogryn hits 204-154-210-204 for 772. Bob Jones capped this day's four men honor roll with his 210-704. On the ladies side Denise Burrows had a 168 high game and Sharon Caldwell the high series 605.

The league leader Jones' S F Valley increased its lead with 13.5 -6.5 points win over 3rd place Eagle Rock. Second place Riverside battled to a close 11-9 over 5th place Low's Anaheim but fell to third when Audette's Mid City moved up from 4th to second with a near sweep 17-3 win over 6th place Chino Hills.

This 56 years old deaf traveling league thanks Jewel City Bowl management and staff for hosting and will return for its 2nd round session on March 20. With a week hiatus the league will resume playing at Gable House Bowl for its first position round on Sunday November 15. The position round will have S F Valley with a big 17 points lead facing Mid City, Riverside just 1.5 points behind against Eagle Rock and Anaheim also just 1.5 points behind against Chino Hills.

# THREE ELECTED TO 2016 USBC HALL OF FAME CLASS

ARLINGTON — The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame will have at least three new members in 2016 - one in the Outstanding USBC Performance, one in the Veterans category and one in Meritorious Service - after their election by the USBC Hall of Fame Committee.

Two-time USBC Open Championships titlist Steve Kloempken of Pleasant View, Utah, will be enshrined in the Outstanding USBC Performance category, Professional Bowlers Association senior standout Harry Sullins of Chesterfield Township, Michigan, will become the newest name in the Veterans category and longtime bowling writer Joan Romeo of Van Nuys, California, will be recognized for years of service to the bowling industry.

The committee also slated eight bowlers for the Superior Performance national ballot that will be voted on by a panel of USBC Hall of Fame members, board members and veteran bowling writers.

The men's ballot includes Mike Durbin of Livingston, Texas; David Ozio and Mark Williams of Beaumont, Texas; Randy Pedersen of Clermont, Florida; Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas and Danny Wiseman of Baltimore.

The two competitors on the women's ballot are Kim Adler of Melbourne, Florida, and Tammy Turner of West Palm Beach, Florida.

The induction ceremony will take place April 28 at the 2016 USBC Convention in Las Vegas and will include those elected for Superior Performance.

A look at the newly elected USBC Hall of Famers:

#### Steve Kloempken

The 45-year-old right-hander's balanced resume includes international success as a past member of Team USA, a memorable collegiate stint at Wichita State and two victories on the sport's biggest stage at the USBC Open Championships.

Kloempken's two appearances on Team USA (1991, 1994), were highlighted by doubles and trios gold medals at the 1991 World Bowling Men's Championships in Singapore. That momentum carried over to his collegiate career, where he helped the Shockers to three consecutive victories at the Intercollegiate Team Championships from 1993-1995.

In 27 years at the Open Championships, Kloempken has a 213.5 average and won titles in Team All-Events in 1993 and Regular All-Events in 2003. He has seven other top-10 finishes.

#### Harry Sullins

Sullins, a 57-year-old right-hander, will be the 50th bowler inducted in the Veterans category of the USBC Hall of Fame.

His resume includes five Professional Bowlers Association national titles, the first in 1986, along with 12



regional victories. He also has found continued success on the PBA50 Tour, earning three national titles and eight regional wins. His lone major championship was the 2009 PBA Senior World Championship.

Sullins is known for his longevity and owns the PBA record for consecutive tournament appearances with 239 from 1986-1993.

As a state and local standout, Sullins has earned 10 city championships and nine state titles, which helped earn him induction into the Metro Detroit Hall of Fame (2002) and Michigan State Bowling Association Hall of Fame (2003).

#### Joan Romed

Romeo has worked in various roles supporting the International Bowling Media Association, World Bowling, International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum, California Bowling Writers and the Team USA program.

Through 2015, there are 412 members of the USBC Hall of Fame - 215 in Superior Performance, 116 in Meritorious Service, 49 in Veterans, 20 in Pioneers and 12 in Outstanding USBC Performance.

The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame.





# **Bowling Etiquette Rules: A Reminder** by Fred Eisenhammer

Do you have a pet peeve about etiquette and courtesy when you bowl?

I have one.

When I release the ball at the foul line, oftentimes a bowler on an adjoining lane will thunder to my side and rifle his or her ball while I'm still tracking my shot and anticipating my upcoming pin action (or lack thereof).

It's easy to get startled by such an ill-mannered bowler . . . and annoyed. Why can't that bowler just wait a few seconds and allow me to watch my electrifying shot (thinking positively) before I triumphantly return to my seat?

The fact is that rudeness often prevails in a bowling house. It's rarely intentional, but it can produce a disturbing moment or two.

On this same topic, perfectbowling.com, a nifty website that provides bowling tips, advice and other interesting data, came up with its list of nine bowling rules for etiquette and courtesy.

So here's goes – the etiquette rules from perfectbowling.com.

- 1 The first rule in bowling is to never bother another bowler while they are in the process of bowling.
- 2 Bowlers on the right-hand lane have the right-of-way to bowl first.
- 3 Never pick up your ball from the return rack while another bowler is preparing to bowl and is in his/her starting position.
- **4** Refrain from using obscenities or vulgar language.
- **5** After your shot, let others bowl.
- **6** Wear proper shoes.
- 7 Keep food and other refreshments off of the approach.
- 8 Remember, there are others waiting to bowl.
- 9 Above all else, have fun.

I'll add Rule No. 10 to the list: Let the bowler next to you complete his or her turn and walk back to his or her seat before you start your approach.

Of course, it's inevitable that some bowlers will slip up from time to time, so it's important not to get flustered if someone violates one of these rules.

Remember, it's just a game.

Robin, a Newhall resident, said she believed that Joan's biggest achievement was her fund-raising role in helping to open a 2011 "50 Years of Women's Pro Bowling" exhibit at the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame in Arlington, Tex.

According to the "Stars and Strikes" newsmagazine, Joan brought in "a majority of the more than \$100,000 it took to build the exhibit."

Working in Hall-of-Fame programs is a natural thing for her to do, Joan said. "The Hall of Fame is near and dear to my heart because Robin's in it," said Joan, adding that Robin actually is a member of seven Halls of Fame.

Additionally, another one of Joan's daughters, Tori Romeo, a former professional, is a member of the California Bowling Hall of Fame.

"As far as I'm concerned," Joan said, "my biggest achievement has been my kids. I've been really lucky that all my kids turned out well."

Joan has five children; in addition to Robin and Tori, she has a third daughter in Deborah and two sons in William and David.

Joan said that her bowling involvement has reaped rewards – for instance, it's allowed her to travel for bowling events to such faraway places as Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates and Sweden.

"It's all because of bowling," Joan said.



# **Valley 600 Club Holds Final Tournament of 2015**

The club is planning a doubles tournament in January at Winnetka Bowl for its first 2016 event.

# **Amateur Russ Davies Defeats** Walter Ray Williams Jr. To Win PBA50 **South Point West Open Regional**

LAS VEGAS - Amateur Russ Davies of Las Vegas won the most memorable match of his career by defeating PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. to win the PBA50 South Point West Open presented by Track regional Monday at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

The 60-year-old Davies defeated Williams 217-206 in the title match for his first PBA title in the concluding event of the inaugural PBA Fall Classic.

"This is unbelievable," said Davies, primarily a local league and tournament bowler who is a member of the Southern Nevada Bowling Association Hall of Fame. "It's the highlight of my career for sure. There's nothing like winning a PBA title especially when you can do it by beating one of the all-time greats."

Davies got off to an early lead in the title match by starting with the first three strikes and was able to hold off Williams for the rest of the match. Williams struck on the final ball of the 10th frame forcing Davies to mark. The lefthander left a six pin and then picked up the spare in the final frame to clinch the win.

"Let's face it, I'm the underdog so I was pretty calm for most of the match," said Davies who finished 22nd in the 1974 Showboat Invitational as an amateur. "When it came down to having to pick up that six pin for the win, I'll admit I got a little nervous."

In the semifinal match, Williams defeated Jeff Jamison of Boulder City, Nev., 248-234, and Davies beat Mike Kanada of Camarillo, Calif., 229-224, to advance to the title match.

The entire PBA Fall Classic, which also included the PBA Team Challenge, PBA Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open, South Point PBA West Challenge Regional and preliminary rounds of the Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship presented by Storm, was broadcast in its entirety by PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame. # EXCITING ENHANCEMENTS FOR USBC OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS IN 2017

New third division highlights improvements to broaden appeal and strengthen integrity

ARLINGTON — When the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships heads to Las Vegas in 2017, the storied event will have several enhancements, highlighted by a new divisional structure.

The new elements for the event come from recommendations of a task force comprised of tournament participants, volunteer leaders and staff. The task force used surveys of bowlers and historical data from the event to make recommendations to the USBC Board, which approved the new components.

The USBC Open Championships also will have adjustments made to policies concerning professional bowlers, scale-room procedures and announcement of lane conditions.

"We are proud of the process that led to creating the future of the USBC Open Championships," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Our customers have been asking for improvements to this event, so we assembled a diverse task force with significant bowler input and came together with a clear consensus on how to move forward."

The 2017 tournament will feature a new division called the Standard Division for bowlers with entering averages of 181-209. The Regular Division now will be for bowlers with averages of 210 and above, while the Classified Division remains for bowlers who have averages of 180 and below.

All three divisions will have team, doubles, singles and optional all-events, with combined entering averages being used for team and doubles placement.

"Research and feedback showed the task force that our largest demographic at the Open Championships wanted a better experience," Murphy said. "The 190- or 200-average league bowler wants to compete against others of similar skill. The current scoring gap between the top and bottom half of the Regular Division is not an ideal peer-to-peer competition."

The task force also recommended a series of adjustments to improve the integrity and fairness of the Open Championships. Starting in 2017, USBC will not publish the lane patterns until after the event. USBC also will discontinue providing information about lane-play strategies, including BowlTV live streaming of complete games and fixed live webcams at the event.

"The task force unanimously agreed that having access to the lane pattern provides an unquestionable advantage to bowlers with access to modern lane machines and centers closely matching the Open Championships lane surface," Murphy said. "Success in USBC Championships should be based on the skill of the bowler, not whether you live near the right facility or have the resources to build arsenals to match a pattern. This change moves the keys to success back to shot-making and skill, rather than personal resources."

Part of the more than 110 years of history and tradition at the Open Championships is a focus on equipment integrity, which includes weighing and checking every bowling ball used on the tournament lanes. In 2017, all equipment will be weighed and checked prior to both team and doubles/singles competition.

The task force also recommended making the Open Championships an event fully open to professional bowlers. In 2017, all professional bowlers will be able to compete, within parameters, and only in the Regular Division. The parameters include limits on the number of Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) and Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) national title holders who may compete on the same team.

The new rules, policies and procedures do not impact the 2016 tournament at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada.

In light of the task force recommendations, USBC will implement some additional policy changes as well.

Effective Jan. 1, 2016, USBC national headquarters employees and Championships tournament staff no longer will be eligible to receive prize money, bracket winnings or awards from USBC national events due to USBC's conflict-of-interest policy.

Starting in 2017, the USBC Women's Championships oil pattern also will not be published until after the event concludes. Visit BOWL.com/OpenChamp for more information on the USBC Open Championships.
