Construction of Osceola County Florida Bowling Facility Delayed

USBC begins search for replacement site to host 2011 Open Championships

ARLINGTON, TEXAS—The United States Bowling Congress has been informed that a proposed privately-funded bowling center which is intended to host 13 USBC national championship tournaments in Osceola County, Fla., has been delayed because of the current economic climate.

The unnamed developer has not been able to secure financing to build the 100-lane facility at this time.

It is expected that the facility will open sometime in 2012, which means the 2013 USBC Women's Championships would be the first USBC event held there.

Since the facility in Osceola County will not be open in time for the 2011 Open Championships, USBC will immediately begin a search to secure a site for 2011 that best suits the needs of the organization and the Open Championships, according to USBC Vice President of Tournaments and Events Jack Mordini.

In June, USBC, Osceola County, the Central Florida Sports Commission and Disney World officials announced an agreement that stipulated USBC would conduct seven Open Championships and six Women's Championship tournaments in the new facility beginning in 2011 and running through 2029.

Walt Disney World has made land available at its ESPN Wide World of Sports complex to accommodate the facility.

Open to USBC members, the Open and Women's Championships are two of the world's largest participatory sporting events, attracting more than 100,000 participants annually.

Team USA Adds 10 Players to 2009 Roster

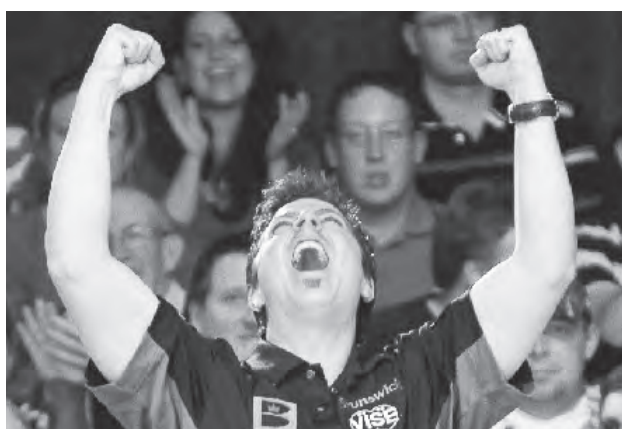
ARLINGTON, TX—A star-studded cast of the country's top bowlers have been selected to join Team USA in 2009, completing half of the team's final roster.

A selection committee of United States Bowling Congress and Professional Bowlers Association representatives picked Walter Ray Williams Jr.,

Tommy Jones, Chris Barnes, Rhino Page and Patrick Allen to join the men's team. On the women's side, Tonnelle Milligan, Lynda Barnes, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Kim Terrell-Kearney and Wendy Macpherson were selected.

"There was such a deep pool of talent to choose from that this was really not an easy decision," Team USA head coach Jeri Edwards said. "We are very fortunate that many great players put their names up for consideration, and we look forward to the players we selected having great success in 2009." continued on page 5

Brad Angelo Wins First Title at the Pepsi Viper Championship

HAMMOND, Ind.—More unforgettable memories were created last week as the historic 50th Anniversary season of the PBA Tour rolled on in Omaha, Neb. for the Pepsi Viper Championship at Thunder Alley Lanes. The PBA Women's Series sponsored by the United States Bowling Congress (USBC), debuted this week, returning for the second season, and two new PBA titlists were crowned at the culmination of the week.

The Pepsi Viper Championship is the first of five PBA lane pattern championship tournaments featured during the 2008-2009 season. With a modified round-robin match play format and the bonus pin factor of receiving 30 extra pins per win, the race to qualify for the ESPN telecast was as close as could be.

Going into the final position round game of match play, five bowlers were vying for the final two spots on the top four telecast. Fans, fellow exempt bowlers and even the tournament directors were scrambling to figure out which bowlers would be in and which would be out.

With Thunder Alley's split bowling center set-up, a majority of the top matches were on the low side of the center. However one crucial match was on the other side, where Wes Malott shot a huge 268 final game, finishing before the other top matches, thus awaiting his fate.

With the other bowlers in contention not knowing what had occurred on the other side, each match continued to come down to the 10th frame. In the end, it was Brad Angelo who squeezed out a victory over Jack Jurek 202-195 to remain third seed, while a pesty ring 10-pin caused Mika Koivuniemi to fall out of the TV show. Wes Malott jumped from seventh to fourth with his huge 268 game, beating out Jurek, Mike Machuga and Mika Koivuniemi for the final spot on Sunday's telecast.

The race for the top two spots for the PBA Women's Series was equally as tight. Michelle Feldman had top seed locked up. However, second seed and a berth to the televised finals was still up for grabs. Stefanie Nation, who bowled against Feldman in the final position round match, needed to beat Feldman and still shoot a big game to hold on to second. Nation did just that shooting a clutch 244 to Feldman's 221, beating out both Shannon Pluhowsky and Diandra Asbaty for the final spot in the TV finals.

When all was said and done after Sunday's live ESPN telecast, two new champions captured PBA titles. In the Women's Series championship match, collegiate standout Nation defeated ex-PWBA touring pro Michelle Feldman in an emotional victory. From the tears in Nation's eyes, you

It started with a fund-raiser and although it didn’t raise much money, it was a journey that was well-worth the travel. Because of the interest of the Blind, it was decided a few weeks later to start an all blind bowling league. With only a few members, it has grown to over 20 blind people.

What is exceptional about this blind bowling league is that they already have won a 2nd place National Championship for the blind bowling from all across the nation. In 2006-2007, the number one National Blind Bowler was our own Jason Eien, who by the way also took the doubles event, singles event, and overall events. We also had many others who scored so well it seemed that the American Blind Bowling Association was built for our California teams.

This coming year the blind once again will have select members going to our National Blind Bowling Tournament in Cincinnati, Ohio. To be able to send our blind bowlers to the Nationals Tournament, we will be hosting another 24 Hour Marathon.

Rob Hartley who has bowled 3 marathons in the past will be bowling non-stop, for 24 hours. (We will give him a restroom break or two) During this time Rob will bowl up against other bowlers to have the chance to beat Rob’s score. Your handicap will be included and we don’t give Rob any.

What will make this event more exciting, sometime during the 24 Hour Marathon, Rob will have knocked down his 100,000 pin. So far he has knocked down over 70,000 plus pins and averaged over 200 for all of his games played. (Over 350 games have

been played so far.)

This is a very worthy cause and it is making a tremendous difference in our Blind Bowlers, and at the same time putting our efforts to creating opportunities for the blind. On November 21, 2008, starting at 8:00 am in the morning until Saturday 8:00 am, the Marathon will roll.

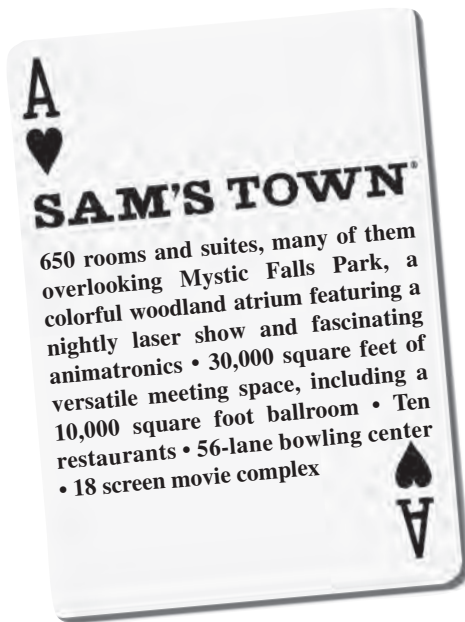

could see and feel how much the win meant to her.

Then in the men’s championship match, it was a battle between Chris Loschetter and Brad Angelo, both arguably the best PBA exempt bowlers who were yet to have a PBA title. In the end, Angelo got the monkey off his back, shooting a huge 256 to Loschetter’s 215 to claim the victory.

Angelo, in his seventh year out on the Lumber Liquidators PBA tour, definitely proved that seven is a lucky number. Prior to the start of the season, I spoke to Angelo at our Brunswick professional staff training camp in preparation for the upcoming PBA tour season. When I asked him about his thoughts on the upcoming PBA Tour, he said “This will be season lucky number seven, and I’m looking to win my first title but above all have a consistent season.” Angelo has already proved just that with an early win and plenty more tournaments yet to come.

“This is something I’ve always dreamed of my whole life. It’s why I continue to bowl, and now I finally have the monkey off my back,” said Angelo.

Angelo has been bowling since the young age of three.

“When I was young, I used to set up my plastic pin set next to the TV during the PBA telecasts,” said Angelo. I watched Norm, Pete, and Earl compete on TV and I would bowl against them every week. After they bowled a frame on TV, then I would bowl a frame using my plastic pin set. So I grew up bowling against these legends in my own home. Now it’s crazy because I’m good friends with these guys,” Angelo added.

All of the selected players were members of Team USA in 2008 and eight of the 10 saw action in international competition this year.

The five men were part of the Team USA contingent that won four gold medals at the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Men's Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

Barnes, Dorin-Ballard and Macpherson, meanwhile, were a part of the team that swept the gold medals at the recent Pan American Bowling Confederation Women's Championships in Santiago, Chile.

Only certain players were eligible to be selected to join Team USA 2009 through the process that was just completed. The men were required to be exempt players on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour, while the women must have been on Team USA at least once since 1998 and/or former Professional Women's Bowling Association/Ladies Professional Bowlers Tour members. The selections only represent half of the final roster of 2009 Team USA players. All USBC members will have a chance to join the team by competing in the 2009 USBC Team USA Trials, which are scheduled to be conducted Dec. 15-19, 2008 at Sunset Station Hotel and Casino's Strike Zone Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

The top three men and top three women finishers at the Team USA Trials will earn automatic spots on Team USA while the National Selection Committee will pick two additional men and two additional women to join the team.

Team USA will represent the United States in several international events throughout 2009, including the WTBA World Women's Championships, the Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships, the World Games and the QubicaAMF World Cup.

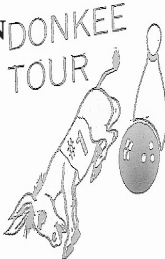

Alpert and Guerrero earned their places on the podium by honing their skills in local PBA Experience competition. Alpert won the adult male award by establishing a 232.60 average while Guerrero, a strong international competitor and exempt bowler on the 2008-09 PBA Women's Series, captured the adult female mark at 203.60.

To be eligible for the Sport Bowling national high average award, members must bowl a minimum of 48 games in a USBC-certified Sport Bowling league.

Alpert and Guerrero will receive the distinctive Sport Bowling Crystal Pin award, symbolic of their accomplishments. Jablonski and Galante will receive USBC Youth medals and certificates.

Sport Bowling membership hit an all-time high of 31,582 in 2007-08, up more than 13 percent from the 27,834 of 2006-07. Those members bowled in 892 leagues, up from 693 in 2006-07.

CALIFORNIA USBC UPDATES

by Phyl Knoll

The scheduled meetings of the California USBC Board of Directors held on September 27 and 28, 2008, at the Holiday Inn, Sacramento were called to order at 9:00 AM by President Al Hoffmann. All members but Gina Moura were present. President Hoffman appointed Nancy Arvanitis as “Recording Secretary”.

President Hoffmann introduced Mr. Adam Drinkwine, CEO, and an organization that arranges discounted lodging for groups attending a common event. This is a free service they provide for the State USBC Associations members and providing a great option for the members to save time and money for future tournaments. They are prepared with Pre-Negotiated discounted rates from ALL of the limited and full-service hotels and will provide a tournament website available to any bowler for making their own reservations. In addition, they are equipped to handle any needs for other concessions CAUSBC would like accommodated for each tournament or convention. They are currently involved with the Virginia State USBC in arranging all their discounted tournament lodging for the 2009 Women’s Annual Tournament. The board approved the motion to accept the services of “Future Conventions”. Working relationships with “Future Conventions” will commence with our 2009 Tournaments.

President Hoffmann welcomed new board members Phyllis Bourque, Vista, CA; Cheryl Huntington, Anaheim, CA and Tom Leigh, Van Nuys, CA.

The board reviewed in detail important issues pertaining to our various tournaments, approving the corrections and codifications submitted by the Tournament Committee.

The Youth Pepsi Tournament District Finals will be held March 14-15-21-22, 2009 and all eight locations are listed on our website. The Pepsi Tournament State Finals will be held at Classic Bowl in Daly City on May 2-3, 2009. There will no longer be a Pepsi Tournament National Finals event. However, from the Scratch Division in the State Finals, the two top boys and the two top girls will earn an entry to the National Junior Gold Finals in Indianapolis, July 11-17, 2009.

The Youth State Tournament held in Visalia Lanes, Visalia was held Oct 4-5 and \$3,360.50 in scholarship funds will be sent to SMART. Sierra Lanes, Fresno will host the 2009 Ancillary Youth Events from July 11 to August 16.

The finals to the 2008 Masters Tournament drew 123 participants at Forest Lanes, September 5-7. Champion Jason Heggemeier will be entitled to a spot in the 2009 USBC Masters and the 2009 and 2010 CAUSBC Masters Finals.

Forty-seven entrants to the Queens Tournament held at West Lane Bowl, Stockton, August 16-17, bowled for a Prize Fund of \$4,190. Champion Tennelle Milligan earned a berth in the 2009 CAUSBC Queens Tournament as well as a paid entry into the 2009 USBC Queens Tournament.

Our Senior Women’s Tournament was held this past August at Rancho Bowl in Santa Maria with a Prize Fund of over \$20,000. The 2009 tournament will be hosted by Double Decker Lanes in Rohnert Park.

The Prince/Princess Tournament held at Tyme to Bowl Lanes in Oroville received 247 entries and offered a prize fund of over \$4,500.

The BVL Committee reported that total donations received from our associations for 2008 were \$124,464.30. VA Centers and Outreach Centers will be notified of their allotments from this amount near the end of this year. The board approved the motion from the committee to hold the 2009 BVL competition at Regency Lanes, Bakersfield, April 4, 2009. All (Mid-State) associations are encouraged to submit, as early as NOW, their bid for this event for 2010.

The board approved the motion by the Legislation Committee to accept their proposed amendment to our CAUSBC By-Laws, Art.X; Sec.A; Procedure, which will now read: “Submitted by September 1, of the calendar year prior to the meeting when the association is considering the proposal.”. The intent was for new members on the local association boards to have the opportunity to submit all proposals.

The Budget and Finance Committee reported that in spite of the current financial climate, all our bank accounts are secure and the committee will be prepared with an updated financial report for the June.2009 convention.

The Star of Tomorrow Committee presented their changes to the Scholarship Application, which will include space for the applicant to identify their leagues as “Standard Leagues” or Certified Sport Leagues” and their averages accordingly. The committee Scoring Sheet will be changed to comply with these changes. As of this writing, every association should have received by email a copy of this new application along with a cover letter inviting them to nominate an eligible candidate. In addition, applications were sent to runner-up candidates of the past two years, and coaches and organizations who work with the youth programs. Applications can be downloaded from our website. Deadline date remains JANUARY 15, 2009.

Hall of Fame Committee is also communicating with all the associations urging them to submit their nominee for the Meritorious or Superior Performance category. Runner-up candidates from the past may submit updated information. The application for this award is also on our website and their deadline is set for JANUARY 15, 2009.

The Product Fair committee is already at work communicating with vendors for our 2009 Convention at the Riverside Marriott, June 13-14. The board approved the committee’s motion for a new price structure on the table rentals: One (1) Table, \$75; each additional table, \$50, with no limit on the number. Table reservation deadline is May 4, 2009. Anyone interested or has knowledge of an interested vendor is encouraged to telephone Diddy Watts, Chairman at 818-899-5125 or email to diddyshops@yahoo.com.

The two topics for the 2009 Convention Workshops currently under review by the Convention Committee are Lane Certification and Youth Committees, however, the committee is anxious to hear from your association. Please send your suggestions by email to Larry Peppers, Association Manager, larry@calusbc.com.

The Youth Committee reported the need for two proprietors to fill the two vacancies as a CYC Member and urged everyone to solicit their local proprietor to participate. Their input is crucial. The board approved the committee’s motion to reinstate scholarship funds to a youngster that had relocated to Florida. Funds will be sent to SMART for distribution.

Credential Report letters to be mailed to all local Association Managers after the first of the year should be reviewed closely so as to meet the deadline date for reporting.

The board approved the motion that we employ Larry Peppers as a full time employee, to become effective immediately.

On a personal note: Phyl Knoll offered her sincere appreciation to all who telephoned and mailed expressions of concerns while she was in Radiation Treatment. She’s doing well. Nancy Arvanitis noted she would be having hip replacement surgery in early November but would be available via email n.arvanitis@cox.net.

President Hoffmann called the next board meeting for January 23-25, 2009 at the Marriott Riverside; adjourning the meeting at 3:59 pm.
