Rhino Page Wins 2017 U.S. Open

LIVERPOOL, NY -Rhino Page captured his first career major championship after defeating top seed Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Arizona, in the title match of the 2017 U.S. Open, 256-222.

Page struck on eight of his first nine deliveries during the championship round Wednesday at Flamingo Bowl, winning his sixth career PBA Tour title, the coveted green jacket and \$30,000 top prize. The stepladder finals of the 2017 U.S. Open were broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

"I don't know if I can put it into words." said Page. a 34-year-old left-hander. "As I looked down as I was holding the trophy, I almost started to cry. It means everything to me and makes

me want to work even harder to win more."

and Butturff Page matched each other shot for shot for the first five frames of the title match, but Butturff was unable to strike in the sixth and seventh frames, leaving and converting a pair of single pins.

Butturff, a 23-year-old left-hander, opened in the eighth frame after leaving the 4-6-10 split as Page continued to strike through the ninth frame. Page sealed the victory with an eight count on his first shot of the 10th frame.

A ball change in his semifinal win against 2013 U.S. Open champion Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, gave Page the look he needed heading into the title match against Butturff, who averaged more than

223 throughout the week at Flamingo Bowl. Page defeated Malott, 226-155.

"I was going back and forth with two balls that were counter opposites," Page said. "One was a little faster off the friction, and the other was a little slower. It became evident in the

fifth frame that maybe the ball I was using was just a little too slow, and I knew I had to find a way to strike with Jakob coming up. I was really happy with my ball reaction when I made the change, and that alone let me know I had everything in place. If something happened with ball motion, I knew where to go next, and that made me extremely confident."

Butturff led the field after 56 games by 617 pins, including bonus pins, and he found a similar fate as several others who have held sizable leads heading into the title match. He earned \$15,000 for the runner-up finish.

United States Bowling Congress and PBA Hall of Famer Earl Anthony led the 1979 and 1980 U.S. Open by 578 and 551 pins, respectively, only to finish as the runner-up, while twotime U.S. Open champion Walter Ray Williams Jr. led the 1993 event by 537 pins before falling in the title match.

"This was by far one of the best journeys I've had

in my career," said Butturff, a Team USA member who now will head to Hermosillo, Mexico, to represent the United States at the QubicaAMF World Cup.

"Second place at the end of the day is always the roughest, especially when you are leading a tournament by two games. At the same time, I put my foot down and I struck as much as I could this week. I bowled an OK game on TV, and Rhino just bowled a better game."

Malott earned his spot in the semifinal after picking up a 2-10 split in the 10th frame to lock up his match against Canada's Graham Fach, 186-179.

In Wednesday's opening match, Fach rolled seven consecutive strikes on continued on page 8

He rolled his perfecto at now-defunct Valley Bowl in El Cajon, a city in San Diego County. Brian says he figures that was his


second or third 300 of approximately seven that he's rolled in his career.

The Perfect Coach: Part 4

by Steve Felege

Bowling appears to be a simple game, but if it is, why is success so hard to achieve? Because it relies on a complex human machine which is poorly designed for this sport, both physically and mentally. There is nothing natural about swinging a heavy ball from one side of a torso and rolling it, with precision, to a pocket 60 feet away.

If you remember your first attempts at this sport, they were probably awkward. Practice made you better, but only to the extent natural talent allowed. The fact is, physical training only creates the "muscle memory" necessary for your improvement. But such practice without proper direction can do as much harm as good.

Consider the phrase, "Practice makes perfect." That doesn't necessarily apply to bowling since "Practice makes permanent." In other words, while practicing solidifies the things you do well, it makes the flaws in your delivery permanent as well.

What are those flaws? If you remember that your ball travels a line to the pins, then flaws can be defined as any part of your technique that takes your ball off that line. Flaws create inconsistencies that desperately deserve disposal from your delivery.* Eliminating them is critical to enabling you to hit the second arrow, or any target, over and over again as we discussed in last week's, Perfect Game article. That, in turn, is the key to higher scores. Let's get started.

Your delivery can be broken down into five basic skills: the stance, push-away, arm-swing, and release coordinated with a short walk.** Executed properly, these create the accuracy necessary to attain any level of bowling prowess you desire. How? By putting your ball on that all-important target-line and keeping it there!

This week we'll describe how to position yourself into an effective STANCE. This skill is important because it aims both you and your ball. Executed properly, it puts the ball directly over the target-line, sets up a consistent delivery and ensures an effortless transition to the next skill. A flawed stance does almost none of this. The following are the elements which compose a most effective stance:

- Begin by picking up your ball and moving to the exact spot on the approach established by last week's lesson.***
- Stand upright and relaxed. Face the arrow you have chosen to target.
- Insert your fingers into the ball, then the thumb.
- Take a deep breath, relax, and focus on the following.
- > Keeping your feet close together, shift most of your weight to one foot; use the other foot for balance.
- > Dip the ball-swinging shoulder straight down to a comfortable level (do not force it down).
- > Anchor your elbow to your side.****
- > Aim your forearm directly at the second arrow (or whichever target you have chosen).
- > Rotate the ball to position your delivery-hand underneath it, but support its weight with both hands. You are now ready to begin your approach.

Well, there you have it. These are the elements of an effective stance. Notice how many of them position the ball in the right place; directly over the target-line. Now get in front of a full length mirror and coach yourself into this posture (you don't even need to have a ball or be at a bowling center). It will take a while to get comfortable with it, but your efforts to make these changes will be rewarded. Join us next week when we will discuss the most ignored skill in bowling: the push-away



Boston Red Sox Star Mookie Betts to Return to PBA's World Series of Bowling

Rising star in baseball world hopes to "do a little better" in second WSOB appearance

RENO, Nev. – Boston Red Sox star Mookie Betts began thinking about competing in the World Series very early in the year, but as much as he wanted to return to bowling's version of the classic event in Reno, he would have preferred playing in the Major League Baseball fall classic.

When the Houston Astros ended Boston's bid for another World Series title, winning their American League Division Series, 3-1, the 25-year-old Betts was free to begin full-scale preparations for his alternative plan, competing in the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Properties, Nov. 7-19 at Reno's National Bowling Stadium. WSOB IX kicks off the 2017-18 Go Bowling! PBA Tour.

"I hope I can do a little better than I did last time," Betts said Tuesday. "I think I understand the mental side of what I need to do a little more, but it's not like I have it down pat. But I can use my experience from last time. We'll see.'

Betts, who made his debut in Professional Bowlers Association competition during the 2015 WSOB VII in Reno, has been eagerly awaiting the chance to try it again.

"Bowling has been a part of my life forever, so it isn't going away," he said. "I like to compete, but I also know I need to get better.

Since the baseball season ended, Betts said he's been practicing regularly, in part to get his right hand toughened up a bit for the daily grind of two five-game qualifying blocks. His goal is to finish among the top 150 against the field of 195 on any given day. In his WSOB debut in 2015, Betts averaged 190 for his 36 qualifying games – nine each on four different animal patterns.

His life as a professional athlete has evolved during the past two years. In 2016, when he played a starring role in helping the Red Sox to the American League playoffs, Betts hit for a .318 average with 31 home runs and 113 RBIs., winding up runner-up in the American League MPV voting. He was named MLB's Defensive Player of the Year, won Silver Slugger and Gold Glove honors, and earned the first of two straight berths in the MLB All-Star Game.

His star continued to rise 2017, when he again played a pivotal role in helping the Red Sox win the American League East Division title and earned another trip to the All-Star game. On Nov. 7 he'll find out if he will win back-to-back Gold Gloves for his stellar play in right field.

As brilliantly as he has played in the Major League Baseball arena, Betts remains grounded to his bowling roots, started by his mother (Diana Benedict) in his Nashville, Tenn., hometown. And he has proven to be a sponge in soaking up knowledge in whatever sport he plays.

Is there any relationship between bowling and baseball? "I think the short bursts of focus are a key," Betts said. "I've played baseball in front of thousands of people, so I've learned

to get over those little moments pretty quickly. It's the same in bowling. If things aren't going well, you get your focus back and get back on track.

Betts will join a sold-out field of world-class bowlers from 27 different countries for five-game qualifying rounds at 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Pacific time) in the PBA Chameleon Championship presented by Reno Tahoe on Wednesday, Nov. 8; the PBA Shark Championship presented by Xtra Frame on Thursday, Nov. 9; the PBA Cheetah Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge Mobile Game on Saturday, Nov. 11 and the Pepsi PBA Scorpion Championship presented by GoBowling.com on Sunday, Nov. 12.

If Betts finishes among the top 25 percent of the field after 40 combined games on the four animal patterns, he'll advance to PBA World Championship cashers round on Nov. 13 and 14. If he finishes among the top 16 in any of the four individual animal pattern events, he'll advance to single-elimination match competition on Nov. 15 and 16.

All of the preliminary rounds will be live streamed on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling channel. For subscription information, visit xtraframe.tv. WSOB IX concludes Nov. 17-19 with finals live streamed on ESPN3 (and also recorded for Sunday telecasts on ESPN beginning Dec. 10).

his way to a 259-222 win against USBC and PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Florida. Duke was in search of his 39th national title and third U.S. Open title, winning the green jacket in 2008 and 2011.

All competitors at the 2017 U.S. Open bowled 24 games of qualifying over three days to determine the 36 players advancing to the cashers' round. After eight additional games, the field was cut to the top 24 players for round-robin match play.

The five finalists for the stepladder finals were determined by total pinfall, including bonus pins, for 56 games.

The U.S. Open was the fourth of five major championships on the 2017 PBA Tour schedule and is conducted jointly by the USBC and Bowling Proprietors' Association of America. Network; the Billiard and Bowling Institute of America; and the International Training and Research

Brian, an Alpine resident, bowls in a league at that 40lane facility and he got a huge shock when he listened from a distance to an ongoing awards presentation that was designed to create drama and surprise – with the name of the 300 bowler being named at the end.

First, Valley Bowl was announced as the site of the perfecto. "Hey, I remember that place," Brian thought.

Then the league (Steve Balga Singles League) was announced. That triggered another response from Brian. "I said to the guy next to me, 'I bowled in that league.' Even at that point, I never suspected it was for me," Brian said.

After being presented the ring, Brian searched his memory. "I wasn't even aware that I had any outstanding awards," said Brian, adding that he was "amused" by the ceremony. "This wasn't my first ring and hasn't been my last," he said.

Trying to explain what happened to the ring, Graves conceded that it was just misplaced. The office has relocated many times and a batch of commemorative rings somehow got lost in the shuffle. Brian's ring was one of many that had gotten misplaced. Graves says she has contacted other bowlers whose rings were discovered. Some of those rings, Graves added, were even older than Brian's.

"It wasn't a deliberate act. It was accidental," said Graves about the ring mix-up. "Very embarrassing."

For his part, Brian made light of the delay when he announced on Facebook that he finally got a ring that he wasn't expecting:

"Thursday night, I was presented with my 300 ring for a game I bowled at Valley Bowl on April 8, 1996. It only took 21 years, but I finally got it."

EJ Tackett to defend World Championship title: In 2016, EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., made history by winning the PBA World Championship at the National Bowling stadium for his first major title, defeating 2010 World Championship winner Tom Smallwood in the title match, 246-180. The victory helped seal PBA Player of the Year honors for Tackett.

Other PBA Major winners in 2017: EJ Tackett will be trying for his second major title of 2017 after winning the FireLake PBA Tournament of Champions in February. Three-time PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte of Australia will be trying for his third major of the season after wins in the Barbasol PBA Players Championship and USBC Masters. Rhino Page of Orlando, Fla. will be trying for his second career major title after winning the recent U.S. Open.

Boston Red Sox star Mookie Betts to compete in second World Series of Bowling: Boston Red Sox outfielder Mookie Betts, one of the rising stars in major league baseball, will compete in the PBA World Series of Bowling for the second time in 2017. Betts, 25, is an accomplished bowler who made it known he wanted to participate in the annual CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitational, a fund-raising event for NBA basketball star Chris Paul's charitable foundation, which led to him being invited to bowl in PBA's WSOB VII in Reno in 2015. In his debut in professional bowling, Betts averaged a respectable 190 for 60 games on four different PBA animal patterns. An injury prevented him from bowling in 2016, but he is returning this year with hopes of improving upon his previous performance.

World Series to play deciding role in Player, Rookie of the Year races – With five PBA Tour titles up for grabs, the WSOB is again expected to play a significant role in influencing the 2017 PBA Player of the Year as well as Rookie of the Year races.

With three wins each heading into the World Series, three-time PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte and defending PBA Player of the Year EJ Tackett are considered early favorites for Player of the Year honors heading into WSOB IX. The wide-open Rookie of the Year race features one of the strongest field of contenders in PBA history.

PBA Hall of Famers entered: While young players are making their mark this season on the PBA Tour, several of PBA's all-time greats will make their presence known. The field includes five 50-and-older PBA Hall of Famers – Parker Bohn III, Norm Duke, Amleto Monacelli, Pete Weber, Walter Ray Williams Jr. and newly-elected Chris Barnes.

Past World Championship winners entered: EJ Tackett (2016), Gary Faulkner Jr. (2015), Dom Barrett (Dec. 2013), Parker Bohn III (Jan. 2013), Osku Palermaa (2012), Chris Barnes (2011), Tom Smallwood (2009), Walter Ray Williams Jr. (2001, '03, '06), Pete Weber (1989, '98), and Patrick Allen (2005) are all past winners of the PBA World Championship.

PBA Challenge Finals highlight other aspects of PBA competition: The PBA50 Tour's top eight players based on 2017 competition points and seven points champions from the PBA's domestic Regional program will compete in head-to-head round robin match play qualifying leading to top-player championships matches in the annual PBA Challenge events to kick off the World Series. Xtra Frame will provide exclusive live coverage of the match play rounds and finals at the National Bowling Stadium on Tuesday, Nov. 7.

PBA Tour events include diverse lane conditions – Four of the World Series events – the Chameleon Championship presented by Reno Tahoe, Shark Championship presented by Xtra Frame, Cheetah Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge Mobile Game and Pepsi PBA Scorpion Championship presented by GoBowling.com – are named after specific PBA lane conditioning patterns. Each different lane condition requires players to be on top of their games in making the right lane and equipment adjustments to be successful. The ability to consistently perform at a high level on all four lane conditioning challenges will ultimately determine the finalists who will compete for the PBA World Championship.

Each lane condition used during the World Series will be highly visible to spectators and ESPN viewers because blue dye is added to the lane conditioner for the telecasts, giving fans a unique visual reference of what players must navigate when competing in the finals. Fans will be able to watch how the blue oil moves around under the traffic of bowling balls rolled during the competition.

Reno's role in professional bowling history – Reno has hosted many topflight bowling competitions since 1977 when the Reno-Sparks Convention Center hosted the American Bowling Congress Championships Tournament for the first time. Since then, Reno has hosted many PBA and United States Bowling Congress events which have been some of the biggest bowling events in history. The National Bowling Stadium is marking its 22nd year of hosting topflight competition after opening its doors in 1995.

Follow the action on pha.com's live scoring – PBA fans will have a number of options for following WSOB IX action as it happens (Xtra Frame, reports on PBA's Facebook page, social media updates by numerous PBA players on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram), and game by game scoring also will be available on pba.com's live scoring feature. A partnership with Lane Talk will provide PBA's ESPN, Xtra Frame and media relations staff with a variety of insightful statistical data to give fans an even more indepth look at the competition and the competitors.

Other special events: A showcase of youth bowling talent will be on display when the Teen Masters WSOB Open conducts doubles and singles events at the National Bowling Stadium Nov. 17-19.

PREMIER PBA "ROOKIE OF THE YEAR" CANDIDATES TO COMPETE IN GEICO PBA WSOB IX

The next generation of PBA stars will be in the spotlight at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno beginning Nov. 7 when one of the strongest PBA Rookie of the Year classes ever will test their skills in the annual multi-event GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Properties.

WSOB IX, kicking off the 2017-18 Go Bowling! PBA Tour series, will be the final opportunity for the 2017 ROY contenders to make a statement while it also will be the first step toward 2018 Rookie of the Year consideration for a few others who will be bowling in PBA competition as members for the first time.

The World Series will award titles in four animal pattern stages (Chameleon 39, Shark 45, Cheetah 33 and Scorpion 42) as well as the PBA World Championship. Players who are leading the charge toward 2017 Rookie of the Year honors include **Andrew Anderson**, Holly, Mich.; **Cristian Azcona**, a Puerto Rico native now living in Lake Wales, Fla.; **AJ Chapman**, Manchester, Iowa; **Nick Kruml**, Downers Grove, Ill.; **Matt Sanders**, Evansville, Ind.; **Kyle Sherman**, O'Fallon, Mo.; **Zach Wilkins**, Barrie, Ontario, Canada, and **Zulmazran Zulkifli**, Malaysia.

Among the 2017 candidates, Sanders is the only one to win a PBA Tour title thus far, winning the Xtra Frame Billy Hardwick Memorial in Memphis, Tenn., in late June.

Making their debuts in Reno as PBA members will be two rising stars familiar to all fans of youth bowling, **Kamron Doyle**, who grew up in suburban Nashville, and **Michael Tang** of San Francisco. Because the World Series is considered as one event under Rookie of the Year eligibility rules, Doyle and Tang will be trying to get a head start on the 2018 Rookie of the Year race.

Doyle, now 19 and living in Warrensburg, Mo., began attracting attention at age 11 when he became the then-youngest bowler to record an 800 series. At age 12 in 2010, he became the youngest to cash in a PBA Regional (for scholarship money), and in 2012 at age 14, he became the youngest to cash in a PBA Tour event when he finished 61st in the U.S. Open as an eighth-grader. After four terms on Junior Team USA, two on adult Team USA (including winning the men's 2015 Team USA Trials), and an abbreviated collegiate career, Doyle has decided to pursue his PBA dreams.

Also vying for 2018 Rookie of the Year honors will be Michael Tang, Doyle's two-time Junior Team USA teammate and a former San Jose State collegiate star, who will join older brother Darren as a PBA member in Reno. The Tang brothers got their first national exposure as finalists in the USBC Masters where Michael won three matches (including a 248-212 decision over his older brother) before losing to Australia's **Jason Belmonte** in the title match, 279-212. Combine the talented rookies coming in 2018 with the star-studded rookie field in 2017 with 20-something stars who have already made names for themselves (i.e., reigning PBA Player of the Year **EJ Tackett**, 2016 Rookie of the Year **François Lavoie, Anthony Simonsen, Marshall Kent** and Sweden's **Jesper Svens-Son**), and you'll see why PBA fans are awaiting a fascinating WSOB IX, and an exciting Go Bowling! PBA Tour season in the new year.

In Sunday's title match, Halverson, from Bonney Lake, Wash., and Mohr defeated non-member **Russ Oviatt** of Tempe, Ariz. and **Jim Pratt** of Avondale, Ariz., 428-411, to claim the \$4,000 first prize. In the process, the 61-year-old Mohr earned his first "standard" PBA Regional title to accompany the 17 PBA50 titles he's won in regional competition.

Halverson and Mohr advanced to the title match by eliminating **Craig Spencer** of Tempe and **Greg Thompson Jr.** of San Jose, Calif., 523-401, while Oviatt and Pratt ousted **Steve Smith** of San Diego and **Frank Barefoot Jr.** of Las Vegas. 401-370, in the other semifinal match.
