PROFESSIONAL BOWLERS ASSOCIATION TO GO “BOWLING ACROSS AMERICA” WITH 2024 PBA ON FOX SCHEDULE

Return of the PBA Playoffs, PBA Elite League season expansion, and the first-ever All-Star Weekend highlight the 2024 PBA on FOX schedule

RICHMOND, VA — The Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) and FOX Sports are pleased to announce the schedule for the highly anticipated 2024 PBA on FOX season, which features over 60 hours of televised competition and a single-season record of eight FOX broadcasts.

In 2024, the PBA Tour will bowl across America to celebrate one of America’s favorite pastimes and highlight the vibrant bowling communities at each stop. More than 10 states, primarily in the Midwest and ranging nearly coast-to-coast from Nevada to Maine, will host PBA Tour events next season.

Furthermore, the PBA will work alongside Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL), the official charity of the PBA, to honor military veterans nationwide.

On the lanes, five major championships and the 15th PBA World Series of Bowling (WSOB) highlight the regular-season schedule, as more than \$4 million in total prize money will be awarded in 2024, the PBA’s 66th consecutive season. All roads lead to the PBA Playoffs, where the top 16 players in competition points following April’s PBA Tournament of Champions will advance into the televised head-to-head postseason tournament.

The PBA will also be expanding the PBA League season — now the PBA Elite League — bringing a new and innovative season-long team structure to professional bowling. The PBA Elite League season expansion aims to further engage bowling fans by introducing League events during the Tour season, which will count as seeding for the PBA Elite League Elias Cup Playoffs.

This original approach sets the stage to build rivalries and allow teams to establish their standing, determining their seeding for the postseason at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.

“We are thrilled to announce the expansion of the PBA Elite League season and the introduction of our League Playoff structure,” said Tom Clark, commissioner of the PBA. “By incorporating League events during the Tour season, we are intensifying the competition and introducing a new level of fan involvement to grow interest in the sport.”

The season begins in January with the PBA Players Championship at Bowlero Northrock in Wichita,

Kan., followed by the U.S. Open and four PBA Classic tournaments, with televised stepladder finals, in February.

In March, PBA will celebrate its first-ever All-Star Weekend, bringing PBA stars together with legends, rookies and celebrities in a series of exhibitions during the midseason festivities.

The second half of the 2024 calendar includes three major championships — the USBC Masters, PBA World Championship, and Tournament of Champions — leading up to the PBA Playoffs.

In addition to the PBA on FOX schedule below, the remainder of the PBA Tour schedule will be released at a later date. Entries for 2024 PBA Tour events will open Nov. 20, 2023.

TOBY LEE and TONY RODRIGUEZ Place High at PBA 50 Casino Morongo Challenge

CABAZON, CA. – Two of our local bowlers Toby Lee and Tony Rodriguez placed high at the PBA 50 Casino Morongo Challenge. Toby finished 11th and Tony 12th at the Challenge. After seven games of qualifying on Saturday the field of 48 was cut to the top 12 bowlers. These finalists met for 12 games of Match Play on Sunday.

After twelve games of Match Play on Sunday Toby Lee finished in eleventh place averaging 198 for the nineteen tournament games. Toby won three matches including a win over tournament leader, at the time, Bryan Alpert. One of Toby's losses was by just a few pins to Multiple PBA National Champion Michael Haugen Jr.

After Saturday's qualifying Toby and Tony were in 3rd and 4th place respectively averaging close to 215 per game. Mike Hartter of Henderson, Nevada was the tournament leader, at that time, averaging close to 230.

Sunday's match play conditions were brutal with scores plummeting for most bowlers. While Mike Hartter fell from first place after five games of Match Play, Bryan Alpert caught fire and took the tournament lead. Alpert surged to a 200 pin lead after eight games of Match Play only to lose the title to Hartter on the position round Match Game, the twelfth game of Match Play and final game of the tournament.

Tony Rodriguez finished in twelfth place after averaging 197 for the nineteen tournament games. Tony is a regular on the PBA 50 Tour and has three Regional Titles to his credit. A few years ago he finished in fifth place at the PBA SENIOR MASTERS Tournament competed at Sam's Town in Las Vegas. Locally, the Riverside/San Bernardino area of California has many great bowlers. It's an area where Michael Haugen Jr. and Walter Ray Williams Jr. bowled in our local leagues before turning professional. It's an area where Toby Lee & Tony Rodriguez are now local bowling stars. We are proud of their bowling accomplishments & are happy to report on their successes.

Professional Bowlers To Go Bowling Across America?

A recent news release from the PBA left me a bit confused. The title says that the PBA is to go bowling across America, but I wonder if they're covering up the fact that the schedule is almost exclusively confined to an area in the midwest encompassing only six states.

Sure, there's an event at Mid County Lanes in Middletown, Del., that's not far from the previous host of multiple U.S. Open tournaments, Bowlero North Brunswick (previously Carolier Lanes) in New Jersey. Mid County has 32 lanes, while the mammoth Bowlero North Brunswick has 82 drives. Prior to the run by Bowlero North Brunswick, Edison Lanes, also in New Jersey (which was the world's largest bowling center in 1959 with 112 lanes), was host to a few PBA events.

I recently discovered an article from the New York Times, dated August 11th, 1959, showing that Edison Lanes was actually a 66 lane bowling center that opened in 1956, but prior to the 1959-60 bowling season, owners Tom and Jim Swales decided to add another 46 lanes. The article, written by Gordon S. White, states: "Edison Lanes is big enough to hold two football gridirons, house a fifteen-car freight train, easily contain the longest home run ever hit and make a great number of bowlers happy at one time."

Edison Lanes closed in 1986, at the end of a 30-year lease. I remember living in New York at the time and working for AMF. I took a day off just to come and see the place before it closed. It was, in a word, HUGE. The lanes were all in a straight line, with a restaurant and multiple snack bars, lounges, and a billiard room. The same building exists today, about a mile from where I currently live, but is now home to the Wick Shopping Mall. The article by Mr. White goes on to say, "The place is so big that the mechanics handling the machines out of view of the bowlers will travel from the number 1 alley to number 112, or any one in between, by electric trolley car."

There's also an event at the Suncoast Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas, arguably the bowling capital of the world today, with at least 8 locations containing 50 or more lanes. Suncoast has 64 lanes, while one of the previous hosts for PBA events in Las Vegas, South Point Casino, has a total of 124 lanes, in two different locations under the same roof. Red Rock Lanes, with 72 lanes, is the other location that has recently conducted PBA events. Before South Point and Red Rock, the Showboat became one of the most famous bowling locations in the world with 106 lanes in an "L" shape. The Showboat, which later became known as The Castaways, closed in 2006. The Showboat hosted a PBA event every year from 1960 to 1998.

The last exception to the midwest dominance of PBA stops is Portland, Maine, at the now famous Bayside Bowl. The center, with its raucous fans, will be playing host to the PBA Elite League finals once again, from September 15-17, 2024.

Familiarity Breeds Complacency

I wonder if the old schedule of tournaments on the PBA Winter Tour needed a redesign? It's only natural that a certain amount of familiarity does breed a kind of complacency. But the flip side to that argument would be, is that bad?

In 1975, I can remember the tour stops being so familiar that most of the players had the schedule memorized, and that made hotel and other arrangements predictable, and easy to organize. The first stop was usually in Arcadia, Calif., followed by Alameda, Calif., and then on to the Showboat in Las Vegas, followed by the Denver Open at Colorado Bowl. Next up was the U.S. Open in Grand Prairie, Texas., followed by the King Louie Open in Overland Park, Kansas, and then the Buckeye Open in North Olmsted, Ohio.

At this point the stops were not always consistent but would usually make a jump to the east coast for the Fair Lanes Open in Towson, Md., followed by Garden City, N.Y., and then on to Bradley Bowl in Windsor Locks, Connecticut. The events would then make a swing through the south, beginning at Don Carter's Tamarac Lanes in Florida, followed by the New Orleans event.

Once again, the stops were not always consistent, but would then usually return to the midwest for an event at Dick Weber Lanes in Florissant, Mo., fol-

lowed by Milwaukee, Wis., Toledo, Ohio, and finally the Firestone Tournament of Champions in Akron, Ohio. That's 16 tournaments, covering just about every part of the country. And although the pros complained about the excruciating travel, you can see that a lot of thought went into organizing the events for the "motor home" members.

Back to 2024

Aside from the three events in 2024 that were already mentioned, the remainder of the scheduled tournaments are in an area so condensed that the PBA Tour members should have no complaints. The events begin in Wichita, Ks., followed by Indianapolis, Mt. Prospect, Ill., Springfield, Mo., and Anderson, Indiana.

Following the events at Middletown, Delaware (March 3rd), and the Suncoast Hotel & Casino on March 31st, the players then return to the midwest for the World Series of Bowling (seven events in one location) at Allen Park, Mich., and then the Tournament of Champions in Fairlawn, Ohio. The final stop is the aforementioned PBA Elite League finals at Bayside Bowl.

There's still a couple of events that have not been finalized — the PBA All-Star Weekend (March 15th - March 17th), and the PBA Playoffs (May 4th - May 19th). It's anybody's guess where these events might be held, but may we suggest California, or Arizona, or Texas?

WE GET EMAILS: The Bowling Museum has asked for help in finding the origins of a bowling lane that was constructed in a Scotland castle, circa 1904. Those in charge of the renovation would like to repair the existing lane, rather than replacement or a synthetic overlay. If anyone has any information regarding bowling lanes that were constructed in 1903 or 1904, please let us know and we will forward the information to the Bowling Museum.

PBA50 CASINO MORONGO CHALLENGE

Hopefully, the bowlers were both lucky on the lanes and at the slots at the Casino Morongo Challenge in California. Michael Hartter began with the lead at +207 for seven games. Bryan Alpert stormed into the lead midway through the day, but allowed Hartter and Michael Haugen Jr. to remain in the fray. The three were separated by just 33 pins with the position round remaining.

All three players started strong, but all misstepped as Hartter missed a 7-pin in the eighth frame, Haugen missed a 10-pin in the ninth, and Alpert split in the 10th. When all was said and done, Hartter took the win by nine pins, shooting a 267 in his final match to take home his first PBA title.
