Justin Pluchino Blisters His First 800 Series

WINNETKA – It didn't take long before Justin Pluchino got acclimated to the adult bowling leagues.

Two months after he graduated from the youth leagues, the 20-year-old Pluchino crushed his first 800 series. Pluchino, a Professional Bowlers Assn. Tour aspirant, rifled scores of 267, 263 and 279 to finish with an 809 during competition in the Men's Classic Handicap League at Winnetka Bowl.

"I was really stroked about it," Pluchino said. "I've been waiting for it for a long time."

Pluchino, who will celebrate his 21st birthday on Veterans Day, was a dominant performer during his years in the youth leagues.

In July, Pluchino won

masterful performance in the United States Bowling Congress Youth Championships at Forest Lanes in the Orange County city of Lake Forest.

The right-handed Pluchino claimed titles in both the singles and Masters divisions. He added second-place finishes in doubles (with Julia Frias) and in the all-events category.

In earning his singles title, Justin crushed a 756 series (235, 254, 267) to finish 25 pins ahead of Matthew Chestnut.

Pluchino, who has rolled a perfect game and a 900 no-tap series, had a series high of 796 before he blasted his 809.

He was averaging a robust 239 before recording his 800 series. Pluchino bowls anchor for his Classic Handicap League fiveman team, called "The Gamers."

There are no weak spots on "The Gamers." Pluchino's teammates are Billy Mulvihill, who averages 203, Ray Kwong (186), Wayne McClean (211) and Drew Stern (207).Pluchino is fitting in well.

'Merica Rooster Illusion Wins PBA Team Challenge Title

No. 4 qualifier sweeps through stepladder finals for "special" victory

LAS VEGAS – After scratching its way into the championship round, the team calling itself 'Merica Rooster Illusion threw nine strikes on 10 attempts to win the Professional Bowlers Association Team Challenge at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

The team, named after a reference found in the movie "Tropical Thunder," knocked off The BFFs, the top qualifying team composed of veteran international players Dom Barrett and Stuart Williams of England, Martin Larsen and Jesper Svensson of Sweden, and Finland's Osku

Palermaa, 498-452, in the two-game, total pinfall final game. 'Merica locked it up with its strike barrage in a 264-232 clinching game.

"We're a team of journeymen and young guys, all of whom can throw strikes when you need them," team captain Ronnie Russell said.

Russell, who won his fourth career PBA Tour title along with a share of a \$30,000 first prize, was joined by former PBA Rookies of the Year Marshall Kent (2014), E.J. Tackett (2013) Rhino Page (2008) and veteran Chris Loschetter, who bowled af-

ter being cleared by doctors in his battle with cancer.

"It really wasn't about Losch and cancer," Tackett said. "Losch is Losch. He doesn't change, but when he got cleared to bowl, that's what we wanted to do for him. To get a win after what he's been through really makes it special."

Loschetter, who earned his second PBA Tour title, also took it in stride. He was diagnosed with testicular cancer just before the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VII in Reno last December, had surgery, and thought he was cleared uncontinued on page 6



Tommy Jones Saves Best for Last in Winning PBA Xtra Frame Series Points Bonus

CHICAGO — After finishing second in the bowlingball.com PBA Maine Shootout in April to kick off the PBA Xtra Frame Tour's winner-take-all points chase, Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., never led until it mattered – at the very end.

Jones, needing a big finish to overtake Xtra Frame Series points leader E.J. Tackett, finished match play in Sunday's Xtra Frame South Point Las Vegas Open with games of 300, 278 and 290 to qualify third for the stepladder finals. He then lost to Anthony Simonson, 248-191, but his fourth-place finish was good for 17 Xtra Frame Tour points and that gave him a total of 89 points for the year, enough to top Tackett's 84 and Ryan Ciminelli's 83. The win earned him a \$10.000 bonus.

For the record, Jones finished second in Maine (19 points), won the Greater Jonesboro Open (25 points), finished 19th in Lubbock, Texas (2 points); 11th in Middletown, Del. (10 points), and fifth in Aurora, Ill. (16 points) before the finale in Las Vegas. The seventournament Xtra Frame Tour awarded 25 points to each tournament winner, 19 points for second place, 18 for third, etc., declining by one point each place through 20 places, resulting in a close, competitive points race all the way to the end.

MURRIETA — The price of gold is up and so is silver. The price of a barrel of oil is down and so is unemployment. Life is all about "UPS AND DOWNS". Bowling is a sport of "UPS AND DOWNS".

So while most of the bowlers in this area are down Paul Nilsen is up. A survey of a half dozen

of our leagues show that 90% of our bowlers are down. Ninety per cent of our bowlers are averaging less than last year. Half of them are "WAY DOWN", as much as 20 pins below last season's average. Not Paul Nilsen. Paul Nilsen's average is up. "WAY UP"!

During the first month of this season Paul's average was up as much as 25 pins. At the present he is up 14 pins. His current 235 average is tops at Cal Oaks Bowl. He's averaging the same in Hemet and Moreno Valley.

Paul has always averaged in the 220s and 230s but that was in years when all of our big shooters were doing the same. This season is different. He is the only one of our big shooters averaging above 230!

His 235 is nearly 10 pins above what any of our other "BIG SHOTS" are shooting. Guys named Bowman, DeYager, Gulley, Gagnon, LaRiviere, Lewen, Markiewicz, Mojado, Moser, Murtishaw, Peters, Sowell and Warning are all trying to figure out how Paul is doing it. According to Paul, it's all about equipment.

Besides leading in average Nilsen is our only scratch bowler to roll a perfect 300 this season. With lane conditions more difficult this season no one of our scratch bowlers has bowled a 800 yet! Nilsen's 778 is just a few pins short of our top series of the season.

Paul is flying high this season even though he has had leg and back problems. As stated above, he attributes his success to his equipment, drilled by JOEL RICKETTS. He says the Optimus Solid is the best ball he has ever used and it is responsible for his carrying strikes at a higher rate than in the past.

Steve Ontiveros Wins Inaugural Bowling Thumb Socks Open

LAUGHLIN — WCO Bowling Tournaments held it's inaugural Bowling Thumb Socks Open October 8th 2016 at the Riverside Lanes in Laughlin Nevada.

It was 6 game qualifier with the top 4 going to the finals. The qualifying was tough as the tournament was held on the Boardwalk pattern and played extremely tough all day.

The top two positions were only 9 pins apart and had been battling all day for the right to be the top seed as the tournament leader gets a bonus of having to be beat twice by the challenger.

It all came down to the final game between Steve Ontiveros of New Mexico and Dan Reed of Kingman Arizona with Steve holding on to lead.

The cut score was low with +51 for 4th qualifier. The top 4 would make it to the finals with a modified shootout for the title. Seeds 2,3,and 4 would bowl a one game shootout with the winner earning the right to face the tournament leader for the title.

The top 4 were Rich Wescom of Arizona, Jesse Galvan of New Mexico, Dan Reed of Arizona and Steve Ontiveros of New Mexico.

Rich, Jesse and Dan would bowl the shootout and as it had been all day the scores were close with Jesse needing a strike in the 10th to beat Dan but came up short 199-204 that would give Dan the right to bowl Steve for the title.

The first of the final match would see the lanes transition and show that they would be the factor as Dan would win the first match 174-161 to set up the "SUDDEN DEATH" match.

Dan got off to a quick start as he ran the first three strikes as Steve struggled to find the line but after a ball change in the fourth frame Steve was within 20 pins of Dan as Dan had a few bad breaks late in the game. It all came down to the 9th and 10th frames.

Dan was first to finish needing the first two strikes to shut out Steve and claim the title , Dan nailed the first strike but his second attempt in the 10 would see the pesky 4 pin stand as he finished with a 236. Steve was working on two strikes and needed 3 strikes to win . Steve's first two shots were solid and all that stood was the last one in the 12 but a solid 10 pin would stand.

Both bowlers had 236 scratch but since Steve had 4 pins handicap the win was his. Steve wins a True Amateur Tournament entry for February as well as cash. 

"It definitely makes you appreciate life," the Avon, Ohio resident said. "Getting another title? Yeah, that's cool."

In the first match in the two-game, total pinfall Baker format stepladder finals, 'Merica Rooster Illusion defeated Playin' With House Money (Josh Blanchard, Dino Castillo, D.J. Archer, Shawn Maldonado and Tom Daugherty), 508-488. Fifth season of PBA team competition returns to "new" Bayside Bowl in Maine in April

LAS VEGAS – The Professional Bowlers Association League took its final steps in preparation for the 2017 season Wednesday when the league's eight team managers got together at the South Point Bowling Plaza to draft the final two players to complete their five-player rosters.

Selecting first in the "serpentine" draft, Philadelphia Hitmen manager Tim Mack selected Ronnie Russell of Marion, Ind. L.A. X manager Andrew Cain then selected Finland's Osku Palermaa. And so the draft went until the 20th and final player selected as the draft came back to the Hitmen was Dave Wodka, a member of the 2016 Philadelphia roster. "That was very difficult," Couch said of making the final pick. "There were a lot of highly capable players left on the board, but it came down to my team wanting a guy they were very comfortable bowling with, and that was it."

The defending champion Dallas Strikers, making the eighth and ninth selections, picked Rhino Page and BJ Moore, respectively. Moore was a member of the 2016 Strikers team, but fifth member Shawn Maldonado was taken earlier in the first round by the Silver Lake Atom Splitters.

"I was hoping I could keep last year's team together," Strikers' player-manager Norm Duke said, "but Maldonado was gone before I could pick him."

"One of the biggest problems with the PBA League and the draft is that we have so many great players and only a limited number of roster spots available," PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark said.

All eight teams were given the opportunity to protect three players from their 2016 rosters prior to the draft.

Among the 40 players selected for 2017 were two women, Professional Women's Bowling Association champions Liz Johnson (Portland Lumberjacks) and Danielle McEwan (NYC WTT KingPins).

The PBA League will return to the newly-reconstructed Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, in April for its fifth season of competition. All matches in pursuit of the Elias Cup will be televised on ESPN.

Ryan Ciminelli Turns Focus to U.S. Open Title Defense

CHICAGO — Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, New York, characterizes his victory at the 2015 U.S. Open as a career-defining win, and the powerful left-hander returns to a familiar venue to defend his title at the 2016 event.

The opening round of qualifying at the 2016 U.S. Open will kick off Friday at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas, and a field of more than 220 of the top competitors from across the globe will vie for a spot in the stepladder finals, which will be broadcast live on CBS Sports Network at 8 p.m. Eastern on Nov. 9.

The 2016 U.S. Open will feature an expected prize fund of more than \$210,000, which includes \$100,000 in added money. The 2016 champion will earn \$30,000 and the coveted green jacket.

The 2016 event also will mark the tournament's first trip to Las Vegas. The U.S. Open has a history that dates to 1941. The event was known as the Bowling Proprietor's Association of America All-Star prior to 1971.

Ciminelli dominated the 2015 event at AMF Garland Lanes in Garland, Texas, leading the field by 461 pins to earn the top seed for the stepladder finals. He defeated England's Dom Barrett, 236-223, in the championship match to claim his first major title. The victory vaulted Ciminelli into the PBA Tour's Player of the Year race, though he was edged by Australia's Jason Belmonte, who won for the third consecutive year.

"I think my U.S. Open win defines my career," said Ciminelli, who also won the Xtra Frame South Point Open and Viper Championship during the 2015 PBA Tour season. "And it may forever. The way it unfolded, being one of five titles in 12 months, and the most crucial, of course. It means everything."

The 30-year-old once again finds himself in the conversation for the PBA Player of the Year, already claiming two titles this season.

"I do have a chance at it again, but there's a lot of work left to do," said Ciminelli, who owns seven career PBA Tour titles. "Winning a major just might do it, but it's hard to tell what the other guys are going to do. All I can do is try and win every time I lace up and let the rest unfold as it may."

Ciminelli's trip to the South Point Bowling Plaza gives him the opportunity to defend his title in familiar surroundings.

Ciminelli won the 2015 Xtra Frame South Point Open at the 60-lane venue just prior to making his U.S. Open title run, and he just missed the stepladder finals in his title defense this past weekend, finishing seventh. Jakob Butturff of Chandler, Arizona, won the 2016 edition. "It definitely helps the confidence knowing you are bowling at a venue where you've had success and feel comfortable," Ciminelli said. "Winning takes a few crucial personality traits. And, give or take, they are the same for every champion - patience, determination and belief. There are a lot of winners on our tour. You just have to try and be as sharp as possible at the most important times and hope fate calls your card, because a million things need to go your way to win an event like the (U.S.) Open."

Qualifying at the 2016 U.S. Open will consist of three eight-game blocks for each competitor, starting Friday at 11 a.m. Eastern. After 24 games, the field will be cut to the top fourth for Monday's cashers' round, which will consist of an additional eight games to determine the top 24 players for round-robin match play.

Match play will begin Monday at 8 p.m. Eastern with the first of three eight-game rounds. Match play resumes Tuesday at 1 p.m. Eastern with the final two blocks of qualifying, including a position round. The five finalists will be determined by total pinfall, including bonus pins, for 56 games.

Each round of the 2016 U.S. Open leading up to the stepladder finals will be broadcast live on Xtra Frame, the exclusive online bowling channel for the PBA.

- 1964 BOB STRAMPE (top P.B.A. \$ maker) won \$17,800. JACK NICKLAUS \$17,300. Times have changed!
- HARRY GRANT'S singles guaranteed \$10,000 in prize monev.
- Brunswick came out with CUSTOM-KOTE lane finish, first in 20 years. The secret ingredient was Formula 566. Did I give it away?
- The first 300 at CIVIC LANES was rolled by EL-LEN HECKENDORF. Also first woman in the Santa Monica Bowling Assn. to score perfecto. Her highest series was 666.
- JOE LYOU joined the C.B.N. staff in April '64. His wife was a bookkeeper for TROPICANA LANES.
- JIM CONNOR rolled first 300 at MERCURY BOWL.
- 62 people wrote stories and house columns every week. Some where paid — most were not.
- Five Buick Coupes were top catch for the men winning the HERALD-EXAMINER tourney.
- The newest Ebonite (Don Carter) Ball hit the market. Bowlers went "ball happy". Pro Shops couldn't keep them in stock. Do you have one? They are worth more in 2016 then 1969!
- CLARK BOWL patrons jammed a bus for a trip to an Angel/Yankee game. \$6.00 included bus trip, snacks on the bus, game ticket, and a chicken dinner at CLARK after the game.
- The Department of Justice sued the B.P.A.A.for violation of the Sherman Act. The complaint stated that B.P.A.A., from 1951, their 6,150 members "controlled bowling" in the U.S. The only sport that was owned".
- VICTORY BOWL in Van Nuys challenged bowlers to roll in their "Rambler Singles". The top prize? A Rambler of course! If you didn't win the car — other spots were paid off with "legal lettuce".
- SGV Jr. Traveling League. Winners for the 1963-64 season were:

Boys A division: Royal Oaks Lanes including Tom Basinger, Rick Barro, Gary Brame and Bill Hainey Boys B division: Beverly Bowl including Bob Arsenian, David Sandler, Randy Donaldson and Jesse Smith

Girls division: STARDUST BOWL (no names available).

- Question? Why were P.B.A. members allowed to bowl in all the local tournaments? Sweepers, associations, marathons, handicap, scratch, sanctioned, unsanctioned, house, T.V., etc. were easy picking. Seemed like the top 20 averages were winning week after week. Does anyone remember when the rules changed???
- TROPICANA LANES in Inglewood was unique. As you walked in the front door 2 staircases (left and right) led to the second floor which held a few lanes for parties. The main floor was located straight ahead. Their 56 lanes were impressive. The snack bar had a dumb waiter that delivered food and drink orders to the second floor. A little ahead of its time. It didn't even smell like cigarette smoke and stale beer!
- BRUNSWICK CORP. started their 300 Club, giving a beautiful plaque to everyone that shot 300 in a Brunswick Center. If there is one available for my memorabilia showcase — call the Bowling News!
- MAJOR BOWL in Long Beach was the hot spot for Moonlight Bowling. 3 games for \$2.00. Win cash for colored head-pin strikes. The cops didn't like that! Too much like gambling!
- The P.W.B.A. ran three tournaments in California in 1964. Over 100 lady pros bowled in each. Pro-Ams were maxed out. Prize fund for each was around \$6,300.00. Top gals from So. Calif. were Marion Ladewig, Shirley Garms, Sylia Wene, D.D. Jacobson, Janet Harmon and Merle Matthews. Today, a few ladies are bowling on the Men's Tour - and winning! About 60 are 2016 P.W.B.A. regulars.
- COVINA BOWL came up with a new concept, a 925 Scratch League that bowled twice a week. Bowl Tuesday and Thursday — \$4.25 each night. Top team would win \$1,000.00. Never heard of that concept again.
- ROSE LANES was sold and renamed ROSECRANS BOWL.
- The Bowling Proprietors declared August 23 thru August 30 as their first annual "Bowling Week". Activities included Kids Day, Bring A Friend, Ladies Day, Industry Night, Church Night, Sponsor Night and ending with the crowning of King and Queen of Bowling at a banquet.
- - - So much for the centers working TOGETHER for the good of the sport!
- A few centers decided to upgrade the noon lunch crowd from — 2 games and lunch — to a strip tease dance and a couple of drinks. The local police put a stop to stripping in a "family recreation center." Remember CAROLINA LANES down near L.A.X.? (Somebody told me!)
- The first color P.W.B.A. tourney was August 23 in Cincinnati. 135 ladies entered. Berger Brewery was the sponsor. * * A bowler (Henry Levant) went to Hawaii with his league and caught a 206 pound tuna. 100 bowlers were in continued on page 10




