New Detroit Open Kicks Off Extended 2014 PBA League Thunderbowl to host new onen-field tournament live PBA League coverage set for ESPN on Jan. 26

SEATTLE – A new Detroit Open singles tournament, presented by Xtra Frame, will kick off the Professional Bowlers Association's extended 11-day PBA League Week at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., Jan. 17-19.

The PBA Detroit Open will be an open-field PBA Tour title event beginning with a nine-game qualifying round on Saturday, Jan. 18. The top 16 players after nine games will advance to round-robin match play on Sunday.

After 16 head-to-head matches, the top four will admade its competitive debut at 22 and will make its ESPN Frame. Monthly subscrip-Thunderbowl in January 2013, returns to the Detroit area with a revised format and revamped rosters for the 2014 season. PBA League competition begins at Thunderbowl on Jan.



ANAHEIM — Linbrook Bowl hosted our weekend's event. We had a decent turnout of 154 entries. 39 bowlers advanced to semi finals with cut scores of +113 for the men and +69 for the women. Super Seniors added were Ed Palma +102 and Thomas Smith +93 for the men, and Gwen Harris +56 for the women.

High Qualifiers for the weekend were Tri Vo at +228 for the men and Beth Borci with +163 for the women. They each get a paid entry to a future ABTA regular event. Top qualifier gets the privilege of drawing for the Match Series and Leo Tartamella was the solo winner with his 443 series worth \$1,640.

Tri Vo was this weekend's big winner for the OPTIONAL DOUBLES. 1st place with Jeff Taino 1618 for \$120 and 2nd place with Vuong Do 1581 for \$100. Doubles paid out 18 places for a total of \$940 with a low to cash score of 1465.

The Semis took the floor with the top 16 bowlers advancing to Match Play Finals. Top Seed, was Minh Dang with +198 followed by Vuong Do with +153. Vuong will sit out the first round while Minh waits for his challenger. Top seed gets the honor of drawing for Match Game and the 169 game drew worth \$3,830 was matched by another solo winner, the likeable Richard Anesi. Our optional 3-6-9 pot is a carry over with Ed Abarca taking home the \$50 consolation prize. Estimated fund for 3-6-9 next week is around \$1,000.

Top 16 took to the lanes and eliminated in the first round and getting \$100 each were Kerry Lucka, Holden Au, John Armenia, Rithy Ath, Greg Kokanour, Gwen Harris and Tri Vo. Placing 6th through 9th and getting \$105 each after the second round eliminations were Vuong Do, Rey Josafat Jr., Thomas Smith and Annaliza Agoncillo.

Many leagues and tournaments wind up with races as close as a bunch of college students trying to see how many of them can fit into a telephone booth or a compact car.

When competition is keen and can go any way, it's tension time. Tempers are short, and there are flareups of all sorts, even between bowlers on the same team. The most docile bowler can become aggressive when a battle is on, whether the reward is a tiny trophy or the Tournament of Champions title.

Adapting to change is a source of tension. Yet, tension is natural. It shows up when there is a conflict of any kind, a spat with your mate, kids, friends, enemies, or in fighting off another bowler or bowling team, or even a lane condition.

You become great at something the same way you learn to swim or ice skate. By making a fool of yourself until you master the challenge. Good judgement comes from experiece, and experience usually comes from poor judgement. Money can't buy natural ability. It's a gift. And experience comes from countless hours of practice, patience and competition.

The finest athletes in every field of sport, and talent in all other fields, generally agree that you never fully get used to pressure. Don't let outward appearances fool you. Tension grips the most seasoned performers. But that doesn't reduce ability. Some rise to the greatest heights when under the most pressure. Nobody completely shakes tension. It's a fact of life and must be lived with — like it or not.

Winston Churchill said, "It is very much better sometimes to have a panic feeling beforehand, and then be quite calm when things happen, than to be extremely calm beforehand and to get into a panic when things happen."

Eddie Rickenbacker once noted, "Courage is doing what you're afraid to do. There can be no courage unless you're scared."

Think about that when you're making a clutch shot or a style switch in the middle of a game or tournament. Being tense or scared is not the major problem. Being scared of being scared causes most of the trouble. The first step in the battle against pressure is to admit it is there, and won't fold up or silently slip away.

Each individual battles pressure in his own way. Veteran performers, having been through it, have more weapons to combat the common malady. Some chew gum, tobacco, candy or their lips. Others take a deep breath, or try to stop breathing. Some fidget as much as a lobster in boiling water. Some talk more, others less. For every action or idea that works, there's another that won't.

Look in the mirror. You should know the best way to calm the person looking back at you. Don't think you're different because a triple gets you flustered or you nervously shake when you face even a so called simple spare at a crucial moment.

On the surface most established pros seem as calm as the proverbial contented cat. Inside they're more like raging tigers. Similarly so, though most bowling competition seems to be decided on the lanes, the hidden element, the battle against the pressure, really determines the winner.

Some bowlers, when thinking about upcoming key matches, expend so much energy they tire and sleep well. Some have trouble sleeping prior to the trying times. One, when he's having a bad night, shakes his roommate until the latter is awake, then asks, "What's the matter, can't you sleep either?"

Don't sleep when it comes time to face pressure, as it does for every bowler. Face it the best way you know how — and only you really know how.

The Perfect Game

Interview continued by: Carol Mancini

Editors note: I apologize to our readers for the length of this interview. I promised to keep it brief, but haven't yet found something to argue with the coach about. As soon as I can nail him on some point, however minor, I promise we'll get back to having some fun. This shouldn't take long!

Carol: Last week, you began telling us about your search for principles that lead to bowling success. You also stated that it was a long story. Is that accurate?

Steve: More or less.

Carol: Well, let's hear it.....but keep it short.

Steve: I'll do my best. We all know the frustration of wanting to get better but not knowing where to turn for help. I was no different. In 1973 I was a sophomore at Penn State majoring in science. To help pay for college I had the greatest gig in the world; a part-time job at a bowling center. I loved the game and wanted nothing more than to become a pro. Unfortunately, I peaked at an average of 193. The owner of that center eventually sent me to a class to become a certified instructor. That class was sponsored by the American Junior Bowling Congress and presented by AMF. I had hoped it would make me a better bowler....but it didn't! In fact, using the techniques learned in that class, my average began to decline. I soon realized the class actually taught terrible bowling technique. I felt like I had been certified to teach others how to bowl badly!

Carol: What ?!

Steve: I'm not kidding! The instructor, following the manual we had all been given, stated, "The delivery consists of a stance, push-away, arm-swing and release." He then described and illustrated the stance presented in that manual, "Shoulders are kept level to the floor and square to the target. The ball is held waist-high, centered to the body and supported by both hands. The feet are kept several inches apart; one held slightly back from the other."

Carol: Yeah, that's pretty basic stuff.

Steve: Carol, that may be the worst stance a bowler can use. Most of it makes no sense at all.

Carol: What made you think that it was, well.....less than ideal?

Steve: Common sense. I asked myself, "If this stance is so effective, why aren't the pros using it?" They make their living delivering bowling balls more effectively than anyone else. When I realized the instructor had taught technique based in tradition, I started copying the pros instead. My average immediately began to improve. The next step was to figure out, "Why?" After all, that instructor had said, "This stance is the most effective because it's perfectly balanced."

Carol: Well, it is perfectly balanced!

Steve: Of course it is, but that doesn't make it an effective bowling stance! Being perfectly balanced only means that you're not falling over. You could hold the ball like the torch on the Statue of Liberty and be perfectly balanced, but that stance wouldn't be effective either.

Carol: So....what's wrong with it?

Steve: A lot! Let's start by asking this question: "What is the goal of delivering a bowling ball?"

Carol: To throw strikes.

Steve: Not exactly. The goal is to deliver it so consistently that, when released, it will roll precisely over a target you have selected and end up where you want. Sometimes it's to create strikes and other times, spares. Effective technique makes that happen.

Carol: I'll give you that one.

Steve: Now, ask the same question about each part of the delivery. "What is the purpose of the stance?"

Carol: To aim the shot at the target.

Steve: Again, that's only part of it. To be effective, the stance must do two things; it must aim the shot and set up a consistent delivery. Therein lies the answer to your question, "What's wrong with it?" That stance doesn't even aim the shot.

Carol: So what? Any stance will work, won't it? I mean, isn't the

most important thing just to be consistent with whatever stance you use?

Steve: That's one of the biggest myths about bowling, Carol. While it is all about consistency, it does matter what you do because some techniques actually cause problems. That stance is a prime example.

Carol: Aha! Now I gotcha! You're one of those coaches that thinks everyone should bowl exactly the same way! I hate that!

Steve: But to some extent that's true. Every successful bowler I have ever watched incorporates a specific set of principles into their delivery that leads to their success. Since every bowler I have ever met wants to improve, they need to understand and utilize those same principles also.

Carol: Nuts! I thought I had you there. Hey, Dean! Do we have enough room left to cover the gospel according to St. Stevie? No? Well readers, so much for making this interview short and sweet. Join us next week for this never-ending saga.

Steve: Hey! You started it!

Carol: Yeah.....I gotta give you that one too.


