JAKOB BUTTURFF NEWS: A UNIQUE TROPHY AND AN **UNEXPECTED SETBACK**

TEMPE – Unorthodox left-hander Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., made PBA news for a couple of different reasons over the past couple of weeks.

On the good news side, the 25-year-old Arizona native defeated EJ Tackett, 258-244, to claim the \$50,000 winner-take-all prize in the PBA Clash. Along with his cash prize, he also received a unique bowling pin trophy made of Legos by a company called "Custom Brick Sculptures."

Unique trophies are kind

of a badge of honor to distinguish certain events, but this trophy was the first one made of Legos. The tie-in to Legos is that the popular Legoland Theme Park Florida is located in Winter Haven, Fla., just up the road from the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Fla.

On the bad news side, Butturff was noticeably absent from the ranks of contenders in the U.S. Open in Mooresville, N.C., especially after finishing as U.S. Open runner-up in both 2017 and '18. He was

Dom Barrett Wins PBA-WBT Kuwait Open for Eighth Career PBA Tour Title

KUWAIT CITY - England's Dom Barrett defeated Iceland's Arnar Jonsson, 289-235 and 278-277, Wednesday to win his eighth PBA Tour title in the PBA-World Bowling Tour Kuwait Open in Kuwait City, Kuwait. Barrett, who qualified third for the stepladder finals, had to beat Jonsson, the top qualifier. twice to claim the \$50,000 first prize under tournament rules.

Jonsson, 25, joined the PBA in August. He became the first Iceland native to bowl for a PBA Tour title.

Barrett, 34, advanced to the title match by defeating Venezuela's Ildemaro Ruiz. 276-223, in the second stepladder match and Cana-



PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: WILLIAMS-ALLEN PARTNERSHIP WINS AGAIN

• The partnership of seven-time PBA Tour titlist Dick Allen of Lexington, S.C. and PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., has proven to be highly successful in PBA/PBA50 doubles competition where the duo was victorious again Sunday.

Williams, in winning for a 114th time at all levels of PBA competition, and Allen defeated Brandon Curtis of Manson, N.C., and Troy McKinney of Yorktown, Va., 202-197, to win the PBA/PBA50 Decker Appraisal Services Baker Doubles title presented by Hammer Sunday at Interstate Lanes in Bristol, Va., for the second year in a row.

Williams, who recently celebrated his 60th birthday, and Allen qualified first for the stepladder finals and watched as Kristian Rogers of Salisbury, N.C. and Craig Auerbach of Sunrise, Fla., eliminated Joe Scarborough of Charlotte, N.C., and Nick Christy of Newport, N.C., 251-216, to start the four-team stepladder finals. Curtis and McKinney then defeated Rogers and Auerbach, 246-201, to advance to the title match.

Allen and Williams, along with Dennis Lane, were partners in winning the 2016 PBA/PBA50/PBA60 trios event in Bristol that made Williams the first player in PBA history to win a grand total of 100 titles. Allen and Williams have bowled as doubles partners four times in PBA Regional events, winning twice and finishing second in the other two

This year's win was Williams' 20th in PBA50 Regional competition to go along with 33 standard PBA Regional, 47 PBA Tour and 14 PBA50 Tour titles. Allen picked up his 26th PBA Regional win and a share of the \$4,000 first prize in Bristol. Allen's 26 titles are tied for 18th place on the list of 1,903 players who have won at least one title in PBA Regional competition.

- Chandler Stevens of Archbold, Ohio defeated Patrick Dombrowski of Parma, Ohio, 214-195, to win the PBA Fort Wayne Central/Midwest Open at Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne, Ind., Sunday, for his first PBA title and a \$1,700 first prize. In the semifinal round, Stevens topped Nathan Michalowski of Mount Pleasant, Wis., 219-199, and Dombrowski downed Aaron Lorincz of Center Line, Mich., 190-145, to set up the championship match.
- Brian Boghosian of Springfield, Mass. and Keith Laing of Oakdale, Conn., defeated local non-PBA members Mark Bouchard of Deep River, Conn. and Matt Dzikiewicz of Rocky Hill, Conn., 176-224, 200-194, 169-167 in the best-ofthree-game title match to win the PBA/PBA50 Callahan's Bowling for Gold Doubles presented by Tech Vision Sunday at Callahan's Bowl-O-Rama in Newington, Conn.

Boghosian, the 1999 USBC Masters champion, and Laing overcame a loss in the first game of the title round. After winning game two by six pins, the winners needed a mark and good count to win the final game. Laing, who won his first PBA Regional title in April, got a spare and a nine count to secure the victory.

The win meant the first PBA Regional title for Boghosian who had won a regional in 2016 as a non-member. Boghosian and Laing each earned \$2,000. The tournament was open to teams include one member under the age of 50 with

In the best-of-three semifinal round, Boghosian and Laing defeated Sam Ventura of Norwich, N.Y. and Anthony Pepe of Long Island City, N.Y., 2-0, while Bouchard and Dzikiewicz defeated Ryan Shafer and Howard Ayres, both of Horseheads, N.Y., 2-0.

- Jordan Jung of Canada defeated Jake Peters of Henderson, Nev., 216-213, to win the PBA Mesa East Bowl Western Open presented by Columbia 300 at Mesa East Bowl Sunday for a \$2,500 first prize along with his first PBA Regional title. Peters topped Lanndyn Carnate of Modesto, Calif., 208-194, to advance to the title match after eliminating Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., 212-202, in the first stepladder finals match.
- On the Nov. 15-17 PBA Regional weekend schedule are the PBA50 Bryan's Bowling Center Eastern Open presented by 900 Global in Laurel, Del.; the PBA50 PLYGEM Windows Rocky Mount South Open at Rocky Mount Bowling Center in Rocky Mount, Va., and the Japan Region's High Sports Cup Chameleon Open at Kashima Bowl in Kashima, Japan.

- Royalty Rules. Crowned by San Gabriel Valley WBA...Eileen Ortiz Bumangland, Queen and Princess Heather Choi. Their smiles lit up the front page.
- Pam Martin was winner of LAWBA Queens. The LAWBA was organized in 1925. Prohibition was in full force. No champagne to toast the winner. 1993 over 200 toasted lady after lady at the awards luncheon.
- Joe Norris had knocked down 112,910 pins in A.B.C. Tourneys. He wasn't done yet!
- After prohibition ended, a bowling tradition was born. THE BEER FRAME! Bowlers were singing "Happy Days Are Here Again." April 5, 1933 the beer frame was back.
- 13,500 men entered their State Tournament in San Jose. Cal State President Al Hoffman said this was 150 teams.

ARLINGTON, Texas – A Junior Gold Championships collaboration, a trip to the Pacific Northwest and a stop at the longtime home of pro women's bowling highlight the 2020 Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour schedule.

The future of the sport will be on hand in Las Vegas in 2020 when the live televised finals of the PWBA Las Vegas Open will be conducted as part of the Junior Gold Opening Ceremony at The Orleans Arena.

The Las Vegas Open will run July 8-12, with preliminary rounds conducted at Sam's Town Hotel and Casino. The Orleans Arena is located inside The Orleans Hotel and Casino and seats approximately 9,000 spectators.

The 2020 PWBA Tour season will open **April 23** when the PWBA Tour makes its second consecutive trip to Arizona for the PWBA Tucson Open at Lucky Strike Bowl. The tour then heads to Spokane, Washington, for the first time in PWBA history for the PWBA Spokane Open (April 30-May 2) at Lilac Lanes at Cedar Creek. The PWBA last visited Washington in 1986 for an event in Tacoma.

A familiar venue returns to the schedule as Steve Cook's Fireside Lanes in Sacramento, California, will host the PWBA Sacramento Open (May 7-9), followed by the season's first major, the United States Bowling Congress Queens. The Queens will be in Las Vegas for the first time since 2016, with the South Point Bowling Plaza serving as the venue for the May 13-19 event.

The Midwest swing of the 2020 PWBA Tour schedule begins in Parma Heights, Ohio, where Yorktown Lanes will host the PWBA Greater Cleveland Open (May 28-30) for the second consecutive year.

The tour then returns to its historical roots in Rockford, Illinois, where the PWBA was headquartered through 2003. Cherry Bowl will host a PWBA event for the first time in 16 years when the PWBA Rockford Open is held June 4-6.

The PWBA Tour makes its first visit to Longview, Texas, for the PWBA East Texas Open (June 11-13) at Oil Bowl with the U.S. Women's Open, the second major of the season, to follow June 23-30 at USA Bowl in Dallas.

Following the PWBA Las Vegas Open in July, the PBA/PWBA Striking Against

Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles once again returns to Copperfield Bowl in Houston on July 30-Aug. 2. The event is operated by 2019 PWBA Hall of Fame inductee Donna Conners and 1987 U.S. Women's Open champion Carol Norman.

The final leg of the 2020 PWBA Tour will commence with the return of the PWBA Greater Columbus Open on Aug. 6-8 at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl in Columbus, Ohio, followed by the PWBA Tennessee Open (Aug. 13-15) at Pinnacle Family Entertainment Center in Clarksville, Tennessee.

Seminole Lanes in Seminole, Florida, will play host to the season's third major, the PWBA Players Championship, on Aug. 19-22.

The 2020 PWBA Tour season will conclude with the PWBA Tour Championship, which brings together the top 16 players from the season. The dates and site for the event will be announced later.


