

Shannon O'Keefe and Sam Cooley Victorious at QubicaAMF World Cup Finals

LAS VEGAS – Since making Team USA for the first time more than a decade ago, Shannon O'Keefe has had her eye on the coveted QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup.

She watched her teammates hoist the prestigious trophy three consecutive times from 2004-2006 and then anxiously waited a dozen years for her opportunity to join them in the tournament record book.

The 39-year-old righthander earned the chance to represent the United States this week at the 2018 QubicaAMF World Cup, and she did not waste the opportunity, despite one of the most frustrating and demanding weeks of her career, both mentally and physically.

O'Keefe's World Cup dream became a reality Saturday at the Sam's Town Bowling Center as she claimed the 2018 World Cup title with a dra-

matic 238-236 victory over Malaysia's Sin Li Jane. It marked the first time a

KEN PETERSON BOWLS RECORD SETTING 836

LAKE ELSINORE -Records fell a couple of weeks ago in the Senior 565 Scratch League at Temecula Lanes when Ken Peterson rolled a huge 836 (290-257-289). Peterson's 836 series is his career high. In addition, it is a senior House Record and probably the highest series ever rolled in the House. Ken's big score has garnered several USBC Awards for himself including: Two eleven in a row awards for games of 290 and 299, 250 game Award, 275 game Award, 75 pins over average Award, 140 pins over average series Award and 800 series Award. Ken's current 213 average is high in the league. It's no surprise that Ken is topping the league in average since he has been averaging over 200 for years. His book average for the previous three years is 208 (2016), 205 (2017) and 207 (2018).

woman was able to win the World Cup in her home country.

The win was emotional and bittersweet for O'Keefe, who then looked on as Team USA's Kyle Troup, the top seed on the men's side by more than 350 pins, lost a lopsided championship match against Australia's Sam Cooley, 244-163.

"I have wanted to bowl this tournament for 14 years, and to be able to bowl in it, let alone win, is a dream come true," said O'Keefe, who has been a Team USA member since 2005. "It was a frustrating week of trying so many different things, and I'm grateful for the fight that was instilled in me from a young age. I never gave up, and with the help of an amazing coach and teammate, I was fortunate enough to win this special event."

Though Sin had a commanding lead in the women's final, tossing six strikes in her first seven frames, O'Keefe rallied with four consecutive strikes, starting in the seventh frame. A 7 pin on her second offering in the final frame slowed O'Keefe's momentum, but it forced Sin to get any spare and a strike to win by a single pin.

Sin left, and converted, the 6-10 combination to start her 10th frame, but her final shot drifted high, leaving behind the 4-6-10 split, which secured the victory for O'Keefe and gave Malaysia its second consecutive runner-up finish at the event.

"This was an emotional week and something I can learn a lot from," O'Keefe said. "My mental toughness is something I've really worked on, and that includes being able to gather information, move past the bad and then take the good and be able to apply it. tremely tough.

Ballots were sent out to the entire PBA membership as well as a small group of veteran PBA observers (i.e. media) and are due back by midnight on Nov. 11. The winners will be announced at the PBA Clash on Dec. 10 but that special madefor-television show won't air until Dec. 23.

The PBA's Player of the Year ballot has the top 12 players on the PBA Tour points list from this season. However, the credentials for most of those 12 are not as strong as the top contenders.

The ballot includes, in alphabetical order, Andrew Anderson, Dom Barrett, Jason Belmonte, Jakob

Butturff, Marshall Kent, G Bill O'Neill, Kris Prather, Anthony Simonsen, Tom Smallwood, EJ Tackett, Kyle Troup and Stuart Williams.

After reviewing all of the statistics of the 12, there are three bowlers who jump out above the rest in terms of their success on the lanes this season – Anderson, Simonsen and Tackett.

Let's look at each of those three and narrow it down from there.

Anderson competed in 19 events, cashing in 16; Simonsen competed in 21 events, cashing in 19; and Tackett competed in 20 events, cashing in 18. So, that's pretty much a wash between them.

On the points list, which really is a true indicator of success, Anderson led the PBA Tour with 24,195 points, Simonsen was seccontinued on page 6

tion to win, and it worked out in my favor."

O'Keefe experienced some close calls on the way to the World Cup title, which included qualifying seventh for the eight-player round-robin match-play portion of the event and fourth for the four-player semifinal round, thanks to closing games of 227 and 247.

The reigning Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year earned her meeting with Sin, a fellow PWBA champion, by defeating top-seeded Nadia Nuramalina of Indonesia, 247-202. Sin topped 2018 PWBA Tour Championship winner Maria Jose Rodriguez of Colombia, 207-166.

Troup's path to the title tilt featured few obstacles. He was able to use the same two balls for all 40 games leading up to the semifinals, he rolled a perfect game during qualifying - the 75th in tournament history - and he topped the leaderboard from start to finish.

In his two championship-round matches Saturday afternoon, Troup found the need to use a ball he hadn't thrown all week, which worked out well in a 264-216 semifinal win over nine-time World Cup participant Andres Gomez of Colombia, but he never was able to get anything going in the final against Cooley.

Troup's final game included a 7-10 split, two 9 pins one of which he missed - and a 4-9 split. Cooley struck on his first four shots, and eight times in the first nine frames, to put the match away early. The Australian entered the final stage as the No. 2 seed, finishing the 40 games 366 pins behind Troup.

"My heart hurts for Kyle," O'Keefe said. "He was so dominant all week - a cool customer and so focused. He also was an awesome teammate for me, especially since I was struggling. He was there picking me up every night and talking through surface adjustments and lane play. He kept checking in on me and was such a stable support for me. This one is going to sting for a bit, but, hopefully, he can look at all the good this week and realize one game won't define him."

O'Keefe became the ninth woman from the United States to win the World Cup, and she was the first to do so since her Team USA teammates - Shannon Pluhowsky, Lynda Barnes and Diandra Asbaty - won three consecutive times from 2004-2006. The win marked the record 20th World Cup title for the United States.


Had Troup been able to finish the job, it would've been the second time in 54 years of World Cup history a country swept both titles, a feat Sweden accomplished in 1986.

Additionally, it would've been the third back-to-back victories for the Team USA men (1966-1967 and 2007-2008) and second time for a Team USA man to win the event in the United States. That first was accomplished by Robert Worrall in 1981. Jakob Butturff claimed the cup for Team USA in Hermosillo, Mexico, in 2017.

A first-time Team USA member, this week marked Troup's debut in a Team USA jersey. From here, he'll use this experience in helping the team find success at the upcoming 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships in Hong Kong.

"I couldn't have asked for too much better of a first event with Team USA, other than to win, of course," Troup said. "It was an incredible experience, from bowling well and leading the tournament to meeting new fans and players from other countries. Sam bowled a great final game and deserves to be the champion, but I'll also take a lot away from this week. I learned a lot while working with Rod (Ross), and I'm excited to go to the World Championships. Even though this one ended how it did and got away from me, I think we'll get it back in Hong Kong."

With the win, Cooley became the second man from Australia to claim the World Cup, joining Jason Belmonte, who won in Johannesburg, South Africa, in 2011. Australia has won the women's title six times, most recently in 2007 to end Team USA's quest for four consecutive titles.

Cooley was equally dominant in his semifinal match against 2006 World Cup champion Osku Palermaa of Finland, winning 240-203. Cooley, a 27-year-old right-hander, again struck on eight of his first nine shots to outdistance Palermaa.

"I really don't have any words for how this panned out in the end," said Cooley, who dedicated his win to his grandmother Maria, who died recently. "I was very happy to just make the show, and to go on and win it is indescribable. It's

an amazing feeling."

This year's World Cup was the second of Cooley's career, an opportunity he earned by winning the Australian Open early in 2018. His World Cup debut came in Shanghai in 2016, where a disappointing finish left him in seventh place.

Though the United States did not win both titles Saturday at Sam's Town, Team USA's overall performance was enough to win another coveted award given to the country with the best combined finish.

"One of our goals was the country award, so earning that is incredibly special, too," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said. "It was great to see Shannon really turn it on today and come through in the end, but definitely disappointing for Kyle to bowl so well all week and come up short. Sam bowled that title match really well and earned it. Overall, it was a great week. It's tough with so many games and moves and countries. It's quite a grind. I'm pleased with how the team did, and we'll take this as a positive, especially as we head to Hong Kong for the World Championships."

All players this week bowled 24 qualifying games over three days (eight games each day), before the field was cut to the top 24 men and top 24 women, based on their 24-game pinfall totals. The advancing players bowled eight additional games Friday, before their 32-game totals determined the eight bowlers for match play.

Match play participants bowled eight games of round-robin match play, and 40-game pinfall totals, including 30 bonus pins for each match won, determined the four semifinalists in each division.

All rounds of competition this week were broadcast live on BowlTV.

This year's tournament marked a return to the 56-lane Sam's Town Bowling Center, where it was held in 2015, and included representatives from 83 countries - 81 men and 68 women. Each country is permitted to send one man and one woman.

The World Cup first was contested in 1965, and the tournament now is considered one of the sport's most prestigious singles titles.

QubicaAMF World Cup Finals



CHRIS WARREN, HARRY SULLINS PACE PBA REGIONAL TITLE WINNERS

An update on PBA's regional title holders show Chris Warren of Grants Pass, Ore., has maintained his one-title margin on the list of most standard PBA Regional titles and moved into sole possession of the "overall" titles lead while Michigan veteran Harry Sullins has taken a substantial five-title lead on the "most PBA50" regional victories list.

Here's how things stand as of Nov. 4, 2018:

• Warren leads the all-time standard PBA Regional titles list with 47, one ahead of Pete Weber. Rounding out the top five are Steve Jaros (43), Mike Scroggins (40) and Dale Traber (39). A total of 126 PBA members have won at least 10 standard PBA Regional titles since the program began full-fledged operations in 1970.

• With his most recent PBA50 Regional win in Waxahachie, Texas, in October, Warren now has a combined 53 standard and PBA50 titles, breaking a tie for a lead in that category with Traber, who has won 39 standard and 13 PBA50 regional titles for a total of 52. One title behind in third place are Weber and Walter Ray Williams Jr. with 51. A distant fifth with 44 overall titles is Washington's Hugh Miller.

• Sullins, a prolific competitor throughout his career, has won 23 PBA50 Regional titles including wins in the PBA's South, Central, Midwest and West Regions. Second-best is a tie between PBA Hall of Famers Tom Baker and WRW with 18 each. Two more hall of famers – Ron Mohr and George Pappas – have each won 17 times in 50-and-older regionals. Only 13 players have won as many as 10 PBA50 Regional titles.

It's still pretty amazing to realize the PBA, throughout its seven regional programs, has conducted 6,459 tournaments since the beginning – and 1,873 different players have won at least one title.

PBA WELL-REPRESENTED IN 2019 USBC HALL OF FAME CLASS

Existing PBA Hall of Famers Jim St. John and Larry Lichstein, along with newly-elected PBA Hall of Fame journalist Bob Johnson, are among four men elected to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame for induction in 2019, USBC announced Tuesday. Six additional PBA stars are on USBC's Superior Performance ballot which will be voted on by a national panel in the near future.

St. John, a six-time PBA Tour title winner who died in 1987 at age 56, was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1989. St. John, who won back-to-back World Invitational titles in 1963 and '64, was elected by the USBC Hall of Fame Committee in the Veterans category. Lichstein, PBA's long-time Director of Player Services and a PBA Meritorious Service inductee in 1996, was elected in the USBC Pioneer category. Johnson, a highly-decorated journalist as editor of Bowlers Journal International among others, and the late John Davis, the founder of Kegel and creator of revolutionary lane maintenance equipment, were elected in the USBC Meritorious Service category.

Yet to be decided are the Superior Performance induct-



ees. On the men's ballot are multi-title PBA stars Patrick Allen, Chris Barnes, Dave Ferraro, Mika Koivuniemi, Randy Pedersen and Mark Williams. Allen and Koivuniemi will be inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame on Jan. 5 in Arlington, Texas; the other four are already PBA Hall of Fame members.

Candidates on USBC's women's performance ballot are multi-PWBA champions Marianne DiRupo, Kelly Kulick, Sandra Jo Shiery and Tammy Turner. Kulick made PBA history when she became the first woman to win a PBA Tour title when she won the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: DICK ALLEN HELPS WRW IMPROVE RECORD TO 109 TITLES

With the assistance of partner Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., improved his own record for overall PBA titles to 109 Sunday as the tandem defeated Steve Arehart of Chesapeake, Va., and Stoney Baker of Canton, Ga., 248-180, to win the PBA/PBA50 Decker Appraisal Services Baker Doubles title presented by Hammer at Valley Lanes in Harrisonburg, Va.

Allen and Williams qualified first for the stepladder finals and watched as John Furey of Howell, N.J and Sam Maccarone of Williamstown, N.J., eliminated Steve Haas of Enola, Pa., and Bob Michalojko of Pittsburgh, Pa., 244-205, to start the four-team stepladder finals. Arehart and Baker then defeated Furey and Maccarone, 268-248, to advance to the title match.

The win was Williams' 51st in PBA Regional and PBA50 Regional competition to accompany his 47 PBA Tour and 11 PBA50 Tour titles. Allen picked up his 22nd PBA Regional win and the partners shared the \$3,600 first prize. Arehart and Baker pocketed \$1,800 for second, the Furey/Maccarone team collected \$1,400 for third place and the Haas/ Michalojko team \$1,200 for fourth place.

• JR Raymond of Clinton Twp., Mich. defeated Dave Han of Birmingham, Ala., 224-209, to win the PBA Greater Anderson Central/Midwest Open at Dave Small's Championship Lanes in Anderson, Ind., for his fourth career PBA Regional title and the \$2,000 first prize.

In the semifinal round, Raymond eliminated Ric McCormick of Cincinnati, Ohio, 224-173, and Han edged Zachery Tackett of Huntington, Ind., 217-209, to set up the championship match.

• Darren Tang of San Francisco posted a 6-2 match play record and knocked down 3,990 pins Sunday to win his fourth PBA Regional title in the PBA Ken & Kathy Fowler Auto Centers Open at Yokayo Bowl in Ukiah, Calif.

Tang, who earned \$2,000, defeated Raymond Lussier of San Jose, Calif., by 202 pins for the title. Lussier had a 6-2 match play record and 3,788 total pins for his 16 games including match play bonus pins.

In the companion PBA50 Open, Kevin Croucher of Grants Pass, Ore., went 6-2 and knocked down 3,517 total pins to top Derek Gregory of Chowchilla, Calif., for his third PBA50 Regional title. Gregory had a 4-4 match play record and a total of 3,485 pins.

• Heading into the Thanksgiving break, the only events on the Nov. 16-18 schedule are the Bowlers Discount Pro Shop East Open at Terrace Lanes in Frederick, Md., and the PBA50 Plygem Windows South Open at Rocky Mount Bowling Center in Rocky Mount, Va.

• Headlining the Thanksgiving weekend will be the Beaumont Southwest Open at Crossroads Bowling Center in Beaumont, Texas.

• The November PBA Regional calendar comes to a close over the Nov. 30-Dec. 2 weekend with the Knob Hill/MJK Pro Shop Challenge (a non-champions event) presented by Brunswick at Knob Hill Country Lanes in Manalapan, N.J.; the PBA50 Victory Lanes Midwest Open presented by Allstate in Kankakee, Ill.; and the re-scheduled Break Point Alley Member/Non-Member Doubles in Tavares, Fla.

ond with 20,909 and Tackett was third with 19,842. That's a big stat in Anderson's favor.

Tackett made eight shows this season, while Anderson and Simonsen made seven, so that's a very slight edge for Tackett.

Now we get into where it really counts – titles. Tackett had three titles, while Anderson and Simonsen each had two. However, not all titles on the PBA Tour are created equally and when the race is this close you really have to analyze each victory.

Each of the three won a PBA Xtra Frame Tour title, so those cancel each other out because they are all relatively similar shorter duration events.

Simonsen and Tackett also both won the shorter events at the FloBowling PBA Fall Swing. Simsonsen won the Wolf Open, while Tackett won the Bear Open. Those events consisted of just 12 games of qualifying to make the show, so they are similar to PBA Xtra Frame Tour events.

Tackett also won the PBA Xtra Frame Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles with Liz Johnson, which moves him ahead of and past Simonsen for Player of the Year in my opinion. So, Simonsen is out.


That leaves us with Anderson's biggest accomplishment, winning the United States Bowling Congress Masters, a major on the PBA Tour.

Ultimately, for me, it comes down to Anderson's major vs. Tackett's Bear Open and Mixed Doubles titles. In my book, a major is more impressive than those two titles combined, though others may look at it differently.

If you also want to look at performances in majors, it's pretty close there as well. Tackett and Anderson both made two shows, but the stat that really stands out is Tackett's 188th place finish at the USBC Masters, while Anderson's worst performance was 67th at the PBA Players Championship.

In a close race, everything matters, and in this case, my vote will go to Anderson for PBA Player of the Year. His breadth of work over the course of the season was simply stronger and he earned it based on winning a major.

FloBowling To Broadcast World Championships Starting Dec. 1

The 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships are coming to FloBowling.com

The best bowlers in the world will be in Hong Kong to compete for world titles and FloBowling will broadcast the semifinals, finals and medal ceremonies from each of the events starting Dec. 1 and concluding Dec. 5. The broadcasts will be available for viewers in North America only.



Although the season's big award, PBA Player of the Year, won't be announced until next month, two players did earn honors after the 2018 PBA Tour season ended last week.

Andrew Anderson earned the Harry Smith Competition Points Leader Award after leading the PBA's season points list with 24,195.

WBT MEN'S FINALS FIELD COMES DOWN TO WORLD BOWLING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The third berth in the 2019 WBT Men's Finals presented by the PBA will come down to how well a handful of contenders fare in the World Bowling Men's Championships Nov. 23-Dec. 5 in Hong Kong, where finishing positions in the Men's Masters and/or all-events are crucial.

Heading into the championships, Anthony Simonsen (2,183 points) and Stuart Williams (1,943) have locked up the top two berths in the World Bowling Tour Men's Finals, which will be contested on Sunday, Jan. 6, at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas. Currently third is Jason Belmonte (1,441), but within reach of overtaking the Australian star (who isn't bowling in Hong Kong) are Team USA members EJ Tackett (1,423), Andrew Anderson (1,382) and Kyle Troup (1,366). A longshot in the chase is Thailand's Jojoe Yannaphon (1,164).

Don't forget your return address - Carol Anderson won two titles in 2018, including the United States Bowling Congress Masters, and is in contention for PBA Player of the Year, which will be announced after players and media vote on the award this month.

Anthony Simonsen finished second in points with 20,909, while EJ Tackett was third with 19,842. Defending PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte finished in sixth place this year with 17,469.5 points.

For the fourth time in his career, Belmonte earned the PBA George Young High Average Award after finishing the 2018 season with a 221.38 average for 270 games.

It's the second straight year Belmonte has won the award. Last year, he set the PBA single-season scoring record with a 229.39 average for 380 games. Belmonte also won the award in 2014 with a 226.71 average and in 2013 with a 228.81 average.

Jakob Butturff finished second in average with 220.79 for 297 games, while Kristopher Prather was third with a 220.60 average for 234 games. Players must bowl at least 180 games in a season to be eligible for the PBA George Young High Average Award.

The World Championships will award 400 points to the highest-finishing player in the Masters/men's all-events followed by 320 points for second, 280 for third, etc., through 50 places.

The WBT Women's Finals, which also will be contested on Jan. 6 in Arlington, will feature American stars Danielle McEwan, Liz Johnson and Poland's Daria Pajak. FOX Sports will air the finals on FS1 on Sunday, March 10, at 10 p.m. Eastern.






