Machuga Wins His First

Council Bluffs, IA—Mike Machuga proved that good things come to those who wait, as he won his first career Denny's PBA Tour title by defeating Bill O'Neill in the final match of the 2005 Greater Omaha Classic, 256-245, Sunday at Thunderbowl.

Machuga entered the week winless in his first 79 career events and was 0-3 in title matches prior to Sunday's win.

The 29-year-old struck on his first five shots before a failed 4-9 split conversion in the 6th frame. O'Neill, a 24-year-old making his first career televised finals appearance, couldn't take advantage, leaving a 9-pin on his next shot. Machuga clinched the match by striking on his first two shots in the 10th frame.

"That's what I've dreamed about, coming through in the clutch," said Machuga (Erie, Pa.), who earned \$40,000. "I've been bowling well for quite some time and things are starting to go my way."

Machuga, who bowled at the University of Nebraska from 1994-96, advanced to the title match by defeating David Traber, 225-184, in the semifinals. Using a Brunswick Vapor Zone, Machuga struck in frames 4-7 while Traber, searching for

his 5th career Tour title, struck just once over the same span.

In the first semifinal, O'Neill overcame opens in the 7th and 9th frames by striking out in the 10th to defeat Wes Malott, who was making his fourth consecutive televised finals appearance of the season, 223-215.

O'Neill (Levittown, Pa.) earned \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Malott (Austin, Texas) and Traber (Hebron, Ill.) earned \$10,000 apiece for their 3rd and 4th place finishes.

The Denny's PBA Tour moves to Milwaukee, Wis., for the season's first major, the USBC Masters, Nov. 14-20 at AMF Bowlero Lanes. The nationally televised ESPN finals take place Sunday, Nov. 20 at U.S. Cellular Arena at 1 p.m. ET.

Dean Lopez was our man. His expertise saved the Bowling News from extinction, plus Lillian Oak's ability to re-train.

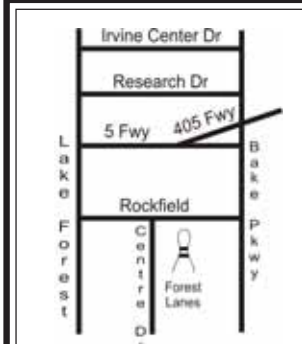

LAKE FOREST — Kevin Gannon, 58, like the Energized Rabbit clashing his cymbals won the West Coast Senior Tour Forest Lanes’ edition \$900 title. It was Kevin’s 20th title. According to the fans and competitors, Gannon has to be one of California’s finest, for sure consistent bowlers.

Tournament Director Dick Sanders said, “I really cannot believe how consistent he is. I think he weighs about 140 pounds, manages to get a ton of ball into that 1-2 pocket.”

Other scratch bowling fans remarked he was on the par of other great lefties like Earl Anthony, Ross Packard and Hank Marino.

Mario Marquez, Forest Lanes long time league coordinator said, “I think Kevin loves Forest Lanes. I remember way back he won more than his share of scratch tournaments — it’s possible.”

Where did he get that energy?

Bowling in his parent’s 16-lane Long Beach Marina Lanes — on real maple, pine center, alleys. Yes, you had to control that hard rubber ball over the hard maple, apply enough lift to take advantage of the softer center pine, hopefully your ball finished with striking force.

Yes, like the Energized Rabbit, fully charged enough power to strike out.

Averaging over 200, he led Joe Merrill by 61 pins after 12 games. Joe blasted a tournament-high 300 game at Kevin taking the final block lead by about 70 pins.

In the final six you could hear the cymbals clash (strike) as he overcame the deficit 216-233-269-248-256 and the coup 245.

Mario concluded, “I am sure Kevin likes Forest Lanes like all the scratch bowlers.”

Director Sanders, smiled, “Forest Lanes was great. Charlie has a nice center here in Lake Forest, Orange County.”

Oh, the Energized Rabbit might be back — this writer remembers Harvey, he was here — Harvey was a star.

Tenpin Slants

The unexpected postponement of the inaugural Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge inconvenienced a great number of bowlers, and in many cases, caused them to lose money. *Tenpin Slants* can personally attest to that.

I had planned to cover the KMDC, originally scheduled Oct. 22-30 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, so I made reservations at the Circus Circus Hotel/Casino for the entire nine days of the tournament.

But when the event was called off—at least for this year—I had to change my plans, including what to do with my nonrefundable airline ticket. It turned out that my good friend, Dick Evans, the Hall of Fame bowling writer from Florida, was in the same boat. He also had a nonrefundable airline ticket.

After an exchange of several e-mails, Evans and I decided to spend a “football weekend” in Reno. We’re both huge gridiron fans. Evans is a graduate of the University of Miami while yours truly went to USC. The Hurricanes are always a football powerhouse and the Trojans—as of this writing—are ranked as the nation’s No. 1 team.

Evans and I agreed to a four-day (Thursday through Sunday) stay at the Circus Circus. That meant I had to change my airline departure date, for which I was nicked an extra \$58. It was well worth it, though, as we had a great time in “The Biggest Little City in the World.” We watched so many football games on Saturday and Sunday that our eyeballs were ready to pop out of our heads.

If you’ve never watched football at a sports book in Reno—or Las Vegas—it’s like watching a 3-ring circus (which was quite apropos, considering where we were staying). There’s always at least a half-dozen different TV football games going on at the same time in the sports book. It’s a blast.

Since Friday was a free day (no football games), that morning Evans and I were to interview Jennifer Cunningham, the genial Director of Sales and Marketing at Circus Circus. Not only was she friendly, she was also full of enthusiasm and animated when she spoke during our interview.

The interview had been arranged by Joan Romeo, owner and operator of The Marketing Team in Van Nuys. She is often employed by Circus Circus as a bowling industry consultant. Romeo also arranged for Evans and me to tour the recently renovated National Bowling Stadium on Friday afternoon.

Our interview with Jennifer Cunningham was quite interesting. She is very knowledgeable about bowling, having been employed for 11 years at the National Bowling Stadium, first as the Director of Marketing and later as the National Sales Manager.

During Cunningham’s 25 years in Reno, she also has worked at the Silver Legacy and Peppermill before joining the Circus Circus executive staff in 2001. All of this experience came in handy when Circus Circus, Eldorado and Silver Legacy formed Tri-Properties, Inc. shortly after the National Bowling Stadium opened in 1995. Tri-Properties has cosponsored virtually every major event held at the stadium.

Their sponsorship will include the 2006 USBC Women’s Championships (formerly the WIBC National Championships) and the USBC Queens. For the ladies entering these events, Circus Circus, according to Jennifer Cunningham, has a special room rate. This special rate is for one to four women in a room. For more information, or to make a room reservation, call their toll-free number at 1-866-447-7728.

Cunningham, incidentally, said she was sorry that the Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge had been postponed. “I hope the tournament, which is good for bowling, is revitalized and held some time next year,” she said. “It would be a win-win event for everyone.”

Evans and I never did get to tour the National Bowling Stadium. When we walked over to the stadium that Friday afternoon, all the doors were locked. Evans, who seems to know just about everything going on in bowling, says we didn’t miss much. “Most of the improvements (at the stadium),” he said, “involves the lanes and the giant automatic scoring screens.”

So, we trekked back to the Circus Circus, where we took a fling at playing the ponies in the race book. Would you believe that Evans, who once handicapped horses for the *Miami Herald*, picked five straight winners? Amazing!

“Why did everybody love Eddie Elias?” That question has been answered in a new biography, appropriately entitled *Eddie Elias*, written by Jane Richardson. It’s her eighth published book and her fourth biography.

Elias, of course, is noted as being “the father of professional bowling.” He organized the Professional Bowlers Assn. in 1958 and was responsible for landing the long-running *Pro Bowlers Tour* on ABC-TV (now on ESPN).

A real go-getter and innovator, Elias, an Akron (Ohio) attorney, also was a well-known sports agent. In addition to representing pro bowlers, he managed auto racing, basketball, and football star athletes and about two dozen golfers, including Fuzzy Zoeller and Chi Chi Rodriguez. Rodriguez, who was close friends with Elias, wrote the foreword for the biography.

Elias died in 1998 following what was described as a “disabling illness.” He was 69.

Jane Richardson, a tireless researcher, interviewed more than 270 of Elias’ friends, family members and business associates. They all loved Eddie Elias, for they had nothing but praise and kind words to say about him.

This led to some redundancies in the book, as several of those interviewed were quoted as saying that Elias was “bigger than life,” that he “lit up the room when he walked in,” or he “always picked up the (lunch or dinner) check” for friends and relatives. Other than that, the book will be interesting for anyone who wants to know all about Elias.

As Johnny Campos, the media book reviewer for *Bowlers Journal International*, says: “If you are looking for a book that takes you through the life and times of Eddie Elias...this is the book for you.”

The recent Bowling Media Tour was “wildly successful,” according to **Tom Clark**, USBC’s Director of Communications. Even the *Wall Street Journal* had a reporter on hand for the event, which featured **Chris Barnes**, **Diandra Asbaty** and **Danny Wiseman**. Wiseman was a last-minute substitute for **Pete Weber**, who couldn’t make it. “Luckily,” Wiseman said, “I live only 1-1/2 hours away (in Baltimore), and I was able to save the day by filling in for Petey. I was glad I could help out in the sudden emergency, even though I had to go out of my way to do so”...

Here’s a belated postscript regarding the **Eddie Elias** story: **Chuck Pezzano**, the Hall of Fame pin scribe and former PBA historian, was a close friend of Elias. Pezzano was the main speaker at this past summer’s dedication of the Edward G. Elias Bowling Center, located on the campus of the University of Akron, Elias’ alma mater. 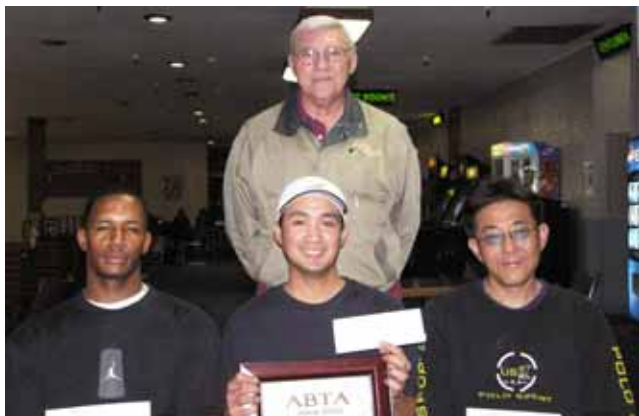

NORWALK — Readers, this is a short story with a bit of a twist. All about a slightly built gentleman of 79 years of age, who has a brilliant record. Not a great name in the bowling world, but a guy that has made his mark and still enjoys the game.

Larry Roberts, who I have known for 55 years is unknown outside of Cal Bowl and Del Rio Lanes. Earlier this year Larry racked up a very nice 722 three-game set at Cal. And competes weekly in the Baker League at Del Rio.

Remember the So. Calif. Travel League in the late 1950’s? We traveled to 35 different centers during a season. Larry averaged 202, second only to Max Gardens.

His 300 games total 29. All sanctioned. All bowled under some what varied conditions. His legs aren’t what they used to be, but the fire is still aglow.

MOUNTAIN TIME

LAS VEGAS, NV— The World Series was over all too soon. Four and out. I didn’t have much of a rooting interest, maybe I gave the Houston Astros a bit more support because they came from the National League...where they play “real” baseball...NO designated hitter, one of the most ridiculous things ever dumped on any sport. Rumor has it, the American League was given the idea by the USBC, back when it was known as the ABC.

I didn’t miss a pitch of the series because I tuned in to watch the best baseball players...the professional stars. I savored every pitch, hit and play. I was watching great baseball.

The same goes for golf on TV as you view the stars as they excel. If Tiger gets on TV on the weekend, the TV audience soars...as much as 30 or 40 percent. People do tune in to see the great professionals of any sport.

Then we have the geniuses running the PBA show! I watch the telly to see the cream of the crop...on what I hope will be a condition that will truly test the ability of the finalists. Well, let’s be honest about this season: pretty much a replica of last year. “Fling and flail” conditions are the norm...hurl the ball hard, watch the Tinker Toy pins fly. If that isn’t boring enough, instead of four-games, we get three-games in an HOUR-AND-A-HALF show! Three! I can guarantee you, three-games can be competed in ONE-HOUR on TV, and both players will be bowling the last frame or two at the same time. My partner Dick Holst and I produced 344-live shows over a 6 1/2-year period, back in the early ‘60’s, when strikes didn’t come in bunches thanks to lane conditions...and strikes do speed things up. Our show was generally the top rated program in our Saturday time slot, even when against the PBA show for 16-weeks! While the talent on both programs was comparable, it didn’t hurt when with a phone call I could find out who won the PBA event, which was taped earlier in the day, I’d frequently offer “congrats” over the air to winner early in our show. (They had a half-hour head start.) My partner would cringe when I did it.

So how does the current PBA program “fill” the excess time since they only show 3-games? With some mangy “trick shot” crapola called the “Skill Challenge,” which is as exciting as watching paint fade. If the guys on the “Skills” thing are so good, why are they not on the “real” portion of the championship battle? We tune in to watch the best bowlers overcome a reasonably difficult condition. This season, it seems the lanes become easier each week. It becomes a situation in which “anyone can win”, “Tho’ tougher conditions brings the “cream to the top”.

When golf’s equipment becomes conducive to lower scores, most courses dig a few more sand traps, slap in a few extra trees, enlarge the lake, grow the rough higher and put the holes on the toughest part of the green. Golf gets it!

The PBA gives it a “huh?” They can’t figure out why they get such miserable TV ratings when more people bowl at least once a year than participate in any other sport. Their one “good” week last year was when half the nation was “snowed in” on a Sunday, and it was shovel or watch TV.

As our primary source of gaining new fans and bowlers, the PBA has deleted one-game and added the lovely “trick shot!” That’s like baseball making the batters stand on one foot at the plate while holding the barrel end of the bat in the 5th inning. Or making golfers lay on their belly and using their putter like a cue stick on the 9th hole. Sheer stupidity. It has become really easy to tune-out the bowling programs when you have turned in to watch ultimate players compete, only to have this thing turned into a childish nightmare of throwing a ball from or under a chair.

When switching to football on Sundays, other than Terrell Owens, football has no gimmicks. Maybe we should try it. But then, that may be too much of a mental strain for the dunderheads running the bowling show. The simple answer guys: Just make the championship match a two-game, total-pin set. Add that, delete the “Screwball Challenge”, delete the bimbo babe doing on-the-spot interviews...and maybe those dismal rating numbers might start going upwards. they call it “REAL” bowling.


