U.S. Women's **Open Shifts To** Las Vegas in 2009

ARLINGTON, Texas-The U.S. Women's Open, a United States Bowling Congress event, will return in 2009 and will be held in conjunction with the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Women's Championships in Las Vegas.

For the third consecutive year, the U.S. Women's Open will feature five television shows on ESPN, with the air dates to be announced at a future date. The event is scheduled to be held Aug. 3-9 at Sunset Station Hotel and Casino's Strike Zone Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

The U.S. Women's Open will immediately follow the World Women's Championships, which will be hosted on the USBC Open Championships lanes at Cashman Center from July 27-Aug. 2.

"The ability to tie these two events together is a big plus because it will allow for a field of the best female bowlers in the world," said USBC Chief Operating Officer Kevin Dornberger, who is also president of the WTBA. Feldman, Machuga Win Chameleon **Championship Titles**

TAYLOR, Mich. - Michael Machuga and Michelle Feldman captured the Chameleon Championship on Sunday at Taylor Lanes, the fourth stop on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour.

Machuga of Erie, Pa., struck out in the 10th frame to narrowly defeat No. 1 seed Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., 209-204, to win his second career PBA title.

Machuga climbed the ladder as the No. 5 seed, defeating No. 4 Sean Rash of Wichita, Kan., 196-190, No. 3 Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 245-188 and No. 2 Wes Malott of Argyle, Texas, 221-210 to advance to the championship match.

Machuga advanced to Sunday's televised finals as the No. 5 seed. The telecast was originally scheduled to be a four-man stepladder finals, but due to a scoring malfunction during Friday's Round of 16 match play, the PBA decided to change the televised format to a five-man stepladder finals. "I haven't felt this good in years," Machuga said. "I actually got nervous the first few frames today, and I haven't felt like that in a long time." Machuga's last title, the 2005 Greater Omaha Classic in Council Bluffs, Iowa, was also on the Chameleon lane pattern. Chameleon resembles a "retro" approach to oil pattern design and measures 40 feet in length. Oil is applied in strips and requires bowlers to play

in a specific zone on the lane as compared to a "multiple angle" condition.

"My bank account likes Chameleon apparently," Machuga joked. "I really don't pay attention to the patterns that much. I focus more on lane topography and house characteristics."

In the PBA Women's Series, sponsored by the United States Bowling Congress, Michelle Feldman of Auburn, N.Y., handily defeated Jodi Woessner of Oregon, Ohio, 199-173 in the championship match.

"I was good through the entire week, then I threw my second ball tonight and my thumb ripped open," Feldman said. "My goal was to not finish twice in two weeks."

Feldman claimed the title two weeks after she lost in the championship match of the Pepsi Viper Championship in Omaha, Neb., the first PBA Women's Series event of the season.

The PBA will next air on ESPN on Sunday, Nov. 23 at





tin Larsen of Sweden defeated Zulmazran Zukifli of Malaysia, by two games to one, 203 to187, 180 to237 and 249 to187.

So Ann Maree and Martin moved forward to meet our top seeds, Jasmine and Derek.

Both matches lived up to the expectations of a World Cup. In the first game, Ann Maree scored 222 but was outpaced by Jasmine who threw the first 9 strikes, leaving a big split in the 10th frame to finish on 263. The second game was of the highest quality; this time Jasmine threw the first eleven strikes before hitting eight with her final ball, setting a new record of 298 for the World Cup finals. Ann Maree hit 215, so the title went to Singapore.

Jasmine, a 20-year-old student of media and communications, said afterwards: "I just tried to throw the best ball I could and if that meant a 300, then that is what it meant. I have been having some psychology sessions before coming here and concentrating on my refocusing plan, coping with setbacks. These sessions have really helped me."

Jasmine paid tribute to her coach, Mervyn Foo. "He was in our national team for many years and it is great to have a coach who understands what a major tournament is all about.'

This is the first time that Singapore has ever won the Bowling World Cup in either the men's or the women's section. "I have been keeping in touch with home by texting my family on my i-phone," Jasmine said. "I know there is a lot of interest in what I have done here but I don't know what to expect when I get home.'

The men's final produced the highest scores ever seen in the Bowling World Cup. Martin won the first game 229 to221. Then both men hit strike after strike to draw the game 279 apiece. This meant a 9th-10th frame roll off, the first time that has happened in World Cup history. Derek hit three strikes and a 9; Martin s trike, nine spare, 7.

So it went to a final game. Derek continued where he had left off and hit 278, a total of 778, a new championship record. Martin could only manage a 196, so the trophy and title went to the USA, the 6th time in seven years that the USA has taken one of the titles.

Derek, who is 28 years old and works for the USBC on the Sport Bowling programme, commented: "This is by far my biggest win ever - way ahead of anything else. I knew I would be up against some great players and I kept looking at the QubicaAMF web site to see who would be playing here. "I was very lucky to have Jeri (Edwards) as my coach here. She has so much experience of previous World Cups and really helped me here this week." Derek went to University in Nebraska, attracted there by their bowling programme, and studied for a degree in business management. He plays other sports, notably baseball, soccer and softball, but his key way to keep fit is to take his rescue dog, Reeses, for a walk. The top country award went to Sweden, Martin Larsen having come second and Helen Johnsson 4th. The award for Sportsman and Sportswoman of the tournament will be presented at the farewell dinner and party this evening.







The Changing Face of Bowling

After nearly 80 years of structured bowling respect for rules and association accountability, membership and league bowling began a downturn around 1980. In the next ten years 1,327,483 members were lost and it was the beginning of a consistent drop in membership and it got everyone's attention.

The parent organizations, The Women's International Bowling Congress and American Bowling Congress, tried numerous ways to find an answer to stemming the tide including hiring consultants and numerous mind altering seminars. Employees who did not get with the program were gone. Everyone pretty much agreed that change was needed but no one expected to have the rug jerked out from under them.

In the over-zealous effort to make repairs the long-time local and state dedicated movers and shakers were seen as the problem and the parent organization felt the need to take a control they felt they had lost. The grass roots were told that the great bowling congresses were not special and were just like any other nonprofit organization. It went something like this – purge the old guard, purge rules and bylaws, save money by forcing the grass roots leaders to live by the national website, give them a bowling magazine and push for consolidation - which soon became "merger."

Affiliated local and state bowling associations were used to being part of the legislating process so the fight to accomplish these goals was taken to the delegates at convention, in their states and in local association areas. With "change" one thing has never changed – it's not what you do but how you do it that makes the difference.

After being rejected once the WIBC, ABC and Young American Bowling Alliance (YABA) finally merged and the heat was on to get states and locals to do the same. The ultimate goal was to get many associations to merge into one BIG association and have maybe just two for large states like California – North and South.

As the new bylaws were constructed and submitted to the delegates there were many bones of contention but it was clear that rules would be watered (too cumbersome,) nominating committees could literally run an association (control)and voting for top leaders would be taken out of the hands of the electorate. We were told that after the proposal was voted on there would be NO changes. Because of the uproar over some of these changes, some were made but in the end the new organization would pretty much have their way.

While unrest, chaos and contention over leadership were festering in the associations the new organization "United States Bowling Congress" (USBC) made it clear in their many visits they were not concerned about membership loss. It seemed this was really what this whole thing was about in the first place. USBC had other methods of growth in mind – increase visibility, promote competitive bowling (the elite bowler and Pros) and boost youth bowling with a goal of retention.

Field Reps were let go, communication was poor unless you wanted to go on Bowl.com – the official USBC website. Awards

were diminished in quality and as the connection with the parent organization became less visible, bowlers and associations began to ask why they should belong to this once revered organization. A long time goal of separating the convention and tournament to different cities became a reality requiring bowling leaders to make two or more trips if they wanted to attend these events.

States and local associations were urged to merge and some did and some did not. Pressure and deadlines to commit pushed them to climb on board. Contentious leaders vied for top positions banking on the new system to put them in charge and boards played musical chairs. Detail oriented women were disenchanted with the over-simplified leadership of men who became leaders of this new mixed group had no idea how to even run a meeting.

Organizations that merged or affiliated were ordered to divest themselves of their assets leaving only "start-up" monies. They could donate it to the charity of their choice or give it to the new organization. State dues were cut to \$1.00.

The USBC leaders were still not concerned about membership loss which was plummeting. USBC now has a male leader who is also a proprietor. Following an initial board that was a mix of members from WIBC/ABC/YABA the board also has been purged and is now somewhat "hand picked" according to member attributes – many not having served in a local or state organization situation.

Enter the Bowling Proprietors of America (BPAA.) A move had been going on for some time to bring their proprietors on board and provide a business advantage and educational tools for them. Bowl Expo, the BPAA Convention and Trade Show, invited proprietors to come together in one place and avail themselves of these tools. BPAA also worked closely with USBC in trying to bring bowling integers together in close proximity. Some heads rolled and after much examination and research ideas began to come to fruition. The USBC and The National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum will join the BPAA in Arlington, Texas in November and move into a new "International Bowling Campus" that will offer an advanced technology 20 lane bowling center with different lane surfaces and different machines for research purposes and education and coaching will also be available. USBC will divest themselves of their headquarters when feasible and the NBHFM building in St. Louis, Missouri as well.

This coming together will offer savings in promotion, education and service to bowling. With the tough economic climate looming, bowling leaders are finally admitting that membership loss is a concern. Open play is stagnate and other "funny bowling" is losing its charm and sports leagues are iffy. State and local tournament participation has dropped drastically. Remember that "Old Guard?" They are the ones who put all those tournament teams together. BPAA feels they must protect the competitive aspect of bowling if they are to survive.

This is a story of what can happen with "blind" change and not being sure where the path will lead or what kind of devastation it will leave in its path. Will the pride in belonging and joy of meeting friends at "Nationals" ever return? Who knows?

Technology has changed drastically. This is a good thing but questionable. After creating an impossible problem with scoring, all of a sudden it has to stop and lane conditions are crazy. How will this even out? Who knows, but it is discouraging to those loyalists who keep coming back each week hoping they can find a line. The average bowler doesn't have an arsenal of bowling balls to handle each lane condition and they are certainly not savvy enough to know how to use them if they had them.

An encouraging aspect is groups like the 500 and 600 Clubs are going strong as well as the California Bowling Writers and a variety of independent tournaments and I presume this is true elsewhere. We do NEED to be connected. After being the adhesive of the bowling organizations for nearly 80 years for women and 100 for men this is important to the very reason we want to belong.

Bowling centers are being renovated and upgraded and there are new ones with new concepts. This is a good thing. I feel bowling has a frown on its face right now but there seems to be a good vision for the future and hopefully there will be a smile one of these years.

Can we learn from our mistakes? Let's not forget how we got here. Yes, the Face of Bowling is changing.

National Deaf Bowling News by Connie Marchione FLASH NEWS! MALUCCI 811/TEAM RECORD

2745 AT RED ROCK LANES LAS VEGAS...Last Sunday Carl Malucci reported that we can erase off the 2607 score we reported in the Bowling News last week because his Team Nation broke the 2700 barrier in the Sunday Mixers League at Red Rock Lanes. This came as a surprise to me because I did not think any deaf mixed foursome would

to me because I did not think any deaf mixed foursome would break the 2700 barrier. To me it is unbelievable like a deaf mixed five-some team breaking the 3200 barrier. But Malucci's team had it done breaking from 2500 to 2600 then now this 2700. On Nov. 9, Malucci's Team Nation scored team games of 879-918-948 for a new deaf mixed foursome team record of

2745, more than 138 pins better than its old record of 2607 in the same league. To achieve this big score, Malucci himself hit an enormous 811 along with an excellent team work from Melchora Lee's 585, Joey Harris' 278/690 and Barrett Lee's 659.

Also important are the team games of 918 and 948, which also broke their weeks old deaf mixed foursome record 910 with now 948 as the new record. This is like having a deaf mixed fivesome team hit an 1100 game.

Now let us focus on Malucci's 811 which is his career 16th. The games were 267-279-265 and from Malucci's account it is a bizarre one with 2 opens and a spare but we understand that he is human and not a machine. His 267 had front 7 strikes and left a solid 7 pin, which he missed in the 8th frame and struck out. His 279 had front 9 strikes and in 10th he left a solid 8 pin on a pocket hit which he spared and strike on his fill ball. The 265 had same 9 strikes in row and in 10th hit a decent pocket 6-8-10 split and ended with picked up the 6-10.

It could had been higher than 811 but that's the way it ended. The only other bizarre 800 I can recall was Bill Hayse's 286-289-284/859.

In 2003 the Knoxville, Tenn right-hander a two time National Deaf Masters Champion had 10 in row in each and was snakebitten with splits on 11th balls in 1st and 3rd game.

As for Malucci's Team Nation, he has a fine team and should enter his team in any mixed tournament like USBC Mixed, State Mixed and National Deaf Mixed tournaments. Malucci said he is urging his team to aim for scores beyond 948 and 2745 in the Sunday Mixers League.

Westchester – Most of us had the pleasure of not traveling anywhere this week since we bowled at AMF El Dorado, a stone's throw away from LAX.




