# L.A. ALL SPORTS FILM FEST AWARDS 'BALLS' **TWO TOP HONORS**

Cherie Kerr's first indie film also earns an "Award of Excellence" at Indie Fest earlier this month; film racks up seven honors in three months

LOS ANGELES—The micro-budget little indie film, "We've Got Balls," a 93-minute family-friendly comedy about the potential demise of a bowling alley in a small town, won two awards Monday evening, November 11, 2013, the same day it screened to a sizeable audience, at the highly festive L.A. All Sports Film Festival, according to filmmaker, Cherie Kerr.

Kerr also announced that the film won an "Award of Excellence" from Indie Fest earlier in the month.

While the film debuted last April with two sold out screenings at the Newport Beach Film Festival, where it was an Official Selection, it has gone on to become an Official Selection at three other festivals where it has garnered four top honors, including Kerr as "Filmmaker of the Year," from the Action on Film International Film Festival. Its fifth honor was announced the first week of November by the Indie Fest's voting panel, when the film was given an "Award of Excellence.'

At the All Sports Film Fest Monday evening, "Balls" took home a coveted "Audience Choice" award, as well as the

In addition to All Sports awarding the film top honors, the festival's team also honored "Balls" co-star, Gary Austin, creator and founder of the L.A. Groundlings, with a Lifetime Achievement Award for his work in the arts. Laraine Newman, known best for her work as an original cast member of "Saturday Night Live," personally presented the lifetime award to Gary with a poignant and funny speech.

Kerr, who has known Austin for 42 years, and who was an original founding member of the Groundlings with Austin and Laraine Newman, said, "It was such a thrill to see Gary receive this honor. He so deserved to be recognized for his many talents and achievements over the past four decades." Austin has been lauded over the years for having launched major careers for such notable comics as Phil Hartman, Paul Reubens (aka Pee Wee Herman),

Hardwick won his final tournament in 1976 in Toledo, Ohio, and finished second to Hall of Famer Marshall Holman in the Tournament of Champions. He retired after the 1976 season and was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1977.

In 1969 Hardwick starred in a Miller High Life commercial becoming the first professional athlete to appear in a beer commercial.

He was also a member of the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame, inducted in 1985. He was a two-time American Bowling Congress Tournament champion winning the Classic team and Classic all-events titles in 1964.

## "Blue Oil" to Illustrate PBA Lane Conditions on ESPN for the First Time Historic graphic element to debut on PBA Cheetah Championship telecast Dec. 1 at 10 a.m.

LAS VEGAS — For the first time in bowling history, national television viewers will have an opportunity to observe one of the greatest mysteries in the sport when the Professional Bowlers Association introduces "blue oil" for the televised finals of the PBA Cheetah Championship on Sunday, Dec. 1, at 1 p.m. ET.

The application of lane conditioning oil has been a mystery to bowling fans for decades – even an abstract science to many viewers of PBA Tour competition on television – because the clear oil traditionally applied to bowling lanes is invisible to the naked eye.

For the first time, the use of lane conditioning oil with a vivid blue tint will give viewers an opportunity to see how oil is applied to bowling lanes, and how PBA players deal with the challenges of lane conditions during the Cheetah Championship, the first of five PBA Tour events conducted during the PBA World Series of Bowling V at South Point Casino, Hotel and Spa in Las Vegas.

The PBA worked with its official lane maintenance provider, Brunswick Bowling, to formulate and test the innovative blue oil that was applied exclusively on the pair of Brunswick lanes installed in South Point's Hotel Exhibit Hall B complex for four "animal pattern" finals conducted as part of the World Series of Bowling. The blue oil, which is a PBA initiative that is being implemented for PBA Tour telecasts only, is not available to the bowling marketplace.

PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, who was involved in the testing of the oil, said the benefits of using the blue oil will be a valuable tool for showing fans the changing conditions players encounter during a PBA Tour telecast.

"It passed with flying colors as far as I'm concerned," said Duke, a 37-time PBA Tour winner. "From a big-picture standpoint it's going to be a great tool for TV and for (color analyst Randy Pedersen) to explain what's happening as the ball goes down the lane and why players make the adjustments they do. It will be a visual aid we've never had before to better communicate a player's strategy during competition."

PBA Commissioner Tom Clark stressed that using the colorful oil for the World Series TV shows is a work-in-progress in explaining to viewers what happens when the ball tracks down the lane and how players navigate the lane condition throughout the course of competition.

"It's important to understand this application is a first step, a very exciting first step," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark.

"With the blue oil, the heaviest concentrations of oil applied to the lane are very easy to see," Clark continued, "but the lower volumes of oil applied to the outside part of the lane, and toward the end of the application patterns, do not show up clearly because the concentration of oil is so thin, it remains transparent. It may appear to viewers that the outside area of the lane is a dry surface for most of the patterns, but that is not the case.

"Even that very thin, almost invisible layer of oil greatly impacts the ball path."

Clark also noted the general shape and the length of the oiling pattern is clearly visible with the blue oil, and it will help most fans gain a significant understanding of how lane oil influences scoring, ball reactions, how lanes are played and other previously invisible aspects of the sport.

"Most knowledgeable bowling fans know there is a big difference between how oil is applied for a high-scoring house condition used in many grassroots bowling leagues vs. a demanding PBA lane condition," Clark said, "but the majority of our ESPN viewers aren't aware of the role lane oil plays, or the fact that there oil is applied in many differing patterns.

"Providing a visible means for fans to see the oil will help the educational process as we reach out to a whole new set of fans," Clark continued. "At the same time, knowledgeable fans will see the critical aspects of the game with regard to transition as they never have before. The traffic of bowling balls thrown during competition causes movement of oil, which requires players to make transitional moves, and we'll be better able to educate viewers about those on-going changes in the lane conditions.

"Also, the various animal patterns used during the World Series involve oiling lanes at different lengths," he continued. "The defining characteristics and differences in the Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon and Scorpion patterns will be visual as the series continues. The patterns are applied on identical arena lanes it will be easier for fans to understand why the scoring pace and strategy of the players will be different, not because of the lanes, but because of how the oil is applied."

The Cheetah Championship, which airs on Dec. 1, uses a 35-foot oil pattern. In subsequent telecasts, applications of oil will vary. For the Viper Championship presented by PBA Bowling Challenge on Dec. 8, lanes will be oiled to 39 feet. For the Chameleon Championship on Dec. 15, the oiling distance will be 43 feet. For Scorpion Championships on Dec. 22, the pattern is 47 feet. All shows air at 10 a.m.

The blue oil was also approved for use by World Tenpin Bowling Association President Kevin Dornberger for the WTBA World Bowling Tour men's and women's finals – another World Series of Bowling event — which will be telecast on ESPN Jan. 5 at 10 a.m.

## DAN FLORES 300/963 IN DEAF TRAVEL AT GABLE HOUSE BOWL

TORRANCE — After struggling with 177 and 169 in his first two games, Dan Flores said to his teammate Dennis Vigil, "I am going to bowl 300". So in his third game in the Southern Calif. Deaf Traveling League's stop at Gable House Bowl, Flores meant it as he rolled 12 pocket strikes in row for his third career perfecto. So happy and excited, the smooth rolling right-hander finished with a 217 for a 4 games series of 963, nine pins short of league season high of 972. This 53 years old traveling league used Gable House Bowl as one of its regular stops back in the 1970s and 80s and just came back last year; Flores is a returnee this year and never bowled in Gable House before. Flores joins Billy Spears as the only two Deaf and hearing impaired bowlers with perfect games at Gable House Bowl. Spears a former member of this deaf traveling league got his 300 ring in the 1970s in one of the South Bay Deaf Club hosted deaf classics. Flores also joins Carl Malucci and Francisco Navarro as only three with perfect games in this deaf traveling league's 53 years history. Malucci was first with his in the 1990s and Navarro with his 3 years ago. With Flores' 963 leading this day's honor roll list of 8 bowlers, Mark Fisser and Bob Jones were next with 800s. Mark rolled an 881 with games of 228-239-219-195 and Jones had 819 with 147-224-202-246. Gorman Low and Leroy MacMonagle followed with 700s, Low (206) 786 and MacMonagle (222) 747. Others with 200 games were Paul Taffolla 204, Andy Lorenzo 202 and Bob Taylor 201. Anita was the top lady with 182 high game and 644 high series. The day's 6 teams match play action was first of three position rounds scheduled that had league leading Taffolla's Mid City against 2nd place Jones' Eagle Rock. In the first game Mid City with it's anchorman Jeff Stansell absent jumped into 3-1 points lead but Eagle Rock rallied to take the next 3 games and total pins for a 15-5 win. That moved Eagle Rock back into first place, 1.5 points ahead of Mid City. That was the only team move up of the day as the four other stayed in their places. Fisser's third place Anaheim won 14-6 over 4th place Low's Riverside to move to one point behind Mid City and made it a three teams contest for first place. In spite of Flores' big game, his S. F. Valley lost 7-13 to MacMonagle's cellar dwelling Orange County. The officers and bowlers of Southern California Deaf Traveling League thanks Gable House Bowl management and staff for letting them use the lanes that happened in one bowler's 300 game. With the league's rules calling for only one action in month of December, the 53 years old league will travel to Canoga Park Bowl on December 15 with bowling at 12:00 Noon.

The outcome of many a sports event is decided on the judgement decisions of officials.

There's nothing wrong with that, simply because there's no other way. You can't have football, baseball or basketball games without ruling officials. And you can't do without arbiters in boxing or tennis or hockey or in most sports. Losing participants and their followers are inclined to disagree with referees, umpires and judges.

Not so with bowling. It's an exact sport compared to most others. On the first ball you knock down all the pins or you don't. If you do, it's a strike. If you don't you receive another ball. If you knock them all down on the second ball you have a spare. If you don't you have an open frame.

Sure, there are rules. You must stay behind the foul line. Pinfall must be legal in every way. The equipment you use and the equipment you bowl on must meet specifications. At times there are arguments or differences of opinion on some ot those points.

But there are more disagreements in a handful of baseball, football, and basketball games than there are in millions upon millions of bowling games.

You can come up with a lucky strike or a lucky game, and you may even have a lucky night, but no bowler has a lucky season. Though bowling is a team game in league play, it's still the individual that counts most.

Once he gets to the foul line, a bowler is strictly on his own. If things go wrong, the bowler usually has only himself to blame. Seldom is the judgement of a second or third party involved or needed.

There is always talk about sports bringing nations together. That's a real laughter. It's more fact than fiction that in certain sports the officials or judges who vote on the outcome almost always favor their own country's participants. That's hardly a popular way to make friends and influence people.

Boxers who travel to foreign countries come to expect that, unless they win without any doubt, they will lose. There are indeed, hometown decisions and home country decisions in boxing, and in other sports, particularly those of Olympic nature.

This problem rarely arises in bowling. Competition is fierce, but friendly, moreso because there is little decision making by third parties. Bowlers roll, and their scores tell the strory, the whole story. It's bowling balls against pins, and nobody or nothing between the ball and the pins to stop the action or rule against it.

This nation, and many others around the world believe in the theory of promoting good will through sports. Too often, ill will is created. That doesn't happen in bowling, mostly because of the nature of the sport. Bowlers get angry, but mostly at the pins, the lanes, and themselves. They don't have an official they can lean on, cry to or argue with, save league officials or tournament directors, who can hardly be termed in the same heavy bracket as other sports officials.

Bowling can bring people, and nations too, together a lot quicker than most of the sports that grab all the space and all the attention. Bowlers can argue with the best, and they do, with each other, but rarely is it over something that happened on the lanes in regard to rules or regulations decided by a third party. At least rarely compared to other sports.




