

In a blockbuster move sure to shake up the industry, Brunswick has acquired Ebonite International in a deal that was announced Friday. Brunswick secured all the assets of EBI, including all of its brands, trademarks and technologies. Effective immediately, the EBI plant in Hopkinsville, Kentucky, has been shut down and production will move to Brunswick's plant in Reynosa, Mexico.

"We're still working on plans," Brunswick Director of Marketing Bugsy Kelly told FloBowling. "We have about two or three weeks of working on what this really means for Brunswick. As far as Ebonite's pro staff goes, everyone has been retained."

EBI's brands include Columbia 300, Hammer, Ebonite, Track, Power House and Robby's. What this move means for the long-term future of each individual brand is unclear and Kelly said those details will be worked out in the coming weeks.

"Our goal and our whole premise behind what we are doing right now is to make sure the consumer still has all the product that they need and would want," Kelly said. "The consumer is going to be top of mind for Brunswick going forward for all of our brands." Before Friday's news there were three major bowling ball manufacturers – Storm Products, Brunswick and Ebonite Interna

wick and Ebonite International. The consolidation means bowling will now only have two major players in the equipment space with Storm and Brunswick going head to head while other smaller brands like MOTIV also battle for market share.

In a press release out late Friday, Brunswick CEO Corey Dykstra said: "Ebonite and its associated brands have an extraordinary history in bowling. We look forward to continuing the tradition of producing outstanding products for loyal Ebonite, Hammer, Columbia 300 and Track consumers."

The release also said Brunswick will continue to market products under all the Ebonite brands and will honor all warranties on existing Ebonite International bowling balls. "Ebonite International has built a strong 109-year legacy in the bowling industry," Ebonite International CEO Randy Schickert said in the release. "We believe that Brunswick Bowling Products is the right partner at the right time for continuing the traditions of the Ebonite, Hammer, Columbia 300 and Track brands."

Tommy Jones, one of the main faces of Ebonite International on the PBA Tour, told FloBowling on Friday night that the news caught him by surprise.

"I called Rob (Gotchall) and talked to him, and I guess they were more blindsided than us because you think they know in the office a little bit," Jones said. "I know when Ebonite bought Columbia and Track they kept all their players and all their contracts, so hopefully that's what that will entail for us. Time will tell, and we will just see what happens."

Although Jones said details were scarce on the deal, he did feel bad for the people who lost their jobs Friday as a result of the

Hopkinsville plant closing.

"I feel bad for the employees of Ebonite because being a union place for however long – factory workers, a lot of them have been there for 20 years," Jones said. "You've got some people who have been working there since they were 15 years old, so I feel bad for those people."

According to the Kentucky New Era newspaper, EBI has operated its Hopkinsville plant for 52 years and the paper reported around 170 employees will lose their jobs. The New Era also reported that employees will receive their salary and benefits through Jan. 13, 2020.

Wesley Low Jr. to Begin Chasing PBA Dreams

He didn't get credit for an official title because he was not a PBA member at the time.






Bobby Hornacek On Fire At Empire Bowl

REDLANDS – Bobby Hornacek is only twentyfive, but this young man is making a statement about his being the Citrus Belt's very best bowler regardless of age!

He has bowled a 252 300 300 852 at the center and it appears the house record of 870 might be in jeopardy!

Bowling in Empire Bowl's explosive Doubles League Bobby posted 300/769 on October 28 and 280/742 on November 4! The smooth righty was rolling his Brunswick Mecontinued on page 7

Chiodo's masterpiece ranks as the second-highest series in L.A. history. Anthony Sharpsteen is No. 1, having blasted an 888 (289, 299, 300) in the Men's Classic League on Jan. 25, 2011 at now-defunct Mission Hills Bowl.

Chiodo revealed that Sharpsteen "chased me down the next day to tell me congratulations and said he had wanted me to beat his score. He was very gracious."

Chiodo actually had a shot at tying Sharpsteen's score on his last shot of his third game but left the 4-7. Frank Chiodo turned in a sizzling performance in October at Winnetka Bowl when he blasted an 886 series with scores of 288, 300 and 298. Photo by Fred Eisenhammer

"It was my only ball out of the pocket," Chiodo said.

Still, Chiodo's score was good enough to claim the Winnetka Bowl house record, surpassing the 869 rolled on July 18, 2011 by California United States Bowling Congress Hallof-Famer and Valley icon Johnnie Englehart. It also

exceeded an 876 series (300-277-299) by powerful Charles Kenny, another California USBC Hall-of-Famer, at Jewel City Bowl in Glendale in 2016. For Chiodo, a 71-yearold Granada Hills resident, it marked his second 800 series. His first came in 2015 at Winnetka Bowl when he rolled an 801 – one year after he ended a 20-year break from the game.

So Chiodo improved his previous best series by a whopping 85 pins.

"Shock," responded Chiodo with a wide smile when asked his reaction to his 886. "Did I really make 33 strikes out of 35 shots?" continued on page 7

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: 25 YEARS LATER, JOE FIRPO WINS AGAIN

A quarter of a century later, Joe Firpo of Tucker, Ga., defeated Gary Shultis of Levittown, N.Y., 258-214, to win a PBA Regional tournament when he won the PBA50 Gastonia Southern Open presented by Brunswick at George Pappas Liberty Lanes in Gastonia, N.C., Sunday. Firpo, a 54-year-old former PBA member, won \$2,000 in his first PBA Regional win since a tournament in Tallahassee, Fla., in 1994. But because he dropped his PBA membership 15 years ago, he doesn't get credit for a fourth PBA title. Firpo won his only PBA Tour title with partner Del Warren in winning the 1987 Showboat PBA Doubles Classic in Las Vegas,

In the semifinal round Firpo easily disposed of Ken Shealy of Myrtle Beach, S.C., 227-190, while Shultis made it to the championship match for a third consecutive year by defeating Bill Vannoy of Lexington, S.C., 275-248. Shultis, who had won at Liberty Lanes three times in the past, pocketed 1,000 as the runner-up.

• Tom Hess of Granger, Iowa defeated Dakota Vostry of Chicago, 225-193, to win the PBA Plaza Bowl Midwest Open presented by Roto Grip in Clinton, Iowa, Sunday for his 11th PBA Regional title and the \$2,000 first prize.

In the first match of the three-player stepladder finals, Vostry defeated Kenny Calkins III of Des Moines, Iowa, 222-215, to advance to the title match to face Hess, the top qualifier. The tournament was the final PBA Midwest Region event of the 2019 season.

• Brendon Miller of Urban, Ohio defeated Michael Adams of Fresno, Mich., 208-166, to win the PBA La-Z-Boy Central Challenge at Monroe Sport Center in Monroe, Mich., Saturday for a \$1,500 first prize and his first PBA title.

The tournament field consisted of PBA members who had not won a PBA title and non-members who have never won a PBA event (non-members are not eligible to win PBA titles).

Miller blanked David Harold II of Columbus, Ohio, 2-0, while Adams downed Corey Miller of Waterford, Mich., 2-1, in a best-of-three-game semifinal round to set up the championship match.

Of Basketball, Baseball and Bowlers

During the year 2017, I described my discontent with professional football on no less than five different occasions in the California Bowling News, as many topflight players took a knee prior to games during the playing of the National Anthem. An argument could be made as to whether or not this was the proper moment to suggest their displeasure with the fundamental principles of the United States.

A case could also be made that the football players protest actually diminished the protest by John Carlos and Tommie Smith at the Summer Olympics in 1968. In the Olympics the cause was the "Olympic Project for Human Rights," and it was recognized by athletes from many nations. As an impressionable young man growing up in California, I remember buying Eldridge Cleaver's book, *Soul on Ice*, to see what all the hubbub was about.

While my Dad was not particularly fond of seeing Cleaver's collection of essays on my bookshelf, he never prevented me from reading it, or sharing thoughts with others in my high school civics class. Cleaver subsequently spent seven years in exile from the United States for his role in the ambush of some Oakland police officers. After spending time in Cuba, Algeria and France, Cleaver returned to the United States as a member of the Unification Church.

In a complete reversal of character, Mr. Cleaver became a Christian conservative, and ran for Congress in 1986. No doubt spending time in other countries permitted Cleaver to understand the exceptionalism of the United States Constitution, something that might be apropos for some current members of the National Football League (NFL).

Now it's basketball that has taken on the concept of American exceptionalism. When I first heard Steve Kerr of the Golden State Warriors comparing the human rights abuses of China with a United States citizen's 2nd amendment right to defend their family, I by Dave Williams

knew that it was time for a sequel of my disgust for NFL players, entitled "Why I Stopped Watching Basketball."

Thankfully the game of baseball restored my faith in professional athletes, with the appearance of the Washington Nationals at the White House last week. Former Oakland A's star Kurt Suzuki stepped to the podium on behalf of the Washington Nationals and donned a recognizable red hat. He was ridiculed on Twitter for this action, to the point of privatizing his account for fear of threats to his wife and three children. The one that stole the show was Ryan Zimmerman, who after 15 years in the big leagues might be scoping out his next profession as a politician. He was cool as a cucumber as he thanked the President for having the team at the White House, and personally thanked the Commander in Chief for keeping our country safe and making it the greatest country in the world.

Then baseball reality struck a few days later when I was watching *MLB Tonight* on the Major League Baseball network. In a game they like to play, the hosts were wondering about possible trades before next year's home opener.

Dan Plesac, an 18-year veteran of baseball, suggested that Boston trade Mookie Betts to the St. Louis Cardinals for Dick Weber, so that Mookie could be close to the Bowling Hall of Fame, since Mookie is an honorary member of the Professional Bowlers Association.

Wait! What? In yet another example of the power and character of Dick Weber's overall charisma, members of other sports media still think that he's alive and serving as "Bowling's Ambassador to the World," even though he passed away in 2005. And could someone tell Plesac that the Bowling Hall of Fame left St. Louis in 2008, and has occupied their current location in Arlington, Texas, since 2010?

Sure, it was all done in jest (trading a professional baseball player for a professional bowler), but perhaps it's time for John Harbuck, President of Strike Ten Entertainment, to bring a portable bowling lane on the set of *MLB Tonight*. Or better yet, invite the *MLB Tonight* program to the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame on their next visit to the Ballpark in Arlington.

Maybe the retro bowling lanes could be used as a backdrop... and Mookie Betts could provide bowling lessons for Plesac, Greg Armsinger and Ron Darling? The idea is "striking," in more sports than one...

Weeks after his gem, Chiodo was still brimming with good cheer about his sensational night.

He mentioned how bowlers have asked him whether he's "come down" from his high. Said Chiodo: "I say 'I'm still moonwalking, tripping on clouds.""

Chiodo, who now has four perfect games, is known as a prodigious practice bowler – typically working on his game four days a week at Winnetka Bowl with his employer of 30 years, Darlene Somers. Asked why he loves the game, Chiodo laughs and says: "I think I'm good at it . . . and it's the only sport that allows me to go [to Winnetka Bowl] and then go back to work."

The right-handed Chiodo is a self-described "stroker," meaning he has a very smooth delivery with a precise shot that doesn't rely on a 100-mile-an-hour fastball.

The result on that special October night was that Chiodo nailed strikes on his first 10 shots before leaving a solid 10 pin. He then collected 23 straight strikes before he knocked down eight pins on his last shot.

"He was definitely in a zone," teammate Ed Chow said. "He was hitting his mark, stroking it and relaxed. He was so confident. Every ball looked the same."

Bob Adams observed Chiodo from a nearby lane and marveled at what he saw. "It was unbelievable," Adams said. "Right in the pocket. Boom. Boom. Boom."

It may seem that Chiodo's effort was shocking, but in reality, it wasn't. Somers says that Chiodo rolls countless perfect games in a row when he's practicing with her during the week.

Very humble, Chiodo insisted that credit must be given for his 886. His list included Somers; Winnetka Bowl proshop operators Rusty Bryant and Karl Kuntz; Corbin Bowl pro-shop owner Brandon McGinnes; and bowling coach Mark Baker for his video and book.

Chiodo now rates as a strong candidate to become the first L.A. area bowler to roll a 900, but he realizes the difficulty of reaching that number.

At last count, only 35 bowlers have rolled a total of 36 certified 900 series.

"You can have all the skill in the world," Chiodo said, "but if the pins don't fall, it's tough to bowl a 900."

But as Frank Chiodo showed a month ago, it can certainly be within reach.

VISA DELAY FORCES EJ TACKETT OUT OF TRIP TO COMPETE IN PBA CHINA TIGER CUP

Former PBA Rookie and Player of the Year EJ Tackett has been forced to cancel plans to compete in next week's PBA China Tiger Cup in suburban Shanghai, China, because of a delay in obtaining a visa in time to make the trip.

Tackett was scheduled to be part of an eight-player PBA contingent competing in the PBA's first-ever competition in mainland China. The invitational China Cup field, based on competition points earned during the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour, will include Sean Rash, Jason Sterner, AJ Johnson, Bill O'Neill, Kyle Sherman, newly-elected PBA Hall of Famer Tommy Jones and Kyle Troup, who will replace Anthony Simonsen. Simonsen declined his invitation due to a prior commitment, but Tackett's spot in the field won't be filled due to time constraints.






