Faces of Sports: Catching Up with PWBA Champion & Ally Missy Bellinder-Parkin

As a member of the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA), Melissa Bellinder-Parkin is better known as Missy to her friends, competitors and fans. Fresh off of her two recent titles at The PABCON Adult Championships (Singles Gold Medalist) and her title defense at the 2016 PWBA Parkin's Bowling Supply Open, I was able to sit down with her to strike up a game of catch up.

Bryan Lee: Missy, let's kick this interview off with a simple question. Why did you decide to become a professional bowler?

Missy Bellinder-Parkin: It's the only thing I've always wanted. Even in school as a young girl, when people would ask me what I wanted to be when I grew up, my answer was always, "I want to be a professional bowler." My father was a professional bowler and owned a bowling pro shop, very much like golf pro shops. So I grew up sur-

rounded by bowling - I was always in a bowling alley so this just seemed like a natural fit.

BL: In what year did you turn pro?

MBP: In 2004. I had hoped to join the professional women's bowling tour but just as I turned professional, the tour folded. So I became the first woman to join the men's Professional Bowlers Association (PBA). I would later become the first woman to win three PBA regional titles and earn the highest finish ever by a woman at both the 2012 USBC Masters and 2012 PBA U.S. Open.

BL: So in your sport the women continue to compete with the men?

MBP: Well, the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) began again in 2015 so we now have our own full-time

BL: I recently caught up with your best friend and fellow professional bowler, Scott Norton. He mentioned that in addition to being a professional bowler, he was also an attorney. Do you also have a second job you do in your "free time?"

MBP: [Laughs] Bowling is my life. In addition to bowling, my husband and I own three bowling pro shops and we are always looking to expand those; eventually we'd like to open more. I also coach and teach private lessons when I am at home.

BL: Now for the tough question: What is the best way to get over a devastating loss, like the one you encountered at the 2010 USBC Queens tournament? How do you cope with situations like that?

MBP: It actually fueled me to work harder in the following months. I changed some things about my game, such as my ball grip and really focused on ways to get more strikes. The end result was that I came back to the 2011 USBC Queens

and went one step further by winning it. Everyone can learn something from defeat!

BL: As a huge tennis fan,

one of my favorite players is Serena Williams. I see her fast approaching retirement at age 35. Do continued on page 4

Knee Surgery Sidelines Mookie Betts From World Series; CP3 Event Next

RENO — Boston Red Sox all-star right fielder Mookie Betts underwent successful surgery to remove "floating objects" in his right knee on Nov. 10, meaning he won't be able to return to the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling this year. Betts, who already has won American League Defensive Player of the Year and a Silver Slugger award, is among the favorites to win the 2016 American League Most Valuable Player award.

Betts, 24, is not only

expected to be fully recovered from his knee surgery in time for the start of spring training, but is expected to be among the special guests competing in the 2017 Chris Paul Family Foundation PBA Celebrity Invitational in January. Betts' public interest in bowling in the CP3 event led the PBA to contact him a year ago, resulting in his "professional" bowling debut in WSOB VII last December in Reno. USBC Youth Scholarship Deadlines Approaching

ARLINGTON – There are plenty of opportunities for student bowlers to receive scholarships. Visit http://www.bowl.com/Youth_Home/Scholarships/ to download any and all of these scholarship applications and submit by Dec. 1. One of the great benefits of USBC Youth membership is the chance to earn college scholarships so you can pursue your dreams.

DEXTER ALL-AMERICAN TEAM

Deadline: March 24, 2017

Five male and five female USBC High School members are selected annually for the Dexter/USBC High School All-American Team and a \$1,000 scholarship.

Coaches or team administrators must nominate eligible contenders; student-athletes and/or family members may not handle nominations. Once nominations are accepted, the student-athlete receives an application packet.

As a high school bowler, your selection to the Dexter/USBC High School All-American Team is based on your bowling accomplishments, academic achievement, letters of recommendation, extra-curricular and community involvement, submitted essays and resumes. Minimum requirements for selection include a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) and at least one letter of recommendation.

All-American Team awards are presented at the Junior Gold Championships.

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016

This award annually recognizes star qualities in a female high school senior or college student who competes in the sport of bowling. Star qualities include distinguished bowling performance on the local, regional, state and national levels, academic achievement and extracurricular and civic involvement. The award winner receives a \$6,000 scholarship.

USBC CHUCK HALL STAR OF TOMORROW

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016

This award annually recognizes star qualities in a male high school senior or college student who competes in the sport of bowling. Star qualities include distinguished certified bowling performance on the local, regional, state and national levels, academic achievement and extracurricular and civic involvement. The award winner receives a \$6,000 scholarship.

USBC EARL ANTHONY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016

If you are a senior in high school or a college student with a record of strong community involvement and academic achievements as well as financial need, you are eligible for this scholarship. Bowling success is not considered in awarding this scholarship. USBC presents this prestigious scholarship in honor of legendary pro bowler Earl Anthony.

USBC will award five USBC Youth members with a \$5,000 scholarship. Candidates must be enrolled in their senior year of high school or presently attending college and must be current USBC Youth members in good standing. In addition, candidates must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 based on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent). Individuals may win this award only once.

USBC ANNUAL ZEB SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016

The award recognizes a USBC Youth member who achieves academic success and gives back to their community through service. Applicants must be in their junior or senior year of high school, and must be USBC Youth members in good standing. This scholarship is based mainly on community service and very strong academic success.

Bowling success does not factor into the selection process. The winner receives a \$2,500 scholarship and an expenses-paid trip for the winner and a parent or guardian to attend the awards ceremony, held in conjunction with the USBC Convention.

USBC YOUTH AMBASSADOR OF THE YEAR

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016

This award annually recognizes one male and one female USBC Youth bowler for his/her exemplary contributions in the sport of bowling outside of league or tournament play, academic accomplishments and community involvement.



Each award winner will receive a \$1,500 scholarship and an expenses-paid trip to the awards ceremony held in conjunction with the USBC Convention in the spring. One of the winners may serve on the IBC Youth Committee and be eligible for additional scholarship funds. Youth Ambassadors selected to serve on Youth Committee must be at least 18 years old as of Aug. 1 in year of selection.

USBC GIFT FOR LIFE SCHOLARSHIPS

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016

The Gift For Life Scholarships are available to any USBC Youth member currently in high school currently holding a GPA of 2.5 or higher and who can demonstrate financial need. USBC awards up to 12 scholarships each year.

Two of the six awards are reserved annually for children of fire department, emergency rescue or police personnel. Selected finalists may be asked to provide evidence of their financial need. Award winners receive a \$1,000 college scholarship.





- Tournament dates: August 17-20, 2017. Closing date: August 20, 2017 at 1:30pm. Walk-ins allowed, but must sign up no less than one half hour prior to the start of the squad. Walk-ins must provide a bowl.com average printout in order to enter brackets or else they will enter at 220.
- Entry fee breakdown: Prize Fund: \$20 + Lineage: \$18 + Expenses: \$12 = \$50 per person. Make checks or money orders payable to CUSBC. Write "Sr. Singles" in memo. Credit card payments are accepted via Paypal online at CalUSBC.com. Any returned payments must be paid in cash or money order on-site plus a \$50 penalty fee.
- This tournament will consist of a six (6) game singles format bowled on the same pair of lanes. The combined total of 6 games plus handicap will determine the champions in each division.
- The tournament shall be conducted on a handicap basis 90% of 220.
- 10. Entrants may enter only once.
- 11. The entering average shall be determined by the following priorities from an established California league:

Highest 2015-16 USBC certified average (minimum of 21 games). If none,

- Highest USBC certified average (minimum of 21 games) as of January 1, 2017. If none,
- Highest USBC certified league-ending **SUMMER 2017** average (minimum of 21 games). If none,

Assigned average: Women 165; Men 185.

Bowlers are responsible for verifying their own averages. If a "sport" league average is the bowler's only verifiable average, then it will be adjusted per the USBC sport chart to determine the correct entering average. Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify score if submitted average is lower than correct average thereby resulting in more handicap. Prize winning will be based on the submitted average if it is higher than the correct average.

- 12. Any PBA or PWBA member, past or present that does not meet the average requirements of rule #10, must enter at 220.
- 13. USBC rules 319a2 (10 pin increase in average), 319d (reporting of prize winnings) and 319e (15 pin increase in accumulated tournament average) will be waived.
- 14. Replacements for original entrants may be made providing the replacement meets eligibility and average requirements per Rule 11. A replacement must bowl under their own name at the time the event is scheduled
- 15. All prize money will be returned 100%. Prize ratio is at least 1:6 per division. In the event of first place ties, co-champions will be declared and prize money will be combined and divided equally. Designated prize funds will be paid accordingly to each division within 30 days upon completion of the tournament, except when USBC nationals has authorized delay in payment, pending settlement of any claim or protest which effects position standings. A symbolic award will be furnished for the champion in each age class.
- Winners in each age classification are eligible to participate in the 2018 USBC Senior National Championships Participation fees will be paid by CUSBC. In the event of a tie for first place in any division, since only one is eligible to participate in the National Seniors Tournament, the tie will be broken by using the highest 3 game series with handicap (i.e., first 3 game set or second 3 game set). If a tie still exists, the tie will be broken by using highest game with handicap. Arrangements will be made with each athlete within stated guidelines and parameters from the CUSBC for attending the National Finals. Eligible advancers must agree to bowl in the National Finals or, failing to do so, agree to waive all rights. In the event a winner of any division is unable or declines to attend the national tournament, the second, third or fourth place finisher from that division (in order of finish) will be eligible to compete
- 17. Bowlers arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count beginning with the frame then being bowled. Missed frames shall be credited with a zero. Frames may not be made-up. Bowlers not present to bowl when it's their turn will be credited with a zero for that frame. In the event a bowler cannot finish their series, zero points will be scored the remaining frames.
- 18. This tournament will be certified by USBC. The tournament director shall be the authority to interpret USBC and tournament rules, policies and procedures in deciding disputes. If deemed necessary, the tournament director shall consult with the board of directors of the CUSBC.
- An appeal or protest of a decision involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed in writing with the tournament director and the USBC before tournament prizes are paid. The decision of USBC is final and binding on all involved parties. Any violation of tournament rules is cause for disqualification, loss of entry fee, forfeit of all prize monies and possible suspension from USBC
- Fees are refundable ONLY when the Tournament Director is notified, in writing, within 15 days of the schedule notice mailing, that the date and time assigned are not acceptable, or in the case of an emergency, at the discretion of Tournament Director.

- 24. Always congratulate a teammate or another bowler on an Honor score.
