# Faces of Sports: Catching U U w with PWBA Chammion \& Ally Missy Bellinider-Parkin <br> by Bryan Lee of Compete Magazine 

As a member of the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA), Melissa Bellinder-Parkin is better known as Missy to her friends, competitors and fans. Fresh off of her two recent titles at The PABCON Adult Championships (Singles Gold Medalist) and her title defense at the 2016 PWBA Parkin's Bowling Supply Open, I was able to sit down with her to strike up a game of catch up.
Bryan Lee: Missy, let's kick this interview off with a simple question. Why did you decide to become a professional bowler? Missy Bellinder-Parkin: It's the only thing I've always wanted. Even in school as a young girl, when people would ask me what I wanted to be when I grew up, my answer was always, "I want to be a professional bowler." My father was a professional bowler and owned a bowling pro shop, very much like golf pro shops. So I grew up sur-
rounded by bowling was always in a bowling alley so this just seemed like a natural fit.
BL: In what year did you turn pro?
MBP: In 2004. I had hoped to join the professional women's bowling tour but just as I turned professional, the tour folded. So I became the first woman to join the men's Professional Bowlers Association (PBA). I would later become the first woman to win three PBA regional titles and earn the highest finish ever by a woman at both the 2012 USBC Masters and 2012 PBA U.S. Open.
BL: So in your sport the women continue to compete with the men? MBP: Well, the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) began again in 2015 so we now have our own full-time tour.
BL: I recently caught up with your best friend and fellow professional bowler,

Scott Norton. He mentioned that in addition to being a professional bowler, he was also an attorney. Do you also have a second job you do in your "free time?"
MBP: [Laughs] Bowling is my life. In addition to bowling, my husband and I own three bowling pro shops and we are always looking to expand those; eventually we'd like to open more. I also coach and teach private lessons when I am at home.
BL: Now for the tough question: What is the best way to get over a devastating loss, like the one you encountered at the 2010 USBC Queens tournament? How do you cope with situations like that? MBP: It actually fueled me to work harder in the following months. I changed some things about my game, such as my ball grip and really focused on ways to get more strikes. The end result was that I came back to the 2011 USBC Queens

Coaches or team administrators must nominate eligible contenders; student-athletes and/or family members may not handle nominations. Once nominations are accepted, the student-athlete receives an application packet.

As a high school bowler, your selection to the Dexter/ USBC High School All-American Team is based on your bowling accomplishments, academic achievement, letters of recommendation, extra-curricular and community involvement, submitted essays and resumes. Minimum requirements for selection include a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) and at least one letter of recommendation.

USBC ALBERTA E. CROWE STAR OF TOMORROW Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016
This award annually recognizes star qualities in a female high school senior or college student who competes in the sport of bowling. Star qualities include distinguished bowling performance on the local, regional, state and national levels, academic achievement and extracurricular and civic involvement. The award winner receives a $\$ 6,000$ scholarship.

## USBC CHUCK HALL STAR OF TOMORROW

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016
This award annually recognizes star qualities in a male high school senior or college student who competes in the sport of bowling. Star qualities include distinguished certified bowling performance on the local, regional, state and national levels, academic achievement and extracurricular and civic involvement. The award winner receives a $\$ 6,000$ scholarship.

USBC EARL ANTHONY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016
If you are a senior in high school or a college student with a record of strong community involvement and academic achievements as well as financial need, you are eligible for this scholarship. Bowling success is not considered in awarding this scholarship. USBC presents this prestigious scholarship in honor of legendary pro bowler Earl Anthony.
USBC will award five USBC Youth members with a $\$ 5,000$ scholarship. Candidates must be enrolled in their senior year of high school or presently attending college and must be current USBC Youth members in good stand ing. In addition, candidates must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 based on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent). Individuals may win this award only once.

## USBC ANNUAL ZEB SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016
The award recognizes a USBC Youth member who achieves academic success and gives back to their community through service. Applicants must be in their junior or senior year of high school, and must be USBC Youth members in good standing. This scholarship is based mainly on community service and very strong academic success.

Bowling success does not factor into the selection process. The winner receives a $\$ 2,500$ scholarship and an expenses-paid trip for the winner and a parent or guardian to attend the awards ceremony, held in conjunction with the USBC Convention.

USBC YOUTH AMBASSADOR OF THE YEAR Deadline: Dec. 1, 2016
This award annually recognizes one male and one female USBC Youth bowler for his/her exemplary contributions in the sport of bowling outside of league or tournament play, academic accomplishments and community involvement.

3. Bowlers must check in 45 minutes prior to scheduled squad time and must show proof of membership by showing their USBC membership card, a duplicate membership card printout from www.bowl.com or a letter of verification from the local USBC

4. This tournament consists of two separate divisions: Open Division - men and women; Women's Division - women only. The Age Classifications are: 50-54; 55-59; 60-64; 65-69; 70-74; 75+
5. Bowlers need not belong to a senior league to be eligible for entry in this tournament.
