# Professional Women Regional Bowlers Need A Major Sponsor

The Professional Women’s Bowling Association (PWBA) announced their upcoming schedule for the 2023 season last week, with a total of 12 national tour events and nine regional events. The national events are scheduled from May through August, with the three majors being contested on May 17-23 (USBC Queens), June 13-20 (U.S. Women’s Open) and August 13-15 (PWBA Tour Championship). The Queens and U.S. Open events will carry a \$60,000 first prize, while the PWBA Tour Championship winner will receive \$50,000.

There are many interesting avenues to explore from the information provided by their news release. The one that really caught my eye is the fact that while the women will be shooting for some impressive prizes in the national events, there are only 9 regional tournaments scheduled for the year... in the entire country! This is in stark contrast to the men’s regional program that has grown exponentially since my first involvement almost 50 years ago.

As a western region PBA member in the mid-1970’s, I can remember around 12 yearly events that helped the full time members whenever there were no national tournaments scheduled. That was the case for most of the regions in the country, with the exception of the south. Regional director Harry O’Neale seemed to have an event scheduled almost every weekend in the southern region, and especially in Florida. It was an incentive for many national tour players to move to the sunshine state to supplement their income.

A look at the PBA regional calendar for 2022 (which turned into a two day search on the internet and consultation with PBA eastern regional director Russ Mills) finds that there are significantly more events scheduled than could ever have been imagined in 1975, with at least one new region added (northwest) to alleviate extensive travel in that part of the country.

If our calculations are correct, there are now a total of more than 200 regionals scheduled throughout the country. That includes senior (PBA50 and PBA60), PBA Junior (youth league members), and at least a couple of women only tournaments on the west coast. In any event, it would be fair to say that the PBA regional directors are definitely earning their salaries!

## AMF Becomes Major Sponsor Of Regionals

When I arrived on the scene at AMF’s corporate offices in 1982, I was the only PBA member, and one of only a few bowlers among the more than 300 employees in Westbury, New York. This afforded me great opportunities in every aspect of my newfound position. I was called upon to not only provide marketing services for the bowling centers division, but also to test new bowling balls and other products. I also became “the unknown bowler” in many of the AMF print ads and television commercials.

Perhaps my greatest thrill was taking advantage of AMF’s failing relationship with Dick Weber and reestablishing him as the star of the AMF Staff of Champions. We utilized Dick for grand openings, exhibitions, and just about any other

special event that I could dream up that would involve the greatest ambassador of bowling that the world has ever known. At \$1,000 per event (plus expenses), the marketing value of Dick Weber could not be beat!

Another concept that we initiated at the AMF Bowling Centers was the sponsorship of PBA regional tournaments. AMF had always been involved on the national tour, sponsoring such well known tournaments as the AMF MagicScore Open, the AMF Angle Open, and the AMF Grand Prix, but the regional circuits had never been tapped.

My proposal to a couple of newcomers that had come upon the scene at the AMF Bowling Products Group about this time — George Kaltner and Scott Werthmann, was to sponsor a couple of PBA regional tournaments each summer to the tune of \$2,000 each. The impact upon the bowling centers during the lackluster summer months would be minimal in terms of displacing existing business, and in fact would be an enhancement to other ancillary forms of income such as food and beverage, pro shop and vending sales.

Werthmann recognized this opportunity right away, and we embarked upon a PBA regional sponsorship program at some of our more lucrative locations, as well as newly acquired properties. Our first two sites in 1985 were at AMF East Meadow Bowl in New York, and AMF Lang’s Bowlarama in Rhode Island. As it turns out, the increased revenue from the food and beverage sales alone was enough to make the sponsorships successful.

## A Winning Recipe For The PWBA

What the women need is a major sponsor for their regional program. Since AMF is heavily embroiled in their PBA and bowling center involvement, could Storm Bowling be the answer regarding sponsorship of the women’s regional tournaments? Or perhaps the women should look to another industry for assistance. It’s amazing what you can achieve just by asking.

That’s what happened when I approached Seagram about sponsorship of a tournament held during league play that eventually became known as Seagram’s Coolers Get Things Rolling Tournament at all AMF Bowling Centers. The next year my contact at the Seagram Building, Pat Roney, asked about even more involvement and I directed him to the Bowling Proprietors Association of America (BPAA).

The result of that initial meeting with Mr. Roney led to Seagram becoming involved in the US Open tournaments for both men and women. The unprecedented first place prizes of \$100,000 for the men, and \$40,000 for the women, have only recently been topped, after more than 35 years. To put the women’s 1st place prize in perspective, only one woman in the history of professional bowling (prior to 1987) had ever won more than \$50,000 in an entire year, so this was indeed uncharted territory.

Another of my well known expeditions to Manhattan resulted in an interesting involvement with Revlon, where Mr. Kaltner had previously worked for the make-up company that has been around since 1932. Looking back on that adventure now, I’m sure that George must have provided some assistance with a couple of calls to his former associates. The result was a complimentary basket filled with Revlon products that we provided to bowlers in all our daytime ladies leagues.

So, whether it’s Seagram, or Revlon, or even HelloFresh that recently signed a multi-year deal with the Women’s National Basketball Association (remember Colie Edison?); all that someone from the PWBA needs to do is ask, and a vibrant regional bowling program with additional prize money and events could be the result.

now he gets into the Hall of Fame. It’s inspirational for a lot of people.”

“It really hasn’t sunk in yet,” said Boresch. “I look around at all the Hall of Famers out there and it’s the guys I watch on TV, and now I’m one of them? Going into the Hall of Fame was a goal of mine. I’ve been very blessed in my career.”

## PETE MCCORDIC

Long-time Southwest Region manager McCordic, of Katy, Texas, retired in 2022 after 25 years running the region. Overwhelmingly respected by the players for his excellence, consistency and fairness, McCordic will enter the PBA Hall of Fame for his meritorious service to the game.

“Having bowled on Tour for about 18 years, I know what it’s like trying to make a living competing,” said McCordic. “I did the best I could to give the bowlers chasing that dream a great experience in every tournament.”

“The PBA has been blessed with great regional managers,” said Clark. “They keep the PBA together by running a regional system that is the backbone of the PBA. They understand tournament bowling and how to create a consistent, fair environment for the players. Pete McCordic was all those things and he was also a great player.”

Prior to devoting his time to amplifying the regional program, McCordic was a touring pro, winning two PBA Tour titles and bowling a perfect game in the 1987 Greater Los Angeles Open. It was the fourth televised 300 game in PBA history and first in 13 years. In 2018, during the PBA’s 60th anniversary season, McCordic’s perfect game was designated the fourth-most memorable moment in PBA history.

“He sacrificed his own playing career to take on the Southwest Region and give opportunities for so many players to compete,” said Clark. “Pete’s going into the Hall of Fame for meritorious service, and his unforgettable performance on the lanes is the cherry on top.”

“I was literally speechless when Tom told me,” said McCordic. “I loved my job. I was blessed to be able to be around great bowlers 25 weekends a year, if not more. I got to see Chris Barnes and Wes Malott win their first titles and it was a joy to watch those players and so many other greats. I have no complaints or regrets. It was a great way to spend my adult life and it’s a tremendous honor to be inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame.”

## FRED BORDEN

Coach, teacher, proprietor and author Fred Borden’s impact on the PBA began at the very beginning. When Eddie Elias announced the formation of the PBA in 1958, 17-year-old Borden, like Elias a resident of Akron, Ohio, fast-tracked his devotion to bowling.

“When I was 15, I made up my mind I was going to own a bowling center or two,” said Borden, “but I knew I wasn’t going to bowl professionally. Our junior coach had us older kids coach the younger kids, and one of the kids I coached bowled a 300 game. I always respected my coaches and I realized there was a lot to coaching beyond just the Xs and Os. Then when Eddie announced the PBA, I got really serious about bowling. I never expected it would lead to this. I’m really taken aback by this honor.”

Borden, studied biomechanics, sports psychology, physiology and began coaching women’s learn-to-bowl schools that had 600 women taking lessons at the same time.

“Harry Smith started telling people I’ve been coaching,” said Borden, “and up comes Don Johnson. He hadn’t won yet but he was a very coachable person. He would try anything, saying, ‘Bords, that’s so clever, I’ve never heard of that.’ Then he started telling a lot of players. George Pappas, Johnny Petraglia, Barry Asher—they all started showing up. They became friends, not students. My wife would make spaghetti and they’d stay at the house and show up and bowl.”

Borden continued coaching the top players and honing his own coaching skills, eventually famously working with eight-time PBA Tour champion John Mazza. “I told him, Johnny, I want you to think of yourself as world class every time you go out there. To this day, he calls me World Class. The relationships I’ve developed in this game are so special to me.”

“Fred’s credentials are amazing,” said Clark. “The work he did with the PBA and its players since the sixties is unmatched. The art of coaching is something Fred mastered and the PBA is proud to recognize that skill and how important and influential it is on the game and the players.”

Borden, a member of the USBC Hall of Fame since 2002, owns five patents in the world of bowling and is a former head coach of Team USA. Borden was instrumental in creating the USBC Bowling Coaches Certification Program and spent time as the color analyst with the PWBA among many other roles in the industry.

“Bowling is a sport that’s good for everybody,” said Borden. “This is the biggest thrill of my life. I didn’t do these things for the accolades so I just need to know how blessed I am to be appreciated. I didn’t do this by myself by any means.”

The second weekend saw the bowlers on the 36’ PWBA Albany Open pattern. Scoring was higher on this pattern, with Jon Huff making a big run at the end, needing to win the last match by 53 pins to take the title, but Vertigan’s 250 in the final game slammed the door on any comeback.

Vertigan put his foot down all day, not shooting a single game under 200 along with winning all eight of his matches, going an incredible 14-2.

career-best fifth PBA Tour title of the season, bowling his second career televised perfect game in the process. Earlier in the event, Kyle Troup also bowled a 300 game, marking the first time two perfect games were bowled during a single PBA Tour Finals event.

“The Tour Finals is one of the hardest events to win and qualify for,” Belmonte said. “I respect this event so much. Going back to defend my title at Strikerz Bowling is so exciting. The fans there love bowling and the massive crowds are proof of that. Plus, my ball seems to strike a little better there, which I won’t complain about.”

This is the seventh iteration of the PBA Tour Finals, which rewards the best bowlers over a two-year period with a chance to compete in the quest to earn a Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour title.

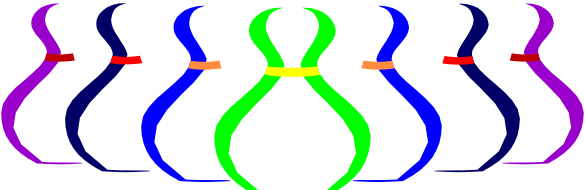



### FINISHING TOUCH FLOORS CONTINUES TO LEAD INVITATIONAL

*Improves to 17-3 after beating Cal Bowl. J.A.T. is next up to challenge them*

DOWNEY – Coming into Monday night, teams have had three opportunities to bowl on the second round short oil pattern in the Brunswick Invitational. For some, they are loving the challenge and rising to it. Five teams entered play on Monday with records of 10-5 or better. For others, the short oil is proving to be tougher than they may have guessed and they are already looking ahead to the next challenge. On this night, we'll pass through the mid-way mark of the round and teams will start getting a great idea of where they stand and their chances to clinch that elusive playoff position.

At 13-2, Finishing Touch Floors came into the night with the lead for the round. Cal Bowl was only a game behind them. And, both teams have players that have been putting up pretty solid numbers considering the challenge of the pattern. Finishing Touch started quickly, posting a 789 in the first game to win by 75 pins. Bobby Hornacek led with 216, edging out teammate Vernon Adams and his 215. In the middle game, things got worse for Cal Bowl as Finishing Touch shot a huge 839, putting them over 200 pins ahead for totals. In the middle game, it was Hornacek leading the way again, improving to 257. The final game was much closer, and Cal Bowl came out on top, 721-713, but couldn't close the gap for totals. For the night, Finishing Touch gets four wins and improves to 17-3. They will hold on to the top spot for another week, two games in front.

The second pair of lanes featured a match between two teams that came in 11-4 for the round, as Junior Amateur Tour battled Bowlium. In the opener, J.A.T. earned a 30 pin victory to get off to a quick start as Kevin Valmonte led the way with 195. Bowlium squeaked out a five pin win in the middle game to even the match at 1-1, with a strong 206 from Billy Myers Jr. In the final game, Bowlium struggled throughout, and J.A.T. cruised to a 90 pin victory giving them the game and total pins, for a 4-1 win. Anthony Santos of J.A.T. was the high scorer, shooting 209/590. The wins improve J.A.T. to 15-5 for the round. That record ties them with DV8 for second place. Based on total pins, J.A.T. will face off with Finishing Touch on the top pair next week.

DV8 easily swept past a shorthanded Bowling Guys team, taking totals by more than 400 pins. Jeff Carr continued to bowl well on this pattern, posting a 235-226-220/681. Preston Epps of Bowling Guys

had the next highest game and series on the pair, with 222/565, but it certainly wasn't enough to overcome the efforts of Carr and his teammates.

U.S. Foods improved to 12-8 for the round with a 4-1 win over Family Ties. After winning the first round, Family Ties has struggled to a 9-11 record so far in this round. Gabriel Martinez of U.S. Foods led all bowlers on the pair with a 207/563. Vince Duarte led Family Ties to their lone win in the middle game with his 228 game.

Forest Lanes and Threadworks both came into the night with 7-8 records and were looking for a big night to get on track for the round. Neither got the big night they needed though as Threadworks took the match, 3-2. Threadworks took the opener with very solid games from Erick Snow (228) and Ray Minter (225). Forest Lanes came back to get the next two games, but they were unable to overcome the total pins deficit they had dug themselves into in the opener. JT Diso of Forest Lanes led the pair with his 234/568 set.

J.K. Inc improved to 11 ½ wins for the round with a five game sweep over the Professional Approach in a low scoring match. Sean Sosebee of J.K. Inc. topped the pair with a 184/535.

Allied Paving was forced to bring in a couple of subs as they were missing two regulars. Both have experience on the shot, but the team came up short regardless, as Westminster Lanes swept all five games in this match. Michael Barnett had a huge middle game, shooting 267. Jonathan Gale and Bryan Osborne both added games over 200 to help Barnett to the sweep for Westminster.

Don Julio Tequila finally got a win for the round, but only one, as HB Complete Builders took the other four points in the match. 509 was the top score on the final pair of lanes, as Anthony Rieger finished with a 182 to earn that total.

Jeff Carr took the first sidepot of the night, edging JT Diso by a single pin, 235-234. In the middle game, it was Michael Barnett winning with his 267 game. 257 is usually enough to win on this pattern, but tonight Bobby Hornacek had to settle for second place. In the final game, it was Carr again, this time with 220. That was enough to win \$136 in the super
