The Norton/Bellinder team eventually led the full field of mixed doubles teams with +579 for the nine qualifying games. Sunday's match play brought just as much excitement with the team of Dave Wodka and Wendy Macpherson eventually taking over the lead. Going into the final, position round match play game, Norton and Bellinder held a slight lead over the Wodka/Macpherson team. Frame by frame the teams matched mark for mark, until the Norton/Bellinder team pulled away for the title.

Missy is one of the 16 exempt players on the PBA

Women's Series and serves as a public relations coordinator for the PBA. She is on staff with Brunswick, Etonic, and Verve (bowlingenergy.com). She wanted to be sure to thank her family, the Norton family, and her friends—Drew, Shalin, and Ed for coming out this weekend. This is her first week home since the PBA tour started, "it's great to be home for a short break and relax", Missy reflected upon her victory, "and I love bowling with Scott", she continued.

Scott is currently in his last year of law school at UC Hastings while working for Xanthus Sports (a sports media firm for NFL players). On top of all of that, he continues bowling, "It has been a great last few months", he recalls of his two recent PBA regional titles and Don Glover Masters championship. Scott is on staff with Brunswick, Vise, and Verve. Over the course of the weekend he used his

Michael Wolfe Crowned Ultimate Scoring Champion

TAYLOR, MI. — Michael Wolfe managed to outlast a first-of-its-kind weeklong shootout to be crowned the Ultimate Scoring Champion at Taylor Lanes, the fifth stop on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour which was taped on Nov. 16 and aired on ESPN on Nov. 23.

Wolfe of New Albany, Ind., struck in the fourth-seventh frames of the championship match to defeat Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, 246-206, to win his fourth career title. Wolfe defeated Bill O'Neill and Scroggins beat Robert Smith in the semifinals.

"I think all four of us guys had a pretty good shot (on this lane pattern)," Wolfe said. "Scroggins never got off to a good start (and) was never able to put any strikes together in the first half. I don't think he threw a double until the sixth or seventh (frame) and at that point I had a 30-40 pin lead and I just needed to mark in the eighth, ninth and 10th."

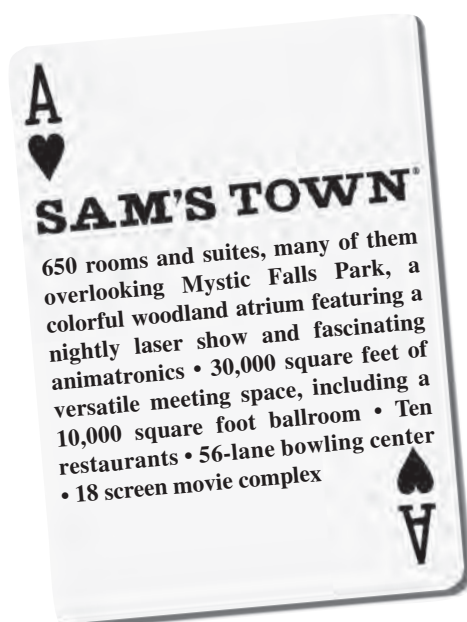

Stogryn 933, Yoma 279/905 as Deaf Travel Battered Cal Bowl Pins

LAKEWOOD—At Cal Bowl last Sunday So. Calif. Deaf Traveling league opened with five 200 games in the first game which equaled its total output for the whole league in the last session. That indicated more big ones would come as in 2nd game Bob Jones started off with 6 in row before stopped by a 4-7 standing pins which he missed and struck out for a 266 to lead three more other 200 games.

In the third game Darrell Stogryn made a short run of strikes added with spares in two separate frames to end up with 259 along with four other bowlers' 200 games. In the 4th game Pablo Yoma outdueled Stogryn by running more strikes with 7in row before being stopped by a 10 pin, spared and struck out for a 279 while Stogryn finished with a 255. In all there were seventeen 200 games that day.

Both Stogryn and Yoma finished with the league's first season 900 series with Stogryn leading 933 from 213-202-259-255 and Yoma a 905 from 222-220-184 279.

Jones did like what he did in his last session's 298/886, failing to hit a 900 by faltering in his 4th game, hit 867 with 215-266-209-177.

Ed Abakumoff had a cold start with 168 and finished strong with 226-202-236 for 832 and Andy Lorenzo hit 199-194-203-201 for a lucky 777 score.

Amazingly two unlikely bowlers crashed in the honor roll by bowling 20 and more pins each game over their average, Alfonso Ruelas hit 216-166-175-196 for his best 753 and Dennis Vigil also his best 725 from 200-169-175-181. Bob Taylor had 703 and Don Millwee203.

In this day's position round matches teams scoring was the season's best since the opener with 5 of 6 scoring 2100 and better including four 600 games. Yoma's S. F. Valley closely contested dueled with Ruelas and Jones' Los Angeles with L.A, finishing ahead with 11-8 victory and the series by 10 pins, 2267 to 2267. Vigil, Taylor and Lorenzo's 2nd place Glendale beat Abakumoff's 1st place Riverside 14-6 with 2205 to 2111 and Glendale took over first place by two pins.

Stogryn's El Camino Village beat short handed Tri-Cities 13 to 7 scoring 2157 to 1875.

S. F. Valley started with a 600, 8 pins short of the season high game and in the 2nd game Los Angeles with Jones' 266 bettered their season high game by two pins with a 610. Then after El Camino Village with Stogryn's 259 came short by 8 pins with 602, S.F. Valley with help of Yoma's 279 totaled 613 to take over the season team high game.

Abakumoff's Riverside had a higher 614 but its 2361made in the season opener had preference as high series.

The league thanks Cal Bowl's Manager Leonard Ruiz and his staff for the excellent scoring condition resulting in our league's record178 plus average per game for its 18 bowlers ranging from 214 down to 133.

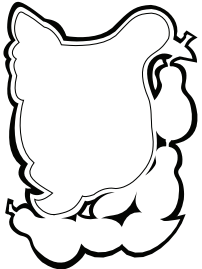
