- Pete DiChiara of Ardsley, N.Y., defeated PBA and USBC Hall of Famer Danny Wiseman of Baltimore, 279-227, to win the PBA50 Bryan's Bowling Center Open presented by the Hopkins Automotive Group and 900 Global at Bryan's Bowling Center in Laurel, Del., Sunday.
DiChiara, who qualified in second place, rolled clutch 10th frame strikes to win his first two matches on Sunday. In the Round of 8 , he struck in the 10th frame of game 2 to remain alive in his best-of-three-game match against Jay Davis Jr. of Silver Spring, Md., after Davis missed three one-pin spares. DiChiara then won the final game to advance to the semifinal round where he eliminated Sammy Ventura of Syracuse, N.Y., 211-205, after Ventura failed to strike in his 10th frame.

## So, You Think You're a Dedicated Bowler? Try to Match This!

WOODLAND HILLS - Seven years ago this month, Greg Kolski did something that was very special.
In fact, it was so special that it's safe to say that very few people have accomplished this - and perhaps no one else!
What Kolski did was persevere through a whopping 100 games of practice in one day, rolling game after game at AMF Woodlake Lanes, now called Bowlero Woodland Hills.

At the time, Kolski was just another good league bowler with a 163 average. But he wanted to be better. Much better.

So, bowling at his home center, Kolski took advantage of a heavily discounted price in which he was allowed to bowl as many practice games as he could in one day for \$12.
Kolski, then 28 , took full advantage. "It came out to 12 cents a game. That's a real bargain," said Kolski in a pretty sizable understatement.
The right-handed Kolski bowled by himself on Lane 30 , showcasing his wicked curve. He worked on his game for 13 hours, 10 minutes without taking a break to eat.
He played no-tap, a game in which a bowler is awarded
a strike if at least nine pins are knocked down on the first shot.
Kolski blistered a 284 in his ninth game - bowling 10 strikes at the start. He scored at least 200 in six of his first 10 games. He slowed a bit thereafter but still blasted a 261 in his 15 th game, a 233 in his 30 th game, a 242 in his 39 th game, a 253 in his 67 th game, a 250 in his 83 rd game and a 252 in his 98 th game. Kolski hung tough to the end, finishing with a 195 in Game 100.
How many bowlers would have even been standing at that point?
Veteran bowler Tom Martino was one of many who paid tribute to Kolski's feat.
"He's relentless in practice so he can perfect his game," Martino said.
Bowling so many games wasn't completely foreign to the likable Kolski. He had previously bowled 85 games in a day. This time, he wanted to last 100 games, so he chose no-tap, where the games go much more quickly.

Kolski started at 9 a.m. and he threw his last ball after 10 p.m.
Afterwards, he was asked what he learned from the experience. "Mostly about how much endurance it takes to get through them all," Kolski said. "Once you get to 80, you really feel it. I'm just glad I got through 100 games."
A year later, his average was spiking and Kolski cited the benefits of that marathon day. "The 100 games gave me a better perspective on what I was doing wrong," said Kolski, a West Hills resident.

Kolski has ridden the momentum of that 100 -games day to the present where he is averaging about 200 in his three leagues - two at Winnetka Bowl and one at Corbin Bowl in Tarzana. He's still looking for his first 300, but he's rolled a 289 and seven 279s and has crushed plenty of no-tap perfect games. He's also had 18700 series with a high of 761 .

When Kolski looks back at his 100 -game effort, he remembers his iron-man effort with fondness. "If not for that, I wouldn't even be thinking about getting to that [next] level," said Kolski, who used a 13-pound ball for the 100 games. He now rolls a 16 -pounder.

After he finished his grueling session, Kolski remembers that he "could barely lift my right arm." Furthermore, his left quadriceps and his right bicep "were really sore."

So, was he more tired or hungry after finishing?
"I was more hungry," Kolski laughed. "All I had was a few drinks since the bar was right next to me." Would he ever consider bowling 100 games again?
"Possibly, but I'd probably need a sponsor because I couldn't afford to bowl 100 games," he said with another laugh.

fixed. But there was always a hope. Since the center was up for sale, local bowlers were hoping to hear a private owner might buy it and put the needed money into the mechanics for the lanes and bring it back to life. The acrylic lanes and approaches were in good shape. Since Bakersfield lost Regency Lanes in December 2017, there was that hope this center would fill the void. But it was not meant to be.
Sunday afternoon a group of local bowlers gathered at AMF Westchester Lanes one last time to visit their old stomping grounds and reminisce about this center when it was the place to bowl.
Westchester Bowl was built in 1959 in the heart of Ba kersfield on 30th St. near "F" in the Westchester neighborhood. It was originally owned by Pete Lokey \& Jack Moore (who also owned the old Bakersfield Academy) They sold the center to Ed \& Laura Malkin/Active West in the early 1980's, who owned this center plus Southwest Lanes. When the Malcomb's retired and moved to Nevada in 1998, AMF purchased both Westchester and Southwest Lanes from them.

This new center was the first in town to have automatic scores with this massive printer/projection screen placed in the back in the middle of each two pairs of lanes and there was a trick to putting the paper in and push the pin in to get the scores printed out. And, this center featured automatic pin setters and were the quickest in town! The lanes and approaches were all wood and remained that way until the 1990's. It also had a "Jiffy Bar" that was conveniently located close to the lanes so bowlers could get their drinks.
Throughout AMF Westchester Lanes 60 years, it has hosted quite a few events such as PCB (Pacific Coast Bowlers, West Coast Senior Tour, San Joaquin Bowling Club, and even hosted the State BVL (Bowlers to Veterans Link).

There was a pro shop in the early days tucked in the back behind the Nursery when you entered the south door that was ran by Harold Johnson, Urban Best \& Joe Romeley.

Many popular leagues were started at this establishment including the Wed. Night Masters Scratch league, which bowled at 9 pm , the Stockdale Men's league on Thursday nights and Greg Barraza started the Tuesday Night Men's Classic league. But leagues took a back seat to pot games! Everyday pot games started at 2 pm and went until around 5 pm before night leagues started. That was for some, but other pot game zealots would start their pot game day at 10am at the Bakersfield Academy and then come to Westchester and continue through the night until daybreak because Westchester would stay open for them! One game cost $\$ 2$ and two-three games cost $\$ 5$ If you shot a 250 game on the nose, Westchester would pay you $\$ 2.50$ ! (Cost to bowl at Westchester when it first opened was 25 cents per game.) The late Bud Hannaman moved Coffee Club which bowled on Sunday mornings from Skyline/Freddie's Lanes in the mid-1980's and this tournament is still taking place today every Sunday.
You could feel the excitement brought back into the center Sunday as the bowlers fed off each other's stories and their individual accomplishments were remembered Many fondly shared that Westchester was the center they shot their career first 300 game and even said what pair they rolled it on. For a little while this afternoon, the hope still glimmered, but as the time went by it faded. Now the center is completely closed off and removal of the lanes begins. What was once a thriving center is now gone.
