The PBA World Series of Bowling IV - A Fan Favorite

LAS VEGAS — My trip home after nine days at the South Point Hotel and Casino was one long conversation about the highlights from this years PBA World Series of Bowling. It was a thrill watching the most talented bowlers on the planet compete for the title of "World's Best Bowler."

When I say the World Series hosted the world's most talented keglers, I mean it. Besides the best PBA players from the United States there were about two score of international players from about a dozen countries including Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Columbia, Costa Rica, Denmark, England, Finland, Mexico, Saudi Arabia, Sweden, and Venezuela. Most of these international stars were professional champions.

The World Series is my favorite bowling event and the "Greatest (Bowling) Show On Earth." Many other fans agree. While most of the daily attendees were from Sin City, I did meet bleacher birds from Arizona, California, Colorado, New York, Oregon, and Utah.

I also met several Canadians. These fans came to Vegas specifically to see the World Series. International subscriptions to Xtra Frame also attest to the planetary popularity of this event. People are enthused because of the number and variety of events, the talent of the competitors, and the thousands of dollars of prize money.

Without revealing who won the various events, I will share some observations and opinions. First, the PBA staff "on the ground" is thoroughly professional and very efficient. KIRK von KRUEGER and JOHN WEBER have decades of experience and ensured every event ran smoothly. Neither computer failure, electrical outage, fire alarm malfunction, lane breakdown, or player injury could keep the PBA show from going on. Kirk is a maestro, the indispensable man.

Next, my hat is off to the ideologues behind the scenes. The guys and gals who keep coming up with one great innovation after another. Thank you TOM CLARK for your

leadership in this area. This season we will be treated to the first PBA League. Eight teams of five bowlers representing eight cities. The teams will compete for the Elias Cup. The first ever PBA draft was held at the World Series, to fill the team rosters. I was there and the first round was especially exciting. Who would be the top pick in the first round? Hope you saw it all on Xtra Frame.

While this fourth rendition of the World Series had many exciting moments, the things I remember most involve absences, match-ups, and many surprises.

The guard is changing. In with the new and out with the old. Absent from match play for the World Championship were players such as Patrick Allen, Chris Barnes, Ryan Ciminelli, Norm Duke, Mike Haugen, Jack Jurek, Mika Koivuniemi, Ryan Shafer and Walter Ray! Some of the new faces who did well included Fawaz Abdulla, Dom Barrett, Tom Daugherty, Thomas Larsen, Craig Nidiffer and Stu Williams.

The World Series featured many interesting match-ups: the world versus the USA, power versus finesse, one handers versus two handers, old versus new, and left versus right. After the international players won every singles title last year, expectations for a repeat were high. From east, west and south came Belmonte, Barrett, Gomez, Koivuniemi and Palermmaa. Over Atlantic and Pacific they flew. On the ground at McCarran Airport they were all smiles, confident and prepared. At the same time the Americans predicted victory. Nine days later there were a boat load of surprises. If you can't wait for the television shows, check out the results on the PBA web site.

Every current PBA competitor will tell you they are concerned about being able to compete against the upcoming power players. Brad Angelo said it best when he spoke of feeling like a dinosaur as today's game evolves. This years World Series showed that while the sun is setting for

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

INDIANAN DJ POWELL HITS 300 & 825 IN HIS TRIOS LEAGUE

INDIANAPOLIS—An email was received from DJ Powell carrying the news of his recent honor scores of 300 and 825 made in his Wednesday night trios league at Pinheads Bowl in Fishers, IN.

Impressively both honor scores are his career 36th 300 and 17th 800. Powell said he had a run of 19 consecutive strikes stopped by a ringing 10 pin.

Also Powell added, recently he won the 53rd annual Hoosier Deaf Classic with a 6 games 1479 score. This tournament hosted by Indianapolis Deaf Club every year in month of November open to deaf bowlers and CODA (Children of Deaf Adults) that only lives or works in Indiana. His winning score consists games of 258, 258, 225, 242, 237 and 259 and he has clean 72 frames.

Congratulations to DJ for his honor scores and winning the Hoosier Deaf Classic.

Personally I met DJ Powell back in 1992 when I was directing the first bowling venue in the U.S. Deaf Sports Festival at California School for Deaf in Fremont. DJ was a 15 years old teenager from Pennsylvania entering in the Deaf Team USA Tryouts at nearby Mowry Bowl. He was carrying 185 league average at that time and that made me curious for a deaf bowler that age..

During the practice sessions I watched him bowl and was surprised that he was smooth and well trained in bowling fundamentals. So I thought in a couple of years or so if properly led right, he could be the next deaf ABC Star of Tomorrow like Mark Fisser. But my thought were dashed when I found out that he was not longer in the Junior ranks because he left and joined as ABC member to bowl in adult leagues.

Apparently he got bored bowling with the kids and wanted to bowl with higher average bowlers. In growing up, I am not surprised that he had that many 300s and 800s.

DEAF FRANK GALLO ONCE LOST TO ROBIN ROMEO IN NY

The last week's front page Robin Romeo Story struck me to recall one of Robin's conquest in New York in which she beat a deaf New York bowler Frank Gallo, Jr. It happened in a mixed doubles tournament that drew top male and female bowlers.

Robin was in New York for this tournament which had qualifying round that paired top male with top female bowlers and so on for the match plays. The day happened to be Gallo, Jr's day as everything went right for him and he finished as the top male qualifier. The top female (sorry, I could not remember her name. She was the top NY bowler that time.) was the one Frank hoped and wished to be paired with. Robin was paired with a guy named Fleetwood (sorry again I could not recall his first name).

Long story short. Frank and his partner led all the way in the match plays to get in the finals. In the semi finals Fleetwood bowled a 300, so he and Robin got in the position round finals.

That was where Romeo/Fleetwood duo beat Gallo, Jr and his partner for the championship.

CBW Phone Card Donation Deadline Nears

The Essentials of Bowling

Approaching the Perfect Game

CHAPTER 3

The Stance

A proper stance is important because it aims your shot. It also sets up a consistent and effective delivery, ensures effortless transition to the next skill, and positions you to walk correctly, even though a very heavy weight is swinging from one side of your torso. Most important, the correct stance puts your ball *directly on the target line*. A bad stance does none of this.

Okay, let’s get started. You have stepped up onto the approach, have picked your ball up from the return, and are standing on your normal starting spot.

Technique

Look down and note *exactly* where your feet are positioned. Visualize the line your ball will travel, noting which arrow this line passes over.

Stand erect.

Face that arrow (it is your target).

Insert your fingers into the ball as tightly as possible, and then stretch your hand around the ball until the thumb slides easily into place.

Take a deep breath, *relax*, and *focus* on the following elements. Shift all your weight to the foot that corresponds to the hand you’re holding the ball with; use the other foot for balance only. Dip your shoulder *straight down* as far as it will comfortably go. Do not force it down.

Anchor your elbow to your side.

Aim your forearm directly at your target.

Rotate your wrist to position your hand under the ball, but continue to support it with *both* hands.

TIP Of the four basic skills, the stance has the most elements. It may take a while for you to become comfortable with it. Practice it at home, in front of a mirror. It won’t cost you a dime, and the results will be worth it. Training yourself at home will allow you to reduce the number of elements you need in your checklist once you hit the lanes.

Discussion

As you can see, the stance is composed of eleven elements. It is the most complicated of the basic skills. No kidding! The **SPARE** system is so easy that the most complicated thing you’re going to have to learn is how to stand still properly. The following comments explain why every single one of these elements is vital.

Position your feet. For any of your skills to be useful, they must be repeatable. The lane’s approach area is designed as it is for this very reason: to allow you to make the *precise* location of your stance repeatable.

A bowling alley is 41–42 inches wide and consists of 39 boards side by side. The boards that make up the approach are lined up with the boards of the lane. Markers in the form of dots are built into the approach area so that you can easily note exactly which boards you have put your feet on. These dots line up with the arrows you will see about fifteen feet beyond the foul line. These arrows are the targets you will aim for, because they are closer than the pins.

The line your ball travels is determined by two points: your starting position and the arrow or other target that you aim for. Obviously, changing either of these points alters this line. Starting at a particular spot and then delivering your ball so that it rolls over a specific target will result in a strike. To repeat the process, you must continue to start at that exact spot and roll your ball over the same target.

TIP Changing where you stand is the most common adjustment bowlers need to make as lane conditions change. Keep things simple; alter your starting position while aiming for the same target on the lane. Moving your stance to the left brings the ball to the right side of the pins; moving it to the right brings the ball to the left side of the pins. This is how you zero in on the pocket—by moving the position of your stance one board at a time. This concept is also used for making spares.

TIP Since precision is so important to any skill, it is helpful to draw a line on the toe of the weight-bearing shoe. This line lets you quickly position your stance in exactly the same spot time after time. A dot will suffice, but a line also gives you a sense of direction.

Visualize your line. This element establishes your target line. It is what practice shots (sometimes called shadow balls) are for, so that you can see how your ball will track once competition begins. Learning to visualize this line is a huge step forward for any bowler. It develops and strengthens your mental game. It takes your mind off distractions and puts your focus where it belongs: on your technique. This element becomes easier with practice.

Stand erect. An upright stance allows you to be smooth and relaxed at the beginning of your approach. It also helps prevent “rushing the foul line.”

The sports of track and field and scuba diving teach that the feet follow the head. To run faster, lean forward. To dive, point your head down. In bowling, crouching over in your stance leads to the head getting in front of the feet. The feet will naturally try to catch up and cause you to rush the shot. When this happens, you will feel that your timing is off. This is a common symptom of being tired and is easily cured by standing up straighter in your stance.

Face the target. This element is invaluable, because it aims *you*. It determines the *proper direction* of your delivery. Squaring

your shoulders to the target every time squares *you* to your target every time. This component of the stance helps ensure consistent accuracy.

Grip the ball. You cannot deliver consistent shots without a secure grip on the ball. Nothing will destroy your concentration faster than feeling the ball start to slip off your hand prematurely. Two things determine the security of your grip: fit and friction.

Good fit comes from having a ball custom drilled specifically for you by people who know what they’re doing. Have this done by a qualified professional, ideally at the bowling center at which you compete. Please note: a ball that fits poorly may cause blisters. These can quickly rupture, begin to bleed, and lead to an infection. You do not want that.

Friction is a different matter altogether. Keep your hands dry by judicious use of a cotton towel, and always have a rosin bag handy. (Blowing gently into the thumbhole can help too!)

In addition to controlling fit and friction, you have to develop a consistent routine when you are up on the approach. You must learn to put your hand into the ball the same way each and every time. This helps to ensure that the hand comes out of the ball the same way each and every time. This is an example of how a good stance complements the other skills. The grip created here enhances the certainty of a reliable release later.

Start by placing your fingers into the ball as deeply and as tightly as possible. Why? Again, it’s about being consistent. Tight fingers = consistent release; loose fingers = inconsistent release. Simple! The next step is to stretch your hand around the ball until the thumb can easily be inserted into the thumbhole. If necessary, test your grip by hanging the ball at your side and swinging it back and forth a few times to make sure it doesn’t slip. If it does, dry your hand with a towel, apply some rosin, and start over.

TIP *Never* leave your thumb inside the ball while waiting for someone else to bowl. It quickly begins to perspire. Excessive moisture acts as a lubricant and *will* compromise your grip.

Take a deep breath. You have completed the preliminaries of your stance. You are positioned. Now you must set up your delivery. Taking a deep breath at this point relaxes your body. Tension causes bad shots by making you “choke.” With tension gone and nerves under control, it is easier to focus on what you need to do next. One deep breath—it may seem unimportant, but it makes a big difference.

Put your weight on one foot (the right foot for right-handed bowlers; the left foot for left-handed bowlers). This element of your stance is a consistency insurance policy. It guarantees that you will always take your first step with the same foot. Try it. Put all your weight on one foot, lean forward, and see which foot moves first automatically, without your thinking about it. This is critical when your concentration is blown because you need one more strike for your first 300 game. It is one less thing you have to worry about.

This *one-footed* stance also helps you to walk straighter during your delivery, making certain that the ball stays on its line. Here’s how. If your weight is distributed on both feet, your first step requires that you shift part of your weight sideways to one foot or the other. Sideways movement is off-line movement. Remember, the efficient and effective delivery *gets the ball on the line and keeps it there* (Recall absolute truth number 3: The ball travels a line toward the pins.).

NOTE This one-footed stance creates a three- or five-step approach. If you use a four-step approach and prefer not to modify your technique, ignore this element. Instead, concentrate on keeping your feet close together. If you are just taking up this sport, I highly recommend developing a five-step approach, because it produces superior results.

Dip your shoulder comfortably. This may be the most crucial part of the stance. Here is a list of the benefits created by this one simple element, all of which will happen automatically.

It clears the path for your armswing. While standing erect, dipping your shoulder *straight down* causes your head to move to that side, while keeping you square with your target line. Your head weighs about ten pounds, so to maintain balance, your hips move in the opposite direction. With your hips out of the way, your arm is now able to swing more like a pendulum. The consistency with which you perform this dip is critical to the pendulum motion. Doing it to a degree of comfort makes it repeatable.

The movement of your head to the side places one eye more directly above the target line. For most people, this will be your dominant eye. This enhances the accuracy of your pushaway by giving you a more direct line of sight down the target line. It’s just like aiming a rifle.

Dipping the shoulder enhances your ability to walk the ball in a straight line. Look at your footprints in the snow or in the sand. You will see that as you move forward, your footprints move from side to side. This is because as you walk, your weight shifts from side to side. If you are shifting side to side, so is the ball. Remember, we want to get the ball on a line and keep it there. Any sideward movement is taboo. Dropping your shoulder changes your sense of equilibrium. You begin placing one foot more directly in front of the other, as if you are walking a tight-rope. You will move straight forward, the ball will move straight forward, and you will have one more reason to visit the beach: to study your footprints in the sand. Life is good.

Dipping your shoulder also enhances the consistency of your delivery by allowing your head to remain steady throughout your approach. Swinging any heavy object from one shoulder naturally pulls that shoulder down. Allowing this to happen during your approach means that your head changes position during your approach. Keeping your head steady is crucial to your ability to concentrate. For this reason alone, it is worth embracing what nature wants and *dip that shoulder* before taking the first step.

Anchor your elbow. Champion archers bring consistency to their shots by drawing the bowstring back and anchoring their hand to the exact same spot on their chin every single time. This principle works for bowling as well. Keeping your elbow anchored tight to your side stabilizes your arm and provides a consistent starting point for your shot.

Aim your forearm. Absolute truth number 3: The ball travels a line toward the pins. Pointing your forearm directly at your target puts the ball on that line. Having the forearm pointing *along* that line ensures that it *stays there* once you begin your approach. Previous elements of the stance have aimed *you*; this one aims *the ball*.

Keep your hand under the ball. This element is a minor one but is important because it sets up your arm to swing like a pendulum, keeping the ball on its intended target line. Remember to continue to support the ball with both hands. You are now fully prepared to initiate your approach.

P.S. No mention is made of *how high* to hold the ball in the stance. This is a matter of personal strength and comfort. Ball height during your stance is important because gravity will be used to produce the speed of your shot, not muscle power. I discuss this as part of your next skill, the pushaway.

TIP Once you are in your stance, run through a mental checklist to ensure a uniform posture from frame to frame. This not only promotes the consistency of the remainder of your actual delivery but it also engages your mind to take control at this point. The most important elements of this checklist are weight on one foot, shoulder dipped, forearm aimed at the target, and hand under the ball.

PBA PLAYERS HEAD TO ROUND 1 JAPAN CUP TO CLOSE CALENDAR YEAR 2012

JAPAN — A field of 20 invited PBA Tour players will join a field that includes more than 100 Japan and Korean PBA members for the renewal of the Round 1 Japan Cup in Tokyo Nov. 30-Dec. 2, the final tournament of the calendar year.

After a two-year absence, the Japan Cup returns twice in the extended 2012-13 PBA Tour season. The second Round 1 Japan Cup of the expanded season is scheduled for Nov. 28-30, 2013. As of Jan. 1, 2014, all PBA competition returns to a calendar year schedule.

Sandwiched in between the Japan Cups will be another PBA International Tour event in Japan, the DHC International Championships, Jan. 17-19, at Inazawa Grand Bowl in Aichi-ken.

The Round 1 Japan Cup 2012 will feature invited PBA Tour players (**Chris Barnes, Dom Barrett, Jason Belmonte, Josh Blanchard, Parker Bohn III, Ryan Ciminelli, Norm Duke, Mike Fagan**, defending champion **Tommy Jones, Mika Koivuniemi, Wes Malott, Amleto Monacelli, Bill O'Neill, Rhino Page, Osku Palermaa, Sean Rash, Ryan Shafer, Pete Weber, Stuart Williams and Walter Ray Williams Jr.**) Williams will make his 26th Japan Cup appearance, keeping his streak alive as the only bowler who has competed in every Japan Cup.

PBA fans can follow the action through "live scoring" on pba.com. The finals will be taped for airing on ESPN on Sunday, Jan. 20, at 3 p.m. ET. The winner will earn roughly \$75,000 along with a PBA International Tour title.

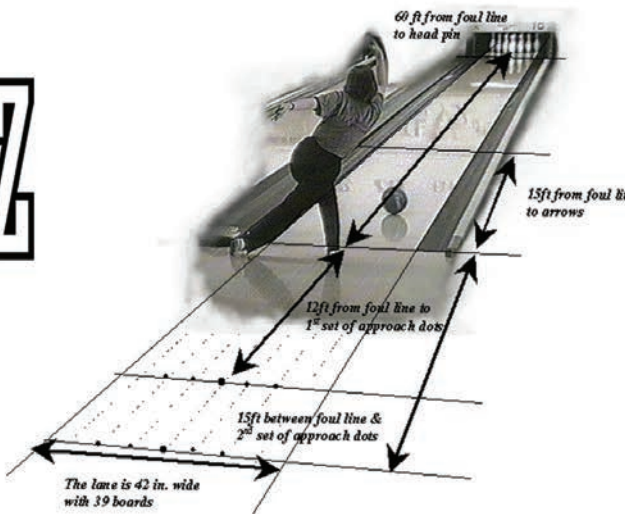

Ashley Dunn Wins U18 Girls Teen Masters World Championship Title!



Red Rock Lanes - Las Vegas, Nevada. On November 10th, 2012 **Ashley Dunn of Palmdale, CA** accomplished a feat that will likely make her name forever synonymous with **Teen Masters Champion**.

As you may recall, in August of this year Ashley won an unprecedented third consecutive Teen Masters National Championship. With wins in 2010 & 2011 in the Girls U14 Division Championships, and then in her first ever appearance competing in the Girls U18 Division she

dominated the tournament from the qualifying rounds in Cleveland, Ohio all the way to becoming the only competitor to go undefeated in round-robin match play during the Championship Finals in New York. Ashley's total domination of the Championship match compelled Xtra Frame's Mike J. Laneside and guest commentators to call the match over after only the third frame of game two, in what was scheduled to be a best two out of three competition. Their call proved to be accurate as Ashley threw strikes in the first seven frames, eliminating any chance of her opponent, 18 year old Haley Rubin, forcing a game three. Now to Red Rock Lanes, where on November 9th & 10th, 2012 the Teen Masters held it's first ever International Competition, The Teen Masters World Series, an event sanctioned by the World Tenpin Bowling Association (WTBA). Gary Beck, the founder of the Teen Masters idea was to hold this first ever Teen Masters World Series in conjunction with the PBA's World Series of Bowling finals. His premise was to lure International Competitive Youth bowlers to Las Vegas to compete for their own World Championship, and get to mingle with and watch the Pros from around the world in action at the same time. That is why the event is listed as November 9 - 11, because the participants had special seating at the taping of the PBA's WSOB stepladder finals for both Saturday afternoon and all day Sunday.

The event attracted high caliber male & female youth competitors from four countries aside from the United States. Australia sent the largest contingent with female representatives from their National team, a version of our Junior Team USA. The tournament format consisted of six games bowled on the long 42' sport pattern, six games bowled on the short 35' sport pattern, then 6 games bowled on mixed pairs where the left lane was conditioned with the long pattern and the right lane conditioned with the short. After those 18 games a cut was made to the top six male and female competitors for six games of match play on the mixed pairs that awarded 30 bonus pins for a win. The venue for the match play round was moved from Red Rock's open lanes to the lanes in their VIP Room.

Ashley entered the round of six in second, but only 17 pins out of the lead. Much like her Teen Masters Tournaments of the past it was match play where she really excelled. She went 5 - 1 in match play firing off games of 198, 221, 237, **174 (3 pin loss)**, 235, and 179 to take the World Championship title by an amazing 203 pins! Her average during match play was the highest in the field, even higher than any of the male competitors. **FOUR CONSECUTIVE TEEN MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS!** Like recent Teen Masters competitions this was a restricted equipment tournament. Competitors were only allowed to use an Ebonite Innovate, Ebonite Cyclone, and a plastic spare ball of their choice.

Ashley would like to thank the California Bowling News for continuing to publish her accomplishments, her coach Mark Baker for helping her continuously improve her game, Will Wilson her ball technician & advisor for great layouts and lane play advice, and Ebonite International for great products and their increasingly strong support of Youth Bowling.

You never cease to amaze me Ashley. I am so proud of you!

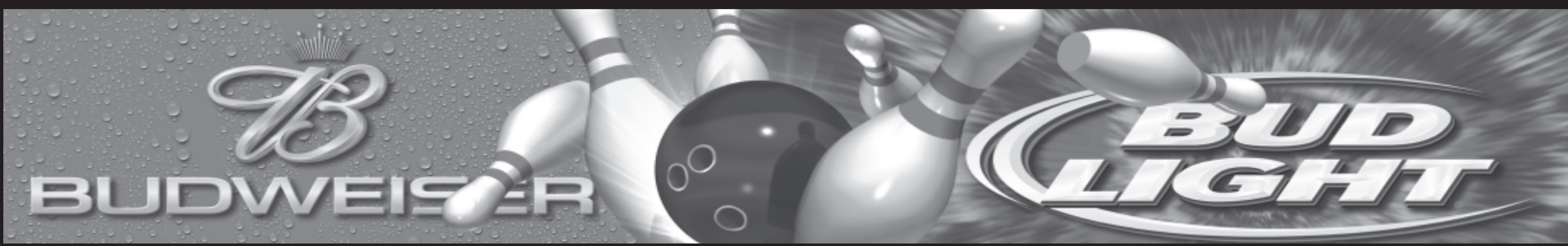
