

among the top-10 earners during the calendar year. Any player with multiple titles during the year is automatically added to the ballot.

2023 CHRIS SCHENKEL PBA PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD NOMINEES

Jason Belmonte — Australia

Title (1): PBA Tournament of Champions

Other notes: Runner-up at World Championship (lost to EJ Tackett); Won Super Slam Cup (non-title event); Shot televised 300 game at Tour Finals (first player with three TV 300 games in title events)

The seven-time and reigning Player of the Year finished third in points (23,180), earnings (\$338,825), and fourth in average (221.02). Belmonte's eight top-10 and 13 top-25 finishes in 17 events were also top four on Tour.

Belmonte's improbable comeback at the Tournament of Champions marked his lone title of the season. He nearly brought home a second major title at the World Championship, in a similar come-from-behind fashion, but fell in the final frame to Tackett.

Jakob Butturff — Tempe, Ariz.

Title (1): PBA Scorpion Championship

Other notes: Runner-up at PBA Players Championship presented by Snickers (lost to Kevin McCune)

Butturff led all left-handers and finished third overall on Tour in average (223.43), third in top-10 finishes (9), fourth in points (20,450) and fourth in earnings (\$175,125).

After a midseason lull, he notched seven consecutive top-eight finishes from the Cheetah Championship through the Tour Finals. During that stretch, he tallied his first title since 2019 at the Scorpion Championship.

Packy Hanrahan — Wichita, Kan.

Titles (2): PBA Kokomo Classic, Roth/Holman Doubles Championship (with Mitch Hupé)

Three players won multiple titles in 2023: Tackett, Simonsen, and Packy Hanrahan. In a breakout season of his own, the two-handed lefty bested Ogle to win the Kokomo Classic, then dominated the Roth/Holman Doubles Championship with Mitch Hupé to tally Hanrahan's first two career titles.

Despite a slow start to the 2023 campaign, Hanrahan ranked fourth on Tour in top-five finishes (5), sixth in points (16,060) and ninth in earnings (\$98,100).



Kevin McCune — Munster, Ind.

Title (1): PBA Players Championship presented by Snickers

The 2022 Rookie of the Year runner-up scoffed at the idea of a sophomore slump. McCune ranked sixth on Tour in earnings (\$141,300) and eighth in points (14,357).

McCune took down Zac and EJ Tackett, Simonsen, and Butturff to capture his Players Championship crown. That win made the McCunes the first threegeneration PBA Tour champion family, as Kevin followed in the footsteps of his grandfather, Don, and father, Eugene.

Matt Ogle — Louisville, Ky.

Title (1): Shark Championship

Other notes: Runner-up at Kokomo Classic (lost to Packy Hanrahan) and Roth/Holman Doubles Championship (lost to Packy Hanrahan and Mitch Hupé with partner Sean Rash); Finished 2nd at PBA SKILL Ball Challenge (non-title event; lost to Dom Barrett)

A true breakout season, in which he captured his first career singles title and second overall, resulted in Ogle's first appearance on the Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year ballot. The 39-year-old ranked fifth on Tour in points (16,995) and seventh in earnings (\$114,200). He racked up four top-five and nine top-25 finishes in his 13 title events.

Ogle's season could have been even greater had title matches in Indiana (against Packy Hanrahan) and Delaware (against Hanrahan and Mitch Hupé) gone in his favor.

Anthony Simonsen — Las Vegas

Titles (3): PBA Wichita Classic, USBC Masters, Storm PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles (with Danielle McEwan)

Other notes: Finished top-10 in all 17 events; Finished top-4 in all five majors; Runner-up at Jackson Classic (lost to EJ Tackett)

The 26-year-old reached new heights during the 2023 season. He finished top 10 in all 17 title events, leading the Tour in games (508), top-five finishes (13), top-10 finishes (17), top-25 finishes (17), and cashes (17). He ranked second in points (36,265), earnings (\$347,500) and titles (3).

Perhaps the strongest way to exemplify Simonsen's excellence is by his lowlights: His lowest finish of the season was 10th at the Springfield Classic; his lowest major finish was fourth at the U.S. Open and Players Championship.

The highlight of Simonsen's season came during his second consecutive USBC Masters triumph, which included a 34-strike 845 series to clinch the No. 1 seed and a new match-play record with a 250.4 average for his 18 games.

EJ Tackett — Bluffton, Ind.

Titles (5): U.S. Open presented by Go Bowling!, PBA Shawnee Classic, PBA Jackson Classic, PBA Cheetah Championship, PBA World Championship presented by Pabst Blue Ribbon

Other notes: Earned No. 1 seed at four majors (first player to achieve this feat in PBA history); Runner-up at TOC (lost to Jason Belmonte) and Scorpion Championship (lost to Jakob Butturff); Shot televised 300 game at Super Slam Cup Finals (non-title event)

The 2016 Player of the Year turned in the best season of his career thus far. Tackett led the Tour in points (41,200), earnings (\$458,450), average (227.18), titles (5), major titles (2), and runner-up finishes (2).

Tackett earned the No. 1 seed in four of five major championships this season - the U.S. Open, Tournament of Champions, World Championship and Players Championship — becoming the first player in PBA history to accomplish that feat.

All in all, Tackett won five titles during the 2023 campaign, beginning with a Triple Crown-clinching victory at the U.S. Open presented by Go Bowling!

Kyle Troup — Taylorsville, N.C.

Title (1): PBA Tour Finals

Other notes: Runner-up at U.S. Open (lost to EJ Tackett)

The 2021 Player of the Year ranked fifth on Tour in earnings (\$145,400) and 12th in points, while notching five top-five and 10 top-25 finishes in 17 title events.

Troup's Tour Finals title in June — which brought his career total to 10 titles and made him PBA Hall of Fame-eligible - and U.S. Open runner-up finish highlighted his 2023 season.

The 2023 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year award winner will be announced during the week of Dec. 4.

2023 HARRY GOLDEN PBA ROOKIE OF THE YEAR AWARD NOMINEES

Ramsey Basurto — Rancho Palos Verdes, Calif.

Basurto, the eldest of the five Rookie of the Year finalists, closed the season with a season-high 25th-place finish in the Players Championship. He finished third among rookies in points (2,340) and fourth in earnings (\$4,000) and average (207.03).

Andrew Hall — Westborough, Mass.

Hall finished fifth among all rookies in points (1,280), earnings (\$3,200) and average (205.36) this season. The 25-year-old Massachusetts native tallied his best performance of the season in March, finishing 18th at the Kokomo Classic.

Dallas Leong — Las Vegas

No rookie started the 2023 campaign stronger than Leong, who finished in 19th place in the season-opening U.S. Open. Leong advanced to match play at the USBC Masters as well, and was the lone rookie to tally three top-50 finishes in major championships.

Leong ranked second among rookies in points (2,375) and earnings (\$5,550) while finishing third in average (207.93).

Cortez Schenck — Phoenix

Schenck led all rookies in points (3,465), earnings (\$11,800), average (215.02), and top-25 finishes this season. He closed the campaign with his two strongest performances: 10th place in the Roth/Holman Doubles Championship and 24th in the Players Championship.

While Schenck bowled in two events during the 2022 season, the 2023 season is considered his rookie season by PBA rules because he bowled fewer than three events during the 2022 season.

Nate Stubler — LaSalle, III.

Stubler, the top left-handed rookie, notched the lone top-five finish of any rookie this season. He brought home a fifth-place finish with Breanna Clemmer at the Storm PBA/PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles tournament in July.

The 25-year-old finished second among all rookies in average (210.40), third in earnings (\$5,000) and fourth in points (1,817).

To Subscribe, Or Not To Subscribe

My first yearly subscription to Bowlers Journal International had to be in about 1970. Most of those years were complimentary, as they were included with my PBA membership; and later with three multi-unit bowling center operators, where I was the marketing arm that provided information in the form of news releases to the Chicago-based (and now Arlington) publication.

In the past couple of years, I had become disillusioned with the new format and content provided by the Bowlers Journal. There are still writers and columns that I enjoy; namely, "Yesteryear," by J.R. Schmidt, and "The One Board," with Jef Goodger. But overall, the format and content of the magazine does not impress.

The result of the above comments brought me to the topic of this week's article. Since the magazine was available for free on the internet, I decided not to subscribe in 2023, because the above mentioned authors could always be viewed online. That was back in January of 2023. Then a few months ago I received a rare email from J.R. Schmidt:

"My piece in the next Bowlers Journal is about Don Glover. I vaguely remembered his spinning-ball trick but didn't have the details until I ran across one of your articles. So naturally, I gave you credit in my article."

The article of mine that Jake was referring to appeared in most publications in April or May of 2019. While doing a bit of searching for a Leanne Barrette-Hulsenberg thank you letter that she wrote to me following the U.S. Open tournament at AMF Major League Lanes in Winston-Salem, N.C., I stumbled upon another piece of memorabilia... a 1960's era autographed photo of professional bowler Don Glover.

Don was born in Arizona but spent most of his early life in Bakersfield, Calif., where he excelled in both golf and bowling during his high school years. When the golf coach learned that Don had received money from a professional bowling tournament in Fresno, and would no longer be eligible for golf, Glover decided to concentrate on bowling.


Glover was an immediate success on the tour and signed with the Ebonite Pro Staff. Primo Liberatore, proprietor of our small bowling center in Sebastopol, Calif., was always looking to promote the center and booked Glover for an exhibition during a swing he made in Northern California. Glover spent the day at L & L Lanes, autographing photos, conducting clinics, bowling an exhibition against the top "lefties" in our area, and wrapping up the day with some trick shots.

The trick that Don Glover made famous was called the spinning ball top. As I mentioned in the article from 2019: "Now I don't know if it was because the lanes had just been resurfaced, or if there were specific weights that he had placed in the bowling ball, or just what the reason... but he set the ball on the lane and spun it very fast, like a top, and gave it a slight nudge."

"Next, he went to the lounge and ordered a draft beer, as the ball continued its journey on the lane. Back and forth the ball would go, edging closer and closer to the pins, but never going into the gutters. About halfway through his beer, Glover came out to inspect the progress of the bowling ball as it had reached the pins."

"He returned to the lounge, and the ball began a journey back to the foul line! Once he had finished his beer, Glover returned to the lanes and the ball had almost returned to its original location at the foul line. I tried for years to duplicate this trick and was able to match the spinning ball maneuver which prevented the ball from entering the gutter most of the time, but was never able to conquer the 'approach-to-pins-and-back-again' activity."

In Schmidt's article, he expanded upon the emergence, and mysterious disap-

"It hasn't been mentioned, but Glover was a left-handed bowler," writes Schmidt. "In 1971, when complaints were being heard that lefties had an unfair advantage, the PBA took steps to address the problem. Glover later admitted that the controversy bothered him. His prize winnings shrank."

Schmidt continues, "In 1974, Glover suddenly disappeared from the tour. He resurfaced in Bakersfield, bowling in local house leagues. Rumors swirled. The reasons for Glover's abrupt departure were not fully revealed until he spoke to the Bowlers Journal staff seven years later, when he was featured on the cover

pearance, of Don Glover. He began his pro bowling career in 1968. While all of the top pro's were in Akron, Ohio, for the Firestone Tournament of Champions, the PBA staged a concurrent tournament for non-champions in St. Louis, according to Schmidt. Glover won the event for his first pro title. He won again in November at Joliet, III., this time competing against a full strength field.

Schmidt resumes, "Glover continued on into January 1969, defeating Don Mc-Cune on national TV at Tempe, Arizona. He won a month later at Kansas City, Missouri. And in April, in his first appearance in the ABC Tournament, his Wrist Masters team captured the Classic Division Team championship."

Bowlers Journal named Glover to the All-America team that year, but it was in 1970 at the ABC Masters tournament that Glover was at his best. Schmidt continues: "Glover moved through his first four matches, until Bob Strampe dumped him into what was known as the losers bracket. Then Glover rebounded and won two more matches, to advance to the finals against the winners bracket survivor — Bob Strampe. Now needing to defeat Strampe twice, Glover rose to the occasion. He won both the matches and became the 1970 Masters champion."

In my article from 2019, I wondered whatever happened to Don Glover. I learned from searching the internet that Don had passed away in 1998, at the tender age of 51, and that his memory had been immortalized in Bakersfield with the formation of the Don Glover Masters Tournament. Schmidt's further investigation provides more answers to what happened.

of the August 1981 issue."

It seems that the PBA had placed Glover on probation for writing bad checks, according to Schmidt. "Glover said that he didn't know the checks would bounce," writes Schmidt. "He said his sponsor had been cheating him out of money. Then later that same year, Glover banged against a ball return, causing a logo plate to drop off and distract another bowler making his delivery."

Words were exchanged, according to Schmidt, and the PBA Tournament Committee elected to suspend Glover for a period of one year. After that, Glover returned to his roots in Arizona, and he became the proprietor of a 12 lane bowling center in Show Low, a small town about 180 miles northeast of Phoenix.

When I went to the internet to view the Schmidt article, I discovered that free access was no longer available, so because of great historical articles like the one prepared by J.R. Schmidt, I decided to renew my subscription. Discretion is the better part of valor...


