Back in the Winner's Circle

VERNON HILLS, IL-Jason Couch snapped a 42-event winless streak and captured his 12th career Denny's PBA Tour title Sunday as he defeated Joe Ciccone, 217-204, in the title match of the 2005 Chicago Classic at Hawthorn Lanes.

Couch overcame a slow start in which he struck just twice over his first five frames, by striking in frames 6-8. Ciccone, who struck in five of his first six frames, opened the door for Couch with a devastating open in the 9th, when he left the 4-6-7 split.

"You don't get that chance out here ever, so you have to take advantage of that," said Couch (Clermont, Fla.), who earned \$40,000 and an exemption for the 2006-07 season.

The left-hander did take advantage of the situation. Need-ing to mark in the 10th, Couch struck out to capture his first Tour title since 2003.

Couch, who used an Ebonite The One strike ball, advanced to the title match with a 235-232 semifinal win over 22-time title winner Norm Duke. Couch struck on seven shots, none more important than his final shot of the 10th frame, which put Couch in his 24th career title match. Duke was making his third televised finals appearance of the season.

In the other semifinal, Ciccone defeated 30-time title winner Parker Bohn III, 224-200. Ciccone struck in three of his final four frames, forcing Bohn to double in the 10th. Bohn left a 7-9 split on his first shot in the 10th, giving Ciccone his first career win on TV.

Ciccone (Buffalo, N.Y.) earned \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Duke (Clermont,



Fla.) and Bohn (Jackson, N.J.) earned \$10,000 for their respec-

tive 3rd and 4th place finishes. The Denny's PBA Tour moves to Hammond, Ind., for the 2005 BowlersParadise.com Classic, Nov. 30-Dec. 4 at Stardust Bowl I. The nationally televised ESPN finals take place Sunday, Dec. 4 at 1 p.m. EST.

Racette & Austin High Roller Senior Champs

LAS VEGAS, NV—Hang around a Senior tournament long enough and you will hear many complaints of aches and pains. Especially in a High Roller senior event where, although the format is a short 4-gamer, players can bowl up to 30 games in just a few days.

Ken Racette, 58 year old from San Diego, is a High Roller veteran, in fact a 2-time champ as he started the tournament. Over the years, Racette has participated in 61 previous High Roller events despite some nagging injuries. However, watching him grimace at the foul line, the crowd was witnessing a gutsy performance.

He had apparently pulled a groin muscle in an earlier match and was in obvious discomfort. Couldn't tell that by his scores though - or the \$25,000 winner's check! Racette not only "got through" the final matches but seemed to strike at will, firing a pair of 269's back to back against Mike Larsen in the semis and Kerry Painter in the title match enroute to his 3rd title.

In the high scoring affair, Racette actually could have lost! The 2005 Senior "A Game" champ Kerry Painter stared at a 4-9 split to lose 269-268! The

53 year old from Henderson, Nevada, picked up the \$12,500 runner-up prize. Just coming off of his "A Game" win in August, Painter made a strong charge at High Roller Player-Of-The-Year.

Mike Larsen, 57 years old from Gardenia, California, lost to Racette in the semi-final game 269-258 in another barn burner. He then bowled David Chew from Brentwood, California in the consolation match for 3rd & 4th places. Chew, 56 years old, lost to Painter 238 to 234 in another great semis matchup. Chew, a former runner-up in another Senior Classic defeated Larsen 238 to 234 to claim 3rd place and \$7,500. Larsen took home \$5,000 for 4th place.

Earlier in the week, Joe Austin, from Freeport, Long Island, NY, won the 60 & Over Classic, defeating Anthony Calarco, from Alconguin, Illinois 205 -182. Austin picked up \$10,000 with Calarco getting \$5,000.

Pacific Bowler publisher Joe Lyou remembers Mallard and his wife Pauline a great pair who did a lot for bowlng.





TORRANCE—Welcome once again to the junior roundup from Gable House Bowl. We hope you all had a great Thanksgiving holiday and are looking forward to the upcoming holiday season. Let's get to this week's scores.

As promised last week, we kick off this week's article with our annual Youth Thanksgiving Scholarship Tournament. A field of 13 bowlers took to the lanes for the first qualifying round. High scores came from Scott Santos with the tournament high game 278-204, Brandon Mullikin 225, Andrew Fontenot 215-209, and Matt Simon 209. After the first three games, Scott Santos pulled down the top seed with a 639 scratch/693 handicap series. Amanda McInerney qualified second with 555/690. Kavleigh Gates the third qualifier with 515/689. The fourth and final qualifier was Brandon "Don't call me 'Mulligan" Mullikin at 569/683. The first match in the stepladder finals featured thirdseeded Kayleigh Gates, coming off tying for first place at the Memorial Day Tournament, taking on number-four seed Brandon Mullikin, coming off his boys' division win at the WWPB Mission Hills Open Junior Pro-Am. Both bowlers wanted to show their recent success was no fluke, but it was Brandon who came out swinging and looking for the early knockout as he started the match with the first seven strikes. Kayleigh managed a turkey in frames 5-7 and the first two strikes in the tenth frame, but Brandon's turkey in the tenth would seal the match by a final score of 257/295-183-241

Action shifted from lanes 1-2 to 3-4 for our semifinal match pitting Brandon against numbertwo seed Amanda McInerney. Mullikin again tried for a fast start with a double before opening three times over the next four frames. McInerney had similar problems, opening the match with two splits over her first four frames. Amanda was never able to get out of the gate, and a double in the ninth and tenth frames would be enough to punch Brandon's ticket to the finals by a score of 169/207-140/ 185

The final match went back to lanes 1-2 as Mullikin faced off with top seed Scott Santos. The shot moved around just a bit as Brandon alternated spares and strikes for the first five frames before opening in the sixth. Santos started off with a spare before firing a turkey to take an early lead. Mullikin never reclaimed his first match dominance as he opened three times over the final five frames. Despite a gutter ball-nine count in the fifth frame, Scott came back with four strikes in the final five frames to win the match and the tournament by a final score of 216/234-164/202. The July, 1996 issue of BOWLING THIS MONTH magazine carried an article entitled, "MANAGE YOUR BREAK POINT". It was so popular that requests for back issues emptied the shelves. You'd think every better bowler alive would learn break point techniques to increase strike percentages, wouldn't you? Well wou'd be wrong!

Well, you'd be wrong!

While it is true that many professionals do use break point targeting as a valuable tactic, it seems that even the better amateur tournament bowlers who employ it are in the minority. Among mid range bowlers it seems to be almost non-existent, while those below 150 have never even heard of it.

Why? Shouldn't any tool to help scores be welcomed by all? That's exactly what break point bowling does, no matter what the lane conditions are.

But what is the break point?

Well, it is defined as the point down lane where an already hooking ball begins to actually "break" toward the pocket. So, if you watch the ball's travel down lane, you'll see just where that point is. The reason so few bowlers know about it, is because the normal "house condition" hides many of a bowler's mistakes. So league bowlers have little reason to change.

But anybody who wants maximum improvement, will need to learn to bowl on tough lane conditions...and break point bowling is a huge scoring aid in such conditions!

But...what many house league bowlers don't realize, is that break point targeting is not just a tactic to help overcome difficult lane conditions; it also helps raise averages for those who use it in today's high scoring conditions. So it's a win-win situation for all!

A QUICK BACKGROUND

I have been teaching break point techniques since the early 1980's, but never knew whose idea it was. It was taught to me by a pro, who used it successfully. It has been helping bowlers ever since, although at first I had to overcome the resistance of many who didn't think such a thing would work. Later, I learned that long time coach Sam Baca was the originator of the break point principles. He's the one who deserves kudos for originally coming up with its principles.

GETTING TO THE POINT (THE BREAK POINT)

One of the Baca's main revelations was one which had also been hard for me to swallow when it was first taught to me, but is actually true. That is, that several successfully striking bowlers, although each may be using a different line, will nevertheless *all have the same break point on the same lane!* So if one bowler is using a deep inside line, the second one a mid-lane line and the third points the ball from the far outside, a 'down-and-in' shot, the successful break point will be the same for all (see illustration 1).

Difficult though it may be to believe at first, this turns out to be oh so true in actual play! The reason? The strike creating break point on a given lane bed is actually determined by the lane condition, <u>not</u> the bowler's lane play area!

Notice that in illustration 1 the balls of all three players, regardless of which part of the lane they play, *have virtually the same break point to pocket*! Just another reason for the importance of break point targeting.

REACHING FOR IMPROVEMENT

Baca also pointed out that one of the reasons some bowlers reject the principles of break point targeting, is that they perceive it as a major change, and they'd rather stay in their "comfort zone". We've discussed this defeatist attitude before. To succeed, bowlers must be willing to *stretch their comfort zone*...not to hide in it! This is true in all sports!

But there are legitimate reasons some bowlers have initial difficulty utilizing break point principles. Some find it difficult to visualize a target so far down lane. We'll explain how to overcome this. Since there are always several possible break points that will get ball to pocket, some bowlers just flat don't understand that every such break point may not be the one which will get the strike. It must be remembered that you didn't necessarily get robbed if a pocket hit didn't strike. Just hitting the pocket is no guarantee.

Then there are those who don't realize what was just mentioned above...that the location of the optimum break point which will create the strike is *not* determined by which line the bowler happens to be using...but by the lane condition! So that when the lanes change, that break point also changes...and the bowler must be aware of that.

THE HOW TO...THE TARGET METHOD



The other way takes a bit longer, but is just as successful. Test shots to find the line is always a good start. That knowledge is a short cut to finding the best starting position and launch angle, which will get your ball to the pocket without over skidding or rolling out. Remember...*how* the ball hits the pocket is critical. And hitting the break point is the best way!

Remember, the most important single trait in bowling; *repeat-ability!* This never changes! Without it nobody can be accurate enough to be successful, especially in break point bowling. So practice accuracy.

Break point tageting can become your savior, especially in tough lane conditions. Why? Because getting your ball to that optimum target eliminates the lane condition from the picture.

MAKING IT EASIER

The new Brunswick(R) AnvilProTM lanes feature a cleverly thought out aid for targeting break points. Target strips are imprinted into the surface down lane in the general area where balls usually reach their break point. These are called RANGEFINDERS and there are four of them. They are light brown, making them easier to see. Each is 36 inches long and one board wide. They are strategically placed as follows (see illustration 3): The two closest ones to the bowler are on the 15 boards (one each on the left and right sides). They run from 34 feet to 37 feet down lane. The two more distant ones are each on the 10 board (also right and left sides) and run from 40 to 43 feet down lane.

Think of these markings sort of like landmarks to identify an *area* into which to place your break point target. They are aptly called Rangefinders. They make it so much easier to locate your break point. Who knows? If they're smart, other manufacturers may follow suit with similar sight points down lane.

STILL SKEPTICAL?

In 1994, Norm Duke, still one of the greatest champions today after about 24 years on the tour, said that after years of learning how to read a lane he could now use break point targeting and throw the shot the *lane wants*!

Once Gary Dickinson, one of the winningest senior tour players ever, when asked why he was watching players on the next pair of lanes, said he was watching the highest scoring bowlers to find out where their break point was.

He found out. He won the tournament.

This Month's Rolf-ism

The instant you finish your follow through... FREEZE! Then check your position. Any mistakes become obvious.

Here's how I teach this targeting concept: It's obviously more difficult to hit a target in the break point area (approximately 35 or 45 feet away) than 14 feet out where the arrows are. The fact that most lane beds have no markings at that distance makes it even tougher. One way to make it easier is to visualize a target at that distance. Another, is to provide a target *area* rather than expecting to hit a specific board so far away. So I created an imaginary square, 6 boards wide and deep (about 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches) to be visualized at the intended break point. This larger area is easier to get the ball into. That was (and is) the target (see illustration 2).

As with any target, the bulls eye is in the center, a one board wide dot which will gain the highest strike percentage. Getting the ball farther away from the center will yield a lower percentage of strikes, but anywhere within that target will always score better than missing it altogether. Obviously, if the bowler has chosen the wrong break point area for the condition, that break point could be hit all day long and still not score well, even though the ball may find the pocket.


