Annaliza Agoncillo Wins \$10,900 in ABTA at Cal

LAKEWOOD — Our Annual Thanksgiving Event at Cal Bowl surely didn't lack excitement and fun in our 4-day Thanksgiving event. We saw 518 entrants come out to vie for the First Prize of \$5,250—\$13,000 and support the ABTA across the 4 days.

We had a semi tough shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +93 (men) and +62 (women) on Wednesday. Thursday was +71 (men) and +58 (women). Friday +60 (men) and +47 (women). On Saturday the cut was +61 (men) and +28 (women). Re-entry cut on Saturday was +61 (men) and +39 (women). The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 3 female) Carla Sanchez (+42), (tie) Bobbie McCollum (+2), Dodie Sajonas (+2), Adam Drozd (+62), Manny Loria (+60), Romy Cajucum (+59). Super Seniors are men 63 and over. For the women you just need to be a young 55.

That would give us 103 bowlers making it to the semi-finals. The Tourney Hi Qualifier for the Men was Thomas Licauco with a +154. For the women, it was Gina Velarde with a +92. Each of them will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week the top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$844. Thomas drew a 479.

We had 4 bowlers that

bowled this score during the qualifying squads. They were Art Alvarez, Derick Brown, Leon Bradford, and Nemesio Tagalag. They each got \$211. We will estimate the Match Series at \$300 at Oak Tree Lanes event.

The roll for the 3-6-9 this week went to Virgil Hilvano worth \$2,100. Unfortunately, he missed on the final shot and received a consolation of \$100, which will make the pot \$2,200 at Oak Tree Lanes. As a special note, during qualifying we had a bizarre event happen during qualifying on Thursday night. You've heard of people picking up the 7-10 split, but have you heard of anyone getting just the 7-10 on their first shot? Well we saw that happen, by Chris Kelly. He did this during the first frame of his third game.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were William Garrett and David Owens with a 1465 for \$170. Finishing second was Jeff Wu and Kenny Kwan with 1437 for \$150. There were a total of \$1,940 paid out in doubles and 26 paid spots with low to cash of 1347.

In the semis we would see Annaliza Agoncillo lead from start to finish this week. During the first game the top two bowlers were at +56 and +48 with the lows for top +32 making the cut at +18 for the women

BVL Representatives Participate in National Veterans Day Activities

WASHINGTON D.C. — For numerologists, 11-11-11 marks an historical date. However, for the thousands joining in the National Veterans Day ceremony at Arlington Cemetery, it was much more.

November 11, 2011, Veterans Day, was an opportunity to pause and remember the sacrifice of those who have served our country. In a ceremony replete with pomp and tradition - from the 21 gun salute to the wreath laying to the parade of colors -- the day is filled with patriotic symbolism and deep reflection.

As the wind whipped the flags aligning the Amphitheatre at Arlington Cemetery, the crowd turned to watch the specially-appointed Presidential Color Guard to initial the start of the observance. These designees marched in step, carrying the flags of the Veterans Service Organizations of the Veterans Day National Committee.

Representing the Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL) as a member of that committee, was HN Sean Ryan Bridges (USN), currently serving at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center. Bridges carried the American flag in

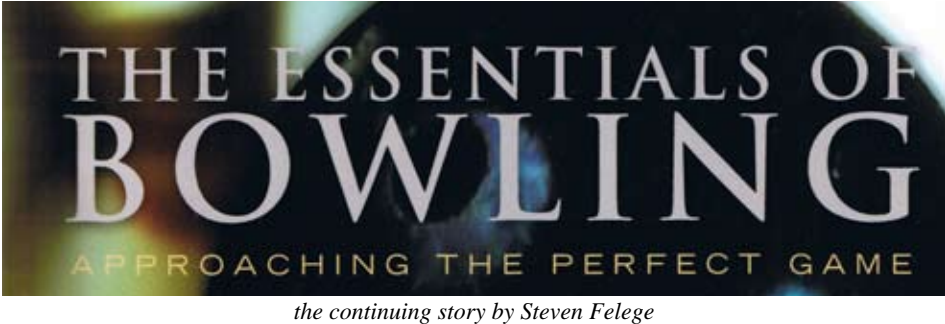

CHAPTER 9

Random Thoughts and Tips

- While developing your game, set realistic goals. Of course, these depend on the skill level from which you begin. Here are some examples starting with novice.
 - Bowl a complete game with no gutter balls.
 - Bowl a complete game without a five-count (or less) on the first ball.
 - Bowl a complete game without a six-count (or less) on the first ball.
 - Bowl a 200 game.
 - Bowl a complete game without an open frame.
 - Bowl a complete game without missing the pocket on the first ball.
 - Bowl a 600 series.
 - Carry a 200 average for the season.
 - Bowl a 700 series.
 - Bowl a 300 game.
 - Bowl an 800 series.
- The skills you have learned from this book will enable you to accomplish *all* of these goals!
- Everyone’s anatomy is unique, so everybody’s delivery will be unique. Perform the skills described in this book to the best of your ability, but remember to stay within your *comfort zone*. If you’re comfortable with what you do, you’ll be consistent at it.
 - Never keep score when practicing. Practice scores are absolutely meaningless and prevent you

- from focusing on training yourself to perform the skills necessary to produce higher scores.
- When competing, ignore the scores until the game is over! It’s hard to do, but allowing yourself to be distracted by paying attention to who’s winning and who’s losing keeps you from focusing on *what* you need to do to *win*!
 - Whether practicing or actually competing, endeavor to learn at least one thing every time you bowl. Don’t be afraid to experiment with your technique. That’s how to find out what works best for you!
 - If something in your technique causes you pain or discomfort of any kind, you are doing it wrong! Change your technique or seek advice from a *qualified* instructor.
 - During the summer months, cross-train by pitching “horseshoes.” Armswing and wrist position are key to success at this sport as well. Oh yeah, it’s fun too!
 - When rolling shadow balls, ignore the pins left behind by the bowler in front of you. Deliver a pocket shot on each lane and then try for a ten-pin and then a seven-pin (especially if there isn’t one there)! This will confuse your opponents! Meanwhile, you are getting comfortable with those shots, while figuring out the lane conditions at the same time!
 - Whatever you do happens inside your head first. Practicing in front of a mirror develops a strong mental imagery of you doing the right things. Until you have developed your skills adequately, avoid watching people bowl badly. Their bad habits are easy to pick up!
 - Except for the effect the stance has on it, your walk to the foul line is not addressed in this book. Your natural stride is just fine. It is comfortable and automatic. Your leg muscles are among the strongest in your body so they behave consistently all by themselves. Adjusting your walk is a *highly* advanced skill, so “If it ain’t broke, don’t fix it!”
 - At the end of your delivery, your slide should end up within six inches of the foul line. Adjust your stance until it is.
 - Besides a ball and shoes, a well-equipped bag will contain the following:
 - A cotton towel to keep your hands dry.
 - A microfiber towel to remove oil and dirt from your ball.
 - A rosin bag to maintain a secure grip.
 - A small bottle of baby powder. Applied to the back of the thumb, it prevents sticking.

- Never apply it to the front of the thumb as it will cause you to lose your grip! Never put this stuff on the floor! Someone will step in it! They may slip, fall and injure themselves!
- A wrist support to prevent wrist injuries and enhance ball control.
 - Various grades of sandpaper to enlarge and smooth the ball’s thumb hole.
 - Ball cleaning solution to clean your ball at the end of the day’s competition. Reactive resin balls absorb oil like a sponge. Clean them with solvent both before and after bowling. This will maintain their performance and extend the life of the ball.
 - You may develop calluses on your fingers or thumb. Use fine-grit sandpaper to keep them under control. The thicker they get, the more likely they are to dry, split, and become painful and infected.
 - To develop your confidence in making spares, play this game:
Frame 1-Deliver one ball for a strike: score 10 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 2-Deliver two balls to knock down nine pins: score 10 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 3-Deliver two balls to knock down eight pins: score 20 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 4-Deliver two balls to knock down seven pins: score 20 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 5-Deliver two balls to knock down six pins: score 30 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 6-Deliver two balls to knock down five pins: score 30 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 7-Deliver two balls to knock down four pins: score 40 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 8-Deliver two balls to knock down three pins: score 40 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 9-Deliver two balls to knock down two pins: score 50 points for success; otherwise, 0.
Frame 10-Deliver one ball to knock down one pin: score 50 points for success; otherwise, 0.
- Be a gracious winner and an even more gracious loser. A good bowler is, above all else, a good sportsman/sportswoman! No matter what the outcome, enjoy the game!
 - Do not equate individual scores with ability. Bowling is funny that way-- it’s possible to bowl well and score terribly. It’s also possible to bowl terribly and score well. What matters most is your average over a period of time and on various lane conditions. Good technique improves both your high scores and your low scores. This is what raises your average!
 - Bowling apparel should be cool, comfortable, and nonbinding. Only your shoes should be snug to provide safe, secure, and consistent footing.
 - Learn the rules of the game. They are readily available from a variety of sources. League rules may vary from “sanctioned” rules.
 - When two bowlers step up to the approach at the same time, the person on the right goes first. That person may defer by simply taking a step back.
 - Always pick up your ball with *both hands* placed on the sides of the ball. Never put your hands in line with other balls on the return. Doing so risks serious injury!
 - Never complain about the lane conditions; they are the same for everyone. A bowler reads and adjusts to the lane conditions. That’s what bowling is really all about. Let your opponent complain about the conditions. It’s his excuse for losing.
 - An old bowling adage is “Make your spares and the strikes will take care of themselves.” This is the same as saying that it is okay to roll a bad first shot as long as you have the skill to make spares. *It is NOT okay to roll a bad first shot!* If you do so consistently, it means that you probably lack the skill to make spares consistently. A better motto is “Learn to hit the pocket with the first shot. You will get plenty of strikes, and the spares you have to make will be easy ones.” The SPARE system allows you to do exactly that!
 - Never lose your temper when you make a bad shot! The ball is telling you something and you need to pay attention to it. Remember universal truth #2: You cause what the ball does! Diagnose the shot, figure out which skill was off, correct your technique with an adjustment, and move on! Keep in mind that a practice session is absolutely worthless if you don’t learn something. Now that you know how to bowl, every shot you make is a practice session!
 - Keep food and drinks behind the bowling area. Anything on the floor will be stepped on! That person will then track it up onto the approach where it will *cause problems* for everybody, including the risk of serious injuries that can result from falling with a heavy ball in your hands!
 - Do not waste time up on the approach. Get into your stance, do a quick checklist, and *go*! Other people are waiting to bowl also.
 - Your target does not need to be an arrow. It can be any board in the area of the arrows.
 - Use the heaviest ball you can manage reliably. The more a ball weighs, the less it will deflect when it strikes the pins. You want the ball to “drive” through the pins in order to create an effective domino action.
 - For the best chance of a strike, the ball should enter the pocket heading directly for the five-pin. This rule of thumb is the reason this pin is referred to as the “king-pin!”
 - No combination of pins can be properly referred to as a “split” if the head-pin is among them.
 - Do not store your bowling ball in your car during cold weather. Cold hardens the cover of any ball, making it slide farther down the lane. It will act inconsistently as its temperature changes. Also, moisture will condense on any surface colder than the surrounding air! You will have to deal with that as well! A cold ball all but guarantees that you will have a bad night!
 - League bowlers are classified according to their averages. Your average is a function of many basic elements. Among them are:
 1. passion for the game
 2. education about the game
 3. physical ability
 4. experience
 5. lane “conditions” where you bowl
 6. the nature of your equipment
 - Hook is a “double-edged sword!” On one side, it increases the size of your strike zone. On the other side, balls that hook a lot create some gawdawful-looking spares!
 - You have the right to expect only one lane on each side of you to be clear before you bowl. Waiting for more space delays play for everyone.
 - “A thumbhole can never be too big.” Ray Smith, former professional bowler out of Erie, Pennsylvania, on how to keep a ball from “hanging up” on one’s hand.
 - “Every lane has a line to the pocket. Your job is to find it, then stay on it all night long!” Luke Curlett, bowler extraordinaire!

Steven’s closing comment: Now, quit making excuses and get to work! Remember, that 15’ of approach is your stage and you want to put on a good show.

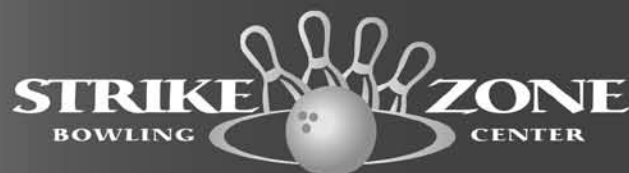

en and +26 for the men. During the 2nd game, we would see Annaliza still in the lead with a +125, with 2nd now at +111. The lows for women at +14 and the low for the men was now +45. After the 3rd game it was Annaliza with a +155 who would finish on top and sit out to bowl for the title. The 2nd spot would belong to Tomas Chavez at +134 to sit out the first round. Low for the women was +58 and low for the men was +33 to make it into the top 32 match play finals.

Our top seed Annaliza in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500, which is maxed out. She drew a 298. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score so it will be carried over. We will have \$3,500 at Oak Tree Lanes, and continue to build on another back-up pot.

This would bring us to our top 32 Match Play finals. In the first round, the 14 losers were Faye Josafat, Sandy Rosenblum, Ben Bagoisan, Joevin Bolanos, Bobbie McCollum, William Garrett, Kristine Soliman, George Parker, Darren Garcia, Virgil Hilvano, Bob Pearson, Teddy Villaroman, Bart Sanchez, Vuong Do, and Jonathan Barraca. They received checks of \$200 each. In the second round, the losers were Shaun Suase, Leo Silva, David Emrich, Ludee Masangcay, Tomas Chavez, Angelito Hilvano, Dom LaGuardia, and Freddie Catamisan. They received checks of \$220 each. In the third round, the losers were Derick Masangcay, Danny Alcayde, Gerald Sanchez,

and Clemente Guajardo. They received checks of \$300. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$99 (Carlos Medina) to a high of \$765 (Richard Hirata) depending on who would win. In this round it was between Marina Suos (31st seed) bowling Carlos Medina (22nd seed). Their match was close til the end with Carlos finishing it out with a 191 to 169 to advance. In the other match we saw Michael Davis (8th seed) bowling Richard Hirata (25th seed). This was a match that was close all the way to the very end with a possible tie. It would be Richard who held on with a 187 - 185 finish and send him onto the semi-final match. Both Michael and Marina finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$625 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and pitted Rich and Carlos into the match play. In the weekly "horses" we would see opposite payout of low \$99 and high \$765. This match was another nail biter we had at Cal Bowl on this night. This would go all the way to the 10th frame before we would know who was to win. It was Richard who would finish the match first. He went in with a 14 pin lead but Carlos did have a strike in the 9th frame and was waiting. Richard would leave the 10 pin and he would just need to pick that up to force Carlos to double in the 10th. But it wasn't to be as he would miss the shot and left Carlos with a chance. Carlos came up needing a strike on his first ball and that he did, he would get 8 pins on his second shot which was

good enough to let him finish with a 151/198 to 165/194 and advance on to the title match. Finishing in 3rd place was Richard Hirata who bowled so well this week for \$1,250. For those lucky "investors" that had Carlos as a horse, he paid \$99.

The title game was set Carlos Medina advancing to bowl Annaliza for the title. You could tell that this was going to be another close match. Carlos would start with a strike, and Annaliza was not going to be out done as she came up and matched him. She continued to get marks through the first 5 frames, while Carlos would struggle in the beginning with 3 opens in the first 5 frames and put him behind by 24 pins after the 5th frame was over. RESULTS OF DEAF SENIOR BOWLERS OF AMERICA ELIMINATION EVENTS

LAS VEGAS — DSBA Secretary Treasurer Carol Moers (Denver) mailed out the results of the 15th annual senior men and women Singles, Mixed Doubles and the prestigious Elimination Match play events. The tournament was held at The Orleans Hotel Bowling Center last October 11-13 with entries of 60 men, aged 55 and over and 24 women, aged 50 and over from all over US.

Note: Ed Abakumoff already wrote in October 27th issue of Bowling News, the winners and results of both men and women Singles and mixed doubles but did not have the complete details of the exciting men and women Elimination tournaments. Now they can be reported here.

DELORES MCCARTY WON OVER PATRICA MORFORD IN SENIOR QUEENS

Out of the 24 women, only 17 entered for the Deaf Senior Queens competition. In the 4 games qualifying event for the top 8 positions in the double elimination one game match play bracket, Penelope Hendee, Illinois closed with tournament high game 190 in her 4th game and 664 high series plus her handicap of 204 for 868 total for the top spot in the match play.

Former champion (2002) Lyndene Higginbotham (AZ) followed with 854 total for 2nd and 2005 champion Sharon Duran (CA) qualified 4th with 841. Violet Greenspon (CA) with 816 beat Janis

Bowers (CO) by two pins for the 8th and last spot.

In the next day match plays both Hendee and the eventual winner Delores McCarty (CA) who qualified in 7th place had won all their 2 rounds match games without a loss and met in the 3th round. McCarty gave Hendee her first loss, 227-203 including handicap putting herself in the championship finals. Hendee moved into semi finals match.

Meanwhile the 3rd qualifier with 842 total Patricia Morford (CA) who lost 192-242 in first round to McCarty, then in the losers bracket Morford beat in succession Greenspon 196-181, Mary Sickinger 181-175 and Duran 208-178. Morford moved into the semi final round against the waiting Hendee and defeated Hendee 211-205, moving herself in the championship finals.

In the all California championship finals McCarty continued her winning play with a 203-182 win over tired Morford for the \$200 prize. Morford got \$100 for 2nd, Hendee 3rd \$80 and the prizes ran down to \$25 for 8th place.

TED THOMAS BEAT LONNIE JONES, JR. IN MEN'S ELIMINATIONS

In the senior men's eliminations qualifying round with 51 entries, Deaf Team USA member Gene Takinen (AZ) led with 4 games of 247-203-246-235 for 931 plus 32 handicap 963 total for the top spot of the 32 men double elimination match play. DSBA's outgoing Vice President Renwick Dayton (OR) followed with 8 pins behind 855 total from 209-258-224-152/843 plus 112 handicap. Third place Jose Sermenio (AZ) had 938 from 248-258-211-205/922 plus 16 handicap.

Former champions (2003) Marvin Murray (CA) qualified [n 10th with 870, (2006) Walter Holder (TX) in 22nd with 829 and defending champion Gorman Low (CA) in 25th with 828, The 32nd place was taken by Robert Taylor (CA) with 807 score.

In the next day one game elimination match play, of the top three bowlers only Sermenio advanced as far as being eliminated in 6th round by Murray. Takinen was out in 3rd round and Dayton lasted in 5th round. The eventual winner Ted Thomas. (NB) had qualified in 14th place with 856 total and eventual runner-up Lonnie Jones Jr. (CA) qualified in 6th with 899.

Both Thomas and Jones, Jr. had won their 4 matches without a loss and met each other in the 5th round. There with both carried same average 178 and handicap 25, Thomas gave Jones, Jr. his first loss 246+25=271 to 205+25/230. putting Jones, Jr. in the semi-finals of losers bracket. Thomas, without a loss, placed in the Championship finals.

Meanwhile the actions turns to the loser bracket, Murray after losing in the 2nd round, worked his way up, winning 3 more matches and eliminated Sermenio in 6th round. Lonnie Jones, Jr. had won the Pacific Coast Deaf and National Deaf Seniors titles and wanted this one so bad but it was not for him. In the title match Thomas won his first DSBA Elimination title after some tries by winning 211+25/236 to Jones, Jr. 157+25/182.

Thomas got the trophy and \$520.00 first place prize and Jones, Jr. got \$260.00 as runner up prize.

The next year's 16th annual Deaf Senior Bowlers of America Tournament will be at same place, The Orleans Hotel Bowling Center on October 9-11, 2012.
