Malaysia's Ismail Wins Singles Gold

HONG KONG – Malaysia's Rafiq Ismail, a finalist for the PBA Rookie of the Year award in 2018, won the gold medal in singles Saturday at the 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships.

The left-hander entered the singles medal round as the No. 3 seed and defeated No. 4 seed Dan MacLelland of Canada, 217-204 to take the title at the South China Athletic Association Bowling Centre in Hong Kong.

In a tense semifinal match, Ismail took down No. 2 seed Kyle Troup of the United States, 171-170, and threw a clutch strike to open the final frame to help him advance.

In the first semifinal, MacLelland eliminated top seed Andrew Anderson of the United States, 256-170.

Malaysia Wins Doubles At Worlds

HONG KONG - Malaysia has long been a country that has been in the hunt to win gold medals at past World Bowling Men's Championships but always seemed to come up a little short. The lone exception was the gold medal Malavsia won in the 1979 trios event. Now, the Malaysians have won two gold medals in two days at the 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships after capturing the doubles event.

Adrian Ang and Tun Hakim defeated Team USA's EJ Tackett and Andrew Anderson, 433-370, in the gold-medal match at the South China Athletic Association Bowling Centre in Hong Kong. The victory came a day after Rafiq Ismail won the singles gold medal for Malaysia.

Hakim fired a 228 game, while Ang shot 205 in the title bout, while Tackett had

196 and 2018 PBA Player of the Year Anderson only managed 174.

It was the second straight day the United States was left disappointed after a medal round. During Saturday's singles medal round, Team USA finished with a pair of bronze medals with Anderson and Kyle Troup losing their semifinal matches. In Sunday's doubles semifinals. Tackett and Anderson put up a big game in defeating Korea's Park Jongwoo and Kim Kyungmin, 495-377. Tackett shot 259, while Anderson had 236.

Malaysia's Hakim fired 262 in the other semifinal, while Ang shot 196 to defeat Canada's Dan MacLelland and Francois Lavoie, 458-412. It was the second medal of these World Championships for MacLelland, who earned the silver in singles.

10th Anniversary PBA World Series of Bowling to Return to its Original Home in Suburban Detroit

Five consecutive nights of national television coverage on FS1 set for March 2019

ALLEN PARK – The 10th anniversary Professional Bowlers Association World Series of Bowling will return to its original home at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit in March where it will write a new chapter in bowling history with five consecutive nights of prime-time national television coverage on FS1.

PBA's World Series of Bowling, created in 2009 as a multi-event series of tournaments, has grown into the most important international event in bowling, annually attracting the most talented bowlers from around the world. And the 2019 WSOB X will continue the trend, concluding with an historic television package including four consecutive nights of live championship tournament finals telecasts - Monday through Thursday, March 18, 19, 20 and 21 - plus a USA vs. The World team match featuring the World Series' top performers on Friday, March 22.



The five consecutive nights of prime-time coverage is a first in bowling history, and an important segment in the PBA's 60th consecutive year of national television coverage. All five two-hour shows, part of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season, will air on FS1 at 8 p.m. EST from the famous arena bay inside historic Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich.

WSOB X, which gets underway on March 10, will include four championship tournaments: the PBA Cheetah 33, Chameleon 39 and Scorpion 42 Championships plus the 2019 PBA World Championship which will include an elite field of players based upon their overall performances in the three preliminary "animal pattern" events that will be contested on distinctly different lane oiling patterns. The PBA World Championship will be contested on the Earl Anthony 43 oiling pattern. Each event's numerical designation indicates the distance oil is applied down the lane.

A total of 115 PBA members will be invited to compete in the World Series, based upon their composite WSOB earnings between 2015-17, plus any PBA Tour title winner who has not qualified on the composite earnings list. A pre-tournament qualifier will be held on March 10 at Thunderbowl to allow other PBA members to compete for all remaining berths in the 135-player field.

Team USA Wins Trios Gold At Worlds

HONG KONG – After two days of disappointing performances in medal rounds, Team USA finally broke through Monday to win its first gold medal of the 2018 World Bowling Men's Championships.

The United States threesome of Kyle Troup, EJ Tackett and Andrew Anderson defeated Indonesia's Billy Islam, Hardy Rachmadian and Ryan Lalisang, 632-551, to win the trios gold medal at the South China Athletic Association Bowling Centre in Hong Kong.

Troup led the way for Team USA in the gold-medal match with 229, while Tackett had 223 and Anderson shot 180. For Indonesia, Lalisang had 189, Islam shot 183 and Rachmadian had 179.

The trios victory was the first in the event for Team USA since 2010 when Patrick Allen, Rhino Page and Wes Malott won the event in Munich, Germany.

In the semifinals, the United States put up a big score in defeating Korea,

695-654. Tackett shot 245, Troup had 243 and Anderson totaled 207. Korea was led by Kim Kyungmin's 243 game with Koo Seonghoi shooting 212 and Park Jongwoo 199.

Indonesia advanced in the semifinals with a 632-

591 win over Sweden. Lalisang led the way for Indonesia with 235 and was followed by Rachmadian (216) and Islam (181). For Sweden, Mattias Wetterberg had 202, Jesper Svensson shot 195 and Martin Larsen had 194.



Bowling: The Greatest Sport in the World. Here's Why!

WINNETKA – So why is bowling the greatest sport in the world?

Maybe I should rephrase that.

Perhaps I should ask: Why is bowling the greatest sport in the world to so many of us devoted to the sport?

There's a reason for that.

And it's embodied in the spirit and enthusiasm of Geoff Gast.

Geoff is a diminutive firebrand who admittedly is not the greatest athlete in the world. But this charismatic right-hander has found a sport where at times he can perform at a level higher than all the great ones – the Pete Webers, the Earl Anthonys, the Norm Dukes.

Admittedly, that's with his handicap included. But no matter.

That minor fact doesn't short-circuit Geoff's touching adoration of the game.

Once when Geoff bowled particularly well for his league team, he enthused, "It was like I was being Shaq and Kobe and leading the way. I was being the Big Fella and the big man and bringing home the win."

In July, Geoff blasted his first 200 game after bowling in leagues for eight years. He finished with a smoking-hot 211, and that translated into a stratospheric 310 with handicap – the best in the league.

That's why bowling is the greatest sport in the world. When Geoff Gast can bowl 10 pins higher than any pro bowler potentially can – with handicap, of course – that provides a feeling of accomplishment that other sports have trouble matching.

Bowling is for white collar, blue collar, any collar. In any one frame, one can bowl a strike and no pro bowler can do better. The pro may snake a well-crafted hook neatly into the pocket and blow up the pins. But anyone off the street can toss a straight ball and hit the head pin head-on or on either side of the head pin and finish with the same strike result.

Heck, bowlers have been known to miss the head pin entirely and because of a wicked chain reaction of dominos, they can strike too.

Bowling is an equalizer. Form and accuracy win out in the long run. But in the short term, who knows?

In any one frame, Geoff Gast can outperform Pete Weber


Actually, in a game, Geoff Gast can outperform Pete Weber.

That series translates into a whopping 781 with handicap. Don't be surprised if Geoff reaches 800 soon.

- The Ladies All Star Trio League at **KEYSTONE LANES** rostered the best in the west. Here are a few: CIPPY CAKE, SHIRLEY KATUSIC, THERESE ABAIR, CAROL MUR-BACH, AMY HIRT, MARY JO LIGHT - - - - all averaged over 190. These gals were always in skirts, sponsored shirts and high kickers.
- DONNA ADAMEK was teaching senior citizen classes at SOUTH BAY BOWL.
- SHERYL POOLE won the San Gabriel Valley Queens tourney.
- CAROL JOYCE was elected President of the L.A. Women's Ass'n.
- DUDLEY PEEBLES - flash back ladies. He was the state photographer. Always there with camera in hand and a pen for his checkbook. A true gentleman. Team pictures were his specialty for years!
- Looking back three years I wrote about the beginning of a new tournament club The Sunbelt Bowlers Tour. Would it survive with so much competition? Three years later they were guaranteeing \$10,000 first place and \$25,000 over- all for their "Sunshine Bowl" tournament.
- Still having weekly tournaments Amateur Bowlers Tour, S & E Bowlers Tour, NBAC. Roll'n Donkee, Touring Amateur Bowlers, RMC Tour Classic, CBA, J.A.T., P.C.B. just to name the ones that advertised.

- RON GAUDERN was named Executive of the Year by the Bowling Writers. He owned COLUMBIA BOWL in Duarte, 2 in San Antonio and WESTERN COLUMBIA in San Gabriel. Ron was on the Falstaff Beer team with Billy Welu, Dick Hoover, Harry Smith and Glenn Allison. Tired of being on the road he stuck with Columbia - until he retired.


