Ashkan for leader's Team 11 and Steve for the defenders, Team 13. Ashkan opened with two bad frames, finished with 10 Xs for 268 game. Steve a 212 both went on a second game spree.

Lanes 29-30 picked up fans as the leadoffman matched strikes, up until the eighth frame, Ashkan got his strike while Steve got garbage, 4-6-7-10 and finished with a 261. Ashkan went off the sheet for a perfect, a total of 22 strikes.

The fans were pulling for the 300 shooter, maybe an Andy Varipapa back-to-back 300s. Varipapa, a noted trick shot artist, rolled (strung) many two-game 300s, six strikes in two consecutive games. He added them up — another 300 for his record book.

Getting back to Forest Lanes. Ashkan started his third game with a strike, 23-in-a-row, he lost it in the second frame finishing with a 192 game and 760 series, 26 pins short of his loop high 786. The 760 paced Team 11's 724/2071 set. Gene Plotnick (211/595) and Jeff Carr (256/716) contributed to the victory.

Team 13 won four points paced by Steve's 261/698, and wood from Scott Churchfield (214/621) and Danny "330" Wilson's 232/620 slipped to third.

Team Two, Herbert Jones and brothers Francisco and Mike Trejo, kept its second spot even losing, 11 to 6, to Team Five, Frank Street, KathyMcCollom and Alan Meyerson, posted 710/11873 to keep event.

Others on last Thursday's honor roll: Mario Marquez and Johnny Nguyen 269s, Carr 716, Chris Grulke 704, McCollom 221 and Tina Chang 494.

Weber Wins for His Dad

HAMMOND, IN—Pete Weber had some help from above on Sunday.

With thoughts of his father on his mind, the PBA Hall of Famer snapped a 26-event winless streak which dated back to Feb. 2004, and defeated Ryan Shafer in the title match of the 2005 BowlersParadise.com Classic, 189-186, at Stardust Bowl I.

"This is pure enjoyment. I'm enjoying this just as much as Dad is up [in heaven]...thanks Dad," an emotional Weber said, referring to his PBA Hall of Fame father Dick Weber, who passed away in Feb. 2005.

Weber almost missed his chance to collect the \$40,000 and his 32nd career Tour title. Holding the lead, Weber opened in the 8th frame, allowing Shafer back into the match. The four-time title winner struck in the 8th frame, but a disastrous 4-7-10 split in the 9th put Weber back in command. A spare and six pins in the 10th sealed the win for Weber.

The title match had started slowly, with Weber striking just once in the first five frames and Shafer opening twice.

Weber switched between the Storm Paradigm and Fired Up strike balls during the title match.

Weber (St. Ann, Mo.) advanced to the title match by defeating Tommy Jones, 207-167, in the first semifinal. Jones, aiming to extend a 15-match winning streak on TV, struck just twice in the first nine frames while Weber pulled away with strikes in frames 6-9.

Shafer defeated Brad Angelo, looking for his first career Tour title, 210-196, in their semifinal. Shafer stayed clean through nine frames, striking five times, while Angelo opened twice over the first four frames.

Shafer (Elmira, N.Y.) earned \$20,000 for 2nd while Angelo (Lockport, N.Y.) and Jones (Simpsonville, S.C.) earned \$10,000 apiece for their respective 3rd and 4th place finishes.

National Deaf Bowling News Patty Brothag Hits Record 760 In Central States Deaf Tournament

GRAND RAPIDS—Information was received that last month Patty Brothag, a two time member of Deaf Team USA from Matuna, Ohio rolled a deaf tournament record 760 series in the Central States Women's Bowling Association of Deaf Queens event held in Grand Rapids, Michigan. In this 760, which is an all-time high series for deaf women's tournament Patty had games of 245-258-257.

Patty claims this is her 7th career 700 series, so while we wait for more information on what part of CSWBAD Queens event this series was rolled in, we would like to know how she finished in this tournament.

We recall Patty as a member of 2001 Deaf Team USA, she was the star, winning gold medals in singles and trio team, and silvers in 5 women team and women's Masters at the 2001 Rome, Italy Deaflympics. She set record in Deaflympics singles and all-events and helped set record in 5 women team.

Patty was chosen as a member of 2005 Deaf Team USA for the Deaflympics at Melbourne, Australia last January. With Sharon

Rutherford's help, they won a gold medal, setting a record in women's doubles and won silvers in trio team and 5 women team. Although not at her peak, Patty qualified 8th for the women's Masters but unfortunately due to injury, she had to withdraw late in the 2nd round of 8 games.

For her performance in the Rome Deaflympics Patty was invited by USA Bowling to participate in the 2001 National Amateur Championships at Reno. Like the other deaf bowlers, David Reeves and Jerilyn Keller invited before her in 2000 and Matt Pocci along with Patty, although they enjoyed bowling 24 games there but we could not understand why they all could not bowl their real league and tournament averages in the National Amateur Championships. There must be a jinx.

Anyway when we get the results of Grand Rapids CSDWBA tournament, we will report where Patty's record 760 will go in the deaf record archives.

NATION'S OLDEST DEAF TOURNAMENT GREAT LAKES 70TH IN CHICAGO APRIL 2006

CHICAGO...The granddaddy of all deaf bowling associations, Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association will have its 70th anniversary tournament at Stardust Lanes in a Chicago suburb of Addison April 20 to 23, 2006. Its sister association, GLDWBA will be having its 59th tournament at Elk Grove Bowl in suburb of Elk Grove Village on the same days.

GLDBA was first formed in 1934 as International Deaf Bowling Association at Syracuse, NY with 5 teams including one from Canada participating. It grew to 26 teams in 1936 at Cleveland, Ohio where they decided to change the name to Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association to keep the tournament in the Great Lakes area.

After having 5 different secretary-treasurers in its first 7 years, GLDBA in 1940 voted to have one permanent secretary-treasurer and at present Mike Jasko, is the only 5th to man that office since 1941. There were no tournaments during World War 2 in 1943 to 1945.

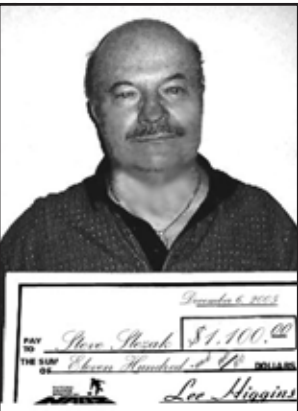

Here are the 3-game scores of the winners of those matches, 738, 751, 754, 736, 783, 760, 712, 682 (SIX?), 720, 690, 768, 705, 719, 751.

THAT, ladies and germs, IS A CROCK! Therein lies the story of what is wrong with the game today. If only PBA guys shot the numbers, it would still be ludicrous, but amateurs hung up many of those digits. Losers scores went into the mid to high 600’s, for the most part, but nearly every match was won by at least 100-pins. Throw (literally) the ball and strike, throw the ball and strike. Boring...just as the Sunday am weekly show has become, especially with more conversation and silly trick shots.

This was the USBC putting up this ridiculous condition. It got scores...my Aunt Petunia could have shot 680...and she’s got a broken arm! I’m sorry...these guys, pro’s and amateurs ARE NOT THAT GOOD! Many of these guys, pro’s and amateurs couldn’t CARRY the bowling ball and bag for Don Carter, Carmen Salvino, Dick Weber, Billy Hardwick, Glenn Allison, Barry Asher, Ray Bluth, HarrySmith, AndyMarzich, or many more genuine super stars.

With in a few years, I’m sure the USBC/PBA combine will be able to figure out how to get these 700’s into 800’s. It is stupid, it is boring, it is becoming easier and easier to turn over to football on Sunday...it is nearing the death of a former great sport. We still have a number of great players, but these phoney conditions and technology put guys named Clyde Snively on the same plain as a Norm Duke or Tommy Jones of Walter Ray, to name a few. The biggest embarrassment of the Masters, of FOUR TV finalists...TWO were AMATEURS! THAT doesn’t speak too highly of the “greatest bowlers in the world” PBA claim.

Mike Scroggins eventually won, beating Duke 245-238, in spite of Duke’s superior performance. Scroggins managed 7-in-a-row against Norm, but he had three shots consecutively that would qualify for the worst deliveries by any bowler, ever, on TV. Yet, on the Twinkies condition from the left side, all three hideous throws ended flush in the pocket. Scroggins only salvation: He didn’t fall down making those three shots.

Yet, Sunday, Dec. 4 provided the best PBA show in years, with challenging conditions...which brings the cream to the top. Pete Weber won it with games of 207 and 189. Tommy Jones 167, Ryan Schaffer 210 and 186, losing the title match by 3-stix, Brad Angelo had a 196. It was what bowling was originally designed to be: Difficult, if not down-right tough. Great show, in spite of Randy Pedersons blathering about conditions. Hey...they had to hit a one-board spot instead of a five or six board area. 40-years-ago, a two board area was seventh heaven. Dec. 4 was a great example of how the game was before technology took over. Like...spares counted and you paid a penalty for 1st ball execution.

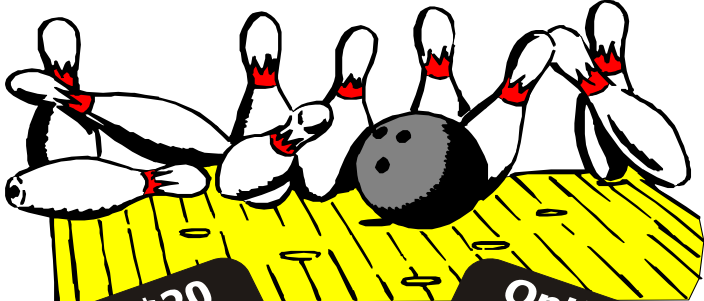

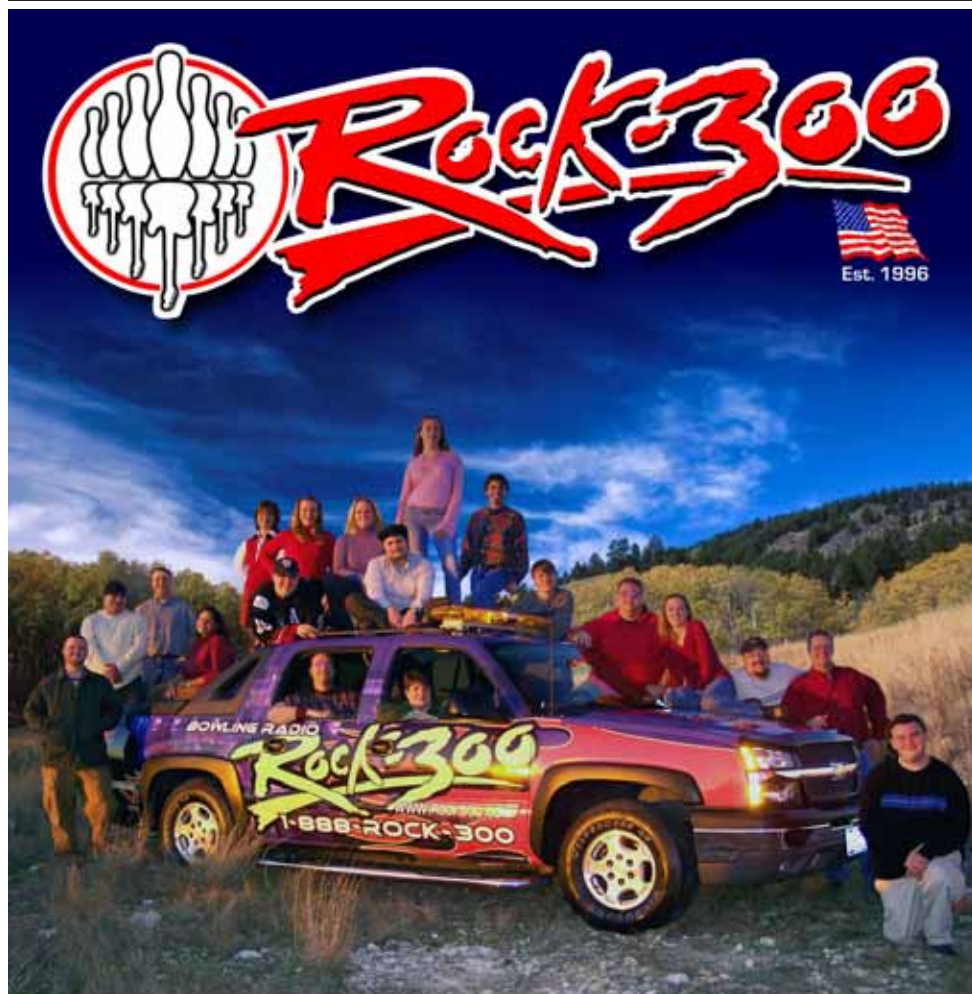
