the Troops Carpet Bowling Lane Kits Enjoyed by American

Service Men and Women Around the Globe Thanks to America's bowling community, when active duty troops around

active duty troops around the world have some down time, they can enjoy some fun and competition via a lightweight, portable carpet bowling lane kit, shipped complete with a rubberized bowling ball, ten pins and scoresheets.

"Bowling Salutes America's Troops," introduced in 2005 by BVL, has now delivered more than 550 kits to troops deployed on active duty in Iraq, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Korea and a host of other countries. The program has been tremendously successful - providing soldiers, sailors and airmen an opportunity to take a break from the stresses of their jobs and enjoy the fun and camaraderie of the sport. The kit consists of a 26 foot long stuffed bag aerial viewred, white and blue carpet bowling lane, a 5 lb. rubberized bowling ball and lightweight plastic bowling pins. The lane, ball and pins, packaged in a nylon carrying bag, can be set up in a few minutes time, whenever a break in the schedule permits. The kit also includes score sheets and instructions. "The response to this campaign has been tremendous - from both our volunteers and the service men and women who have received the kit," explains BVL Board Chair John LaSpina. "We have

But, it was an unexpected guest appearance at the center Monday that yielded a recordsetting performance for the 24-year-old right-hander, who became the 29th bowler to roll three consecutive 300 games for a 900 series in United States Bowling Congresscertified competition.

bowling in new league for the first time, but it ended with additional paperwork he never could have expected. "I couldn't believe it - I still can't," said Osbourn, who owned four 300 games prior to Monday. "I wasn't shaking at the end, though. I think I was in shock. It's great and crazy, and I can't believe it happened to me. I love bowling and always have, and this is something I'll never forget."

First 900 In Lone Star State

Osbourn's last 300 and 800 came at Copperfield Bowl in September, when he opened the night with 12 consecutive strikes and added games of 258 and 254 for an 812 series, the third 800 of his career.

That experience definitely helped him Monday after his perfect start, despite impossible-to-avoid

sizable number of bowlers from Fresno took part.

Two youth bowlers won titles – Jennifer Loredo (13 years old) and Ashley Santos (16) – and they were Fresno residents.

Loredo was the champion in the women's 176-andhigher handicap division. Santos took first place in the women's 176-and-lowthoughts of the likelihood of a poor shot or run-ending 10 pin. Neither happened, though, as Osbourn polished off the first perfect set in the Lone Star State, topping the previous mark of 899, shot by Bill Fong of Plano, Texas, in 2010. "I'd never shot back-to-back 300s or two in the same set, so it was a little unfamiliar, but I just tried to keep it going and keep the shots online," Osbourn said. "I felt the same way at the end of the third game, too. But, I was on my good lane. I tried not to overthink it and just throw the ball."

Osbourn's 36-strike string came in the NFL Fall 2016 short-season league. The trios league kicked off its 14-week season in mid-September and is scheduled to run until Dec.12. "It defi-

nitely helped being in a trios league, so I didn't have to wait that long and was able to keep my mind focused," said Osbourn, who comes from a family of bowlers and has averaged as high as 230, which came during the 2013-2014 season. It's Important to Know the Score

DETROIT - Granted, it had literally been decades since I had stepped inside a major league baseball stadium.

Still, I was shocked this year after I walked through the gates of Comerica Park to watch the host Detroit Tigers face the Chicago White Sox.

Where were all the vendors selling scorecards? There just were none to be found anywhere as I clutched my presumed five dollars for the program and another buck for the pencil to enter my scribbles.

Surely, there was a demand for fans to keep score.

As I recall, fans used to line up to purchase their scorebook filled with photos and stories of their favorite plavers and a middle section that was reserved for recording every play from both teams.

This was absolutely the case with all the White Sox and the Chicago Cubs games that I attended as a teen and young adult. I always bought a program and a pencil as well and then I went right to work denoting each game's play starting with the first pitch.

Not sure if the Tigers' stadium is an anomaly, but it still was a disappointment to not see any readily visible scorecards.

I felt baseball fans, including myself, needed to keep score to really follow the game and extract the most enjoyment out of the action. Furthermore, one never knew if that scorecard would turn into a valuable memento should Justin Verlander happen to hurl a perfect game.

I bring all this up after reading Steven Felege's bowling book, "The Essentials of Bowling. Approaching the Perfect Game."

As I wrote previously about the book, Felege incorporates numerous tips and musings around his core message about the path one needs to take to become a top bowler.

CHINA'S BACK WITH RECORD GROUP OF 10 PLAYERS

For the third year, "graduates" of China's Longmarch Pioneers League have returned to the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling. This year's record group of 10 players includes three traditional right handers, two lefties and five players who use the "spinner" technique with very light bowling balls, a technique that is popular in Taiwan, Malaysia, Singapore and a few other Asian Rim nations. It's the largest group of "spinner" technicians ever to bowl in PBA competition.

After making its debut with six bowlers in 2014 and seven last year, China continues to pursue its first "casher." But the players who have qualified through the "Pioneers" program created by Longmarch Bowling President Frank Zhao continue to make progress and Zhao is making sure Chinese bowling fans are constantly updated by feeding them video and audio reports on social media on a daily basis. As a demonstration of the progress China is making, Zhiyong Wang averaged 224.5 in the Cheetah round to finish in 26th place – missing the cut to the match play elimination rounds by finishing two pins behind PBA legend Walter Ray Williams Jr.

One of those tips bears mention because it seems so obvious but yet not everyone has gotten the message:

"Learn how to keep score!"

That goes for bowling as well as baseball.

Since electronic scoreboards came into vogue in bowling and elbowed out the need to score by hand, some people have been left out of the learning process of bowling's basic scoring system.

If you don't know how to keep score, you may not realize how many strikes it takes to finish with that memorable perfect game (12 is the answer.)

Or you may not know what you need to score at the end of the game to propel your league team to victory.

In any event, a little knowledge goes a long way to increasing enjoyment of any game.

Scoring is really easy in bowling. And once a bowler learns it, he or she realizes not only the importance of striking - putting that X up on the scoreboard - but the importance of stringing those strikes.

Learn how to score and bowling will never be a bore.

Nor will baseball, for that matter!

In order to earn trips to the WSOB, Chinese players have to earn their PBA memberships through Zhao's Longmarch Pioneers League, establishing minimum 200 averages, and then they had to finish among the leaders in a national qualifying event.

Once again accompanying the delegation is Guotai Shi, who is Vice Chairman of the Chinese Bowling Association.





2016 WSOB "ANIMAL PATTERN" PRIMER

Since its inception in Detroit in 2009, the essence of the World Series has been a variety of "animal pattern" which not only offer PBA Tour titles, but serve as qualifying stages culminating with the PBA World Championship. In order to win the PBA World Championship, players must demonstrate a high level of consistency across the different challenges the "animal patterns" present.

While oiling patterns on bowling lanes are normally invisible, the PBA helped fans get a visual picture of the differences in playing conditions when it introduced blue dyed oil for televised WSOB events in 2013. The "blue oil" lanes have remained a part of PBA's televised events ever since.

Another major advance in understanding the challenges of bowling came when the PBA gave those varying oiling patterns names. Thus the so-called animal patterns were born, and fans can now relate to the playing surface involved simply by referring to the animal pattern name and knowing peculiar features are involved with that particular oiling pattern. This year's patterns are the Cheetah, Chameleon, Scorpion and Shark. The Shark, making its first WSOB appearance since 2011, replaces the Viper to give this year's World Series a different challenge than they faced in 2015. Here's a brief look at the 2016 animal patterns:

The Cheetah: PBA's description says "A cheetah may look harmless, but this speedster has a dangerous side. So does this pattern - with a fast scoring pace and play near the gutter, there's no room for error." The Cheetah involves applying oil on the lane to a distance of 35 feet. Past WSOB Cheetah champions include Norm Duke (2009), Eugene McCune (2010), Bill O'Neill (2012), Wes Malott (2013), Anthony Pepe (2014) and Parker Bohn III (2015). The Cheetah was not part of the 2011 WSOB.

The Chameleon: "Chameleons change color to outsmart their enemies. To excel on this pattern, bowlers must be versatile in many styles of play." The Chameleon pattern involves oiling to a distance of 43 feet. Past WSOB Chameleon champions include Bill O'Neill (2009), Scott Norton (2010), Jason Belmonte (2011), Scott Norton (2012), Ryan Ciminelli (2013), Mika Koivuniemi (2014) and Jesper Svensson (2015).



The Scorpion: "A scorpion is dangerous and unpredictable, like this pattern. If you can't find the right groove on the lanes, you'll be stung!" The Scorpion pattern involves oiling to a distance of 47 feet. Past WSOB Scorpion champions include Mike DeV-aney (2009), non-member Yong-Jin Gu (2010), Dom Barrett (2011), Tom Daugherty (2012), Tom Smallwood (2013), Michael Haugen Jr. (2014) and Jon Van Hees (2015).

The Shark: "The shark involves a heavy application of oil and is frequently preferred by players who can play the inside part of the lane because abundant oil on the outside part of the lane can lead mistakes into the abyss. Precise shot-making will be rewarded. Miss your target or make an errant release, and you may wind up in the jaws of the beast." The Shark pattern involves a high-volume application of oil to distance of 43 feet. Past WSOB Shark champions include: **Jack Jurek** (2009), **Osku Palermaa** (2010) and **Jason Belmonte** (2011).

The PBA World Championship: A specific oiling pattern, to a distance of 41 feet, is used for PBA World Championship match play and television final competition. Past WSOB PBA World Champions include: **Tom Smallwood** (2009), **Chris Barnes** (2010), **Osku Palermaa** (2011), **Parker Bohn III** (2012), **Dom Barrett** (2013), **Mike Fagan** (2014) and **Gary Faulkner Jr.** (2015).

In addition to the distance oil is applied to the lane for each specific animal pattern, the distribution of oil across the lane varies from pattern to pattern, using sophisticated lane maintenance equipment for precise duplication of oil lane to lane. The oil application influences angles of attack, ball speed and numerous other decisions bowlers have to make. Instead of being able to see the oil on the lane – and how it is moved around as each round progresses – professional bowlers read the motion of their bowling balls as they travel down the lane in order to make adjustments.

The variety of playing surfaces challenges combined with the most talented bowlers in the world are reasons why the PBA World Series of Bowling is the greatest event in bowling.

QUBICA AMF PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: *FINDLING WINS IN BEAUMONT*

Joe Findling from Mesquite, Texas defeated Mark Williams on Williams' home lanes Sunday, winning the 15th annual PBA Beaumont Southwest Open at Crossroads Bowling Center with a 218-182 victory over the PBA Hall of Famer. The victory was Findling's seventh career QubicaAMF PBA Regional title.

Findling led qualifying to claim the top berth for the stepladder finals. In the opening match, Williams defeated **Andy Patterson** of Tyler, Texas, 257-225. He then eliminated **Dylan Macon** from Lubbock, Texas, 233-214, to advance to the championship match. Then, holding a one-pin lead, Williams opened in the seventh frame and Findling pounced, striking in the ninth and 10th frames to secure the \$3,000 first prize.

CA to take care of both parents. They bowled three times a week at Cal Oaks Bowl in Murrieta, CA so it didn't take long to get back into the game. A year later I won the 2002 PWBA Regional Player's Championship at the Gold Coast Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas and wanted to compete in the PWBA National Tour for one year, but the PWBA folded in 2003.

Frustrated about the loss of the PWBA I made a commitment to do something to improve prize funds for all competitive bowlers and spent more than a decade creating various ways to make bowling more fun and interesting to watch.

The Tuesday night league is having a blast bowling for jackpots. Division One bowlers (150 & up) had their work cut out for them this week. The fifth challenge, "Get a strike" eliminated almost everyone from the competition except for Doug Stebelton, Brandon Dore, and Justin Sims. The sixth challenge required that the bowlers leave a split. Everyone failed that challenge miserably so they all stayed in the game, but no one could win the \$55.00 progressive jackpot because you have to successfully complete all ten challenges. The second jackpot based on entries was still up for grabs.

The eighth challenge required that the Division One bowlers knock down at least nine pins. Doug didn't make it leaving Brandon and Justin to go head to head for four more challenges ending up in a sudden-death competition until finally, the twelfth challenge; "Must leave one pin standing" ended the game. Justin got a strike and Brandon left only the headpin to win the jackpot. Next weeks' progressive jackpot will be worth \$60.00.

Most of the Division Two bowlers (149& under) made it through the first three challenges, but many had difficulty knocking down at least nine pins leaving Dan Kelly and Zechary Uribe to fight to the finish. Neither bowler won the challenge so they continued to play the game until the ninth challenge, "Knock down at least 9 pins." had already left, there weren't that many people around. Those who were left came up to congratulate me, and 5-10 minutes later is when it really started to sink in."

Osbourn had about a week's notice concerning his substitute role in Monday's early league, in which he bowled a less eventful series in the 670s. But, the first session served as a great warm-up and gave him an idea how to attack the oil pattern, even though his record feat would take place on a different pair of lanes.

Osbourn's achievement is pending approval from USBC and would be the 30th USBC-approved 900.

The first USBC-approved 900 occurred Feb. 2, 1997 when Jeremy Sonnenfeld rolled three consecutive perfect games in Lincoln, Nebraska.


as word of the kits spread, requests for more lanes poured in from individual service men and women in outposts around the globe. Reports from the troops indicate that the lanes are in use on rooftops in Baghdad, along military air-strips, on board ships in the Gulf, and in dozens of camps in the Iraqi desert.

From the U.S.S. Enterprise, one seaman says this, "Whenever we find a time to set the lane up, it tends to bring out Sailors from every hatch looking for a chance to relieve some stress. And everyone agrees that this is one of the coolest packages ever..." From Camp Arifjan, a soldier wrote, "I have to say that this is one of the greatest ideas I have seen come to Kuwait. Thank you for what you are doing for the troops."The first Strike Campaigns to fund the contribution of a kit to the troops are underway at bowling centers from coast to coast. In Daytona Beach, (Fla.) bowlers have already raised enough money to send the lane kit to 12 different former league bowlers from that area currently serving in Iraq.

In California, the bowlers at Tustin Lanes (Tustin, Calif.) have purchased 10 lane kits to support the troops. The program's success has extended beyond the sport of bowling. In fact, campaigns to purchase and ship lane kits have been coordinated by a range of other organizations and businesses. In Tennessee, a Sunday school class raised money to help the effort. In Rockford, Ill., Riverside Community Bank set up a lane in their lobby and encouraged their customers to donate to the effort. "It was a fun way for Riverside to show our community service," reports spokesperson Paula Schweinler. In Kentucky, USBC member "Jo" Wisby explains that after she operated the campaign at a local bowling center, she took the idea to the area Wal-Mart, where the manager eagerly agreed to conduct their own campaign, consequently raising enough money to send over two lanes to the husband of a Wal-Mart employee now on active duty.


